## Got Your Photo ID? You'll Need it to Vote on November 6th

The League of Women Voters of the Lewisburg Area reminds you that under the new Voter ID law, you will be required to show a valid photo ID when you go to the polls in November.

If you are a registered voter and have any one of the ID's below, you can vote on Election Day.

- ° PA Driver's License or PennDOT photo ID card
- ° Current U.S. Passport
- ° Current U.S. Military ID
- ° Current government employee photo ID issued by Federal, PA State, County or Municipal Government
- ° Current photo ID issued by a credited PA institution of higher learning
- ° Current photo ID issued by a PA care facility, including long-term, assisted living residences and personal care homes.

Your ID must have an expiration date that is current. Driver's licenses and PennDot IDs can be expired by one year or less. Military IDs can say that the expiration date is indefinite.

If you do not have a valid photo ID to vote, you can get a free one at a full-service Driver License Center (Selinsgrove or Williamsport).

It may take time to gather the necessary documents so you need to begin the process now.

Voting is important: you don't want to be left out this November. The last day to register is Tuesday, October 9. If you or anyone you know is not registered or does not have a valid photo ID, act now!

## Local Work Group Meeting to be Held

The Pennsylvania Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) will hold a Local Work Group meeting on September 5th from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. at the Union County Government Center, located at 155 North 15th Street in Lewisburg. Agenda items will include a discussion of USDA programs with a focus on developing local priority natural resource concerns in Juniata, Mifflin, Snyder, and Union Counties. Recommendations developed by the Local Working Group will be presented to the NRCS State Technical Committee. Input is sought from environmental professionals, agricultural producers, landowners, and special interest groups. Those who

The primary role of the Local Work Group is to provide input to the State Technical Advisory Committee which develops technical guidelines necessary to implement the conservation provisions of the 2008 Farm Bill. NRCS is USDA's lead conservation agency and has worked hand-in-hand with farmers and landowners for more than 70 years to conserve natural resources on private lands.

## Ecology Day

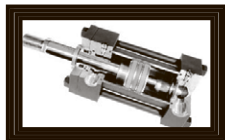

## Rural Beginnings

100 YEARS OF PENNSYLVANIA 4-H

## Global Success

In the early 1900s, farmers made up half the population of the United States. Because farmers were skeptical of new farming ideas, local clubs were started to teach the farmers' children about agriculture with the hope that the children would teach their parents the new production methods. It was believed children would be more open to learning the new methods. Bean, livestock, cotton, cooking and canning clubs began. The strategy by university educators worked and was the early model for what became known as a 4-H club.

4-H officially came to Pennsylvania in 1912, a decade after the organization was founded nationally in Ohio. The first counties to have traditional 4-H clubs were Mercer, Montgomery and Butler counties.

This year, we celebrate the Centennial of Pennsylvania 4-H. Although 4-H has agricultural roots, many of today's popular projects are slightly removed from the stereotypical farming and livestock projects. Sewing, film making, training a Seeing Eye Puppy, robotics, physical fitness and babysitting are just a few of the unique projects offered to youth. There are more than 70 projects to choose from in our program.

Youth who participate in 4-H gain valuable life, leadership and citizenship skills. For example, while they think they are just building a robot to enter in a competition, they are actually gaining a hands-on understanding of science. Raising a dairy cow can teach money management through purchasing feed. All projects include a record book that can build organization and time management skills. Today's 4-Hers will be using these skills to design our new medical technologies and feeding the world, among many other amazing feats.

4-H members report gaining life skills such as public speaking, problem solving, goal setting, leadership, planning, self-confidence, expanded horizons, organizational skills, patience, and "real world" experience from hands-on projects.

There are more than 8 million 4-H alumni around the country who have moved on to numerous professions. The most well-known include the following: Reba McEntire, David Letterman, Johnny Carson, Tom Wopat, former President Jimmy Carter, Johnny Cash, Jim Davis (creator of Garfield), Orville Redenbacher, Reggie White, to name a few.

In 2012, we appreciate our Rural Beginnings and rejoice in our Global Success. Nearly 205,000 youth are served by the Pennsylvania 4-H program either through participation in local clubs or our embryology curriculum presented to public elementary schools.

# Hamlin Perseveres At Bristol

BRISTOL, Tenn.— Denny Hamlin displayed one of the best racing performances of the year in Saturday night's Sprint Cup Irwin Tools race. He and Carl Edwards raced each other hard for several laps, before Hamlin was able to gain the lead on lap 462 of the 500-lap race. As Edwards faded, Hamlin pulled away to beat Jimmie Johnson to the checkered flag by 1.103 seconds.



Unlike Bristol's Spring race, which had little in the way of excitement, Saturday night's race featured 13 cautions and plenty of emotion, as drivers began to rubber-in the outside groove and discovered it was the fastest way around.

"It's just a different kind of racing," said Hamlin, who won the 20th Cup race of his career. "But it was the same thing -- we were all running in a line. You're just waiting for the next guy to screw up to get around (him)."

"I don't think we saw as much side-by-side racing, but you didn't see side-by-side racing with the old Bristol. You just saw a bunch of cars in line, waiting for someone to get knocked out of the way or to mess up."

Jeff Gordon contended for the lead but finished third.

"The pace was fast," said Gordon, who inched closer to a wild-card spot in the Chase but still trails Kyle Busch by 16 points for the second of two positions. "You'd fly up around the top like that with all that rubber down. . . . It was fast, and it was intense."

Brian Vickers was fourth, followed by Marcos Ambrose, Kyle Busch, Clint Bowyer, Joey Logano, Kasey Kahne, and Paul Menard.

