## Protect Your Pet, Buy A License. It Is The Law!

Union County Treasurer, Diana Weikel, reminds dog owners to purchase 2012 Dog Licenses, for the safety of your family pet, if you have not already done so. If your pet gets lost, a license is the easiest way to identify the owner and return the dog home safely, and is a simple and inexpensive way to ensure your dog will be cared for in the event of an emergency. License is due on January 1st of each year "no matter" when you purchased your license last year. Dog license for all dogs 3 months or older is mandated

by Pennsylvania State Law. The department of dog law enforcement may charge fines up to \$300.00 For violation of this law plus court fees.

## Third Annual Duane Sharp Memorial Stroke Awareness Tournament



The Third Annual Stroke Awareness Golf Tournament in memory of Duane Sharp will be held at the Shade Mountain Golf Course, Middleburg, on June 28, 2012 with a 1 pm shotgun start. Registration is \$35 for a 2-man scramble, 18-hole format which includes dinner at the clubhouse, refreshments on the course, and gifts. Players are responsible for the green fees and carts. The event memorializes Duane Sharp, a Mifflinburg resident who suffered a stroke while riding ATV's in West Virginia. The stroke left him with limitations on one side of his body and he came to Evangelical Community Hospital's Acute Rehab unit with the determination that the stroke and resulting affects were not going to limit him in life. That meant getting back to golf, after modifying his golf club to work with the affects of the

stroke and addressing it in rehab he was back on the course enjoying the game. He also returned to the workforce and other hobbies that were dear to his heart.

Duane became part of the rehab unit family by providing encouragement to others struggling with disability in the stroke support group and attended yearly rehabilitation reunions. He also volunteered his own time to speak to stroke survivors one-on-one to show them what was possible during the recovery period. Since passing away he still serves as inspiration to many recovering patients as members of the acute rehab staff recount with others how he overcame any obstacles the stroke tried to put in his path.

Evangelical Acute Rehab will be holding blood pressure screenings and assessing stroke risk at the golf event to bring added awareness to stroke prevention and awareness.

Stroke is the leading cause of disability in the United States and in the top five causes of death in adults. Evangelical Community Hospital, Lewisburg, handles emergency care of strokes, provides diagnostic and interventional services to lessen the chance of stroke for high-risk patients, provides care to those who have suffered a stroke through acute rehab to help patients regain quality of life, and offers a stroke support group for individuals and families who are affected by the disease.

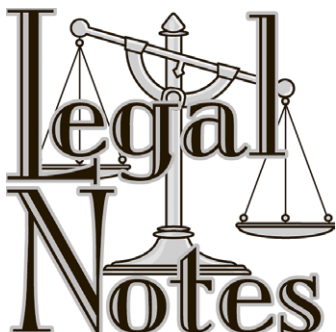

The Public Library for Union County will present Alvira and the Ordinance: An American Dream Denied at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 14. This program is part of the Lewisburg Area High School's One Book Every Sophomore program.



Stephen Huddy, local historian, will discuss how in early Spring of 1942, within weeks of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, the War Department seized and then destroyed the village of Alvira—located in the White Deer Valley—to build the Pennsylvania Ordnance Works. That facility was a massive TNT production plant covering 8500 acres of prime farmland that uprooted hundreds of homesteads in both Union and Lycoming counties.

Remnants of the TNT factory can still be seen today on the grounds of the Allenwood Federal Correctional Complex in the form of "igloos"—the storage facilities used to hold the explosives. Also still standing is The Stone Church, where Lutheran services are still held today.
