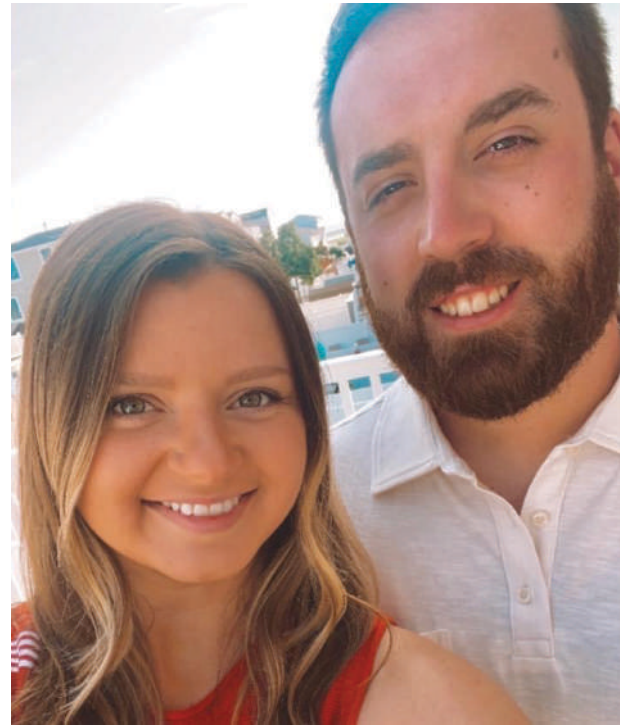

Dylan Yoder Wins the Points Championship at Port Royal

Dylan Yoder of Middleburg picked up his third Port Royal super late model title in six years getting the championship on the last night of points at the speedway. Dylan entered the night 25-points behind defending champion Rick Eckert of York, Pa., Both drivers knew what they had to do; Dylan had to beat Rick by a few spots in the front of the field, while Eckert just had to keep Yoder close to the finish of the race. Rick won his heat race a Dylan was second in his, and with the invert for the 33-lap feature they started in row four side by side. Extra incentives were available in the race and extra money on the line because of the running of the 21st annual Butch Renninger Memorial paying the winner \$8,333 to win. In the first seven laps of the feature Dylan settled into fifth place with Rick was right behind him as they raced for the championship, but that all ended on lap eight when a broken drive shaft on Eckert's #0 ended his night getting credited with a 25th place finish. Dylan saw the car towed off the track, and knew if he keeps his nose cleaned the title was his. "There was some good money to win this race for a little while I did try to move up, put after a few laps battled with Dillan Stake was to close for comfort". Dylan decided let's look at the big picture and just finish the race, which he did in sixth place, and the title was his, third of his career with the others coming in 2019-2021. "With Rick out of the race it made things less stressful for sure it was bad for him but we could use some good luck for once, it would have been fun to race it out. If Rick would have not dropped out, I might have tried a bit harder and work my way to the top of the track like I saw Mason Zeigler doing, because most of the rest of us ran the bottom or middle, Zeigler ended up second so it worked for him. I did not have a shot at winning the big money so I decided to stay where I was at and win the points. I did not win a race at Port this year and like getting them but we were consistent all year and that also helped us in winning the points." Noted Dylan.

For the season Yoder had nine top tens and four top five finishes in the point races run. He does have two wins this year one at Lincoln speedway during the Appalachian Speedweek show and the other at a ULMS series race at Outlaw speedway in Dundee N.Y. "The

points pay about what it is to win here \$4,000 so it makes it worthwhile to come here and race every week, and to win a title with driver like Rick Eckert, Hayes Mattern, Kyle Lee, Justin Weaver, my cousin Andrew (who placed fourth in points), Dillan Stake, Trevor Feathers and more it makes it tough to get wins". Dylan drives a XR1 Rocket chassis with a Clements Ford engine under the hood of his #24. "We had the same car and Motor racing all year so that is a good thing for us, that Ford has been a little better for us with time trial races, it helped me with the Speedweek races also it had a bit more power so I had to get use to that when starting the races, so I would not break the car loose on the start." Noted Yoder. Dylan wants to thank his crew and sponsors Strouse Electric, Valley Supply, S&R Repair, Broadband Networks and Ingram fuels, the crew and fans for their support.

