Adult Daily Living Center Closes

Union and Snyder Agency on Aging can no longer afford to provide an adult daily living center at the Penns Creek Adult Resource Center. The program, which was started in 2006, could support up to 14 clients on Monday, Wednes-day and Friday for 5¹/₂ hours, to allow caregivers a respite and to help clients remain in their home and maintain their level of physical and cognitive function. Eight clients with

Alzheimer's or dementia took part in the adult daily living center before its doors closed on December 30, 2011. The closest adult daily living center is in Shamokin.

Even though the program has been shut down, no one was displaced and all continue to receive services such as care in their homes and some are participating in the Shamokin program.

Fire Hurts! **Red Cross Helps**

South Central Pennsylvania consider January and Febru-ary "Fire Hurts" season, due to the large numbers of fires during the typically cold winter months. Despite this year's unusually mild winter, records are being set for numbers of house fires occurring. It is thought that even when the winter is mild it is still cold at night and people are not being as careful as they might be when using small appliance heating sources and still not using caution while cooking. Kitchen or grease fires occur in a second. The Red Cross urges people to never leave the kitchen while cooking, not even for a moment and especially when deep frying food.

During the twenty days from January 20 through February 7, volunteers with the American Red Cross responded to and assisted 135 people in 24 separate incidents. Of these incidences, 23 were from home fires, the remaining incident was a gas leak.

On February 7, an early morning fire, displaced nine families; 26 people. The homes were destroyed and the Red Cross is assisting with immediate needs for food, clothing and shelter, and is working with each individual family to help them onto the path of recovery.

In every response, the Red Cross was on hand to provide a shoulder to lean on and in-

Red Cross units serving the needs caused by the fire. Outreach and referrals are made, along with support and guidance to those affected.

South Central Pennsylvanians are asked to check their smoke detectors, review fire safety plans with their fam-ily members, have heating equipment inspected and take extreme caution while using alternative heating sources, including space heaters and wood stoves and fireplaces. 

PennDOT, State Police Remind Drivers to 'Steer Clear' of Emergency Responders

PennDOT and the Pennsylvania State Police are reminding motorist to obey the Steer Clear law and keep emergency responders' safety in mind when traveling near incidents. Police are conducting periodic operations, enforcing this law on Route 15, Interstate 80, Interstate 147 and Interstate 180.

Pennsylvania's Steer Clear law requires motorists to move into a lane that is not adjacent to an emergency response area or incident. An emergency response area is an area where law enforcement, tow truck operators and other emergency personnel have their lights flashing and where road crews have lighted flares or posted signs warning motorists.

If drivers cannot move over because of traffic or other conditions, they must reduce their speed. The law allows road workers and emergency responders to report violations by motorists where law enforcement may not be present.

Failure to move over or slow down will not only result in a citation carrying a fine of up to \$250 but drivers cited for traffic violations in these situations will also face double fines. If the

The off season is over, and it back to racing this weekend. As the teams count down the final days until the engines start turning over in earnest, this week is the last before NASCAR's three national series head to Daytona International Speedway for their respective 2012 season openers.

Daytona Speedweeks kick off with the traditional Shootout at Daytona on Saturday night, followed by pole qualifying on Sunday for Daytona 500's front row and the Gatorade Duel at Daytona, a pair of races to set the remainder of the field for the Feb. 26 Daytona 500.

There are many storylines coming out of Daytona, but Kasey Kahne is one of the top ones. This will be Kahne's first season with Hendrick Motorsports, and it got off to a good start with the fastest lap on the final day of Preseason Thunder testing as well as the fifth-fastest overall of the three-day session at 205.747 mph

The eight-year NASCAR Sprint Cup Series veteran hopes to follow the example of Dale Earnhardt Jr., the last high-profile driver to switch to Hendrick Motors ports, by winning in his first start for Hendrick at the Shootout on Feb. 18.

But he will be driving with a sore knee, after undergoing surgery last week for a torn meniscus in his left knee.

He should be ready to practice next Friday, according to a team annoucement Kahne, who has replaced Mark Martin in the No. 5 Hendrick Motorsports car, will not have a backup driver at Daytona, according to the team.

He also plans to race for Turner Motorsports in the Nationwide Series

Can defending NASCAR Sprint Cup Series champion Tony Stewart finally win the Daytona 500? Will there be a seventh consecutive first-time Daytona 500 winner?

Stewart is a three-time winner of the Budweiser Shootout, a non-points event. his most recent victory coming in 2007. Stewart also won in 2001-02 – one of four drivers with consecutive victories in the 75-lap, 187.5-mile event.

No surprise, Stewart has the best Driver Rating among Shootout eligible drivers, 105.2. Next best is Dale Earnhardt Jr. at 97.9 followed by Kevin Harvick, another four-time Shootout winner; Jimmie Johnson and Kyle Busch.

Kurt Busch, who'll make his debut in the event with James Finch's Phoenix Racing, is the defending champion.

A driver to watch is AJ Allmendinger. He'll make his second Shootout appearance in last year's winning car - Penske Racing's No. 22 Dodge. Allmendinger, a member of the Rolex 24 winning Michael Shank Racing team, finished fifth in the race's 2009 edition. Figure Allmendinger to be a legitimate contender to become the next first-time Daytona 500 winner. The No. 22 Dodge won its Gatorade Duel at Daytona qualifier a year ago with Kurt Busch finishing fifth in the Daytona 500.

