## A River Rat's Ramblings: 1957 Spring

It's the middle of March. The river ice broke up at the end of February. Happened mid-week and I had to be in school instead of standing on the river bank, listening to old time river rats telling stories of what ice out was like when they were kids; some of them were talking of the late 1800's. Some told of helping to build coal flats in the spring, 30' long, 8' wide with the boat sides sawed from a white pine log with a 30' clear span 24" high and 2" thick. The bottom boards were 8' long, 6" to 8" wide and 1 1/2 inches thick. These boards had to be clear span also (no knots). The bottom of the boat had additional bracing as these flats were filled with coal or other freight. The river rats that helped build the flat also worked on that same flat, digging stove coal from the river in the summer months. They were paid \$1.00 a day for a 10-hour day.

The owner of the flat usually operated a coal yard and might have several flats working a coal bed. Each flat had three or four men diggin' coal all day long, seven days a week. The commercial hand digging of coal lasted until the advent of the internal combustion engines, which were used to power commercial dredging of coal on the river. It still took a handful of river rats to operate the commercial dredging of coal, but there were some that transitioned from the river to jobs over town.

In 1957, there were still three coal dredging outfits on the Isle of Que that operated from May until October or as river levels and weather conditions permitted. Most of the shoreline ice cakes have melted by now and just yesterday, I was poking around where we had dumped a wheelbarrow full of apples and found some nightcrawlers at the bottom of the pile.

I'm thinking that maybe this weekend it's time to start fishing for suckers on the river. You need to remember, in 1957, there were no bait shops to buy nightcrawlers, which means the ground needed to be warm enough to dig worms. An apple pile or a pile of leaves would usually produce enough in a week or two.

The Houseworth crew from Port Trevorton will bring their coal dredging outfit up river and set up their barges at our boat landing. Our house is one of three properties that have road access to the river; road access to the river is necessary for the dump trucks to haul the coal from the barges.

March is a goofy time of the year. Too early to take the boat out because the river is too high to scrounge good junk from the heads of the islands. It's also too high for serious fishing other than carp and suckers. Last weekend, we made dough bait and went up the canal to the wash out and fished for carp. The best part of that is not fishing but building a fire and making "Peppywood tea," which in hindsight, was God awful!

In the next 30 days Spring will be in full swing and I'll be ready for a whole new set of adventures.

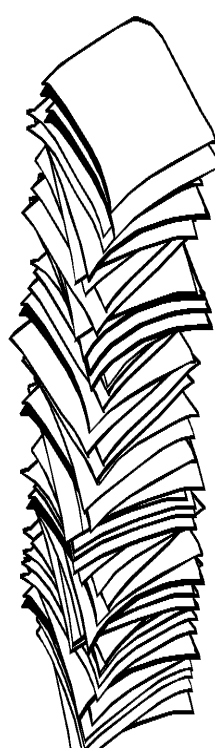

# SPORTS NEWS

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

What month is the best month for sports? I've been hearing a lot of chatter lately that March is right up there near the top. October will always be the best month perennially with baseball's post-season, the NFL and college football in full swing and the NBA and NHL starting their seasons. The high volume of diverse, high stakes games makes October premier.

April would have to be a strong but distant second with baseball games that count and playoffs in the NBA and NHL. What separates April from March is The Masters and the NFL Draft.

March is a sneaky third all due to college basketball's March Madness. College hoops has lost a bit of its luster these last few years but the NCAA tournament always delivers. Wives, daughters and co-workers all fill out a bracket and thus have a dog in the fight.

The brackets will be out a week from this Sunday. Though my bracket history isn't very good, I will give you a few thoughts on a couple teams next week. It still might be better for you by just picking winners based on their team colors or school mascot.

The college conference and national wrestling championships also put the month of March on the medal stand. The Big Ten conference championships are this weekend at Penn State.

The Nittany Lions might need the home crowd to win their 10th league title in the last fifteen years. How tough is the BIG title to win? Penn State has won twelve NCAA wrestling titles in the last fourteen years. In 2020 they were canceled due to Covid.

This year's team might be coach Sanderson's best team ever and next year they should be even better. Penn State has six #1 seeds and might have a seventh before they hit the mats. This means they will wrestle in fewer matches because of first round byes. This will allow Ohio State and Nebraska more opportunities to earn more team points in the first round.

Just a heads up, all matches will not be on The Big 10 channel. Big Ten+ will have the consolation and wrestlebacks on Saturday at 5pm and Session III at noon on Sunday.

Locally, Line Mountain had a very strong showing at the 2A regional wrestling tournament by taking the team title. Mifflinburg finished sixth and has four wrestlers going to Hershey. Middle-West finished a strong tenth and Lewisburg 13th and both schools are sending two wrestlers to States.

The Cats Bradley Wagner and Landon Tucker brought home gold medals and neither were really challenged. Ben Straub placed third and Lane Kenamond fourth to complete the state's contingent.

Middle-West will be represented by Evan Maneval with his runnerup finish and Charley Paige's third place. The L&L boys from Lewisburg, Landon Michaels and Landen Wagner both took bronze.

