MILTON STATE POLICE
Crash 2:38 p.m. April 26, on Westbranch Highway, north of Albert Blvd., in Union Township. A 2021 Tesla driven by Joshua H. 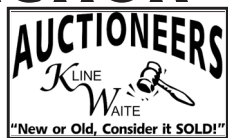

Wild Night of Racing at Port Royal, WOO Racing Series Coming to Our Area for Sprints and Late Models

Port Royal moved their start time up one hour from the scheduled starting time to beat the cold weather that was coming in. But what they did not expect was a field of 109 race teams in the three-division show. 28 super late models, 34 410-sprints and 47-PASS 305-sprints filled up the pit area, for a long night of quality racing. It started with four heat races for the 410-sprints followed by three heats for the super late models, then four heats for the 305-sprints. Then was one consolation each for the 410-sprints and the super late models, followed by two B-mains for the 305 sprints which had thirteen drivers in each B-main. The Port staff did an excellent job moving the show along until the first start of the 410-sprint feature. A spin by Mark Smith collected Jake Karklin sending him flipping and then a trip to the hospital for a checkup. Good news for Jake as he was checked out ok after his wild ride. Brock Zearfoss made a late race pass of Justin Whitall driving the Maik Heffner #27H for Steve Snyder. Ryan Smith in the Kreitz #69K was third followed by Logan Wagner and Lance Dewease who led the race early. The super late model feature also came down to the last lap, or maybe the last corner when Trevor Feathers made the pass of leader Gary Stuhler. Stuhler, who led the first 24 laps settled for second with Rick Eckert, Colton Flinger and Dylan Yoder in the top five.

Zearfoss was so choked up about his win, he had to ask a crew member at the scales who won. "It was just crazy out there tonight! This car would go anywhere I put it and I have to thank Jim Shuttlesworth for his help the past few weeks as we are starting to come together as a team." Feathers talked about his super late model win. "Gary just got stuck in the lapped traffic and stayed low on the track, which I figured what he would do, so my only move was to try and make a pass on the outside. It paid off for the win. Just cannot believe that things worked out that way. Earlier in the race we got to Gary in lapped traffic, but then a caution came out. So, the same thing happened near the end of the race. If not for the lapped traffic the air off him, I am not sure if I would have won this race. We have a new XR1 chassis and the car has been working so far this season." Jeff Weaver of Lock Haven led all the 20-lap 305-sprint features but must hold off a late race challenge from 11th starting Timmy Bittner who placed second, with Josh Spicer Kenny Heffner and Cole Dewease in the top five. Both Lance and Cole placed fifth in their respective sprint car division. Again hats off to the Port Royal speedway and all the staff moving the 109 racecars show along at a fast pace.

Friday night was a wash out in are area with Williams Grove, Selinsgrove and Clinton County all rained out, but three tracks did race Bedford Speedway somehow dodge the rain drops and got thee four division show in the books. Kyle Lear won the 13-car field limited late model race over Brad Benton, Brian Booze, Gunner Walls and Brian Benton. The 305-sprint feature went to Cole Dewease over Josh Spicer, Timmy Bittner, Kasey Weaver and Donnie Hendershot. Only ten drivers showed up for this race on Friday night. This Friday the URC 360-sprint race at Bedford. Selinsgrove will bounce back from last Friday with a special for the super late models paying \$6,000 to win and \$600 to start the feature. Also, Limited late Models and Street Stock will also be a part of the Friday night show. Williams Grove will have a two-show for the WOO sprints on Friday and Saturday May 8-9, while Clinton County will have the IMCA 305-sprint has their headline division for this Friday. Not sure what all happened but Linda's speedway and McGrew Pub speedway. Both tracks got their micro-sprint racing programs last Friday somehow beating the rain. Linda's is located near Jonestown while McGrew is located on the inside of BAPS Motor speedway near York Pa.

The WOO Sprints will be at Lincoln Speedway this past Tuesday, before they head to Williams Grove for the two-day show. Chase Dietz will lead the local charge against the travelers after his fourth win of the year at Lincoln on Saturday and followed that up with his second win of the season at BAPS on Sunday night. Kasey Kahne will be driving the Macri #39 for the local shows. Last year this event was rained out both days. Going into these races, leading the way for the WOO series, is defending champ and current point leader David Gravel of Waterdown CT. In sixteen starts, David has four wins, eleven top fives and four-

teen top ten runs. Carson Macedo is second in points, 70-behind Gravel and one feature win. Michael Kofoid is third with 104 points back. Kofoid also has four wins this season, fourth in points is Donny Schatz 128 back and has one feature win, and in fifth is Sheldon Haudenschild with one feature win and is 152 back. Looks like the series will bring a solid field of seventeen drivers added to all the local talent it should be three great nights of racing for the 410-sprints.

