

Union County's 2nd Cemetery Tour Slated for Lewisburg Cemetery

A walking tour of Lewisburg Cemetery will be conducted by Diane Meixell and Nancy Neuman on Monday, May 27 at approximately 11:30 am. The tour will begin at the cemetery chapel immediately following the Memorial Day parade and ceremony.

Much of the history of the Lewisburg area is contained in this cemetery. Participants will be introduced to that history as they pass the monuments of early settlers such as Colonel John Kelly, General Abbot Green, Colonel William Chamberlin, Henry Spyster, Christopher Weiser, Roan McClure, and John Linn.

Andrew Gregg Tucker killed at Gettysburg, Wilbur Blair survivor of the Civil War and the Battle of Little Big Horn, several African-American Civil War veterans, and other noteworthy veterans' graves will be identified. Included in the tour will be the cemetery's Medal of Honor recipient, George Ramer.

The tour will include brief histories of area notables along the route: Christy Mathewson, William Cameron, Eli Slifer, and six Bucknell University presidents.

The tour, which is part of the Union County Bicentennial Celebration, is free and open to the public. Walking shoes are recommended. Other cemetery tours include the New Columbia tour held the evening of May 26, in New Berlin in the evening of August 21st, and in Mifflinburg in the evening of October 27th.



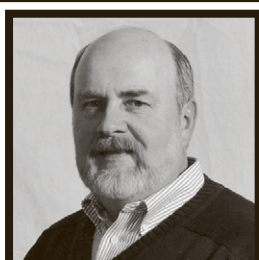

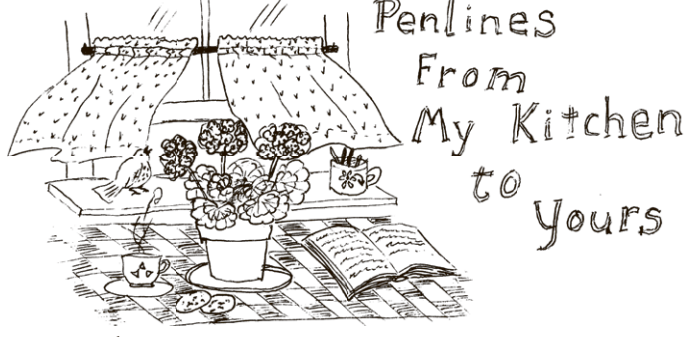

Well, after last week's article, I learned that you can make yeast from potatoes, grains and fruit peels... with varying flavors and results... interesting! I hope I have time to try out some of these ideas. I used to use sourdough starter a lot, but not since we've moved back to PA... The bread and pancakes made using it were wonderful. I would love to have that same starter, but might not use it enough to keep it alive now.

More Glossary words:

SCRAPPLE--- a product of butchering. Pork meat scraps, organ meats and bones with meat are cooked to produce a rich broth. The meat is then removed, ground and returned to the broth and the mixture is thickened with corn meal and/or buckwheat or wheat flour; seasonings are added, and when adequately thick, the scrapple is ladled into pans to harden. The usual seasonings for scrapple are coriander, sweet marjoram, black pepper and salt. A richer concoction with higher liver content is called liver pudding or liverwurst.

SOUR CREAM--- not commercial sour cream, but rather cream that has soured or is thick.

STENNER--- a tall tub for making sauer kraut or salting meat; also a tin can, such as a lard can.

SWEET MILK--- fresh milk, as opposed to sour or buttermilk.

TEA CUP--- a unit of measure equal to the size of your tea cup. Measurements tended to be haphazard and far from standard until 1896. It was then that Fanny Farmer began her campaign to remedy this matter by operating cooking schools and publishing recipes employing standard measurements. Undoubtedly some time passed before this method of measurement reached all homemakers. The cup familiar to the early Pennsylvania farm families was one lacking a handle.

THICK MILK--- sour milk; buttermilk is a substitute.

TRAMMEL--- a notched metal rod-like device used to raise and lower pans and kettles over the open fire. Also called a pot hook.

WINE GLASS--- a unit of measure. The common wine glass is ¼ cup.

Have you ever made scrapple? I did frequently when we lived on the west coast. The other day our daughter in Japan said she had just made some. (You definitely can't buy it in Japan!) Do you make sauer kraut? I made it also when we lived in Oregon.

How many ounces was/is a "tea cup"? Six or eight?

May is National Dog Bite Prevention Month

Postal Service spreads the word about preventing dog bites

May has been designated as National Dog Bite Prevention Month, The Postal Service will be spreading the word about dog bite prevention all month.

Last year, about 3100 mail carriers were bitten by dogs and about 4.7 million people suffered dog bites nationally. Children are the majority of the victims and are 900 times more likely to be bitten by a dog.

