

High School students from Midd-West, Shikellamy, Selinsgrove, Danville, and Warrior Run school district, serving as youth grant-makers through the Central Susquehanna Community Foundation's (CSCF) Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) program, met at the Regional Engagement Center recently to discuss their needs assessment surveys that they conducted in their schools and communities. To apply for a grant, the students will be accepting letters of interest

online now through March 6, 2020.

High School students from Midd-West, Shikellamy, Selinsgrove, Danville, and Warrior Run school districts are serving as youth grant-makers through the Central Susquehanna Community Foundation's (CSCF) Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) program. This year, more than 150 students from eleven school districts are participating in the program. Each school district group has the responsibility of granting up to \$5,000 to youth-related projects. The funding was provided through a variety of funding sources including donations from established funds at CSCF and individual donors.

YIP make philanthropic values, principles and traditions come alive for young people and communities. The goal of the program is to provide meaningful engagement in the workings of the CSCF and to encourage interest and understanding of philanthropy. In addition, the students provide valuable input on the needs of youth, a perspective that is helpful to CSCF.

Throughout the school year, students develop a set of funding priorities determined through needs assessment surveys that they conducted in their schools and communities. Students use the information collected to review and vote on grant applications.

The students met at the Regional Engagement Center recently to discuss their needs assessment surveys that they conducted in their schools and communities. This information will be used to review and vote on grant applications. To apply for a grant, the students will be accepting letters of interest online now through March 6, 2020. Following the letter of interest, some applicants will be selected to participate in short interviews conducted by the students.

Decisions will be announced via email on March 31, 2020. Information on each school's target areas for grant-making can be found at www.csgiving.org, click "partners" and then click "Youth in Philanthropy". If an organization wishes to apply to more than one school, a separate letter of interest will need to be submitted for each.

The CSCF invests charitable funds to benefit Snyder, Union, Northumberland, lower Luzerne, Columbia, and Montour counties. In order to be eligible to receive a grant from the Foundation, an organization must hold a 501(c)3 nonprofit status or be a governmental organization. 

Youth In Philanthropy Grant Walk It! Bike It! Public Program

"Bicycle Wonderland, USA" Public Program will be held Tuesday, March 3rd at 7pm at the Public Library for Union

The third Walk It Bike It public program for the year will discuss bicycle infrastructure best practices using Minneapolis, MN as a case study. The program slides and video are from a tour organized last summer by Bicycle South Central PA for planners and advocates.

It is a good complement to the first program of the year on the recently adopted Middle Susquehanna Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. That plan will guide planning and improvements in the valley in years to come. This program will show concrete examples of what that might look like and address the kinds of policies needed to make it happen. The plan and all supporting documents are available on the SEDA-COG website here: bit. ly/MSBikePedPlan

This event is part of a series of programs developed in response to public input suggesting Walk It Bike It appeal more to general public interest as opposed to inviting the public to attend the committee's business meetings. This and future public programs are primarily informational and afford time for questions and discussion. The final meeting for this season, in April, will be on the new interscholastic competitive mountain bike teams operating in the area. After that, the group will shift from indoor programs to easy group rides, meeting at Earl's Bicycle Store, beginning on Tuesday, May 5, also at 7pm.

Dear Editor,

In 2018 Pennsylvania had the highest rate of early death from combustion-related air pollution (ozone and fine airborne particles) in America. More of these early deaths were due to air pollution produced in Pennsylvania than from pollution arriving from other states.

So why are our legislators subsidizing methane to-plastic factories that will negatively impact the health of Pennsylvanians and cause more combustion-related deaths?

Royal Dutch Shell, one of the wealthiest corporations in the world, was given a tax break of \$1.6 billion over 25 years to build its Beaver County facility. Each job will be subsidized by \$2.7 million of taxpayers' money. The PA House has passed HB1100, part of Energize PA. The PA Department of Revenue estimates the tax credit in HB1100 is worth an average of \$2.2 million annually per new petrochemical facility.

The PA Senate has not yet passed its version of this bill, SB 866. Please tell your senator and Governor Wolf you do not want your tax money used to subsidize these rich corporations, especially at the expense of public health of Pennsylvanians. Is \$2.7 million per job worth it? We already are dying early from combustion-related deaths more than any other state in the nation. How does this attract young families to move to Pennsylvania and help create a vibrant economy for the future?

in a clinic, doctor's office, or hospital outpatient setting. Some common examples of Medicare Part B drugs are medications used in a nebu-

lizer, chemotherapy, Insulin that is used in (Insulin pumps only), immunosuppressant drugs, certain oral anti-cancer drugs, most intravenous infusions, some bone density infusions, and of course immunizations, like the pneumococcal vaccine and the influ-You pay 20% of the Medicare-approved amount for these covered drugs, and the

Medicare Part B deductible applies. A standard Medicare Supplement or Medigap plan will pick up that 20% payment.

A Medicare Advantage plan or Part C requires you to pay that 20%. Medicare Advantage plans do have a cap on annual medical expenses, typically in the \$3,400 to \$6,700 range.

The program also uses edge, industry standard state of the art law enforcement equipment to create real equipment. SUN Tech students can earn certifications

"In the Criminal Justice program, students not only receive classroom instruction but hands-on experience with current criminal justice employees in the tri-county area," explains instructor, Kale Geiswite.

The class focuses on law enforcement skills such as Area Technical Institute traffic stops and handcuffing to corrections where "we opened its doors and offered discuss cell searches and inmate transport" adds Geiswithe opportunity to explore te. Other instruction highlights courtroom procedures three classroom settings: and legal knowledge regarding PA laws. Oscar Machorro of Selinsgrove and Gary Degroat of

Mifflinburg were conducting a search of an inmate cell ogy, and Criminal Justice as looking for unauthorized contraband that Geiswite had part of Career and Technical hidden in the cell. > Another of the 19 programs offered at SUN Tech, is Electrical Systems Technology. Electrical Systems Technology students gain hands-on experience in developing electrical skills used in residential, commercial, and industrial installation, design and repair. Students can pursue a career as an electrician's helper, residential wireman, construction electrician, automation tech, and appliance repairman.

'There are a lot of opportunities for employment for skills to start students on students completing the program," explains instructor Van Reichelderfer. "We learn house wiring, electrical codes, motor controls, and study 3-phase power and 3-phase transformers."

Co-op opportunities with local employers such as Thermal Product Solutions (TPS) in New Columbia and contractors SRS Electric in Hummels Wharf are also available. The local unions have been visiting the program to encourage perspective employees to apply. Reichelderfer says, "Probably, the best opportunity for students would be to work for one of the three local electrical unions."

Some students plan to further their education by atexplains Destiny Walter, a Midd-West student. "I enjoy tending the Georgia Lineman School or Thaddeus Ste-

nology. Jonathan Aurand of Selinsgrove is one of those students planning to attend Lineman School in Georgia. "I like doing electrical work. There is a new challenge every day. We have to figure out how things work and learn how

to troubleshoot problems."

"The average age of an electrician is 56 years old," notes Reichelderfer. "So, in the upcoming years there will be a lot of retirements and that means a lot of jobs will need to be filled!"

"Jobs paying family sustaining wages can be difficult for youth to find, but with a technical education students can earn high wages and a great jump start on a career," says Hain.

Thomas Boyer, Workforce Development Coordination at SUN Tech, agrees. "You don't need to go to college to find a successful career and earn life-sustaining wages."

In addition to the students who want immediate employment after a year at SUN Tech, others are using their experience as a stepping-stone into higher education. Many students earn college credits that are transferable to a variety of state universities. Today's technical students have the advantage of being both college and ca-