The highest-ranked 25 drivers in 2011 standings plus previous winners of the Daytona 500, Coke Zero 400 and Shootout events are eligible to compete in this year's Shootout.

Since 2005, there have been but two NASCAR Sprint Cup Series champions: Jimmie Johnson and Tony Stewart. Stewart was the last to win the championship before Johnson began his incredible run of five consecutive titles, which Stewart ended in 2011

Will Stewart join Jeff Gordon as the only four-time champions of NASCAR's premier series? Can Carl Edwards, who lost last year's crown on a tie-breaker, give Roush Fenway Racing its third championship? Or will there be a first-time champion – the first since Johnson in 2006?

Richard Petty Motorsports must somehow get their act together. After a terrible 2010 season, RPM attempted to regain its footing under new ownership and a reduction from four teams to two.

Marcos Ambrose starts his second season with the No. 9 team. With Todd

Parrott at the helm, Ambrose's statistics showed dramatic improvement in his first season at RPM. Not only did he earn his first win and post five top-five and 12 top-10 finishes, Ambrose improved his position in the points standings by seven spots and was on target to finish 17th before an engine failure in the season finale at Homestead.

Aric Almirola rejoins RPM following a five-race stint in 2010, when he subbed for Kasey Kahne, who opted out early for Red Bull Racing. Almirola had one career-high fourth-place finish. Most recently, Almirola competed for JR Motorsports in the Nationwide Series and finished fourth in the points standings. Although Almirola, 27, has 35 Cup starts, he did not compete in a Cup race last year. ŔPM suffers from professionalism and lack of sponsorship. If their sponsors stay on board, then this organization should be able to finish the season. However, both teams must work together to overcome inexperience and size. ROBBY GORDON WINS DESERT RACE With a successful 2012 Dakar Rally behind him, Robby Gordon headed to Parker, Arizona last week for the Best in the Desert Parker 425, for a new challenge He drove a new truggy (a hybrid between a trophy truck and a Class 1 buggy). Built by the Geiser Brothers and owned by SPEED Energy/RPM Off-Road Racing teammate Clyde Stacey, it was be the first time Gordon had entered the 1500 class instead of the BITD's Trick Truck class. Gordon finished an impressive 14 minutes faster than last year's winner, Jesse Jones. Gordon beat the next competitor by nearly 5 minutes. He is scheduled to run the Daytona 500, but has announced no further NASCAR plans. WEEKEND RACING: Saturday marks the first NASCAR race of the 2012 season. 

Letters Written During WW1 From Jay A. Rigel to Family and Friends

Included in an envelope received by Jay's family was a post card of the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor. The card was from J.A Rigel to Mrs. J. C. Thoman. It was dated June 4th at 6 P.M and stated:

Somewhere in N.Y. Have been on the train since 3 o'clock. Saw the beautiful scenery along the Hudson. The weather is cooler here. J.A.'

And included in the envelope was this note:

Letter to: Mrs. J.C. Thoman From: Miss Naomi Herd of RD #4 Kingston, New York Date: May 24, 1918

Mrs. J. C. Thoman,

I received this card as J.A. passed through Kingston and I knew he would like me to mail it. Would you please tell him when you write to him that I mailed the card.

Good-Bye, Miss Naomi Herd Then later, on June 23, 1918, Miss Herd wrote another letter to Mrs. Annie Thoman:

Friend Mrs. Thoman,

I received your letter some time ago and you asked if I had seen your brother Jay. I saw him and he handed the card to me as the train was pulling out. He had his hair all cut off. Most all of the fellows with him had their hair cut off. They looked funnv.

He wanted me to come over to the train, but I didn't like to. Of course all the girls liked the soldier boys

They were going north. I hardly think they were going right across. They may have been going to Canada.

Well, I will close hoping that I may hear from you again.

I remain, Naomi Herd (Kingston, N. Y.) And I'll give you a bit more info about where he was going: They were on their way to Camp Merritt, which was about 15 miles northwest of Jersey City, New Jersey and about 10 miles from New York City. It was 770 acres in size and would accommodate up to 42,000 persons. From here, thousands of soldiers were transported by railroad to Hoboken, NJ and from there, deployed to Europe. Approximately four million troops were sent to the Western Front during WWI and about one million passed through Camp Merritt.

There were about 1300 buildings on the base. One was the camp hospital with a staff of about 300 nurses who treated over 55,000 soldiers. In the fall of 1918, the Influenza epidemic reached Camp Merritt. There were well over 1000 cases and many deaths. Many soldiers also became sick during the time after they left camp, as they prepared to go to Europe.

Camp Merritt also saw the return of many troops, the last ones in January 1920. It was closed and dismantled after this and eventually sold by the government.

A monument was erected to remember and honor those who were stationed at Camp Merritt. It's a 65-foot tall granite obelisk, modeled after the Washington Monument in Washington D.C. Inscribed on it are the names of the 558 enlisted men, four nurses and a civilian who died there during the war.
