The Public Library for Union County hosted their 35th Annual “An Evening Among the Stacks: Annual Auction and Social” on September 20. The event offered a special opportunity to see how the fundraising donations will benefit the library.

The sidewalk was lined by signs acknowledging the Silver and Bronze sponsors. Tech savvy volunteers assisted attendees with downloading the app for the event and explaining the new bidding format. Becky Perez, Secretary of the Library Board of Trustees, and Diane Meixell, past board member, warmly greeted guests. Attendees were quickly and efficiently registered. The 35th Annual Auction was a successful event with over 180 people attending the benefit.

“I am really excited to be here to support the auction,” said Janice Butler. “The library provides such a vital service in our community.”

A festive atmosphere permeated the library as guests chatted with one another, admired the vast array of Silent and Live auction items, and munched on appetizers, desserts, and other scrumptious items provided by Eat & Run Catering from Williamsport.

idea,” explained Larry Means. “I thought it would just be a \$100 donation to the library.” He was pleasantly surprised.

Prior to the Live Auction, Sharon Koppel, Board President, welcomed guests and encouraged them to “Bid High and Bid Often” to support the library. She also asked the crowd to offer personal thanks to local businesses for their important donations. Don Adams read the description of each Live Auction item with a smooth, rich voice. Auctioneer Neil Courtney kept the crowd engaged. There were some heated bidding wars and ripples of applause for high bids. He encouraged the crowd with comments such as “Keep bidding and I’ll tell when you paid too much,” “Let make it an even \$700” and “It doesn’t cost you anything unless you’re the last bid.”

The Live Auction featured Paddles Up to support the library with a generous contribution to support programs, collections, and library operations. Throughout the auction three different appeals were announced. Keep the Lights On – bidders held up their paddles to give a \$100 donation to keep the library doors open and the space welcoming. Celebrate the Joy of Reading- bidders raised their paddles to give a \$75 donation to grow the library’s collection and spread the love of books throughout the community. Support Lifelong Learning- bidders held up their paddles to donate \$50 to spark programs that inspire learners of all ages.

“I think that the outreach that is accomplished by this library is absolutely phenomenal... Outreach to all kinds of people that I see coming through these library doors. There is all kinds of cultural diversity,” said Leona Martin.

There are a wide variety of large print books, newspapers, DVD’s, ebooks, emagazines, eaudiobooks, public computers, and laptop work stations. The double-sided fireplace provides a cozy spot for reading or conversations. The library provides opportunities for patrons to explore books and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) related topics. The Exploratorium allows for many creative projects for young learners. The interactive play area is used for programs, story hour, and as a place to foster early literacy. There is internet access for WiFi hotspots, assistance for patrons to learn basic computer skills, and outreach visits to homebound patrons.

The Public Library for Union County in Lewisburg is part of the Union County Library Systems consisting of Herr Memorial Library in Mifflinburg and the West End Library in Laurelton. Each library is governed by a Board of Trustees that is responsible for that library’s budget, building, collection, programs, staffing, and fundraising efforts. The library’s executive director is Toby Schwartzman who, along with several staff, played an important role in auction planning, tech training, and event management.

Fatal Crash 6:33 p.m. September 17, on Trutt Street, north of Yordy Circle, in Union Township. A 2017 Harley-Davidson Ultra Limited driven by Craig A. Derk, 65, of Winfield, was traveling north on Trutt Road. Two entered the roadway from the east berm in front of the motorcycle. Derk could not avoid the deer and the front of his motorcycle struck the deer. After the initial point of impact, Derk lost control causing the motorcycle to lay down on its left side. The motorcycle slid down the roadway in a northeast direction coming to its final resting position on its left side facing south. Derk was thrown north from the motorcycle and came to rest in the middle of the roadway. Fatal injury.

A horse entered the roadway from the south berm of SR 304 and struck the front of the Toyota Rav4. After the initial impact, the horse continued traveling north. The Toyota Rav4 exited the roadway via the north berm and came to rest off the roadway facing east.