WOO SERIES RACE CANCELLED AT SELINGSGROVE RACE MOVES TO LINCOLN SPEEDWAY

In the Recent events at Selinsgrove speedway, due to Stephanie Baker health concerns the race was to be run on Friday and Saturday October 11-12, Baker and the WOO series decided not to have the race at Selinsgrove which was to be a two-day show. The WOO series will now move the race to Lincoln speedway for a one-day show on Saturday October 12th, paying the winner \$20,000 to win and \$1,200 to start, with a four-cylinder class set to be the other division in action. There is talk with the WOO series for a date in the 2025 season at Selinsgrove speedway. Otherwise, they will receive a face-value credit to their MyDirtickets.com account good for two years or to be used toward any WOO event Available at WorldofOurLanes.Com/tix. If credit to the account does not work for them then you have until October 9th to request a refund.

The original event that was to be run at Lincoln speedway on October was a show for the super late model which was being promoted, by Jim Bernheisel, that event is now cancelled and will not be rescheduled for this year. "The Lincoln management team called me that we had a chance to get this show, and ask what I thought about it. I hate to lose a race that I am helping promoting being a late model guy, but they would be foolish to turn this deal down. I officially gave them my blessing, and I told them there is no hard feelings and that I understood where they are coming from, and in return for next year, they told me that they will have an increase purse for our late model Speedweek race. There is also a possibility for more super late model races there next year, which would be a positive thing to look forward to happening." Quoted Jim.

Last weekend was the big High Limit sprint events at Port Royal speedway, with over 50-some drivers on hand for the three nights of racing. Two of the three races were taken by the series regulars, while Aaron Reutzel a driver that has a pick and choose scheduled scored the win on Friday night. Brad Sweet and Rico Abreu scored the feature wins with Abreu getting the big Saturday 57th Annual Tuscarora 50 weekend collecting \$57,000 for the feature win. Anthony Macri did the best of the Posse drivers with two third place runs to go along with a bad flip in the Friday night program,

Justin Whittall also had a good weekend with a tenth, second and a fifth-place runs, Chase Dietz had a third, and ninth. On Friday night Mike Wagner wrapped up the Port Royal 410-sprint car title, outdistancing Chase Dietz by 90-points with Logan Wagner 105 out in third. In Thursday night action had Drew Young of Beaver Springs winning the 305 features over Ken Duke, Jr of Winfield who was the 305-track title winner at Port by 110-points over Owen Dimm, Zach Rhodes 160 back and Kruz Kepner 205 back in fourth, Port got six of the eight scheduled shows in for the class. The super late model part of the Tusky weekend, Hayes Mattern of Beavertown did place third in the track points 135 back of champ Dylan Yoder, another Middleburg driver Andrew Yoder placed fifth in the final points. Other news from Port Royal for 2025, the Bob Weikert Memorial race will take place on the weekend of May 23-24-25 which will be a Friday, Saturday, and Sunday events, paying \$75,000 to win on Sunday, also the Tuscarora 50 weekend has also been announced for September 4-5-6-, with the final on Saturday paying \$58,000 to win, all these events will be sanctioned by the High Limit racing series. That closes out the 2024 season at Port Royal with the Speed Showcase Weekend that was set for October 17-18-19 has been cancelled, with hopes of holding this event in March of 2025.

Williams Grove still has a number of shows left this season for sprint car fans, starting with this Friday September 13th with the Billy Kimmel Memorial for 410-sprints along with 358-sprints. The special for the 358-sprints has the winner collecting \$3,000 out of a total purse of \$19,000, Hard Charger and Hard Luck awards will be handed out for an extra \$250. Friday September 20th is the Kevin Gobrecht Challenge race for the 410-sprint along with the 358-sprint, September 27th is another two division show with the same two divisions, that all leads up to the National Open for the 410-sprint a WOO series race that pays the winner of the Saturday October 5th race \$75,000 to win.

