### Adamo Seeks Nomination for the Office of County Coroner

Local funeral director, Dominick T. Adamo, has announced that he will seek the Republican nomination in the 2013 Municipal Primary for the office of Union County Coroner.

Adamo is currently an appointed Deputy Coroner under the current Union County Coroner.

Mr. Adamo is the owner of the Dominick T. Adamo Funeral Home, Mifflinburg.

Dominick feels that his 15 years of experience in the mortuary sciences field give him a good understanding of death investigations, and he also has the training and compassion to aide families as they go through a very difficult time in their lives. Once in office, one of his focuses will be to implement the electronic death records system that the Department of Health, Division of Vital Records is unveiling to its data providers. He feels this system will create a more effective communication tool between the different authorities who need to have access to this information.

Over his 15 year career in funeral service, he has had the opportunity to work with county corners throughout the state and has developed a list of best practices and where appropriate will work to integrate these practices into the Union County Coroner's Office.

Mr. Adamo is a graduate of Pennsylvania State University and The Pittsburgh Institute of Mortuary Science where he graduated with a funeral directing degree.

He is a member of Mifflinburg Church of the Nazarene, President Elect of the Mifflinburg Rotary Club, Buffalo Valley Sportsman Club, Central Pennsylvania Funeral Directors Association, and Pennsylvania Funeral Directors Association.

### Man Charged with Beating Baby

Isaiah Tashan Fulton, 21, of New Berlin, was arrested on Thursday, February 21, 2013, and charged with one felony county of aggravated assault and two misdemeanor counts of endangering the welfare of a child and recklessly endangering another person. The charges stem from an August 13, 2012 incident where emergency personnel were called to his residence for an unresponsive baby girl.

According to the police affidavit, Fulton was watching the baby while her mother was at work. He told first-responders that he found the baby unresponsive and began performing CPR.

Fulton had been dating the child's mother for over a year. He stated that after the mother left for work he was alone in the house with the baby, who is a year old. He was in his room playing MW3 on his Xbox in his room and she was just sitting there bored so he told her to go to her room and play. He called for her but she didn't respond that is when he went to her room and found her sitting in a chair, leaning to the side and chewing on her tongue. Fulton picked her up and her head fell backwards along with her eyes rolling into the back of her head. He also noticed she was not breathing and unresponsive. He called Rodney Barclay and Michele Patterson. Barclay then called 911.

Barclay, Patterson, and the child's mother all stated that she was acting normally before they left her alone with Fulton.

The child was taken to Evangelical Community Hospital where she was later transferred via Life Flight to Geisinger Medical Center for treatment.

According to Dr. Paul Bellino a member of the Pediatric Abuse Team at Geisinger Medical Center, the child had suffered a devastating intracranial injury which she could not have inflicted on herself. The presence of retinal hemorrhages along with an unexplained subdural hematoma, in this context, is most consistent with a diagnosis of abusive head trauma.

Due to the fact that the child was acting normally prior to her leaving the child in Fulton's care, Dr. Bellino has concluded that the injury occurred after the mother left for work.

Fulton has been incarcerated in the Union County Prison in lieu of \$100,000 bail. He has also been accused of arranging rides to and from Easton for the murder suspects, who are accused of murdering Terrell-Henderson-Littles in Williamsport on January 9. Littles was shoot in the head in an unnamed alley south of the 1100 block of West Fourth Street, where he was selling marijuana. He has yet to be arraigned in Williamsport.

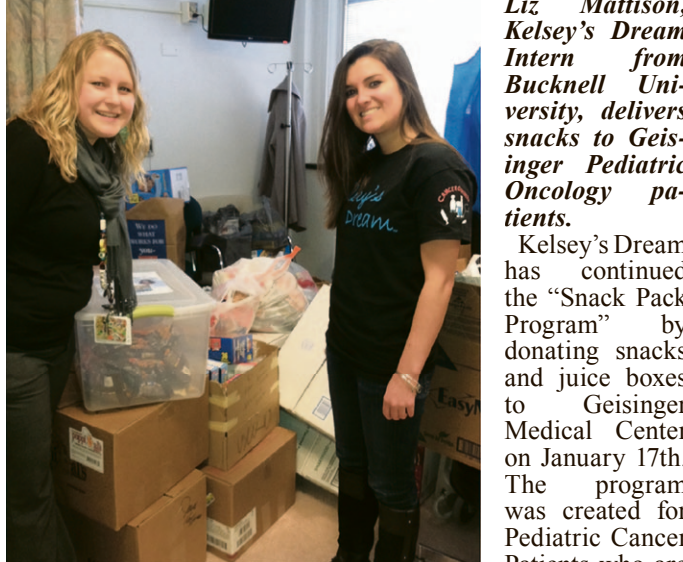