Crash 8:15 p.m. September 15, on Old Turnpike Road (SR 45), east of Martin Drive, in West Buffalo Township. A 2007 Ford Taurus driven by Jonathan Florez, 33, of Mifflinburg, was traveling east on SR 45. There were two vehicle stopped in the eastbound lane of SR 45 for deer crossing the roadway. Florez failed to slow down and struck the rear of a 2025 Dodge Durango driven by Jonathan T. Paine, 70, of Indian Harbour Beach, FL, which was stationary. The Ford Taurus came to rest in the travel of SR 45 facing southeast. The Dodge Durango drove to the south shoulder of SR 45 after being struck. Minor injury reported. Forez was issued a warning for following too closely.

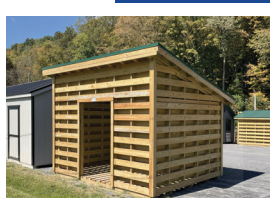

Owen Dimm of Mifflintown won the River Valley Builders RaceSaver Sprint Cars. AJ Hoffner of East Berlin won the 4-Cylinder feature event.

Dylan Yoder of Middleburg and Trever Feathers brought the full field of Super Late Models to the green flag for the start of the 40-lap Fall Clash. A multi-car incident in turn numbers one and two slowed the field once again on lap number 21. Feathers was quick on the gas with Yoder and Ziegler in tow. Two laps later, mechanical issues slowed the second-place car of Yoder forcing him to take his car to the pit area.

The leaders worked their way through lapped traffic with Feathers leading Ziegler and Cecee. A lap 30 caution slowed the field one final time and gave Feathers an open track while Ziegler, Cecee, Bernheisel and Robinson rounded out the top five. Feathers led the final 10 laps to claim the win over Ziegler, Cecee, Bernheisel and Robinson.

John Walp and Owen Dimm led the field of RaceSaver Sprint cars for the start of their 30-lap main event. Dimm took the lead at the drop of the green flag. Walter, Duke and Satterlee and Eckert Split Super Late Model Twin Twenties at Selinsgrove Speedway

With only 2 races left after Friday's action, it means the end of the crown jewels for season at Selinsgrove. One of them returned as the United Racing Club held the 22nd annual 360 National Open with Selinsgrove's Michael Walter II taking his first 360 win since 2019 at Selinsgrove. Meanwhile Indiana, PA Gregg Satterlee would score his third Selinsgrove Ford Super Late Model win of the season in the first Twin 20. Meanwhile current Selinsgrove Ford Super Late Model Points leader, York's Rick Eckert would also score his 3rd to inch ever so closer to the points title. Speaking of points battles. Selinsgrove's Ken Duke would take his second Keller Auto Body PA Sprint Series 305 Sprint Car win of 2025 at Selinsgrove with one race remaining sitting 2nd in Points.

14 URC Sprint Cars signed in for their 77th race at the Snyder County half mile. Walter and Mertztown, PA's Josh Weller shared the front row for the first running of the 360 National Open since 2022. Selinsgrove's Walter would take the initial lead over Weller. Walter would begin the beating from there. Out to a quick 2.5 second lead in the opening laps. Walter's lead would be nearly 6.6 seconds and that was all she wrote as Walter would become the 294th different winner in URC history winning the 2025 Selinsgrove 360 National Open

"I have a lot of laps here. Moving up to 410's makes driving this thing like driving Grandma's Cadillac." Walter II said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. "I had to run the heck out of it so they couldn't get underneath me or pass me.

20 Selinsgrove Ford Super Late Models signed in for twin 20 lap features. It started with a three wide battle for the lead with Yoder, Jones, and Beavertown's Hayes Mat-

tern fighting for the top spot. Yoder would win the battle. Satterlee would throw everything but the kitchen sink to get around Feather's. We would finally do so and the chase was on for Satterlee to chase down Yoder. Satterlee would make a charge on Yoder. Yoder was ready for it and Satterlee couldn't make it happen yet. Coming to the white flag, Yoder would get around the lap car of Trevitz. So would Satterlee. Satterlee would get a run down the back straight away pulling the slider in three and four. Satterlee would take the top line away. Yoder couldn't hold him off as Gregg Satterlee scored his 8th career Selinsgrove Ford Super Late Model Feature win by .391.