Selinsgrove's Alex Kadryna and Jack Peters will be in Hershey for the 3A championships. I foresee our four schools will be bringing home a total of five medals from Hershey.

Mifflinburg's Taylor Stewart is the lone girls wrestler from our schools going to States. Stewart finished fourth at 190.

Two bowlers qualified for the state tournament by finishing in the Top 12 at the East Regional singles competition in Mount Joy. Middle-West's Madison Herrold and Grove's Gabrielle Heckman will return to Leisure Lanes next week.

The Middle-West and Selinsgrove boys team qualified for the state team title as did the girls from Lewisburg, Mifflinburg and Selinsgrove. They will compete this Saturday in Lancaster.

The Lewisburg girls finished third and the Grove girls sixth at the D4 swimming championships. Morgan Shannon took first place in the 500 free and Jillian Mutchler won the 100 back for Lewisburg. The Green Dragons also won the 400 free relay with Emma Hopkinson, Claire Graver, Shannon and Mutchler.

The Mifflinburg boys finished fifth at Districts with Elliott DeLuca claiming the 100 back title. Lewisburg's Collin Shannon won the 500 free.

All of our basketball teams that played last week in Districts are still playing, all five teams have advanced to States.

Top seeded Warrior Run held off a game Mifflinburg squad 64-48 in the boys 3A district semis. Every time Miff got close to Warrior Run the Defenders went on minor runs of 6-0, 9-0 and 7-0 for breathing room. The Wildcats were led by Grady Brubaker and his 16 points.

Mifflinburg had a chance to go onto States by beating Loyalsock for third place. Miff wasted no time

in turning the page and the game was over at halftime with the Cats up 33-8. The game ended 55-25 with the mercy rule in place. Chad Martin had 14 points, Cheeky Griffith 12 and Brubaker 11. The Wildcats will travel to Riverside this Saturday to take on the D2 champs.

The Lewisburg boys jumped out early 24-9 against Mt Carmel and went on to win their D4 4A opener 58-42. Lew has had a balanced offensive attack all year and this game was no different with five players scoring at least eight points. Leaders were Nazir Meredith with 15, Re-bira Jemama 13 and Cortland Michael's 11.

The Green Dragons won the District 4 title by beating Montoursville 56-53. The Dragon defense shut down the Warriors by winning the second quarter 11-6 which was the difference in the game. Staffer Jemama had 12 points, 6 boards and 3 steals and assists. Cooper Mowry led all scorers with 19 and LJ Tucker added 11 points. Lewisburg will host Big Spring this Friday in the first round of States.

The Selinsgrove boys handled Blue Mountain in the D4/11 5A semi-finals 64-50. Xavier Jackson did it all with 31 points and 7 rebounds and dimes. Grove was draining treys all night and made 12 of 25 shots from beyond the arc. Mac DeFazio made four and totaled 14 points. The win qualified the Seals for the state tournament and it's a good thing.

You win by the three and you lose by the three. Grove made just 4 of 23 in losing to Southern Lehigh 60-44. The explosive Jackson was held to nine points and DeFazio was shutout. Jack Piecuch had 11 and Noah Walter 10 in the losing effort.

Selinsgrove will host Bonner-Prenchie this Friday. Bonner is led by junior Korey Francis. Francis is class president, straight A student and a mid-to-high major Division 1 point guard prospect. Certainly worth the price of admission in Selinsgrove.

On the girls side Parise Shuck led the Lady Cats early against Jersey Shore until she fouled out early in the fourth quarter with Miff down seven points. That's when Avery Reibsome took over the game and led Mifflinburg to the 43-41 state qualifying win. Reibsome finished with 24 points, 11 boards, 6 blocks, 5 steals and 3 dimes.

The Wildcats lost to current six time district champ Central Columbia 61-32. It was over early for the Cats when it was 23-4 after one quarter. Reibsome had a double/double with 15 and 11. The good news is that the Cats will play at Allentown Central Catholic this Saturday at 1pm in the Eastern Region.

Lewisburg also lost to the juggernaut that is Central 54-37 in the semis. The Green Dragons were up 14-10 early on only to fall behind by 10 after a Central 14-0 run. Lewisburg fought hard but couldn't get closer than ten points the rest of the way. Ava Motto and Addy Sheddleski both had 10 points.

Lewisburg beat Jersey Shore to make the PIAA tourney 50-40. Teagan Osunde had 18 points and 15 rebounds to lead the Dragons. Motto had 14 and Sheddleski 12 to help Lew move on. Lewisburg plays Penn Cambria this Saturday at 1pm at Saint Francis University in the Western Region.

I find it very interesting that Lewisburg is playing in the West region and Mifflinburg is in the East region. They could conceivably meet in the state title game! Who knew that The Purple Cow was the dividing line separating the east and west regions?

This is also the first year ever that Union County has four basketball teams playing in the PIAA state tournament.

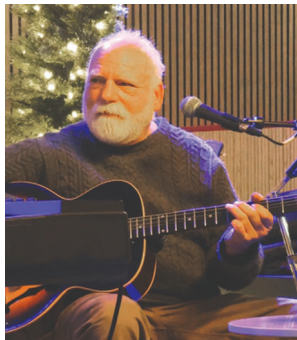
