This section of the roadway was subject to a work zone pattern that was flagger controlled due to a lane closure for contracted tree trimming along the roadway. A 2011 Chevrolet Silverado driven by Ethan R. West, 19, of Wellsboro, while moving rearward from a stopped position struck a pedestrian. West was uninjured and the pedestrian Sammi J. Swigart, 42, of Williamsport, was transported to Geisinger Medical Center for the treatment of non-life threatening injuries. West was issued a warning for limitations on backing.

**Crash** 12:59 p.m. March 25, on New Berlin Mountain Road at its intersection with Turkey Run Road, in Buffalo Township. A 2010 Ford Focus driven by Xaeli Costales Cheverez, 19, of Lewisburg, was traveling north on New Berlin Mountain Road. The crash occurred as the Ford Focus attempted to pass another vehicle in a no passing zone. During this maneuver the Ford Focus exited the east side of the roadway and made contact with a tree. Following the initial impact, the Ford Focus continued traveling approximately 10 feet, rotating in a clockwise direction and subsequently struck a utility pole. The vehicle sustained disabling damage as a result of the impact with the utility pole and came to rest adjacent to the utility pole, facing west. No injuries were reported. Costales Cheverez was cited for pass when prohibited.

**Intimidation of Witness** 10 a.m. March 31, on S. 2nd Street, in Lewisburg. On March 31, PSP was present at the Union County Courthouse for a suppression hearing. The suppression hearing was in regard to an active June 2025 case with the accused William Wilson, 39, of Philadelphia. At the conclusion of the hearing, the court dismissed the motion to suppress in favor of the Commonwealth. Afterwards, Wilson made verbal threatening comments to the Troopers. Wilson is charged with intimidation of a witness, terroristic threats, and obstruction of justice.

**Hit & Run** 2:16 p.m. March 27, on Yarger Road, in Kelly Township. A 2023 Ram 2500 driven by Codayrio O. Clarke, 24, of Williamsport, was stopped on the shoulder of Yarger Road, facing east. The unknown vehicle was traveling east on Yarger Road. The unknown vehicle attempted to pass the Ram 2500. While passing, the passenger side mirror of the unknown vehicle struck the driver side mirror of the Ram 2500. The unknown vehicle fled the scene.

# Three Tracks Raced on Friday and Three on Saturday in Our Local Region, Two More Open this Weekend

Big Diamond got their first race of the season on Friday night with a show of 358-Modifieds, 602 crate Modifieds and Roadrunners, along with eight drivers in the 602 crate Modifieds. Mike Lisowski claimed the win in the 358-Modified feature for the opening night "Thaw Brawl" as the race was billed. Mike from Minersville, Pa. out raced Ryan Watt who led the first 13-laps before a caution on that lap slowed the fast-paced action down. Lisowski got by Watt on the restart and led the rest of the 25-lap feature to claim the \$4,054 paycheck over fourth starting Jared Umbenhauer, seventh starting and defending track champion Loudon Reimert came home in third, with Watt fading to fourth and twelfth starting Alex Yankowski fifth. Brett Kressley drove from his 22nd starting spot to a ninth-place finish, sixth place finisher Alex Payne started 18th with 22nd starting Tim Buckwalter seventh. Mike was very excited about his feature win. "Without that restart, I believe that I would not have been able to get around Ryan on this very fast track we had tonight. Drawing a good pill was also the key for the starting second. After the heat race, we really went to work because we were not very good at the heat. We had a new shock package on the car, and it was really good tonight. I must thank the crew for working hard after the heat to get the car changed. The track was really racy tonight and you could run in different spot. It was all the same and fast". Mike Started. Colin Cox drove past early leader Christopher Buffalino to win the 602 crate Modified feature, and the \$1054 top prize. He scored the win over Ryan Graver, Brennan Chapman, Teague Miller with Buffalino fading to fifth. Alex Schoffstall drove to the win in the 20-lap roadrunner feature over Joe Bassininsky and Terry Kramer. In the 602 Crate feature, Kevin Fitzpatrick drove to the win, adding to list of Fitzpatrick drivers who have raced there before Kevin. Second place finisher Devin Whitmoyer is another family name that has a long history of racing at Big Diamond. 30 358-Modifieds 29-602 Crate Modifieds 12-Roadrunners were in action for the start of the 54- season of racing at the Minersville PA area speedway.

