Historic House Tours and Exhibit

The Dale/Engle/Walker House, 1471 Strawbridge Road, Lewisburg is open for tours on Sunday, October 20 from 2 to 4 in the afternoon. The last tour of the season is on the 27th. These are the last chances to see the exhibit on the Union County Centennial and the exhibit on gristmills, based on the newly released Heritage book, "Water-powered Gristmills in Union County, Pennsylvania" by Tom Rich and David Del Testa of Bucknell University. The Gristmills book is available for purchase during tour hours at the house.

Tours of this c. 1793 limestone farmhouse include the original hearth with period cooking implements, the wagon shed with vintage tools and vehicles, and the milk house with dairy display. Interactive audio stations describe county history: early residents including immigrant Samuel Dale and family slave Dinah; farming and dairying: the Engels who ran a farm and dairy in the 1930s-40s. The house is a good example of 18th-19th century architecture, restored and maintained by the Union County Historical Society.

Directions from Route 15 in Lewisburg take Route 192 west for 1.5 miles and turn north on Strawbridge Road, continue 1.5 miles to the

TIRE BURNER TOWN HALL LOCATION CHANGE

The Tire Burner Team opposing the proposed En-Tire Logistics tire incinerator to generate steam and power for National Gypsum in White Deer Township announces a Town Hall Meeting on Tuesday, Oct. 22, 7:30 p.m., at the Warrior Run Area Fire Department Building, White Deer Ave., Allenwood. This will immediately follow the Department of Environmental Protection's informational meeting about the En-Tire projected scheduled for 6 - 7:30 p.m. at the same

The purpose of the Town Hall Meeting will be to discuss the DEP's permit approval and next steps for the project, explain the risks this tire burner poses, and organize the community for the various tasks involved in fighting the incinerator.

Fatal Motorcycle Crash

Craig A. Kratzer, 40, of New Columbia, was riding his 2011 Harley Davidson Street Glide west on Ridge Road, near Yonkin Road, in White Deer Township at approximately 1:54 a.m. on October 13, 2013. He failed to negotiate a right hand curve in the roadway and the motorcycle traveled off the north side of the roadway before continuing west along a ditch, striking a drainage culvert, east of Yonkin Road. Upon striking the culvert, Kratzer was thrown from his motorcycle and it overturned, sliding along the roadway.

Kratzer was pronounced dead at the scene by the Union County Deputy coroner Bradley Miller. Ridge Road was closed for approximately three hours for investigation. White Deer Fire Department assisted on the scene.

Deadly Bus Crash Tests Emergency Preparedness of Local Hospital

On Wednesday, October 9, 2013, a Greyhound Lines bus collided with a tractor trailer on Interstate 80. Victims were sent to area hospitals in the rare mass casualty incident. Evangelical Community Hospital's Emergency Department responded with medical treatment for 14 patients.

The Hospital's Incident Command Team was initiated into service at approximately 2:00 am with patients arriving starting at

This team of experts trains each month for incidents, including response to a mass casualty accident. Though done in simulation environments, those exercises prepare the team for reallife responses like the accident on Interstate 80.

Gregg Rokavec, Director of Environmental Safety and Security at Evangelical, said, "We always say we hope we never have to use our emergency response systems that are in place. In this case, we had to use the team to respond, and it is a validation that we are prepared to handle an emergency with mass injuries, and to do it in a way that puts patient care first and makes them as comfortable as they can be in an unfortunate situation.'

The Incident Command Team consists of employees representing the emergency department, infection control, security safety, pre-hospital services, nursing, surgical services, plant engineering, information technology, finance, and public rela-

The Hospital's Emergency Department responded with treatment for a total of 14 victims, 2 of those patients were transferred to another local hospital, and the remaining 12 were released after treatment. Additional victims were transported from the scene to Geisinger Medical Center, Susquehanna Health, Muncy Valley and Lock Haven.

Staff at Evangelical, from volunteers to nursing staff to physicians met the needs of the patients under their care assisting in connecting them with family members. A variety of Hospital departments cooperated in meeting the victims' emotional and psychological needs. Individual patient names and conditions are not being released.

Evangelical is working with representatives of Greyhound Lines who are assisting the victims in reaching their travel destinations.

Evangelical Community Hospital received the Healthgrades Outstanding Patient Experience Award in 2013 for the fifth consecutive year, making it one of two hospitals in Pennsylvania

to be recognized for consistent, positive patient experience.

Evangelical is a non-profit organization that employs approximately 1,300 people and has more than 170 employed and non-employed physicians on staff. 

During a pit stop under caution on Lap 87, Keselowski left his stall too early with the jack stuck under his car. It remained there for the entire 1.5 miles around the track. He

was able to return to his pits, and the team removed it.

