Singercise Offered Free for Those With Parkinson's



The Greater Susquehanna Valley YMCA has partnered with Bloomsburg Music Therapy to offer Singercise, a free, therapeutic class for people battling Parkinson's disease. Singercise aims to improve speech intelligibility, increase vocal intensity, and improve respiration and swallowing, all while providing a source of social support in a fun and engaging setting. The program, offered completely free of charge to participants and their caregivers thanks to a community grant from the Parkinson's Foundation.

Singercise is currently being offered both in-person and virtually. In-person classes meet at the Lewisburg YMCA at the Miller Center every Monday from 2:30 to 3:30 pm now through June 27 and virtual classes meet via Zoom every Wednesday from 1 to 2 pm beginning April 13 and running through June 15.

Class is led by board-certified music therapist Alysha Suley, MM, MT-BC, a member of the American Music Therapy Association and the International Association for Music & Medicine. Singercise is open to individuals of all physical ability and fitness levels who are battling Parkinson's disease.

Previous participants have seen marked improvements in their speech and breathing, with one participant saying, "A friend recently commented on how much better I was speaking and sounding."

Another attendee remarked, "My husband and I find the program to be enjoyable, and both of us have seen some positive results. It also gives us something positive to do together relative to Parkinson's rather than focusing on all the negatives that come with the disease."

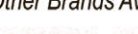

Beaver Valley Country Store in Beaver Springs is one of the clients that accessed the no-cost educational programs and one-on-one expert consulting services of Bucknell's Small Business Development Center (SBDC) as they took steps to plan and launch their new company.

Businesses of the region have felt many negative impacts and faced significant challenges throughout the two years of the COVID-19 pandemic, but for 68 small business owners, the future looks bright!

That's the number of new businesses that were started during the last two years by clients of Bucknell's Small Business Development Center (SBDC). Each of these entrepreneurs accessed the SBDC's no-cost educational programs and one-on-one expert consulting as they took steps to plan and launch their companies. Some of the newest include Rick Maloyed as a new co-owner of Beaver Valley Country Store in Beaver Springs, Amber Gardner, who launched Amber Gco Photography studio in Lewisburg and Nick Fuller's startup Mindful Central PA in Danville.

Additionally, 138 existing businesses turned to the SBDC for guidance as they secured over \$35 million in capital to sustain or expand their operations in the same period of time. From the very first days of the pandemic, the SBDC mobilized to help these firms successfully navigate new relief programs like the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) program from the United States Small Business Administration (SBA), as well as state grant and loan programs.

And it's not just entrepreneurs launching new endeavors: the SBDC itself continues to innovate and develop new services for individuals and firms of the area. One of these, initially launched just before the pandemic, is Startup Danville, a business incubator providing office space and conference rooms, specialized consulting services, and high-speed internet service to member businesses. Innovative firms starting up there also have exclusive access to networking opportunities with students, faculty and staff, as well as programs from throughout Bucknell's entrepreneurship ecosystem and regional economic development organizations.

Mark Burke, founder of Mynddset notes, "You get to spend time with other entrepreneurs, you get to share ideas, you get to share your struggles, and your successes with others who are going through exactly the same thing you are."

Bucknell's Small Business Development Center helps businesses with up to 500 employees in 6 local counties to innovate, grow, and attract capital. Over \$35 million in funding was secured by 138 Bucknell SBDC clients during the pandemic alone! It also operates two business incubators for early-stage companies.

The SBDC will once again run Bucknell's BizPitch competition for student startups at BizPitch on April 12, 5:30-7pm in the Terrace Room. It also employs 18 university student consultants who, along with the SBDC's professional staff, provide expert consulting services to clients.

On Tuesday April 5, 2022, the Union County Commissioners at their regularly scheduled public meeting approved a purchase and sales agreement that paves the way for the sale of 45 acres at Great Stream Commons to Patton Industrial Development, LLC at a price of \$1,375,000. Once finalized the transaction will represent the sale of the last remaining industrial land at the county owned business park.

"The final sale is a noteworthy accomplishment for the county and also a relief. The county debt tax in next year's budget will be eliminated creating a savings for our taxpayers", said Commissioner Chairman Jeff Reber.

Steve Patton, owner of Patton Logistics Group, said they are looking forward to being in the park and intend to construct 275,000 square feet of industrial space on the property. They hope to get underway fairly quickly seeking development approvals once due diligence is completed and the sale closes.

The land at Great Stream Commons was originally acquired by the county's industrial development corporation in the mid-1990's after a multi-year fight by the community to prevent a hazardous waste incinerator from taking up residence in Gregg Township north of Allenwood. In 2007 the first notable sale of 166 acres was made to Minneapolis based Target Corporation. Target planned to build a large distribution center on the site but the ensuing Great Recession scuttled those plans. The only other sales that occurred were to the Eye Center and to another medical provider whose four acres have since been acquired by Geisinger.

Following many years of no transactions Great Stream Commons finally took off and began picking up momentum with sales the county made to Snappy's convenience store and Mericle Commercial Real Estate in the summer of 2021. After that interest in the property continued to accelerate.

"I was very concerned when the Commissioners gave our office this assignment in 2018 given the history there and our lack of experience with economic development. It has been a tremendous learning experience and fortunately it all worked out thanks to the hard work of everyone involved," said Shawn McLaughlin, the county's Director of Planning and Economic Development.