The American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) and the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) report that small children, the elderly, and letter carriers, in that order, are the most frequent victims. Dog attacks are the most commonly reported childhood public health problem in the United States.

The AVMA also reports that the number of dog attacks exceeds the reported instances of measles, whooping cough, and mumps, combined. Dog bite victims account for up to 5 percent of emergency room visits.

The Postal Service isn't anti dog, but pro-responsibility. Postal officials ask that you properly restrain your dog to help prevent bites. Many bites occur because owners fail to leash their animals.

The Postal Service is offering these tips for avoiding dog bites.

How to Avoid Being Bitten

- Don't run past a dog. The dog's natural instinct is to chase and catch prey.

- If a dog threatens you, don't scream. Avoid eye contact. Try to remain motionless until the dog leaves, then back away slowly until the dog is out of sight.

- Don't approach a strange dog, especially one that's tethered or confined.

- While letter carriers are discouraged from petting animals, people who choose to pet dogs should always let a dog see and sniff them before petting the animal.

- If you believe a dog is about to attack you, try to place something between yourself and the dog, such as a backpack or a bicycle.

How to Be a Responsible Dog Owner

- Obedience training can teach dogs proper behavior and help owners control their dog in any situation.

- When a letter carrier comes to your home, keep your dog inside, away from the door, in another room.

- Don't let your child take mail from the letter carrier in the presence of your dog. Your dog's instinct is to protect the family.

- Spay or neuter your dog. Neutered dogs are less likely to bite. HSUS statistics reflect that dogs that have not been spayed or neutered are up to three times more likely to be involved in a biting incident than neutered or spayed dogs.

- Dogs that haven't been properly socialized, receive little attention or handling, or are left tied up for long periods of time frequently turn into biters.

Heimbach Comes From Behind To Win

Blane Heimbach of Selinsgrove turned in an exciting come from behind performance to score a convincing win in Saturday night's 25-lap 410 sprint car feature at Port Royal Speedway, worth \$3,000.

In the 20-lap pro stock championship event, Tim Krape of Bellefonte picked up the checkers for his 80th career victory at the oval.

And Tim Wilson powered to his first win of the season in the late model main, wiring the field from the pole for the \$1,500 victory.

Many may have thought the sprint car feature was a write off when the lineup was announced with two-time 2013 winner Doug Esh on the pole alongside Mike Erdley.

But Heimbach proved them all wrong. While Esh drove out to the early lead with Erdley keeping pace, Heimbach bided his time from the third starting spot.

In fact, he allowed fourth starter Davey Sammons to run into third for the first eight laps before taking the spot back.

Racing through traffic, Erdley was still keeping pace with Esh on the ninth tour when a caution flag regrouped the field.

For the next several laps after the restart Esh and Erdley pulled away with Erdley applying pressure for the lead but with 10 to go, Heimbach began closing on both drivers.

The front pair of Esh and Erdley nearly crashed on the frontstretch as they got caught up racing one another with Esh pulling a massive drop back to the bottom of the track just as Erdley was making a run for the lead off of the fourth corner.

After some evasive swerving by the pair to avoid a collision, Heimbach pounced on Erdley for second with seven laps to go and then set his sights on Esh.

And with Esh on the cushion, Heimbach had his machine hugging the inside rail off of the fourth corner and that's where he made the winning pass to motor by Esh with five to go.

And from there it was clear sailing through traffic for the victory, which was the fourth of Heimbach's career at the speedway.

Esh held on for second with Erdley third followed by Chad Layton and Dylan Cisney.

Sixth through 10th went to Mike Wagner, Davey Sammons, Daryl Stimeling, Rick Lafferty and Keith Kauffman. Heats for the 23-car field went to Esh, Erdley and Heimbach.

Krape started sixth in the pro stock championship race and took the lead from polesitter Dan Berry on the fourth circuit.

A yellow flag with seven laps completed found Tim Fedder on Krape's tail for the restart and although Fedder was able to get his car underneath Krape on the restart, Krape was able to motor away on the straightaways.

After being involved in a multi-car crash on the seventh lap, Scott Landis rejoined the field at the rear and came racing back through the field to finish a stout third.

Nate Stroup, who was also involved in the incident, came back for fourth followed by Nate Fisher.

Sixth through 10th went to Jared Fulkroad, Dave Berry, Chase Bowsman, Dustin Kirk and Shawn Stahl.

Heats for the 13 entries went to Krape and Andrew Shoop. After finishing in the top three several times over the previous weeks, Tim Wilson finally put together a winning performance in the late model main.

DARLINGTON, S.C.—Kyle Busch appeared headed to victory lane in Saturday's Sprint Cup race at Darlington, but with 11 laps left in the 367-lap race, Busch had a right rear tire go down. This allowed Matt Kenseth to take the win, while Busch had to settle for sixth.