"That was a big mistake on my part," said Keselowski. "We had a lot of struggles tonight. We didn't qualify well (23rd), but we kept working our way forward. I knew we had a good car. I'm not sure we were as good as the 48 (Johnson) or the 5

"I never got to really race them until the end, so I think we were probably pretty even. When they made the call to take four tires, and I saw we were close to the front, I knew we could get

The Hendrick Racing teams of Jimmie Johnson and Kasey dominated the race, but took only two tires on the last pit stop, which proved to be a mistake. Kasey Kahne led 138 laps of the 334-lap race, while five-time champion Jimmie Johnson led

Johnson was leading the race, with Kahne running second mph around the 2.5-mile Daytona International Speedway triwhen a caution came out on lap 309. On the restart, it was Kahne, Jeff Gordon, Jimmie Johnson and Brad Keselowski.

Johnson seemed to have the dominant car, but got off to a poor restart and was shuffled back to the eighth position. Kahne pulled out front, but Keselowski was able to catch him on lap 321, and two laps later, made the pass for the lead.

Keselowski became the first non-Chase driver to win a Chase race since Jamie McMurray in 2010.

"I actually had a good car all night," said Kahne. "We raced hard and came close. I rubbed the wall a little with a couple laps to go, and I knew that was the best I could do.'

Matt Kenseth's third-place finish kept him ahead of Johnson

'Based on where we qualified, I'd say we did a pretty good job," said Kenseth. "The car was real good there at the end, but we just couldn't get it to the front.' Johnson had to settle for fourth.

BRAUN SETS NEW DAYTONA SPEED RECORD Colin Braun became the first driver to average better than 220

oval in a special record run session last Wednesday. His speed of 222.971 miles per hour broke Bill Elliott's time

of 210.397 that was set in 1987, in a Harry Melling No. 9 Ford Braun's record-shattering run started coming at about 3 p.m., following a morning spent mostly on chasing demons whose

ugly little heads rarely arise until it's time to start chasing re-First up on that list was a wet track left overnight from Tuesday's rains. If anyone was to go fast through the track's 31-degree banking, the asphalt would have to be dry.

The track's jet-engined dryers were on the track at daybreak. When allowed on the track, the mechanical issues, such as they were, began to arise. Eventually, Braun was able to get on the track for his record-setting run.

'I'd have it on a line and it'd suddenly jump 10 feet to the right or 8 feet to the left," Braun said. "There just wasn't a feel for when or by how much it was going to do it; you just suddenly found yourself somewhere other than where you desired to be.' What Braun experienced was his car being lifted up by the

aerodynamics of the wind created at that speed. By 1988, NAS-CAR discovered that at speeds over 200 miles per hour, wind was able to get under the cars and lift the front end up, causing the entire car to become airborne. To remedy this NASCAR instituted the use of spacers or "re-

strictors" under the carburetor so the engine would not produce as much horsepower. This came to be known as "restrictorplate" racing, and continues to be used at Daytona and Talladega. With these engine restrictors in place, car speeds are kept below 200 mph, and keeps them from becoming airborne. Weekend Racing: The trucks and Cup teams are at the 2.66mile Talladega Superspeedway. 

Haunt To Benefit Local Transplant Fund

All sightseers including trick or treaters are invited to the annual Roushville Yard Haunt at 605 Spangler Street in New Berlin, just above the New Berlin Elementary School. The Roush family has been holding this event for the past 16 years and it's considered "the house" for Halloween. There's a full yard and garage display that includes skeletons, witches, and a variety of monsters.

"We're open for viewing October 28th to the 31st," Kelly Roush said, "and trick or treaters can stop on the 31st from 6:00-10:00 PM. "We have a lot of displays and we're very family friendly.

There aren't any actors jumping out to scare people.

This year the Roush family is partnering with Pennsylvania Cystic Fibrosis, Inc. (PACFI), and all proceeds from the event will go to the Save Chris Transplant Fund. Chris is a local young woman who has cystic fibrosis (CF) and diabetes. She's been on the lung transplant list at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center for several months and she was previously rushed to Pittsburgh to receive her new lungs only to find that the new lungs could not be transplanted due to an infection. Chris worked all her life until her health declined and now she works part-time when able.

PACFI has already donated \$1000 to her Transplant Fund, and the organization will send all proceeds to the Fund to help with expenses. The average lung transplant costs about \$650,000, and most insurance plans will cover about 80% of that, leaving the family to pay the remaining 20% or about \$130,000.

"This Halloween season we ask that if you come to see our display please place a donation in the container provided," Roush said. "It might be guarded by a witch, but she's friendly, so please stop in if you dare!" The first 15 donors will receive a special gift


