Author of New Book Will Hold Two Book Signings

The Slifer House Museum will host a book signing with author, Jeannette Lasansky, from 1-3 PM on Saturday, July 6th. Slifer House Museum is on River Road, on the campus of Riverwoods, off Route 15 north of Lewisburg.
Ms. Lasansky will do a second signing the following day, Sunday, July 7th from 2-4 PM at Bucknell University Barnes & Noble Bookstore, 400 Market Street, Lewisburg. Books will be for sale at each location.
Jeannette Lasansky, current president of the Union County Historical Society, has authored over two dozen books and articles on Pennsylvania's history and material culture including Union County River Towns the second in a series of four books celebrating the county's bicentennial. Her new book, New Berlin and the Buffalo Valley, presents the region's history using over 220 images from the extensive photographic resources of the Union County Historical Society, the New Berlin Heritage Association as well as many private collections.
New Berlin and the Buffalo Valley highlights what life was

like in New Berlin and the surrounding communities of Dry Valley, Dice, White Springs, Vicksburg, Buffalo Crossroads, Mazeppa, Cowan, Red Bank, Rand, and Forest Hills New Berlin, the county seat from 1813-1855, was considered a cultural, educational and governmental center for craftsmen, farmers, and tradesmen. Located in an area rich in natural resources, New Berlin is bounded by Penns Creek and Shamokin Mountain. The creek was a busy waterway that was used to transport goods while Shamokin is known for being rich with iron ore, and timber.
New Berlin and the Buffalo Valley can also be purchased at the Union County Historical Society (in the county courthouse on S. Second Street, Lewisburg), at the West Milton State Bank and Mifflinburg Bank & Trust, as well as the area's libraries. The book is also for sale at the Dale/Engle/Walker house on Strawbridge Road on Sunday afternoons.

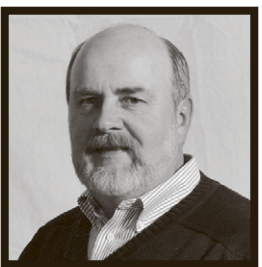

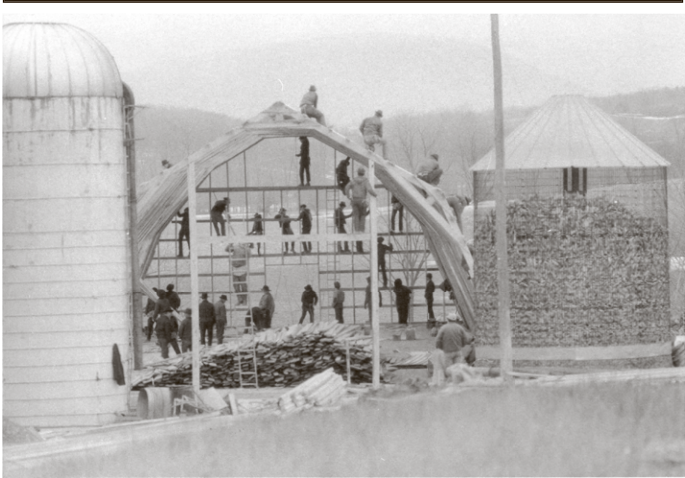

Bread Baking on Bock Dag (Baking Day) (Continued)
The next step was to place flour in the old-fashioned dough tray and gradually mix in the leaven with the hands and a stirrer, until it became a rather firm mass in which fermentation began.
After enough raising had taken place through the fermentation, a portion of the dough, sufficient for a desired-size loaf, was placed on a large, flour-sprinkled baking board on the kitchen table. Here each loaf was separately hand-kneaded by continuously turning the outer edges toward the center of the mass and pressing it down with the ball of the hands.
Now and then you would scatter a bit of flour over it and onto the bake board until the loaf became of the proper consistency. Muslin cloths were then spread in the rye straw bread baskets and a bit of flour spread on them, so the dough would not stick to the cloth. The overhanging edges of the cloth were covered over the top and baskets were placed near the warm kitchen stove for further raising.
After the second raising in the bread baskets, the loaves were again dumped out on the bake board. One by one they were given another gnoatching (kneading) and again put back into the baskets, covered again and set near the stove for the final raising.
It was between all these operations that the mother would make the pies, tarts and cakes so that all were ready for the outdoor oven at the same time. Then too she had to keep one eye out the back kitchen door to see that the fire she had ignited earlier was coming along all right.