"I knew I was running out of time." Satterlee said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. "Yoder was keeping himself in a really good position with the lap cars. When I caught him, I could get around him at first. If he would have come back to me on the bottom. I wouldn't have been surprised. I sent my car deep. I knew if I could get in front of him, it was my only shot"

In the second super late model race Eckert would get to the lead and get out in a hurry. Eckert would get out to an almost four second lead at one point. Before lap traffic became a factor. Meanwhile, Andrew Yoder, Rine, Jones and Mattern were putting on a show behind the "dork from York." As the bottom started to clean off, Yoder would start to search around as lap traffic became a factor. Rine would follow Yoder to the high side to get through lap traffic. Rine would miss his line allowing Jones to get around him. Rick Eckert would get his 15th career Selinsgrove Ford Super Late Model win over Middleburg's Andrew Yoder.

"We've changed everything on this car." Eckert said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. "I got to thank Gregg for drawing the 8th. I was terrible in that first race. Starting on a pole is always a big advantage. We've been okay lately but man did we need this one."

26 Keller's Auto Body PA Sprint Series 305 signed in for racing action on Friday night. Turbotsville's Josh Braim and Thompsontown's Jason Roush shared the front row Duke would take the early lead from his third starting spot around Roush and Braim. Briam would get a run on Duke. But Duke was so much better in three and four and start to put distance between himself and the field. Braim would have to hold off the charge from Spahr, Kreamer's Kruz Kepner, and Watson-town's Kenny Heffner. Just as the battle was getting good.

Duke would use the clean air to his advantage to get out to a quick second a half lead. Spahr would get around Briam for the second spot. Kepner would follow not too far behind. Kepner would then get around Spahr on the final lap. Meanwhile Ken Duke Jr. Would dominate winning his 9th career Keller's Auto Body PASS 305 feature at Selinsgrove. One win behind Garrett Bard for the most all time.

"Last week I thought we were in a good spot to get a win before our tires sealed over" Duke said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. "We thrashed on the call all week to get a little bit better. This thing was a hot rod from the start. I tried to give Briam enough room to get by him. Once we got out front, I knew we were in good shape."

of the season, and his 8th overall. Satterlee beat Yoder by 0.391 seconds with Trevor Feathers of Winchester VA third, then Jeff Rine and Hayes Mattern. On September 10, 2025, Journey to Justice presented their first Outreach Beneficiary Donation to The Manor at Penn Village. The Manor received 10 dementia-friendly digital calendar dayclocks. Funding for a future show by Kj Reimensnyder-Wagner, a local musician, will be provided for all of the residents as music provides a connection to their memories. The group will be purchasing individual music boxes for residents, programmable by musical preference, with one touch for easy, independent use for dementia

residents.

"We are incredibly grateful to Journey to Justice for their generous donation of dementia clocks to The Manor at Penn Village. These clocks will make a meaningful difference in the daily lives of our residents living with dementia by helping reduce confusion and anxiety," said Chris BowesNHA, PCHA, SHRM-CP, Executive Director atThe Manor at Penn Village.

Journey to Justice is a grassroots movement that grew from the horrific elder abuse of 17 individuals at Heritage Springs Memory Care facility in Lewisburg in 2023. The

group was organized after realizing the lack of protections and the injustices of current state laws.

Lynn Fiedler's mother, Alice Longenberger, was one of the abuse victims. Lynn Fiedler created Journey to Justice to honor her mother, Alice Longenberger and the other 16 victims. "My parents taught me to stand up for what is right and to use my voice to advocate for justice. With one voice you can make a difference. You can take something horrific and turn it into something that does good for people and improves the condition of the human experience and this world."