Commissioner Stacy Richards said she was very pleased for the county and gave credit to Commissioner Preston Boop and her predecessors in former commissioners John Mathias and John Showers who already had the ball rolling. Richards also noted the excellent service the county received from John VanBuskirk and Bill Shrader with Lee and Associates the county's real estate broker.

"I have been hearing about Great Stream Commons from county taxpayers ever since I first took office. It wasn't like we weren't trying to sell it. For a multitude of reasons, the property always seemed to end up as the bridesmaid and not the bride when companies decided on where to locate. Fortunately, we got over that hurdle and the land is sold, jobs are being created and we have improved the local economy," said Commissioner Preston Boop.

All three county commissioners indicated they are looking forward to having Great Stream Commons in the rearview mirror so they can focus on addressing other county tasks. It is safe to say the county will not be undertaking any new county-owned business parks for the foreseeable future.

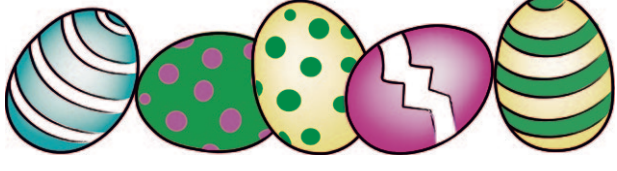
Members of the Good Time 4-H Club met on Sunday, March 13 at the Limestone Township Building for their monthly meeting.

The mission of the Embrace Hope Project is to provide comfort for End of Life (EOL) patients at Evangelical Community Hospital and their families," explains Chaplain Jackie Heitmann.

Comfort quilts are one part of the Embrace Hope Project. The comfort quilts are designed and handmade by community members. These are people in our community that have a special passion in quilt-making and share their gifts and talents in support of this program.

The donated quilts are a personal touch that not only makes the rooms a little more home-like, but also provides a warmth and evokes a sense of security to know that someone has put so much love into making their quilt. These beautiful handcrafted quilts are given to patients and their family members as a gift, something they can take home with them when they leave.

Evangelical Hospital's Spiritual Care Team blesses each finished quilt provided by the community. "We say prayers of kindness and peace and ask that each quilt bring comfort to the family and patient before and after the death of their loved one," explains Chaplain Jackie.

The comfort quilts measure 45 x 60 inches. Most quilts are given to adults with a variety of patterns and designs. Some are theme quilts such as sports, hunting, fishing, and camping for the male patients. Others are patriotic in nature and given to veterans to honor their years of service. Each quilt also includes an embroidered label.

In addition to a quilt, The Embrace Hope Project includes a French-seamed pillowcase. Each family receives an Embrace Hope felt folder which includes information about grief, what to expect during the End of Life process, and a packet of Forget-Me-Not seeds that symbolizes the continued spiritual journey of the soul. They also receive an embroidered butterfly that symbolizes the transformation from a physical state to a spiritual one.

"It is our hope that this program provides our families with the graces they need as they grieve and mourn," says Chaplain Jackie. "It has been such a privilege to come alongside our patients and families as we hold the space for their grieving and healing."

"We are glad to finally hold our banquet. It is three years' worth of recognitions wrapped into one due to the pandemic," said Raymond Skip Bryner, Jr., Association Manager.

Congratulations to inductees: Class of 2022- Kay Keiser and Raymond "Skip" Bryner, Jr.; Class of 2021- Marge Troutman and Brian Knepp; and Class of 2022- Deb Knepp and Karl Conrad. Each inductee received a citation from Rep. David Rowe (R-85) or Rep. Lynda Schlegel Culver (108), a certificate from PA State USBC President, Renee Talkington, and a clock/plaque from Central PA USBC.

2022 Hall of Fame inductee, Kay Keister, started league bowling with her father when she was 20. We didn't bowl very well, as our daddy said to the person interviewing us, but it's an awesome memory for us girls to hold close to our hearts."

"I have no huge scores to brag about, but I can honestly say, I enjoy this game, and am so thankful for all the friendships I have made over the years." Congratulations, Kay Keister on your induction into the Bowling Hall of Fame!

Central PA USBC welcomed Raymond "Skip" Bryner, Jr. into the 2022 Hall of Fame. In his career he has 39- 300 games and 23- 800 series, the highest being 847 (299-249-299) at Best Bowl. Currently, Skip holds the honor of having the most lifetime 300's (21) and 800's (17) at Best Bowl. He is proud to say that he has bowled a 300 game in 10 different centers, including one at the PSBA State Open Championships and one at the PSBA Sr. States. His highest average held is 235. He has bowled in 35 consecutive USB Open Championships dating back to the 1986 Las Vegas event, averaging in the high 190's lifetime. He has bowled in 38 consecutive PSBA Open Tournaments. 2021 Hall of Fame inductee, Marge Troutman, was also honored during the banquet. Throughout her bowling journey, Marge has won many local tournaments, the 600 series, been League Champion with her teams, hit an All Spare game and won High Average. "Someday, I hope to have a 300 game...I have gone to States for many years; and, on occasion I may win, but I certainly have a lot of fun. Through it all, I enjoy bowling and I have met a lot of fun people."

Central PA USBC welcomed Brian Knepp into the 2021 Hall of Fame. He has competed in 17 leagues in 10 different bowling centers over 46 years. He has attained a high season average of 220. He has to his credit nine 300 games, five 299, and four 298 games.

Brian has bowled in 35 PSBA state tournaments with a high of 295 in Allentown (1998), 15 years in PSBA Seniors where he has a 300 game, and 16 USBC National tournaments.