"It's awful sweet to win here," said Kenseth. "The car was really, really fast. We had a lot of speed in it. We just kind of got off. The racetrack changed, we got much looser than we anticipated. We really could never get it. The second to last pit stop we made we had it closer, but then it took off and wasn't going to be near good enough. I don't know what they changed the last pit stop.

"I told them about four laps into the run, if we were going green to the end, we were going to be pretty good. Thankfully we saved the best for last."

The win was the third for Kenseth this season, and the 27th of his career.

Denny Hamlin, Kenseth's teammate was runner-up.

"For me, we just kept grinding away," said Hamlin. "It was one of those days when we got our car better, pit crew picked us up positions, and took us to the second spot."

Jeff Gordon ran a steady race, and as the laps wound down, moved up to third.

"Our team is ready," said Gordon. "We had good track position, but we just couldn't get it right until there at the end. I thought we were really good. Each week I see the team getting better and better."

Jimmie Johnson was fourth and Kevin Harvick came in fifth.

For Kyle Busch, it was another frustrating night. He had the dominant car throughout the entire race, leading 265 of the 367 laps, but the apparent victory slipped away as the race

neared its end.

Busch left the track without commenting. His frustration is understandable; he was fixing to win, and a misfortune smacked him, again. However, it could've been a lot worse. He could've hit the wall. He could've spun. The good news is he jumped two spots in points, and he still storms off.

However, an incident between him and Kasey Kahne, has Kahne expecting an apology from Busch. It occurred on lap 333, after Kahne had managed to edge by Busch in Turn 3 for the lead. Busch moved ahead off Turn 4, then headed to turn 1 side by side. It appeared Kahne went into the turn a little too fast. Busch went low into the turn, but slipped a little.

Kahne slid up and brushed the wall. "My car moved and then just spun out," said Kahne. "I don't know if he actually touched me or not. If he would have just entered normal like he entered the whole race there would have been no issues and I would have been leading off turn 2. "He just didn't want that to happen, so he blew turn 1. Whether he hit me or not, he still caused that whole deal with screwing up and just mind fade. He's had a few of them this year when I've been around him."

Carl Edwards, Juan Montoya, Dale Earnhardt Jr., and Ryan Newman rounded out the top-10.

DID NASCAR SUFFER A SETBACK

NASCAR needs to rethink their penalties.

Last week, the penalties assessed by NASCAR against Penske Racing and Joe Gibbs Racing were reduced after the appeals process was completed.

Joe Gibbs' owner points penalty was reduced from 50 to 12, and his suspension was eliminated, while driver Matt Kenseth's points penalty was reduced from 50 to 12.

Kenseth's win at Kansas will now count for the Chase.

The manufacturer's point penalty against Toyota increased from 5 to 7 points;

Kenseth's crew chief Jason Ratcliff's suspension has been reduced from 6 races to 1, but his fine remains at \$200,000.

In the Penske case, crew suspensions were reduced from six point races to two on its final appeal.

Chief appellate officer John Middlebrook upheld the 25-point penalties to Penske drivers Brad Keselowski and Joey Logano, as well as fines and part of the suspensions. He created the perception that the violations were still major, but the team should get some benefit of the doubt, since they were working in a gray area in the rulebook, and not having raced the unapproved parts, shouldn't result in such hefty suspensions.

Come on NASCAR, quit acting like a big gorilla. PHOENIX RACING CALLING IT QUILTS

Unable to find a long-term sponsor for either of his No. 51 Sprint Cup team, or No. 1 Nationwide team, James Finch said he is going to call it quits.

"I'm contemplating the rest of this year, and I don't know if I want a sponsor," Finch said. "Sunday was my 776th start in NASCAR between the Nationwide and Sprint Cup. That's a lot of weekends. I'm considering pulling the plug later in the summer."

Finch, 62, said Phoenix Racing will not enter any races after the Brickyard 400 at Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

"I have not been able to get the right amount of funding, the economy is pretty bad, and a lot of people don't want to do it," Finch continued. "I'm getting kind of burned out. I think it is time for me to do something else."

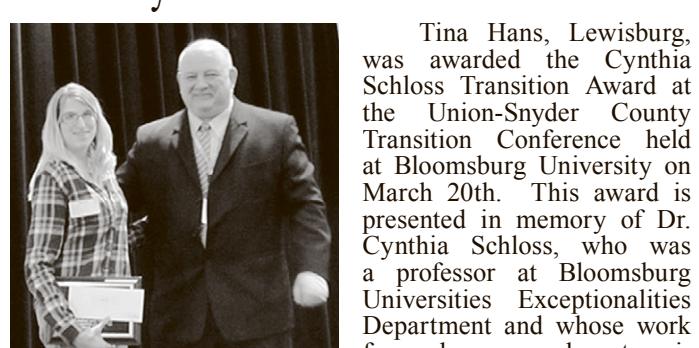
