Selinsgrove, PA - For the first time since July of last year, the 410 sprint cars made their return to the Snyder County Half Mile. York's Chase Dietz scored his second career 410 win at Selinsgrove in the Ray Tilley Classic presented by Icon Legacy Modular Homes. In yet another fantastic race, Lewisberry's Logan Spahr picked up his 5th career win at Selinsgrove in the Keller's Auto Body PA Sprint Series 305 Sprint Car feature.

15 410 Sprint Cars signed in for the 2025 edition of the Ray Tilley Classic, honoring the life of the winning-est driver of what is now the 410 Sprint Car division at Selinsgrove with 69 career wins coming from 1963 to 1969. Tilley passed away in 2011 and since 2012, the Ray Tilley Classic has been an early season staple at the speedway, this year being ran on what would have been Ray's 91st birthday.

It looked like Jake Karklin from Beaver Springs would be winning his first ever 410 feature event as he had a huge lead over Chase Dietz and Danny Dietrich. Then that dreadful yellow flag came out and Chase Dietz was able to pass Jake after his car fluttered on the re-start. Jake actually was passed by Danny Detrich too, but was able to pass him at the finish line for 2nd for his best ever

410 finish. "I didn't want the cautions and I wish I cleaned the motor out," Karklin said on the podium. "

For the second week in a row, the River Valley Builders PA Sprint Series feature at Selinsgrove Speedway came down to a duel between Logan Spahr of Lewisberry and Kruz Kepner of Kreamer. Last week, Kepner got to visit victory lane; this week, Spahr earned the trip

The 2023 PASS champion, Spahr battled the "hometown" racer through the middle circuits of the 20-lap event before pulling off the decisive pass for the lead on the backstretch of lap 14, just before the leaders hit lapped traffic. Another hometown driver, Ken Duke Jr., Winfield completed an impressive run to the front, coming from 11th starting position to take third from Kenny Heffner of Watsontown on the last lap. That per-formance earned the defending PASS champion the Len Krautheim Auto Parts Hard Charger Award for the best

"charge" through the field during the race. PASS races at Selinsgrove are sponsored by Keller & Sons Auto Body.

Spahr while in High Caliber Cranes Victory lane said, "I want to give hats off to Selinsgrove. This is the best this place has been two weeks in a row in a long time. Racing at a track you can start sixth at and win. I knew I was going to be good on the bottom. So, I just gave Kepner a little time and waited till he washed up through the middle. Found a good line of moisture and it slingshot me off of two to get around him.

410-Sprints had a Big Weekend at Four Area Tracks More this Weekend at Port Royal

The Ray Tilley Classic was held Saturday night at Selinsgrove speedway for the driver that has the most overall wins in the sprint car division at Selinsgrove. The event drew a small field of drivers, but the racing was huge on the fast 1/2 -mile track. With Williams Grove raining out again, the ninth time this year, you would think more drivers would have made the trip north to race at Selinsgrove, only one did and that was Australian driver Ryan Newton. The race was good up front with Middleburg, PA driver Jake Karklin leading most of the race until a late race caution when Chase Dietz moved passed him on the restart. Danny Dietrich also got past Jake, but Jake got him back late in the race for a solid, second place finish. Gerard Mc-Intyre was fourth and Austin Bishop fifth. In the 305 feature, Logan Spahr got the win over Kruz Kepner. It seems these two have been competing all season at Selinsgrove. In three races, Kepner had two wins and Spahr one. Selinsgrove will take off this weekend before coming back with a show of super late models, limited late models and the newly named street stock class on Saturday, May 31st.

Saturday the 410-sprint had two tracks to race at Port Royal and Lincoln with Freddie Rahmer getting his second Lincoln Speedway win over Chase Dietz, Matt Campbell, Aaron Bollinger and Kyle Moody. At Port Royal, three High Limit series drivers showed up after their race at Utica-Rome Speedway, in New York, was rained out. The three made the five-hour drive to get to Port, what added to them was Port had a rain delay to start their night also. Tyler Courtney, Aaron Reutzel and Brent Marks all placed in the top ten with Courtney fifth, Marks eight and Reutzel ninth, with the win going to Anthony Macri. Macri made a front tire wheel win over Garret Bard who had his best 410-sprint race at Port so far in his career. Bard first held off the challenges of Danny Dietrich, but in the end, Macri made the winning pass coming down the front chute for his second win at Port this year and seventh overall win of the season

In super late model action, Andrew Yoder of Middleburg PA scored his first ever super late model win at Port Royal leading all the way in the non-stop 25-lap feature. Andrew, who does have three other super late model wins, but noted that with the competition that races at Port regularly, "it was a special win with most of the top name drivers on hand". Justin Weaver was second, with points leader Rick Eckert third, Gene Knaub and Colton Flinner. Rain came back to the track and wiped out the Winged Sportsman fea-