Also, on Friday night at Williams Grove Steve Snyder Jr. from Rising Sun, Maryland, who moved up from the 600-micro-sprint ranks scored his first ever 410 sprint car feature win. Driving a second, Mike Heffner sprint car the 21-year-old driver had to hold some of the best drivers in the business. First, Anthony Macri did grab the lead for one lap before he flipped and suffered some vertebrae damage. Lance Dewease then gave chase but Snyder hung on for the win over Dewease, Freddie Rahmer, Dylan Norris, and Brock Zearfoss. Chase Gutshall of Middletown Pa. won the 358-sprint car feature over Brett Wanner, Derek Locke, Cody Fletcher and Brock Hammaker. At Bedford Speedway, Matt Sponaule scored the 25-lap super late model feature over Shawn Shoemaker, Trevor Feathers, Tim Smith and Bryan Bernheisel. The win for Sponaule was his 10th career feature win at Bedford. Lane Snook won the limited

late model feature over Greg (Spike) Moore Kyle Lear, Bryan Benton and Devin Weyandt. Snook, who won four Limited late model features at the track in 2025, was planning to drive in the super late model class, but had engine trouble the first night out and will run his limited until the engine can be fixed.

Saturday at Baps speedway Coleby Frye won the limited late model feature that was a race to honor his uncle Dale (Smokey) Frye. Coleby has won this race a few times in the past couple of years. This win was special because with his 13th Career feature win that ties him with his uncle for eight on the tracks all time win list. Frye was driving the #000 that is owned by Pat McNeal, for which Coleby will be driving Friday nights at Selinsgrove in the super late model division. The limited Coleby was driving is usually driven by Dale Murphy, but he was away so Coleby got the right to drive the car and won the race. "I have Fox shocks on the super late model, and I put them this car tonight. They worked great. This car drives a bit differently than my usual ride the Benyou #3b, but they are both Rocket chassis cars". Young 22-year-old Dawson Walls was second; Dawson is in his full year of driving limited late models, after racing micro-sprints before that. For Dawson, it was his best effort to date with his second-place run. Chad Smith was third, with Tommy Slanker and Skylar Taschek, with Dawson Walls dad Michael sixth. Tommy Slanker has the number 94 on his silver late model to honor his dad and Uncle Dale who ran those colors and number back in the day. Scott Dellinger who his second winged super sportsman feature of the year at Baps holding off a strong running Kenny Edkin who drove from his sixteenth starting spot to a second-place finish. Third were Matt Ondek, Troy Hockenberry, and Timmie Barrick in the top five. Dave Dietz was credited with the street stock feature win after the first and second place cars were DQ in post racing inspection. Female driver Presley Almoncy raced to a fifth-place finish and had a very unusually lettering job on the trunk ALL CUTS AND NO NUTS. Andrew Ricketts, in a rare start at Baps in the four-Cylinder class, beat the 23-car field for the feature win. 26 limited late models, 18 Super Sportsman, 17 street stocks were in action on Saturday night. Lincoln speedway, like Baps, got their fourth racing program of the year last Saturday with Danny Dietrich getting the win over Freddie Rahmer, Cameron Smith, Matt Campbell and Preston Lattomus. Cody Fletcher made it two for two winning the 358-sprint car feature over Eli Tuckey, Jayden Wolf, Hunter Fulton, and Logan Spahr; Lincoln had 24-410 sprints and 18-358-sprints. Port Royal got the 410-sprint feature in with the 305-sprints and the limited late model feature getting rained out. Both those features will be made up on Saturday, April 18th along with another program for the two divisions, along with the super late models in action. Jake Karklin scored his first ever Port Royal speedway 410-sprint feature win leading after 22 laps when the rain came in and stopped the action for the night. Doug Hammaker had his best finish in some

time with his second place run with AJ Flick subbing for Mike Walter in the #77 third; Troy Wagaman Jr and Brock Zearfoss were in the top five.