An interesting saying of those days: "Do not bake on Good Friday---not even the fish would eat it."
And another note---When considering the fruits of her baking chores, the housewife counted the number of pies, cakes, etc. she made and expressed it by saying "...baked 18 pieces..." (To be continued next week.)

"Oh man, what a day," said Gordon. "This is a race where you never know what is going to happen. Today, we had a fantastic race car. We had a lot of distance to make up, so I'm thrilled to get second. It feels like a win to me."

Third-place finisher, Carl Edwards never ran near the front until after his last pit stop.

"I love this place," said Edwards. "It's all about strategy and staying out of trouble. I know I probably got into a couple cars today, and I wish I hadn't, but it was a good race."

Kurt Busch battled back from a pit road speeding penalty to finish fourth.

"Yeah, we had a fast car, and I take all the blame," said Busch. "I just didn't get my tachometer right coming into the pits and put us in a hole. We just didn't have enough laps left to dig out. My bad."

Clint Bowyer, Kasey Kahne, Marcos Ambrose, Greg Biffle, Jimmie Johnson, and Kevin Harvick were the remaining top-10 drivers.

Car owner Roger Penske gave A. J. Allmendinger a second chance.

Allmendinger repaid him by winning Saturday's Nationwide race at Road America in Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin.

Last year Allmendinger was suspended when he failed a NASCAR drug test, resulting in the loss of his ride at Penske Racing. He said he took a pill offered by a friend that turned out to be Adderall. He was reinstated after completing a NASCAR-affiliated recovery program, and now is getting a limited second chance with the Penske team this year.

Allmendinger, who had the fastest car for most of Saturday's race, took the lead from Justin Allgaier with seven laps to go in regulation, then survived two green-white-checkered overtime finishes.

Afterward, he expressed appreciation to Penske, the team owner who originally let him go last season after he was suspended for violating NASCAR's substance abuse policy.

"It's just meant the world to me," Allmendinger said. "This was the only way I could repay him. I was trying so hard out there – and, at times, probably over-trying."

"I knew the car was quicker than everybody else. I knew that as long as I didn't make any mistakes they weren't going to pass me."

Justin Allgaier was second.

"I'm still not a road racer, I can assure you of that," Allgaier said. "Just watching A.J. and seeing some of the places he was able to go on that last green-white-checker, I still have some stuff to learn."

Parker Kligerman, Owen Kelly, Sam Hornish, Brian Vickers, Kyle Larson, Cole Whitt, Elliott Sadler, and Austin Dillon rounded out the top-10.

WATCH OUT FOR STEWART

Will Tony Stewart be able to keep his midseason performance going or will he begin to fall off again?

In the beginning of the season, Stewart and his team were like a race horse that stumbled coming out of the gate. After four races into the season he wasn't even in the top-20.

Prior to the May 26 race at Charlotte, his best finish was 15th. Since then, he's finished 7th, 1st, 4th and 5th.

If history is any indicator, Stewart runs better in hot weather.

He said prior to the 2011 Chase, he didn't even deserve to be in it with the way his team was performing. But when the championship came down to the last race at Homestead, Stewart out dueled Carl Edwards to win his second championship.

Stewart spoke to the media prior to the Sonoma race about his team's situation.

"It's definitely been gratifying for sure," he said. "The thing is that, 'A,' we have to stay there and 'B,' we got to be consistent. "Getting there has been a lot of fun, it's been very trying to get to this point, but it just shows how quickly you can get things turned around."

There's other teams that can make gains like that too. It's a constant moving target. You have to consistently keep up with it and I'm proud of our group. The hard work that they've put to get us caught back up. The hard thing is that you can't stop and they can't stop with that intensity.