Clinton County speedway closes out its season this Saturday September 14th with special events for the four-division show. The limited late model class will have time trials to set up the heat races with driver racing for \$1,500 to win. Matt Cochran has three wins, with single wins going to Andrew Yoder, Cody Lear and Ryan Zook. The Pro-Stock class will be racing for \$1,000 to win, with your home track rules applying for this race, same for the four-cylinder class racing for \$500 to win, along with the tracks 270-micro sprints racing for \$600 to win.

Super late models have two races this weekend with a bit of traveling involved, first Friday night September 13 the ULMS race will be held at Outlaw speedway in Dundee N.Y. for \$7,500 to win, Dylan Yoder who the race back in July and plans to be back for this race. Drake Troutman of Hyndman Pa. who has a weekend off from the Lucas Oil series where he is leading the ROY standings will be in the Big Frog Viper Motorsports #58, also Colton Flinger of Allison Park also is planning to be on hand. Saturday night the Freedom Raceway Park in Delevan N.Y. has a unsanctioned race with the winner getting \$5,000 to win. Dylan Cecce and Mike Knight have won features in the super so far this year at Freedom.

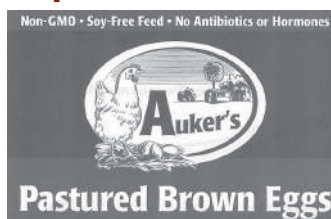

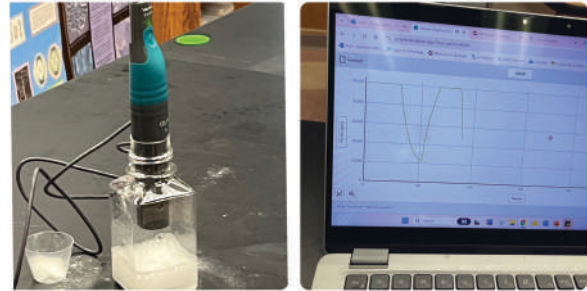

A local biology teacher, Jocelyn Bailey, is celebrating a significant boost to her classroom resources thanks to

a generous donation from the Alumni & Friends of the Mifflinburg Area School District Foundation. The donation allowed Bailey to purchase six new Vernier sensors, six Carbon Dioxide Sensors, and 6 Dissolved Oxygen Sensors cutting-edge tools that will enhance her students' learning experience and provide them with valuable hands-on scientific exploration.

"I'm incredibly grateful for this donation," Mrs. Baileysaid. "Vernier sensors are indispensable for modern biology education. They allow students to collect real-time data, analyze it critically, and develop a deeper understanding of scientific concepts."

The Vernier sensors will be used in a variety of biology experiments, including measuring changes in carbon dioxide during photosynthesis, measuring oxygen production of germinating peas, and respiration changes in fish and crickets to name a few. These tools will enable students to conduct more sophisticated investigations and explore complex biological phenomena.

"I'm excited to see how these sensors will inspire my students," Bailey continued. "They will have the opportunity to ask their own questions, design experiments, and make meaningful discoveries while participating in hands-on biology lab classes."

The Mifflinburg Area High School Alumni Association has a long history of supporting the school and its students. Their donation to the school district is a testament to their commitment to providing students with the resources they need to succeed.

Mrs. Bailey will use the Vernier sensors to create engaging and interactive lessons that will help students develop critical thinking, problem-solving, and scientific literacy skills. In addition, the Mifflinburg Area High School is making waves in the world of journalism thanks to a generous donation from the Alumni & Friends of the Mifflinburg Area School District Foundation. One of Mifflinburg Area High School's technology teachers, Mr. Sunderland, has recently acquired a state-of-the-art VizrtTriCaster for his Morning Video Production class.