This Friday night Selinsgrove speedway will open their 80th year of racing this Friday night with the 410-sprint and the super late models. Clinton County will open this Sunday, with a four-division show of IMCA 305-sprints. Clinton will not have any sanctioned races this year with either the Laurel Highlands, which had been at the track for the last few years, or the PASS group. 270-micros sprints, Pro-Stocks and Four-Cylinders will also be in action.

On a sad note, sorry to hear of the passing of sprint car driver Jim (Cowboy) Kennedy of Evertt, PA. He was 91-years old. Cowboy will be missed at Clinton County this year. Also, there was the passing of Ed Clark of Selinsgrove PA. Ed raced in a stock class at Selinsgrove. He was better known in his racing days as "Ralph Kramden" from the Honeymooners. He was 81 years old.

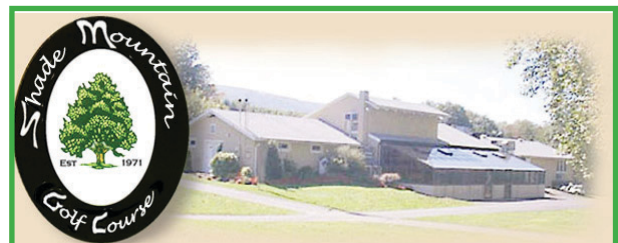

As Karklin began to reel Hauck in and a battle for the lead began to take shape, Hauck's sprint car would lose power and slow to a stop on the front straightaway, bringing out the caution flag and giving Karklin the lead.

With 22 laps remaining, Karklin would lead the field to green with Ryan Smith and AJ Flick tight on his tail to battle for the top position.

Karklin was able to keep Smith at bay over the next 10 laps, and as he caught lapped traffic, Smith's machine would also slow and see him exit the track giving Karklin a much more comfortable advantage over the now third running Doug Hammaker.

Though the breaks kept coming Karklin's way seemingly, the driver of the 5K would once again slip up in turns three and four. Though he was able to keep the car straight ultimately and not bring out a caution flag, his multi-second advantage over Hammaker was now erased to under 0.8 seconds.

Karklin would get back hard on the throttle in an attempt to keep Hammaker out of arms' reach as Hammaker continued to close the gap in the closing laps.

The final break would fall Karklin's way for the night

though, as rain would fall quickly onto the racing surface making the track unraceable and ultimately the night unsalvageable for the teams and the fans.

As there were only 3 laps remaining in the A-main, the race was deemed official and Karklin was ruled the night's winner.

The win is Karklin's first win in a 410 sprint car at Port Royal Speedway that sees him taking the winner's share of \$5,000.

Hammaker would take a career best finish of 2nd and AJ Flick would round out the top 3.

Buddy Schweibinz was the night's hard charging driver for going +15 from his 23rd starting spot.

Unfortunately the River Rock Campground limited late models and Penns Valley Meat Market 305 sprint car A-main events were not able to be completed and will be made up when both series return on April 18th.

Port Royal Speedway will be back in competition on April 11th with the PA Posse 410 Sprint Car Series racing for \$6,000 to win and the Penske Racing Shocks super late models.

The new rules of NIL (college athletes being paid for their Name, Image and Likeness) has allowed the Big Ten conference to separate themselves from all other conferences. Big Ten schools are big, smart, affluent, prestigious and their graduates are spread all across the country.

The UCLA win over South Carolina in the title game was overshadowed by the theatrics the UConn coach displayed in Carolina's previous game. Geno Auriemma was way out of line with his displeasure of Carolina coach Dawn Staley not shaking his hand pre-game, if in fact that was the reason as Geno claimed. Videos show them both shaking hands before the game.

