The community of Lewisburg came together on Tuesday, August 5, 2025, to celebrate this year's National Night Out. Held at Saint Mary Street Park, the annual community-building campaign brought neighbors, local law enforcement, and emergency responders together to interact and strengthen relationships within the Lewisburg and Union County community.

National Night Out is a nationwide initiative held annually in August designed to enhance the connection between residents and the police officers and other first responders who serve them. The Lewisburg event, which ran from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., provided a perfect opportunity for these positive interactions where over ninety-five different agencies were represented.

Families and individuals of all ages enjoyed a wide array of free activities which included live police K9 and martial arts demonstrations, an alpaca petting zoo, a dunk tank, and a vehicle extrication demonstration by the fire department. Attendees had the chance to meet and interact with local police officers, firefighters, emergency medical services personnel, and even see a Life Flight helicopter. These important public

servants showcased their vehicles and equipment, providing a hands-on experience for children and an opportunity for adults to learn more about the services they provide to the members of our community. A space was also provided for guests to visit a variety of information booths from local organizations and agencies. The event featured live music by the Lucky Afternoon Band, and a highlight for many was the free swimming at the Lewisburg Community Pool, which offered a refreshing break from the summer heat. There were also free hotdogs and popcorn available to snack on throughout the event.

The excitement continued with a bike giveaway and other prizes, followed by a spectacular fireworks display that lit up the sky. Lewisburg's National Night Out celebration succeeded in bringing together the public and our local law enforcement, helping to build strong relationships, and creating a more caring and safe community for everyone. Nearly twenty local children dealing with loss gathered for a day of art therapy, healing, and time to just be a kid as Camp Koala hosted an Art Day Camp on Monday, August 4, 2025, at the Mifflinburg Community Park.

Children started out the day by creating steppingstones made from concrete and materials donated by the community which included stones, shells, and fairy garden supplies which each camper would be able to take home at the end of the day. A few extras were made which will be donated and placed in the new Tot Park.

Certified Art Therapist, Celeste Wade, of Conshohocken, Pennsylvania, worked with the children attending the camp. She showed me some of the steppingstones created by the campers and explained that "they have included some powerful symbols, like the bridge, which is symbolic of transformation."

Eastside Diner graciously donated the delicious lunch served to the campers which included pulled pork, macaroni and cheese and all the fixings. After enjoying their lunch, the children would work on a project using old records. Founder of Camp Koala, Lisa Streett-Liebetrau, said, "They start out by breaking some pieces they will use in their art, and then they put them all back together to create something special honoring their loved one. Kids then share or tell about what they created. It's kind of heavy, so then they go play on the playground and have some play therapy to lighten things up."

All participants finished the day with smiles while enjoying a special treat from Pelican's Snowballs. Thank you to Camp Koala and all of the volunteers who helped to make this art day camp so special for the children in attendance.

Last week the Buccos traded three above average players under contract for another year (David Bednar) four more years (Ke'Bryan Hayes) and three years of salary arbitration (Bailey Falter). What they got in return is a catcher from the Yankees in double A and a bunch of single A players none of which are rated a Top 100 prospect. An amalgamation of three pre-season polls has Texas, Ohio St, Penn St, Georgia and Oregon as their top 5. It's not surprising they are all SEC and BIG teams. Those two conferences are slowly taking over college football. It won't be long until Clemson and Notre Dame join them.

Penn Staters on this year's list are DT Zane Durant at #8 and RB Nick Singleton at #19. Feldman says Durant's twitchiness off the ball and his lateral movement is what makes him special. Singleton's speed and strength compares favorably to Barkley's. Nick broke Saquon's legendary RB squat record by doing 665 lbs and benched 425 lbs to Barkley's 405.

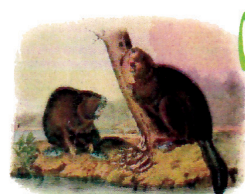

The current point leader beat Denny Fourney, AY Schilling, and Larry Knight. Second place Fourney did one better on Friday night scoring his first ever Clinton County Pro-Stock feature win. Denny has a few wins in the limited late model, but since switching to Pro-Stock it was his first career win there. Another first happened in the 270-micro sprint feature win holding off three-time winner Jeff Weaver, one of the top micro drivers in the area. Ross Perchak, Michael Petock and Mason McAndrew. Larry Beachel scored double wins in the four-cylinder class with Tuesday and Friday wins. Also, on Friday Ken Duke, Jr of Winfield scored his first 305-sprint feature win of the season at Clinton County and then he went from the 3/8 little track down to Hagerstown speedway in Maryland to score another feature win at the fast ½ mile track. Ken’s win on Friday was his eight wins of his career at the Fair-ground oval and that ties him with Scott Lutz for the most in 305-sprint action. Duke held off Matt Tebbbs, Christian Rumsey, Jarrett Cavelet and last time winner Dale Schweikart for the win at Clinton. In 270-micro action on Friday Quinn Roberts, who was making only his second start of the season on Friday, scored the feature win over Mason McAndrew, Garrison Zook, Mac Wert and Michael Petock. This weekend is another double show at Clinton County with a regular show on Friday with the Laurel highlands 305-sprints, Pro-Stocks, 270-micro-sprints and Four Cylinders. Then on Saturday, the second appearance of the 410-sprints along with 270-micro

sprints and an open competition four-cylinders race. Billy Dietrich won the other show back on July 11th over Ryan Smith, Lucas Wolfe, Brock Zearfoss and Logan Rumley. Look for a solid field of sprints with Port Royal shut down for the events taking place at Knoxville Iowa this weekend a few 360-sprint and 305-sprint drivers will also be in action with the 410-sprints.

