The Military Units- LVRR 9052 (Veterans Unit) and LVRR 9050 (Memorial Unit) were parked in Hufnagle Park for public viewing honoring United States military service members – past, present, and fallen for their dedication to the United States Military Armed Forces.

The parade featured Gold Star Families, Mazeppa Veterans, Bucknell athletes, the United States Submarine Veterans and Veterans who served during many conflicts such as the Cold War, Korean War, Vietnam War to present day. Mifflinburg and Lewisburg bands marched in the parade as well. Wrapping up the parade, fire apparatus from across the Valley provided a stunning conclusion to the event.

According to Terry Burke, President of the Union County Veterans' 4th of July Celebration, there were approximately 200 entries in the parade this year with over 2000 participants. The Kingdom Kids was selected as winner of the 4th Annual Sgt. Thomas Reimensnyder Patriot for the best and most patriotic float in the parade. Susquehanna Community Bank has sponsored the contest each year.

"My husband and I are regular attendees of the annual Veterans Fourth of July parade in Lewisburg. Each year holds new surprises!" exclaimed Debbie Bilger of Selinsgrove. "I really enjoyed seeing all the classic and antique cars transporting the veterans from all branches of the military. I especially liked the red white and blue Jeep carrying Bob Elliot, Cold War Navy veteran of the Cuban Crisis. The American Legion motorcycle riders roared through town making quite a commotion!"

Debbie's husband, Sang, enjoyed giving high-fives to the Bucknell basketball players as they passed by. He enjoyed the excitement of the children who were scrambling to get candy and goodies that were being thrown. "We both enjoyed watching the running scarecrow with the Wizard of Oz float representing the Campus Theatre. It was a very fun and interactive float. Most of all the weather was fantastic and it didn't rain on the parade!"

Following the parade, 5 mini-concerts were performed by the bands participating in the parade including The American Originals, Lewisburg and Mifflinburg High School Band, Fralinger String Band, Upper Schuylkill Band and Keystone Regiment Drum and Bugle Corps who also entertained the crowd before the parade doing a "walk-it-back" parade. The concerts were held in the gazebo at Hufnagle Park for an appreciative crowd.

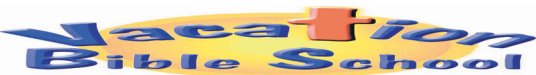

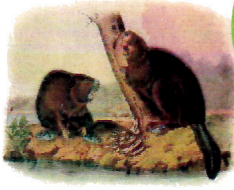

Darwin L. Boyer, 89, Lewisburg

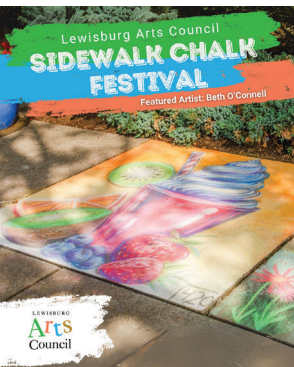

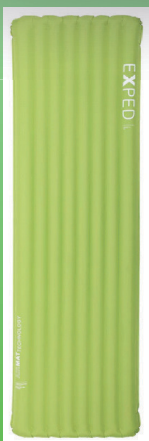

Locals Andrew Yoder and Cory Long Win at Clinton County, PA 410 Sprint Speedweek gets Two Out of 4 with BAPS and Lincoln Speedways

“That was all luck tonight! I was not very good most of the night, the whole race. It was like I was racing on ice. I could not go anywhere after a few restarts. About eight laps in, it started to feel a bit better, but all was not really good. I could not zip around and do whatever, but it was good enough to get the win. Things just fell our way. My Uncle Jim was really good, and I never would have caught him, but he broke a right rear shock late in the race. That helped open the door for me. I thought his car just got tight, so I went outside on the restart, and he washed up the track which I did not expect, but he broke a shock. That left JR get by me. We started to pass each other three or four times, then at the end, I was going to throw a move at him, but after the restart, I knew I did not want to ride in second. It just worked out. I don’t know any other way to put it, but we just had things go our way. Being “lucky” over “good” is sometimes a nice thing to have happen and that is how it was. The track was good at the bottom but was a bit dirty and slippery from that early shower that happened during warm-ups. The middle to the top was good. If I hit it perfectly with throttle control and brake, I could move around the corners great, but if I missed one step at all, it was not going to get off the corners. On the restart, JR lit them up going down the straight a-way and that left me get back to his outside. I got a good run down the back chute, and then I got off the corner better than him and that is what won the race for me at the end. That was a lot of fun racing him. I went over and talked to him, and he said the race was awesome. It was tough not to win but that race was fun. If Jim Yoder did not break that shock, I do not believe I had anything for him. He had the best car, but he broke, and we had a shot and took the win”, stated Andrew.

Cory Long of Selinsgrove scored the pro-stock feature win Friday night at Clinton County his first of the year. The 2023 track champion had to hold off the hard charger of Tommy Dawson to get the win. Cory is now leading in the tracks point standings with seven-point races left in the season. The Pro-stocks have the next two Friday nights off from Clinton County but will be back in action on Friday July 18th. In four races so far, Cory has three top three runs and one bad night out of top ten in his finish. But in the last three races, he has been in the mix for feature wins.

