On February 10, the Mardi Gras Party benefitted two Mifflinburg non-profits. The Mifflinburg Buggy Museum and Mifflinburg Community Parks Action Project (CPAP)partnered to share in the fun and fundraising! The motto of the evening was "Celebrating Mifflinburg's past while looking to grow Mifflinburg's future."

In addition to the Rusty Rail New Orleans Style Mardi Gras buffet dinner, there were Live and Silent Auctions. A great line-up of live music had attendees jamming to the music of Luke Hughes on the electric violin, Ravi the Saxman on saxophone, and the acoustic classic rock group, Rapid Run.

The Buggy Museum has a modern Visitor Center includes an introductory video, self-guided exhibit, handson workbench, gift shop and restrooms. Guided tours through the Heiss family home, the reconstructed carriage house, the original buggy factory, and original showroom provide a glimpse to the past. The Buggy Museum has an ongoing mission to restore other buggies and sleighs in the museum complex. Volunteers continue to be the backbone of the Mifflinburg Buggy Museum by guiding tours, staffing the admissions desk, planning events and programs and offering research assistance to visitors. The Buggy Museum is funded through donations, admissions, store sales and revenue from special events. Mifflinburg CPAP, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, consists of community members who volunteer their time to improve and enhance recreational areas in the borough through grant writing and fundraising efforts. Their mission is "Breathing new life into Mifflinburg's parks". MiffCPAP is looking for ways to improve the town's parks and recreation. MiffCPAP invites all residents to attend the meeting being held on February 21 from 6-8 pm at Mifflinburg Bank to offer input on future projects to enhance Mifflinburg Community Park and Harold Haney Memorial Park.

Mifflinburg Community Parks Action Projects (Miff-CPAP) has grown from a small grassroots organization that gathered to discuss the lack of playground equipment available for tots ages 2-5 to a newly formed nonprofit organization. MiffCPAP is composed of a dynamic group of individuals with the purpose of "Breathing new life into Our Parks!"

The group formed to create a play area for young children. "We noticed so many Mifflinburg residents took their young children to neighboring communities,' explains Mifflinburg CPAP President Karen Musser. "Most of the equipment at the Mifflinburg Community Park was installed in the early 1990's and was designed for youth ages 6-12. There were only a few pieces for young children."

During the school day, the population using the playground equipment are mostly parents and grandparents of preschoolers and tots, including Musser who babysits her young grandchildren.

That kicked off efforts to improve the playground area for young children! With a mission "to assist the Borough of Mifflinburg in securing funds through grant writing and fundraising efforts to enhance Mifflinburg's recreational assets."

MiffCPAP has written and secured several grants for the Mifflinburg Borough for parks and recreation. \$134,432 from the Union County Commissioner's ARPA funds have been designated for the construction of the new Tot Playground.

\$62,000 DCED grant has been allocated to create a master plan for both the Mifflinburg Community Park and the Harold Haney Memorial Park. A master plan is being written with HRG Engineering. The public is welcome to attend a meeting on February 21 from 6-8 pm at Mifflinburg Bank to view and give input on the options and ideas.

\$196,200 DCNR grant has been awarded for the construction of a new Tot Playground.

Many businesses, organizations, and individuals have donated to the efforts. Some have offered their skills in grant writing, others have offered to supply goods and services for the construction of the park or donated monetarily to the cause.

MiffCPAP has also held several fundraisers and plans to continue those events. Successful events included the Duck Derby held in May in conjunction with the Kids Fishing Derby, a food stand at the Annual Mifflinburg 5K in July, Summer Send Off in August, the popular Pedals & Pints, a reception held at Union Cellars on January 22 and the recent Mardi Gras Party held in partnership with the Buggy Museum on February 10. Sponsorship Opportunities are available.

It has been designed to include climbing structures lower to the ground, swings, handicapped swings, swing-along swings, and a merry-go-round that accom-modates wheelchairs with safety features designed for young children.

MiffCPAP is checking off areas and ways to improve the parks and recreation. Their goal is to install the newly purchased playground equipment in late Summer/ early Fall of 2024. "We hope that it will be a community build with volunteers from the community to cre-ate a sense of ownership and community pride," notes Musser. In addition, the community build will help to keep costs down.

Playworld has donated \$25,000 work of equipment. Willow Play Works will install the equipment and offer a 10% discount off additionally purchased equipment. Approximately, 20,000 is still needed to meet this initial project to create a Tots Playground. Donations may be mailed to: MiffCPAP at 509 Hilltop Lane, Mifflinburg PA 17844.

MiffCPAP is working with professionals to assess the strengths and weaknesses of both the Mifflinburg Community Park and Harold Haney Memorial Park. They want to create a Master Plan of future projects. Community input during the meeting on February 21 from 6-8 pm being held at Mifflinburg Bank will help direct those plans.

After that, HRG Engineering will approach Mifflinburg Borough Council with several ideas in the Master Plan. After a vote, the group can begin to phase in improvements and continue to seek out grants that meet their criteria moving forward.

CPAP meetings are held at 6:30 pm on the fourth Monday of each month at the Contrast Communications building, located at 418 Chestnut St. in Mifflinburg. Board members are Karen Musser-President, Michael Smith-Vice President, Secretary-Julia Hummel, Treasurer- Kelly Griffith, Sandy Catherman, Bradley Mover, and Eric Wagner.
