The event memorializes Duane Sharp, a Mifflinburg resident who suffered a stroke while riding ATV's in West Virginia. The stroke left him with limitations on one side of his body and he came to Evangelical Community Hospital's Acute Rehab unit with the determination that the stroke and resulting affects were not going to limit him in life. That meant getting back to golf, after modifying his golf club to work with the affects of the

stroke and addressing it in rehab he was back on the course enjoying the game. He also returned to the workforce and other hobbies that were dear to

Duane became part of the rehab unit family by providing encouragement to others struggling with disability in the stroke support group and attended yearly rehabilitation reunions. He also volunteered his own time to speak to stroke survivors one-on-one to show them what was possible during the recovery period. Since passing away he still serves as inspiration to many recovering patients as members of the acute rehab staff recount with others how he overcame any obstacles the stroke tried to put in his path.



Stephen Huddy, local historian, will discuss how in early Spring of 1942, within weeks of the Japanese attack on Pearl

Harbor, the War Department seized and then destroyed the village of Alvira—located in the White Deer Valley—to build the Pennsylvania Ordnance Works. That facility was a massive TNT production plant covering 8500 acres of prime farmland that uprooted hundreds of homesteads in both Union and Lycoming counties.

Remnants of the TNT factory can still be seen today on the grounds of the Allenwood Federal Correctional Complex in the form of "igloos"—the storage facilities used to hold the explosives. Also still standing is The Stone Church, where Lutheran services are still held today.