I don't care if he has the most career wins in women's college basketball history, you don't act like a petulant child. I actually came to respect Auriemma after his early, cocky years at UConn. Geno has a history of berating other hall of fame coaches. If he's not getting the headlines he will take it by doing what he did with Staley. You don't walk off the court before the game is over without acknowledging that the other team and coach were better than you.

The Michigan win over UConn in the men's championship was not an easy watch in the first half unless you appreciate great defense. Michigan won 69-63 after scoring ninety or more points in their previous five games in the tournament. Big Blue proved it could win any type of way.

The 33 points Michigan scored in the first half were all from the paint or from foul shots. They shot just 2 for 15 from 3-point range but their size, depth and physicality was too much for UConn to handle.

Did you know that all five of their starters were not on the Michigan campus last year? They all transferred in from other schools. There is hope for your favorite team as the transfer portal for college basketball opened up this week.

This is why coaches have different models on how to build their rosters. Some take the top-rated high school recruits for the one and done athlete that will go to the NBA after one year. This is what Duke is currently doing and past John Calipari teams did. This year's tournament showed it's more difficult with one or two great freshmen on a team to beat the older and more veteran built teams.

Michigan this year and other teams pick and poach players they want through the transfer portal. Illinois took a team to the Final Four with six players from the Central Balkan region.

Expect new North Carolina coach Michael Malone to recruit that same Balkan region heavily as he builds his team for next year. Malone used to coach NBA star Nikola Jokic when he was with the Denver Nuggets. Jokic's agent has over forty players he represents from the Balkans region that play professional basketball in the Adriatic League.

These players can make more money playing college basketball in the States and I am sure Malone has already reached out to them. College hoops has always been transactional. Ten years ago it was signing a letter of intent, today it's about money and signing an NIL deal.

I really like the way Penn State football is reconnecting their current players with past Nittany Lions. I realize past players have always returned to Good Ole State for games and special events. This feels different as they are making a concerted effort to bring the football family closer. I'm not sure if new coach Matt Campbell was the impetus for this but someone should get credit.

Locally we had the Lewisburg girls track and field team sweep a tri-meet with Danville and Midd-West and the boys split in losing to Danville and beating the Mustangs.

It's no surprise that defending state champ Baylee Espinosa won the 1600 and 3200 and helped the 4x400 relay team take first place. Kate Batkowski was also a triple winner in the 300IM hurdles and ran a leg in both the 4x400 and 4x800 relays. Midd-West's Carly Faulhaber took first in the 100.

Justin Nolt took three golds for the Lewisburg boys. Nolt won the 1600,3200 and 4x800. Connor Stoltzfus won the 400 and Wyatt Nelson the 800 for Midd-West. These two also combined with Lyncoln Hoffman and Parker Eppley to take first in the 4x400 relay.

Lewisburg and Midd-West traveled to Cumberland Valley last weekend to compete in the 34 school field at the esteemed Bruce Dallas Invitational. Espinosa won the 3200 and Stoltzfus finished just .33 seconds behind the winner in the 800. The Lewisburg boys finished fourth in the team race and the Lewisburg girls finished third.

Props to the Miff LAX team as they handled Wyoming Area 17-5. Dalton DeLong had six goals and Brayden Hommel added three for the Cats first win of the year.

Mifflinburg remains undefeated on the diamond in both baseball and softball. Pitching was an afterthought in the first inning of the boys 17-5 win over Hughesville. Nine combined runs were scored by both teams in the first frame. The Spartans never scored again and the Cats tacked on another 13 after a pep-talk

from fired up pitching coach Steve Hackenberg.

JP Marr went 4 for 5 and scored three runs. Brennen Snyder went 2 for 4 with four runs and two ribs. Cole Reibosome was 3 for 5 with two runs and four RBIs.