Friday Selinsgrove got there ULMS series race in just like the Appalachian Speedweek show both events had been rained out on their original dates and had to use other dates to get the show in. 23-super late model drivers were on hand with Mason Zeigler getting his first career feature win at Selinsgrove over Greg (Spike) Moore, Rick Eckert, Gregg Satterlee and Ryan Montgomery. Danny Dietrich scored the win at the Lou Blaney Memorial at Sharon Speedway last Saturday night. Then his team headed out to Knoxville for the 360 nationals and will stick around and run the Knoxville Nationals for the 410-sprints this weekend, along with some other local talent will also be on hand. Preston became the 12th different driver to win a sprint race this year at Port Royal, Anthony Macri and Ryan Smith have two wins with single wins going to Mike Walter Jr, Brent Marks, Aaron Reutzel, Chase Dietz, Logan Wagner, his dad Mike Wagner, Lance Dewease, Troy Wagaman Jr, Justin Whittall and now Preston. Friday night at Williams Grove Mike Norris became the seventh different 410-sprint car winner there this season beating Freddie Rahmer, Jeff Halligan, Tyler Ross and Brock Zearfoss. Anthony Macri has three wins with single wins going to Cameron Smith, Lance Dewease, Chad Trout, Danny Dietrich, Troy Wagaman Jr and Norris.

Spike Moore, who pulled double duty, would take the lead into three and four to take home the feature event for the UEMS modifieds with Mifflintown, PA's David Stremme, Concord, NC's Cole Hilton, Warren, PA's Dan Davies, and Dixon rounding out the Top 5.

The Dale-Engle-Walker historic site, 1471 Straw-bridge Road, Lewisburg, PA 17837 will be open for a tour on Sunday, August 10 at 2 pm. Guide Bill Brobst will discuss the architecture of the house and its history. The Dale house was built c. 1793 by immigrant Samuel Dale (1741-1804). The Dale family continued owning the farm, while renting it out to tenant farmers, until 1929. The Engles operated a dairy and vegetable farm in the 1930s and '40s. The Walkers updated the house and farm and bequeathed the property to the Union County Historical Society.

This historic site includes the c. 1789 Kantz log cabin, a frontier trading cabin from the Tuscarora Indian Path at Middlecreek, donated to the society and reassembled at the Dale-Engle-Walker site. Also on site is the Engle's milk house and the wagon shed with early farm implements.

PSP/DEO Announce College Enforcement & Public Awareness Initiative

As the fall semester begins at colleges and universities, Liquor Enforcement Officers from the Pennsylvania State Police, Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement, will be working with both local and state police in an effort to target underage drinking in and around campuses within our jurisdiction. Officers will be meeting with selected campus administrators and campus enforcement authorities in an effort to reduce under age consumption of alcohol and preempt alcohol-related problems at colleges and universities. Officers will also be meeting with many liquor licensees in college and university areas in an effort to promote awareness, improve relations, and reinforce preventing sales of alcohol to minors and other alcohol violations.

State laws pertaining to the purchase, possession, consumption or distribution of alcohol will be aggressively enforced. Any persons under the age of 21 found in possession of, consuming, alcoholic beverages will be cited under Pennsylvania’s underage drinking law. Pennsylvania’s under age drinking law is a summary offense and carries a potential fine of up to \$500 and up to 90 days imprisonment for the first offense. The fine increases up to \$1,000 for subsequent offenses. Entry into an ARD or pre-adjudication program counts as a conviction.

Every effort will be made to arrest any person(s) that supplies alcoholic beverages to person under the age of 21. Any person, including parents, found supplying alcohol to anyone under the age of 21 will be charged with furnishing alcohol to minors, a third degree misdemeanor under PA Title 18. The penalty for the first offense is a minimum fine of \$1,000 and up to one year imprisonment. The fine for a second or subsequent offense is a minimum of \$2,500. Any person charged with this section will be fingerprinted and photographed as part of the arrest process. The arrest will then be part of a criminal history.

At Mifflin County High School, Crosson teaches English, advanced placement language and composition and Survival Stories, an elective that explores global humanitarian crises through a youth-centered lens. Throughout her career, Crosson said her goal was never awards or recognition, but rather "to make others shine." She became an educator because she wanted to give the next generation of students the same care and support she once received herself.

"Miss Crosson was a huge part of who I am professionally," said Mina Phillips, a former student of Crosson's who is now a sports reporter with the Lewistown Sentinel. "She taught me everything I know about writing. Taking journalism with Miss Crosson really opened my eyes to how much I really enjoy writing."

Crosson used her national platform to recognize her students, who she said "make the job easy," and called on communities to support their local school districts.

"Supporting your community and your local schools is the best use of your energy," she said. "Find what your school needs and that engagement between families and businesses and stakeholders in the community is what creates a thriving school district."

After graduating from Susquehanna University with a degree in English and secondary education, she earned a master's degree in educational leadership from Penn State University and a gifted education endorsement from Millersville University. In 2018, she became a Fulbright Teachers for Global Classrooms fellow. A passionate advocate for literacy and global education, Crosson integrates international perspectives into her teaching and leads student trips abroad.