Journey to Justice is Lynn Fiedler's voice with an army of volunteers dedicated to spreading awareness about elder abuse, advocating for elders, and making a difference in elder care. The mission of Journey to Justice "is to facilitate the protection of older adults who lack the capacity to protect themselves and may be at risk of abuse, neglect, exploitation, or abandonment."

In addition to the Journey to Justice board and team, staff, residents, elected officials, and supporters gathered for the presentation. Several people spoke during the event.

Journey to Justice has been working closely with Senator Lynda Culver to address the need for legislative change regarding elder care and abuse. Sen. Lynda Schlegel Culver was in session for the presentation, so Terri Campbell, District Director, gave remarks on her behalf. "Senator Culver first met Lynn Fiedler, the founder of Journey to Justice, during a deeply personal and difficult time in Lynn's life; an experience no family should ever have to endure. That time sparked a powerful connection and a shared commitment to change."

Campbell continued, "Senator Culver has been working alongside Lynn, Journey for Justice, and other legislators to explore future legislation that will help prevent similar tragedies and protect our most vulnerable citizens... We look forward to seeing this program grow and touch many more lives in the months and years ahead."

Kim Rigel, Treasurer of Journey to Justice, said, "I have been with Lynn since first learning about the horrific abuse that took place at the Lewisburg facility. Her story was the catalyst to do better for older adults," said Kim Rigel. "In 1979, I was an RN when I started at Penn Manor. Within the first month I witnessed my first incident of abuse. It fueled my passion to be an advocate for the elderly and those unable to speak for themselves." She continued, "We don't know what the future holds for our family, our parents, and ourselves."

Snyder County Commissioner Chuck Steininger thanked Lynn for being the pebble to start the ripple of change.

"It doesn't go unnoticed... We should all be aware that love and care are what we need to give and return that to those who have been there for so many years."

Kj Reimensnyder-Wagner then performed a song that she wrote specifically for Journey to Justice entitled "I Am Here." In one verse, Kj sang, "I am here...so treat me with respect/Don't let others cause neglect in who I am/I am here...protect me if you can/Cause I just don't understand when someone's mean."

Journey to Justice recognizes the vital importance

of education and training and has created two curriculums to address this need. They offer a training designed specifically for healthcare professionals and another for the general public interested in learning more about dementia and navigating the murky areas it often entails.

"Lynn and her whole team are amazing and have already made such an impact on our staff through their elder abuse training. Their training is something all facilities should look into doing. You leave feeling emotional and being able to see how it affects not only the resident but also their family and friends. It gives you motivation to be the best caregiver you can be!" said Lindsey Starnier, CDP, Director of Sales and Marketing, The Manor at Penn Village.

Another branch of Journey to Justice's work involves their Outreach Beneficiary Program providing items to facilities to make the lives of the older population happier and safer. That was the purpose of the Journey to Justice's Outreach Beneficiary Donation to The Manor after conducting several training sessions with staff.

Funding for the Outreach Beneficiary Program come from sales of Journey to Justice t-shirts, bracelets, pinwheels, and donations big and small. "Every penny goes back into programs to make elder lives better. Training sessions for staff fuel motivation to provide top-quality care. Further collaborations help to improve the lives of older adults," said Fiedler.

"We are so honored to be their first beneficiary and receive 10 digital clocks to share with our residents with dementia as well as a performance by Kj," said Lindsey Starnier. "We are thrilled to be able to support Journey to Justice as well as having their support for our facility. We are eager to watch them grow and work with them to support residents with dementia at other facilities."

"Journey to Justice's commitment to dementia and elder abuse education aligns beautifully with our mission to provide compassionate, person-centered care. We're proud to partner with an organization that is making such a powerful impact in our community," said Chris Bowes.

