The Lewisburg Downtown Partnership (LDP) has earned statewide recognition at the 2025 Townie Awards, presented by the Pennsylvania Downtown Center (PDC). The Bull-Run Greenway Project was honored in the category-Physical Improvements & Design: Public Space Improvements.

This award celebrates the transformation of the Bull-Run corridor into a vibrant, accessible public space designed for recreation, connection, and community use. The project is the result of a collaborative effort between LDP, the Borough of Lewisburg, and numerous local partners.

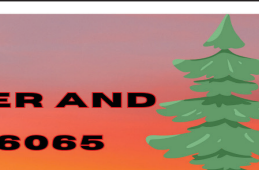

Selinsgrove having No Luck No Matter what Night they Race, Clinton County Finally gets to Race

It all started on Saturday May 31st when most of the cars were in the pits and a light drizzle started to fall down and did not let up on the night the Super late models Limited, late models and street stocks were set to race. Then on Friday June 6th the 410-sprints along with the Kreamer Cup 360/358-sprints, and East Coast wingless sprint were on the schedule, but this time a fully-fledged rainstorm was around and no racing again. Then on Thursday night June 12th with no rain in sight the Appalachian Mountain late model Speedweek super late models along with limited late models were all in the pits when out of nowhere a rain cloud showed up and dumped enough rain that the track could not get run in and the race was postponed. Then this past Sunday it was going to be the 410-sprints and 305-sprint in action and again with most of the cars in the pits persistent drizzle and a little fog cancelled that program also. Four different nights of racing a Saturday, Friday, Thursday and Sunday and it rained for all of them. Two of the events will be made up the Kreamer Cup 360/358-sprint race will be made up at a date yet to be announced, while the late model Speedweek will get the green on Friday July 11th which will be the fifth and final point's race for the series. Five of the eight races will get run with as of now looks like Gregg Satterlee will win his third Speedweek title, with two wins a second and a ninth place in four races, he also has a series best twelve feature wins. Satterlee has 3,485 points to Trevor Feathers 3,355 followed by Bryan Bernheisel 3,311 Dan Stone 3,236 and Kyle Lee 3,199 three drivers have all top ten runs in the four races run so far Satterlee, Trevor Feathers and Dan Stone, Bryan Bernheisel has three top ten runs along with a 11th place finish at Path Valley.

Bridgeport had what would have been the final race last Sunday with where Gregg Satterlee scored his second win and twelve overall in the history of the series. Trevor Feathers was the early leader but Satterlee got past him on a restart and went on to win over Bryan Bernheisel, with Feathers getting a flat tire and came back for his eight-place finish. The big news of the day was the run turned in by Briggs Danner who was making his very first start in a late model, Briggs was driving the Denny Supreko #31 that is usually driven by Jim Bernheisel. Danner has driven all kinds of sprint cars wingless 410- 360 engine stuff, but after only one night of practice he was mixing it up with the veteran drivers with his

fourth-place finish in the feature. Friday night at Bedford speedway Mason Zeigler won his second in a row in the series, also getting a win at Path Valley speedway on June 10th. Those were the only two races that Zeigler participated in or maybe he would have had a shot at the title. In Four events four different drivers had fast time over the field Trevor Feathers, Mason Zeigler, Justin Weaver and Gregg Satterlee. Twelve different drivers won heat races with Rick Eckert the only driver to have two heat wins. When the Selinsgrove race is made up it will pay the winner of the feature \$6,000 to win with \$600 to take the green, limited late models will also be in action that night and Pass 305-sprints. The series will hand out the checks for the top ten in points and other bonus monies after the program is completed. Even with only getting the five races in the series is going to pay out the full purse which was set for an eight race series, nice work by the series to pay out a full point fund when they really did not have to, this is the third year in a row they have paid the money out with the other two years at least one event not getting completed. Selinsgrove races the next two Saturday nights with super late models, limited late models and a special for the SCDRA four-cylinder class paying the winner \$2,500 to win. Then the ULMS regional super late model series will be on hand on Saturday June 28th along with the series UEMS modifieds the East Coast wingless sprints and street stocks.

After eight rain outs so far this season Clinton County had only its second full program run last Friday with one make-up feature for the Laurel Highland 305-sprint which was won by Josh Beamer in the Nittany 40- sprint car special Beamer won the \$1,000 top prize by beating Timmy Bittner, Jared Zionkowski, Jarrett Calavet and Ken Duke. The regular feature was won by Jeff Weaver over Jacob Gomola, Austin Greenland, Calavet and Mike Koehler. A total of 87 drivers in five divisions of racing were on hand for the full night of racing, with the track just getting done in time before rain was about ready to move into the area. The track still has three other divisions that will have make-up features over the next few weeks, that is for Pro-Stocks, 270-micro sprints and the tracks four-cylinder class. Garrison Zook of Middleburg scored the win in the 270-micro sprint feature, while Tommy Dawson won in the pro-stocks and Larry Beachel in the four-cylinder class.

The USAC wingless sprint will be racing at three tracks this weekend after running other shows during this past week. Friday night at Williams Grove they will have the USAC along with the 410-sprints, Saturday they will be racing at Port both USAC and 410-sprints along with the big car Silver Crown sprints. Sunday, it wraps up at Kutztown speedway along with the track wingless 600-micro-sprints. Then starting on Friday June 27th at Williams Grove the annual Pa 410-sprint car Speedweek will be racing for ten straight nights, with Saturday a Lincoln speedway on Sunday ay BAPS Motor speedway. It comes to an end on Sunday July 6th at Path Valley speedway. Also, Lincoln Speedway will have a second show Port Royal will have two shows along with Williams Grove with single events set for Grandview speedway, Hagerstown, speedway. There is a \$35,000 point fund with the mini-series champ collecting \$5,000, also if any driver can run in the top five in all ten shows they can pick up an extra \$5,000 Williams Grove second show on Friday July 4th will pay \$20,000 to win, while Lincoln speedway will pay the winner \$15,000 for there Saturday June 28th show Port Royal will do the same for the Saturday July 5th show. Baps on Sunday June 29th will pay \$12,000 to win with six other races paying \$10,000 to win a feature event.

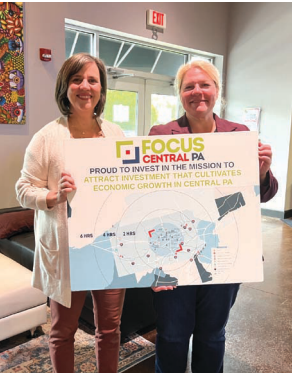