There were plenty of flare-ups to punctuate the racing. Juan Pablo Montoya wrecked Ryan Newman, and dropped him out of a provisional wild-card spot.

Brad Keselowski got sandwiched between three different cars before wrecking.

Contact from Regan Smith sent Danica Patrick hard into the frontstretch wall.

No wreck was more significant to the outcome of the race -- or to the Cup standings, for that matter -- than the one between Tony Stewart and Matt Kenseth on Lap 332. Stewart had the faster car, but Kenseth had the race lead, and their cars collided as they powered through Turn 4, with Stewart to the outside.

Repeated contact between the cars turned both sideways. Kenseth's Ford careened into the inside wall at the end of the frontstretch, with Stewart's Chevrolet slamming into Kenseth's car.

Kenseth's car was damaged, but he drove away from the wreck. Stewart climbed from his car and slung his helmet squarely into the nose of Kenseth's car, as he came back around the track.

"We weren't that great of a race car, but we were definitely faster than that (Kenseth's car) after that restart (on Lap 329)," Stewart said while his car spent 25 laps in the garage for repairs. "I checked up twice to not run over him, and I learned my lesson there."

"I'm going to run over him every chance I've got from now till the end of the year -- every chance I've got."

Stewart finished 27th and dropped a spot to 10th in the standings, 16 points ahead of Kasey Kahne in 11th. If Stewart should drop out of the top 10, he won't get bonus points for his three victories when the Chase starts.

Kenseth finished 25th and fell two spots to fourth in points, but he clinched at least a wild-card berth in the Chase.

UPDATE: NASCAR spokesman Kerry Tharp said Monday afternoon NASCAR will not penalize Tony Stewart for throwing his helmet at Kenseth's car during the race. In a similar incident, they did not penalize Camping World Truck Series driver Todd Bodine for throwing his helmet at another competitor's vehicle earlier this month at Pocono.

Will that "no limits" momentum end in a title? After eight top-5 finishes in 13 starts, including a pair of runner-up results at Daytona and Kansas, Peters has given himself a 17-point cushion atop the charts.

RHR's 1-2 finish at Bristol hasn't been the only bright spot of the year, though. Shawn Fetzer, PennDOT, notified the Roadmaster of a major overhaul on Route 45, Mifflinburg. Detour routes will be emailed to the municipality. Work was required on the mower. Tar and chip projects will continue on municipal roads.

Motion to accept the Roadmaster's Report by Supervisor Heintzelman; 2nd by Supervisor Haines. All in favor.

At 7pm, the FDR Full Depth Reclamation Project bids were opened. The bids were \$191,599 - Eastern Industries; \$245,415.50 - Gutelius Excavating, Inc; and \$238,509.10 - HRI. PennDot earlier provided an estimate of the project as \$345,000. Motion to award the FDR Project bid to Eastern Industries by Supervisor Haines; 2nd by Supervisor Heintzelman. All in favor.

Emergency Management Coordinator Stanley Bingaman provided an update on the new radios. A change in personnel at the preferred radio provider has resulted in delays in the county and municipal purchases of the required radios. Limestone Township already has purchased the radios through an online vendor and will have them programmed when available.

EMC Bingaman noted there were no countywide meetings. Motion to accept the EMC report by Supervisor Heintzelman; 2nd by Supervisor Haines. All in favor.

Code Enforcement Officer Stanley Bingaman reported on two construction permits issued to Leonard Zimmerman (school restrooms and additions) and to Paul Hetrick (implement shed). Mr. Zimmerman authorized the refund of Ben Reeder's construction permit fee due to the requirement that his project must be permitted through the Central Keystone COG. The Board discussed projects requiring a building permit through the Central Keystone COG, rather than a construction permit through Limestone Township Code Enforcement Officer. CK COG director Tom Sauers in a phone call earlier brought to the township's attention that any project which is commercial, including home renovations for businesses located on the premises of a residence in which a member of the public may enter the business, requires inspections for compliance through the building permit process through the Central Keystone Council of Governments. Director Sauers stated also that horse barns are considered non-agricultural buildings and require building permits through the CK COG. Motion to accept the Code Enforcement Officer's report by Supervisor Haines; 2nd by Supervisor Heintzelman. All in favor.

The Union County Planning Commission (UCPC) contacted Solicitor Kerstetter and the township to advise that the Municipal Planning Code allows for a 45-day review of a municipality's Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO) by the county planning commission. The UCPC received Limestone Township Planning Commission's SALDO online on April 19. UCPC offered to meet with the Limestone Township Planning Commission to review their comments and concerns.

Twenty onlot sewer inspection notification letters were distributed at the election. Additional letters will be mailed to township residents.

The Board reviewed a letter from the Union County Planning Commission to Matthew Shirk, Church of God in Christ Mennonite, reminding Mr. Shirk of the July 9, 2012 deadline for completion of required improvements after a complaint was received concerning the infiltration pond located behind the school filled with water after a week of dry weather.

The Board reviewed a letter to Mifflinburg Borough from DEP notifying the borough in response to the annual wasteload management report of corrective action required for preventing/eliminating hydraulic overload conditions in the future since the condition existed in 2011. The report is required by July 16, 2012. No new sewage connections to Mifflinburg facilities (except as provided under Section 94.55 - 94.57 of DEP rules and regulations) will be permitted until the sewerage system no longer exhibits any existing or projected overload. The connection ban letter was received from Mifflinburg Borough.

Motion to adjourn at 9:15pm by Supervisor Haines; 2nd by Supervisor Heintzelman. All in favor.

### June 5, 2012

Chairman Moyer called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.