The ten race PA Sprint Car Speedweek did not start out well with the first two races getting rained out (Williams Grove last Friday and Lincoln last Saturday). It is like other series events similarly to the late model Speedweek only getting four of eight races in. But the Late Models have a make-up date for the series coming on Friday July 11th where Gregg

Satterlee will come into that race with the points lead and two feature wins in the series. Mason Zeigler also has two wins but not running for points. Satterlee, of Indiana PA, has 3485 points with Trevor Feathers of Winchester VA next at 3355. Then comes Bryan Bernheisel of Jonestown PA with 3311, Dan Stone of Thompson PA at 3236 and fifth is Kyle Lee of Mercersburg PA with 3199.

Danny Dietrich of Gettysburg PA beat the strong field of 46 drivers on hand for the Sunday show at BAPs Speedway holding off Chase Dietz, Ryan Smith, Freddie Rahmer and Anthony Macri in the top five. Monday night at Lincoln Speedway; made a great effort to beat the rain and Freddie Rahmer passed Anthony Macri who started on the pole for the win. Rain came with just 5 laps to go for the original 30 lap race. Tuesdays show is at Grandview Speedway, Wednesday the first of two shows at Port Royal (the other this Saturday July 5th). Thursday, the series is at Hagerstown, Friday back at Williams Grove with things coming to an end on Sunday July 6th, at Path Valley Speedway.

Not much going on as rain took out most of the tracks that had races scheduled last weekend. Port Royal was able to pull off their racing program which was the Blue-Collar Classic for the IMCA race savor 305-sprints. Also in action was the Limited Late Models in the Ron Zimmerman tribute race. Nick Sweigart became the first three-time winner of the Classic holding off Christian Rumsey for the win. Rumsey led for a brief moment in the closing laps, but Sweigart got the lead back and the feature won over Rumsey followed by Dustin Young, Ken Duke and Logan Spahr. Beaver Springs racer Drew Young earned the Hard Charger award by finishing in 8th from his 17th place start. The event drew a strong field of 51 drivers. Jarrett Cavalet won the 15-lap Founders cup race for non-qualified drivers, and that win guarantees him a starting spot in the 2026 Blue Collar Classis, Cavalet beat Reed Thompson and Kruz Kepner of Kreamer.

The \$6,000 winning Limited Late Model Zimmerman race was won by Lane Snook who had the perfect night with fast time winning his heat. Then he led all 25-laps of the feature for his first ever Port Royal win. Snook now has won nine features this year overall. Three each at Selinsgrove and Baps speedways, two wins at Bedford and now won at his hometown track of Port Royal. Ryan Zook placed second with DJ Myers, Devin Hart and Spike Moore in the top five. Hart was driving the Frank Gordon #92 while Moore was in the Jim McBee #11.

The super late models will be racing Thursday night at Bedford in a special race, while the supers will also be racing at Port Royal on Saturday part of the 410-Speedweek program. Selinsgrove is off this weekend but will have the Firecracker special for the Go-Karts on Friday night with Middleswarth chips sponsoring a number of giveaways for the drivers. Clinton County will have a four division show on Friday with the Laurel Highlands 305-sprints, along with East Coast Legends, 270-micro-sprints and four cylinders.

Another Speedweek gets started on Sunday July 13th for the Wingless 600 Micro-sprints with seven nights of racing, starting off at Bridgeport Speedway, then comes Airport, Greenwood Valley Action Track on Tuesday July 15th Kutztown, Lindas, BAPS and Clyde Martin Speedway.

A community college is one step closer to becoming a reality.

On June 6, 2025, Susquehanna Valley Community Education Project, Inc. purchased the property at 191 Performance Road, Sunbury, the location of the former Triangle School of Technology. Susquehanna Valley Community Education Project received financial support from private investors to purchase the property and begin processes for startup of a new private licensed school. The process includes submitting an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Education Bureau of Private Licensed Schools.

This is anotherstep towards the establishment of Pennsylvania's 16th community college that will serviceresidents in multiple central counties including Snyder, Union, Northumberland, Montour,and adjacent counties.

Triangle Tech, a 30,000 square foot technology education facility was at the location on Route 890 in Sunbury for 22 years. Closing the school was a decision made at the corporate office in Pittsburgh and the owners were supportive of Susquehanna Valley Community Education Project with the intention of starting a new technical institute with similar and additional programs. The final graduation was held on February 27 and closed on February 28, 2025.

Real estate brokered by Century 21 Scott Mertz and NAI CIR Amber Corbo, project financing is by Journey Bank and transaction logistics managed by the Law Offices of Diehl, Dluge, Michetti, and Michetti. Community outreach programs and services are also being planned for downtown Sunbury.

Then Musser added, "Today is about celebrating community and our Mifflinburg community showed up in a big way to complete the Tot Playground and Pollinator Garden."

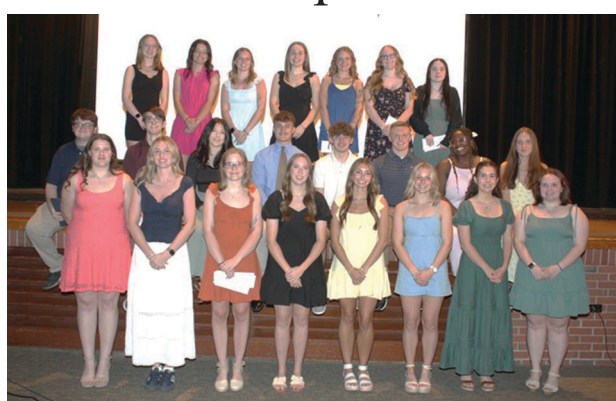