The Vizrt TriCaster is a professional-grade green screen system that allows students to create high-quality newscasts and other video productions. With this new equipment, students can experience firsthand the process of producing news content, from writing scripts to editing footage.

"I'm thrilled to be able to offer my students this incredible opportunity," Mr. Sunderland said. "The Vizrt-TriCaster will help them develop valuable skills in video production, communication, and teamwork."

Box Tree Moth Discovered in Erie: First Pennsylvania Sightings of Invasive Insect Threatening High-Value Ornamental Shrubs Statewide

Harrisburg, PA – The box tree moth, a highly destructive, invasive insect new to North America, was recently discovered for the first time in Pennsylvania in two cemeteries in Erie County. The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture has issued a quarantine to help businesses and homeowners recognize the insect, learn how to control it, and keep it from spreading.

The insect feeds on and destroys boxwoods, which are frequently used as topiaries and hedges and featured in Pennsylvania's public gardens, parks, and conservatories, which are some of the oldest and most popular in the nation.

"This insect does not harm humans or threaten our food supply, said Agriculture Secretary Russell Redding. "It threatens livelihoods in our nursery and landscape industry, as well as the parks and gardens that enrich our communities and feed tourism dollars into our economy. Protecting communities and businesses from economic loss is a top priority of the Shapiro Administration."

Boxwoods are the largest-selling evergreen shrub in the U.S. The destructive box tree moth spreads primarily through shipping and sales of infected boxwoods. The insect had previously been found in Delaware, Massachusetts, Michigan, New York, Ohio, and Ontario, Canada.

Pennsylvania's nursery and landscaping industry generates \$4.1 billion for the state economy annually and is responsible for more than 63,000 jobs. Pennsylvania leads the nation in the number of floriculture businesses – those that produce garden and bedding plants, potted plants, and cut flowers.

Early detection is key to preventing significant damage, loss, and spread of box tree moths. Find information on how to identify and treat the insect, and safely remove and destroy infested materials at agriculture.pa.gov. Homeowners may contact your local PSU Extension office for treatment information.

If you suspect the insect on your boxwoods, please report it to badbug@pa.gov or 1-888-253-7189. Please indicate which life stage was found, if damage was present, and include photos if possible.

Pennsylvania's quarantine requires plant merchants in Erie County to ensure that boxwood sold in the county stays in the county, unless the business has a compliance agreement with the PA Department of Agriculture. A compliance agreement requires surveying, treatments, and record-keeping for shipments outside the county. To enter a compliance agreement in Erie County, contact the department's regional office at 814-332-6890 to schedule a time to meet with a plant inspector.

Several other states' quarantines require pre-notification to ship to their state. See nationalplantboard.org for other states' requirements.

WILLIAMSPORT, Pa. – Pennsylvania College of Technology's architecture & sustainable design program hosted a dedication on Sept. 9 to celebrate its move to a newly renovated space – on the fourth floor of the George S. Klump Academic Center – that enhances student workspaces and provides room for the growing program to expand its enrollment.

The renovation was funded by a portion of a \$1.4 million gift made by Coterra Energy through the Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development's Neighborhood Assistance Program. NAP provides tax credits to businesses that contribute to nonprofit organizations' efforts to revitalize communities.

Portions of the funding were also used to expand and renovate facilities for the college's electrical academic program and to provide scholarships to veterans and first responders who have participated in Camp Freedom.

“The partnership with the Department of Community & Economic Development and Coterra has made the renovation of our architecture suite possible, expanding enrollment capacities to create access for more students to thrive,” said Michael J. Reed, president of Penn College. “Our enhanced instructional spaces truly equip tomorrow's workforce regionally, nationally and globally.”

Offered since 1941, when the institution was known as Williamsport Technical Institute, the college's architectural program most recently was housed in the Hager Lifelong Education Center. Its move to the Klump Academic Center offers an array of enhancements.