Coming up at Selinsgrove speedway on Thursday May 14th for the first time since the 2021 season will be the World of Outlaws super late model series. The series first race was set for 2012, but rain wiped out the event, so they came back for the 2013 season with a two-day show, brought in by then promoter Charlie Paige. Gregg Satterlee won the first race, and Darrell Lanigan won the second night. 204 was another two day show with Tim McCreddie and Lanigan winning the two races, 2015 was a one-day show with Lanigan again coming away with the victory. 1016 was the legend's son Billy Moyer Jr scored the win, 2017 local driver Jeff Rine won the event 2018 the win went to Chris Madden and 2019 Darrell Lanigan won again, 202 was cancelled because of Covid-19 2021 was rained out. In the nine features that the WOO series Darrell Lanigan has four wins with single wins going to Gregg Satterlee, Moyer Jr, Jeff Rine, Chris madden and Tim McCreddie. McCreddie is back racing with the WOO series and will be on hand for this event. The biggest field of driver happened in 2016 with 42 drivers on hand with the following year it was down to it's lowest at 27. Rick Eckert was a series driver back then and had a total of three third place runs during that time. Behind Satterlee was Vic Coffey and Jeff Rine, Lanigan first win was followed by Eckert and Matt Cochran of Williamsport. Following Tim McCreddie win was Shane Clanton and Eckert. Par-Tee Time Golf Event

Lewisburg, PA—Members of the Bucknell Ladies' Golf Association met recently to begin work on the creation of a new golf event, dubbed Par-Tee Time, scheduled to take place June 13, 2026, at the Bucknell Golf Club.

"Par-Tee Time is a new golf tournament for women created with a mission in mind," said Carmen Terry, Chair of the Par-Tee Time committee. "Our goal is to see more women of all ages playing golf and taking up the sport, whether they have played before or would like to take up golf for the first time."

Co-Chairs of the Par-Tee Time committee include Jessie Walsh, Lisa Sojka, and Erica Shames.

Historic Background

According to the National Golf Foundation, the not-for-profit trade association founded in 1936 to promote golf, women and girls have become the driving force behind golf's post-pandemic resurgence, accounting for 60% of growth in on-course participation since 2019. This surge, the NGF says, has pushed the female golfer count to a record 7.9 million – besting the previous high of 7.1 million female golfers set in 2006.

A decade and a half ago, women represented just 1 in 5 "green grass" golfers. Today, they account for 28%, according to the NGF.

Regional Lag

Despite the forward momentum, though, significant challenges exist. Female golfers continue to give up golf at higher rates than their male counterparts, and the conversion rate from beginner to committed golfer for women is less than half that of men.

"Even with encouraging statistics," adds Terry, "we haven't seen a surge in women golfers on our local and regional golf courses. In fact, men outnumber women by a large margin at the Bucknell Golf Club, and our sister courses in the area in Milton, White Deer, Shade Mountain, Selinsgrove, and Danville experience similar deficits."

That gap between male and female golfers is what motivated members of the Bucknell Ladies' Golf Association to take action. The Par-Tee Time Tournament is a way to bring together women of all ages and abilities to play golf in a fun, non-threatening environment. The 6-6-6 format of the tournament, for example, is easier to navigate, with 2-person teams playing and scoring holes 1-6 as a scramble; holes 7-12 as better ball; and holes 13-18 as alternate shots.

The tournament entry fee, to be determined, includes a continental breakfast, round of golf, golf cart, lunch, and prizes for first, second, and third place finishers. Players will have opportunities to participate in a 50/50 raffle and bid on themed baskets including Bucknell Athletic Basket, Bucknell Golf Club Basket, Spa Basket, Gardening Basket, Italian Dinner Basket, and Booze and Chocolate Basket. Mulligans will be for sale – one per player – and occasions to win prize-sin Closest to the Pin, Longest Drive, and putting contests round out the day's activities. Participation in the tournament is limited to 72 female golfers, who will be split up into two flights based on GHIN handicaps.

May 10 Tour of Historic Dale-Engle-Walker House



The Dale-Engle-Walker House, located at 1471 Strawbridge Road, Lewisburg, will be open for a tour on Sunday, May 10 at 2 pm with guide Bill Brobst. The Dale house was built c. 1793 by immigrant Samuel Dale (1741-1804), the property stayed in the Dale family and was worked by tenant farmers until 1929. The Engles operated a dairy and vegetable farm in the 1930s and '40s. The Walkers updated the house and farm and bequeathed the property to the Union County Historical Society.

Architectural highlights include the front door and fan light with original glass; first floor twelve-over-twelve windows and second floor eight-over-twelve windows; original chestnut and pine floors; the early kitchen and hearth.

This historic site includes the c. 1789 Kantz log cabin, a frontier trading cabin from the Tuscarora Indian Path at Middlecreek, donated to the society and reassembled at the Dale-Engle-Walker site. Also on site: the Engle's milk house and the wagon shed with early farm implements.