Cabinetworks in Mifflinburg Shutting Plant in December

Approximately 200 employees will be impacted when Cabinetworks Group in Mifflinburg closes its manufacturing plant on December 5. The news shocked employees who were and still are operating three shifts a day. Cabinetworks Group, a privately-held company, is one of the largest kitchen and bath cabinet manufacturers in the United States with 6,000 employees in 19 locations, including 15 manufacturing facilities.

The WARN notice (A Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification) was announced on September 17, 2025. Signed by Debbie LaPinska, chief people officer, Cabinetworks Group. The notification states, “I am writing on behalf of ACPI Wood Products LLC (Cabinetworks) to inform you that there will be a total, permanent closure of Cabinetworks facility at 100 Industrial Park Road, Mifflinburg, effective Dec. 5.

“At this time, Cabinetworks anticipates most of the separations will occur on Dec. 5. A small number of employees may be asked to continue until March 31, 2026, to assist in winding down the facility and to ensure a safe shutdown of the plant. Unless you are specifically informed otherwise in a separate writing by the company, your employment will conclude on Dec. 5, 2025.

“All employees at the plant will be impacted, and no bumping rights exist.”

Many employees reached out to Tea Jay Aikey, President and CEO of the Central Pennsylvania Chamber of Commerce, shortly after the notice was posted. “I used to work there when it was Yorktowne and went through it.” Even though Cabinetworks Group is not a member of the Central PA Chamber, the organization is stepping up to help.

Aikey immediately sprang into action setting up resources for new employment for workers. She is working to match employers with employees with those skills. “I am making employers aware that there is a great pool of employees available.”

In addition to manufacturing skills, hands-on factory experience, equipment operators, and woodworking experience, there are also other workers that will be impacted such as electricians, maintenance mechanics, front office staff, and managers. She is offering to make connections so workers can transition into other job opportunities.

Many employers have reached out to Aikey. As of September 19, Aikey began working with the HR department at Cabinetworks in Mifflinburg to assist displaced employees with employment. Sen. John Fetterman’s office also reached out to Aikey to offer their services.

Mifflinburg Mayor Cooney posted on Facebook, “Get ready to be a helper. This is going to hit hard in our little community. But just like we did back in 2020 when businesses were shut down, we will band together, help each other and get through this. Please remember, we’re all in

this together.”

“Business closures such as Cabinetworks are always difficult and particularly tough on the employees and their families. Our primary focus and concerns are for these employees. The Greater Susquehanna Valley Chamber of Commerce (GSVCC) works closely with local organizations to make sure that our safety net is strong and well stocked, so that upcoming transitions are as pain free as possible,” said Bob Garret, President & CEO-Greater Susquehanna Valley Chamber of Commerce.

“The (GSVCC) Chamber’s role is to serve as a convener. In other words, while we don’t provide direct services, we are well positioned to make sure that needed services are available and ready when the time comes,” explained Garret. “This includes everything from fresh, nutritious food so that no one ends up hungry because of a work stoppage to worker re-training programs. Former Cabinetworks employees will be highly sought after. Here again, we are positioned to make sure that employment services are at the ready, as needed.”

The plant closing will impact the Mifflinburg community. Cabinetworks is one of the flagship manufacturing plants in the town. According to Aikey, in addition to the employees, small businesses will also be affected by a lack of those commuters traveling through the borough. It will also impact the tax base. Bob Garret also noted, “Cabinetworks is a key agri-business, in particular timber and the hardwoods, that are so prevalent in our valley. Because of this, the impact is magnified.”

Garret explained the role of the GSVCC during this stressful time. “When a business closure is announced, your Chamber’s immediate concern is with the workers whose jobs are being lost and the families whose livelihoods are directly impacted. We work closely with our partners to connect displaced employees to resources, training, and opportunities to help them navigate this difficult transition.”

Garret further explained their ongoing role, “At the same time, we remain committed to the long-term vitality of our region. Our focus quickly turns to recruiting and welcoming new businesses into the vacant space, ensuring that the craftsmanship, tradition, and economic strength of our Valley continue to thrive. By caring for people first, and planning for future investment, the Chamber strives to keep our communities strong and resilient.”