“This renovation allows us to expand our program capacity by 60 students – an increase of more than 50% – while doubling the department's dedicated square footage, increasing the number of studios so each student has their own desk, and creating two separate general classrooms, two new computer classrooms, and two dedicated jury spaces,” said Ellyn A. Lester, assistant dean of construction and architectural technologies. “I'm thrilled to say that these changes achieved their intended goals: First-year student enrollment exceeded our projections.”

The changes enhance the student learning experience and help the college to meet requirements for NAAB (National Architectural Accrediting Board) accreditation. The college is in the process of attaining NAAB accreditation for its Bachelor of Architecture major, introduced in Fall 2023. The accreditation process takes about six years to complete and streamlines graduates' path to registered architect licensure.

“This renovation brings us out of relatively utilitarian rooms to a space that will foster our ability to bring our art and creativity to life,” said James T. McCollum, of Hummelstown, who is pursuing a bachelor's in architecture & sustainable design. “Each of us has our own walls and desks, allowing us to bring our own personal touches, inspiring us, and enabling us to get into a creative flow. There are significantly more windows that let in much more natural light and provide inspirational views of the campus, the mountains and sunsets. It also provides us with more open areas to spread out our designs and collaborate with one another when working on group projects.”

“I am so personally thankful for all of these upgrades to our spaces, and I know all of my fellow students greatly appreciate them, as well,” McCollum added.

To express appreciation to the Department of Community & Economic Development and Coterra Energy, Reed presented copies of the project blueprints to Rick Vilello, deputy secretary, Community Affairs and Development for DCED, and Bill desRosiers, manager of external affairs for Coterra Energy.

“You can change people's lives through design,” Vilello told the future architects in the audience, encouraging them to build communities that people can be proud of: “The workforce needs places to live. When people can live anywhere, why will they choose here? As architecture students, you can design the places where people choose to live.”

“Every time I come to this campus, I am inspired by something new,” desRosiers said, noting how graduates of Penn College's applied technology programs drive the energy industry, and the energy industry, in turn, drives all industry. “I look forward to seeing these students making an impact on this world.”

Coterra recently provided a contribution that will cover the fee for school districts and career and technical education centers to participate in Penn College's dual enrollment program, in hopes that more high school students will be exposed to the college's educational offerings.

Penn College offers an associate degree in architecture, a bachelor's degree in architecture & sustainable design, and a Bachelor of Architecture. The program's emphasis on sustainability and on providing software skills makes graduates “billable from day one,” Lester said.

Bridge Preservation Project Continues on I-80 EB in Union and Northumberland Counties for Bridge Project

Montoursville, PA – Motorists are advised that a bridge preservation project will continue on bridges carrying Interstate 80 eastbound over the West Branch Susquehanna River in Union and Northumberland Counties.

Piecemakers Quilt Guild (PQG) Welcomed Speaker Rita Grimes

Piecemakers Quilt Guild (PQG) of the Susquehanna Valley welcomed guest presenter, Rita Grimes and learned the art of making functional bags and pouches from snack bag wrappers.

Piecemakers Quilt Guild is a patchwork of quilt enthusiasts from all over the Susquehanna Valley who share one thing in common – a love of quilting. For over twenty-five years, Piecemakers has stitched together quilters of all ability levels to meet, share, and inspire; to learn new techniques and improve skills; and to build fellowship and a sense of purpose. Many members apply their talents to service projects, helping neighbors in need both near and far.

On July 28, Rita Grimes guest presenter, demonstrated a creative way that members can do their part to reduce their carbon footprint by turning empty snack wrappers into colorful, functional bags and pouches.

During the presentation, PQG members learned that tons of food packaging are discarded each year. Snack bags for products such as potato chips, are made up of multiple plastic layers, each used for a specific purpose – to keep moisture out, to keep grease from migrating to the outside, and to extend shelf life. These bags don't break down over time and are not recyclable in many areas. As a result, tremendous amounts of snack wrappers end up in landfills and oceans adding to an environmental crisis.

Since many grocery stores have eliminated the use of bags to cut down on waste, a handmade bag or pouch is a unique solution. Why not make your own rather than buy a shopping tote? Just begin by collecting empty snack bags!