Tours are free and open to the public; donations are gratefully accepted toward the preservation of this important historic site. On April 11, 2026, members of Conrad Weiser DAR honored the life of Annie Knight Gregory and placed a wreath of remembrance at her grave site in Union Cemetery in Selinsgrove. Annie Knight Gregory was a "Real Daughter of the NSDAR." Approximately 30 people attended the ceremony.

Annie Knight Gregory was the last surviving NSDAR Real Daughter. Annie was the daughter of Revolutionary War soldier, Richard Knight. As a boy of just 10 years old, Richard accompanied his own father, Conrad Knight, into service during the Revolutionary. They answered the call in 1777 and served together in a Pennsylvania battalion where Richard served as a drummer boy. Later, Richard Knight was Captain of the infantry company he organized during the War of 1812.

Annie was born on March 23, 1843 in Liverpool, PA when her father was 77 years old. She attended Freeburg Academy. At the age of 18, she married Benjamin Gregory, a Selinsgrove banker. When Annie Knight Gregory was born the country was still young; our Nation was less than 70 years old. She lived long enough to see the United States emerge as a global power in the midst of World War II.

Annie Knight Gregory joined DAR on November 4, 1897. On the occasion of Annie's 100th birthday she received greetings from President Franklin D Roosevelt. Shortly before her death, she claimed that buying war bonds "will be my investment in the future of my great-grandchildren, just as my father and grandfather invested in the America we enjoy." At Annie's death on December 17, 1943, she was NSDAR's last surviving "real daughter".

Pam Sparta, Regent, was the Master of Ceremonies. Special guest speakers included Morgan Hoover- Legislative Aide to Rep. David Rowe (R-85), Snyder County Commissioner Adam Ewig, Selinsgrove Mayor Michael Bolig, Rylan Ebright- SC Chairperson of America250PA, and Lee Knepp- President of the Snyder County Historical Society.

Morgan Hoover, representing Rep. David Rowe's office, offered these comments, "Her life formed a living bridge between our time and the era when our nation was first taking shape... As we look ahead to America250, we are reminded that our story as a nation is built not only on great events, but on individuals and families who preserved their history and values across generations. Annie Knight Gregory stands as one of those powerful links in our shared American heritage."

Snyder County Commissioner Adam Ewig noted, "Today, we take a moment to honor a woman who was truly a living link to the birth of our nation: Annie Knight Gregory... (She) reminds us that history is not just about dates and battles; it is about the stories of people, families, and the legacy passed down from generation to generation. She was not just a witness to history; she was the embodiment of it. May we always cherish that heritage."

Selinsgrove Mike Bolig thanked the members of DAR and especially the Conrad Weiser local chapter for keeping history alive. "My family, having a direct ancestor who fought in the Revolutionary War, made it not just national history, but family history."

"We honor the legacy of a true daughter of the American Revolution. As the chair of America250PA - Snyder County, this year, we have the privilege to honor the legacy of the 250th Anniversary of the United States. As we stand here today, we need to be grateful for those who made sacrifices for our freedom, including the daughters of the American Revolution such as Annie," said Rylan Ebright.

Lee Knepp shared that it is important to understand and appreciate our local heritage and its connection to our national history.

Conrad Weiser Chapter's Regent, Pam Sparta, read from a speech written and compiled by Ann Russell. Attendees were invited "to step across time—across nearly two centuries—and meet a woman whose life formed a living bridge between the birth of the United States and the modern world... through her father, she inherited a direct connection to the Revolution itself—not as distant history, but as family memory. Imagine growing up hearing firsthand stories of the struggle for independence—not from textbooks, but from your own father."

Pam also enumerated how Annie's story intersected with many major American conflicts over her lifetime. "During the Mexican-American War, her brother served. In the Civil War, another brother fought for the Union, while Annie herself contributed by preparing bandages and supplies for soldiers. In the Spanish-American War, her son entered service. And during World War I, her grandsons wore the uniform... From a father who fought in the Revolution... to grandsons fighting in World War I. In one lifetime, Annie Gregory witnessed the United States grow from fragile beginnings into a global power."

In conclusion she noted that Annie Knight Gregory "was a Daughter of the Revolution, a witness to a century, and a bridge between America's founding and its future... She represents Continuity. Sacrifice. And the enduring promise of the United States."

In addition to honoring the life of Annie Knight Gregory, the ceremony also acknowledged the Celebration of America's 250 Birthday. During the program, attendees recited the Pledge of Allegiance, The American's Creed, and the Preamble to the Constitution. Steven Porschet, US Navy Veteran and Pastor of Sunbury City Church gave the Invocation and Benediction. The Ritual of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution enumerating the objectives of the DAR- "To perpetuate the memory and spirit of the men and women who achieved American Independence; to promote the development of an enlightened public opinion; and to foster patriotic citizenship was recited by Pam Sparta, Regent of Conrad Weiser Chapter NSDAR, and Susan Gillette Meer, Representative of the PA State Society DAR Regent.