Sunday night at BAPS speedway, Troy Wagaman scored the 410-sprint feature win over Danny Dietrich, Anthony Macri, Chase Dietz and Freddie Rahmer. Another High Limit series driver, Spencer Bayston, placed seventh in the feature. It was a big weekend for the 305-sprints with a three-race mini-series at three different tracks starting off at Selinsgrove speedway on Friday and Hagerstown and BAPS Saturday and Sunday. Kreamer PA's driver Kruz Kepner picked up the most points with second at Selinsgrove, sixth at Hagerstown and third at BAPS winning an extra \$750 for his weekend effort. The series had three different winners: Spahr on Friday, Kenny Heffner on Saturday and Landon Price on Sunday. The series had an average car count of 31 drivers. Drivers in the 410-ranks that had a good weekend Danny Dietrich with two third place runs and a second, Chase Dietz a win and a third and fourth Anthony Macri two races a win and a third Freddie Rahmer a win and a fifth-place finish.

The WOO super late model series was in the region with WOO driver Tim McCreadie winning two races at Raceway -7 in OHIO and at Bedford Speedway on Sunday night. On Saturday WOO regular Bobby Pierce scored the win at Marion Center speedway over Nick Hoffman, Ryan Gustin and Brian Shirley. McCredie wins came over Ashton Winger Shirley, Drake Troutman on Thursday and Bobby Pierce, Dustin Sorenson and Ryan Gustin. Gregg Satterlee, of Indiana PA, had a 9th place finish on Saturday while Mason Zeigler of Chalk Hill PA had a 9th place finish on Sunday, and a tenth placed finish on Saturday.

This weekend is the big three-day show at Port Royal for the High Limit sprint car series with racing Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Friday and Saturday winner collects \$10,000 top prize while the Sunday winner collects \$75,000. Last year, Danny Dietrich scored the Weikert Memorial win beating the traveling series. The limited late models have two shows on Friday and Saturday for \$1,500 and \$2,000 to win races. Lincoln speedway will have 410- sprint car racing on Saturday night in the Bob Leiby memorial, while Williams Grove on Friday will honor the Esh racing family with a special night on Friday, paying \$8,000 to win, along with a program of the PASS 305-sprints will be on hand. Friday night at Clinton County speedway will be the makeup Laurel Highlands 305-sprints series Nittany 40 paying \$1,000 to win. The feature was rained out after all qualifying was completed on Friday May 9th, another program for the 305-sprints will also be run along with Pro-Stocks 270-Micro sprints and four-cylinders.

The six game losing streak before ending the season beating Loyalsock doomed the Miff baseball team. The last three losses were very hurtful as Lewisburg, Midd-West and Warrior Run were all winnable games. Those losses kept Mifflinburg (7-11) from making the playoffs.

Grove girls lost to Shik 15-13 despite 18 hits but only three were doubles. Sadie Bigger continued her raking going 4 for 4 with 2 runs and 2 ribs. They ended their season (4-16) losing 12-2 to Williamsport. Expect improvement next year with a bunch of talented ninth and tenth graders coming back with experience. A wise old coach once said "The best thing about freshmen is they become sophomores."

Grove boys also finished their year at 4-16 losing to Milton 3-2. Griffin Parker did what he could striking out seven and getting two knocks. 

Upcoming Tours of the Dale-Engle-Walker House

The Dale-Engle-Walker House will be open for tours throughout the summer. The c. 1793 limestone house presents the story of Ulster-Scot immigrant Samuel Dale (1741-1804), his family and tenant farmers, Jacob and Maude Engle's farm and dairy of the 1930s and 40s, and Charles and Rosemary Walker.

The Dale housewas built c. 1793 by immigrant Samuel Dale (1741-1804); the back ell was added between 1820 and 1840. The ell is the back, perpendicular addition to the original house, with the roof sloping down toward the porch and three windows (on the second floor). There are doors into each section. The Victorian porch was addedin the late 1800s.

The original house is a symmetrical building: two rooms flank a central hall, with front windows and a side-walled chimney and mantled fireplace. Architectural highlights include the front door and fan light with original glass; first floor twelve-over-twelve windows and second floor eight-over-twelve windows; original chestnut and pine floors; the early kitchen and hearth. The stonework is laid in an un-coursed, roughly squared pattern with larger stones at the corners.

The property stayed in the Dale family until 1929 and was worked by tenant farmers for many years. It was sold

to the Engles, who operated a dairy and vegetable farm in the 1930s and '40s. Their milk shed is on the lane below the house. The property was purchased by the Walkers as a private residence and farm, and then bequeathed by the Walker estate to the Union County
