Lewisburg Cemetery Tour

On April 16, a walking tour of the Lewisburg Cemetery will highlight local women who supported the woman suffrage cause in Union County. Originally planned for 2020 to celebrate the 100th anniversary of American women winning the right to vote, the tour was postponed due to the pandemic. With support from the Lewisburg Civic Club, Union County women organized a Woman Suffrage Party to win a 1915 referendum for state suffrage. Included in the tour are Emma Billmeyer Matlack, Civic Club president, Dr. Mary Moore Wolfe, a prime organizer, and Dorothy Walls, who toured the state and Union County with the "Justice Bell" on a flatbed truck. The Justice Bell was a replica of the Liberty Bell. Its clapper was not to be rung until women won the right to vote.

Also on the tour are pioneers Emma Thomas and Annie Van Gundy who ran successfully in 1911 for the local school board, nine years before women could vote.

The tour will conclude at the old office building at the entrance of the Cemetery. It once was used as a polling place for the South Ward of Lewisburg. South Ward was the only local precinct that passed the 1915 referendum, which lost in Pennsylvania and in Union County

Robert (Bert) Dunkerly and Nancy Neuman will conduct the tour. Dunkerly is the author of A Beautifully Solemn Scene: The Lewisburg Cemetery (Heritage Books, 2013). A native of Lewisburg, he is a park ranger and historian at Richmond National Battlefield Park in Virginia. Nancy Neuman is the volunteer president of the Lewisburg Cemetery Association.

For Southern Section of CSVT



Pennsylvania Department of Transportation The (PennDOT) has opened bids for the first construction contract for the southern section of the Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation Project (CSVT).

Craul, 55, of Lewisburg, passed away at his Section of the CSVT, which will ease congestion, improve safety and accommodate growth in the region," Acting PennDOT District 3 Executive Justin Blakeney said. "This is a major step toward completion of this project, which will have a significant impact in the area.

Bids were opened for the earthwork for the roughly miles of new four-lane, limited access highway in Shamokin Dam Borough and Monroe Township, Snyder County. The CSVT Southern Section will connect Routes 11/15 north of Selinsgrove to Route 15 (and the CSVT Northern Section) south of Winfield. It will include an interchange/connector to Routes 11/15 and Route 61 (Veterans Memorial Bridge) in Shamokin Dam.

In addition to five million cubic yards of earthwork, the contract includes the bridge to carry Sunbury Road over the new highway, various stream culverts, and drainage features. It also includes improvements on existing local roads to accommodate the new highway, such as:

Reconfiguring Park Road, Fisher Road, and Colonial Drive;

Replacing the Mill Road/App Road/Airport Road intersection with two roundabouts; and

A new traffic signal and turning lanes at the Route 204/Mill Road intersection.

The apparent low bid of \$115.2 million was submitted by Trumbull Corporation of Pittsburgh. It was one of three bids submitted by private companies in the competitive bidding process.

PennDOT will review the bids and anticipates awarding a contract within a few weeks. Work is expected to begin in the summer with completion anticipated in 2025.

Bids for the other new bridges that are part of the project are planned to be opened in 2024, and a paving contract is planned to follow in 2026. The CSVT Southern Section is anticipated to be opened in 2027. Work Continues on the

Work is resuming for the season on the CSVT Northern Section, which will connect Route 15 south of Winfield in Union County to Route 147 south berland County. Upcoming the final wearing course on the mainline roadway and ramps that were previously highway lighting, signs, guide rail, and erosion and sediment control features throughout the project area. The CSVT Northern Section is anticipated to be opened to traffic later this year. A ribbon cutting ceremony will be announced when plans are developed.

USDA To Measure Northeastern Milk Production

More than a thousand dairy farms in the northeastern U.S. will receive surveys from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS), as the agency collects information for the 2022 Milk Production report.

"The dairy industry is an important component of the Northeast's agriculture and it is crucial for us to have accurate data about this key sector," said King Whetstone, director of the NASS Northeastern Regional Field Office. NASS conducts the Milk Production survey in the region every January, April, July, and October. The survey asks milk producers to provide the number of milk cows in the herd, number of cows milked, and total milk production for the first day of the month.

The dairy industry relies on monthly Milk Production reports to make decisions about the marketing of milk. By participating in the survey, milk producers can ensure that NASS provides

timely, accurate and useful data that all sectors of the U.S. dairy industry use to make sound business decisions.

NASS will mail the questionnaires to all producers selected for the survey in late March. To ensure all survey participants have an opportunity to respond, NASS interviewers will contact producers who do not respond by mail or online to conduct telephone interviews.

NASS safeguards the privacy of all respondents and publishes only aggregate data, ensuring that no individual operation or producer can be identified.

Survey results will be published in the Milk Production report to be released on April 20, 2022. These and all NASS reports are available online at www.nass.usda.gov/Publica-498-1518.



Selinsgrove Speedway's next race is at 6 p.m. Saturday, April 16, featuring the United Late Model Series in the 30-lap Spring Championship. Joining the super late models again will be the PASS/IMCA 305 sprint cars and roadrunners. Gates will open at 4 p.m.

Bryan Bernheisel started on the outside of the front row while his father Jim Bernheisel started on the pole for the super late model feature. Racing out of turn two, B. Bernheisel pulled into the early race lead with his father in tow.

Fourth-place starter Gene Knaub raced a close third with sixth-place starter Jim Yoder quickly advancing to fourth. The race's first caution flag unfurled on lap nine when Drew Weisser's car spun in turn two. On the lap 10 restart, B. Bernheisel continued to set the pace as eighth-place starter Hayes Mattern challenged fifth-place starter Jeff Rine for fifth.

Late in the race, a double spin for John Schoch in turn two and Jared Siefert in turn three regrouped the field for another restart. When the race resumed, Mattern powered by Rine for the fifth position.
