PennDOT Driver License, Photo Centers Closed for Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) today announced that all driver license and photo centers, including its full-service center in Harrisburg, will be closed Saturday, January 13, 2024, through Monday, January 15, 2024, in observance of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

Customers may still obtain a variety of driver and vehicle products and services, including all forms, publications and driver training manuals, online through PennDOT's Driver and Vehicle Services website.

Driver and vehicle online services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week and include driver's license, photo ID and vehicle registration renewals; driver-history services; changes of address; driver license and vehicle registration restoration letters; ability to pay driver license or vehicle insurance restoration fee; driver license and photo ID duplicates; REAL ID pre-verification; and driver exam scheduling. There are no additional fees for using online services.

A complete listing of PennDOT driver and photo license center closings in 2024 is available online. If you are planning to visit one of PennDOT's On-Line Messenger Service Centers, please call ahead for hours of operation during holidays.

Motorists can check conditions on major roadway miles by visiting www.511PA.com. 511PA, which is free and available 24 hours a day, provides traffic delay warnings, weather forecasts, traffic speed information, and access to more than 1,000 traffic cameras.

Maggie Roat, an Ambassador Girl Scout Juliette in Service Unit 642 of Union County, recently built a new lift box for the Marine Corps League #308 Toys for Tots that serves Columbia, Montour, Northumberland, Snyder, and Union Counties. Not only has Maggie built this new lift box, but she, along with her mother, has volunteered to pick toys for families for the past 3 years.

This year Maggie volunteered 23 hours. In doing so, she saw and experienced the need for a new lift box. The lift box is installed with a pulley system and it is used to lift and drop toys from the first floor to the second floor. This way there is no need to carry boxes of toys up the steps and carry filled bags

back down.

According to Pamela Beaver, Toys for Tots Coordinator, "That old box has seen a lot of work and is just totally worn out!"

This is what inspired Maggie to build and install a new one. "The other one was not in good shape. So, I knew they desperately needed a new one. When Pam asked me to build a new one, I said yes. The other one was ugly and falling apart, and I didn't want it to break while they were using it," Roat said. With the help of her father, she built, painted, and installed the new box in its new home.


"We won't have to carry all the toys up the steps and packed bags back downstairs!" Beaver explained about the impact Roat's project will make on future campaigns. In the 2022 campaign, this chapter serviced 3,279 children and the 2023 campaign served 4,273, just short of 1000 more!

"It feels good knowing that this will help the efficiency of future campaigns," said Roat. "They won't have to worry about the box falling apart with toys in it and replacing it in the middle of a campaign. And, it looks good!"

Iddings Quarry, Inc., 900 Chestnut Street, in Mifflinburg, PA 17844, proposes to conduct overburden blasting in compliance with all State and Federal Laws at its surface coal mining operation located on the Iddings properties in Limestone Township, Union County on Surface Mine Permit No. 60910302, from the hours of 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. (Noon), 12:00 (Noon) to 4:00 P.M. and 4:00 P.M. to sunset Monday through Saturday.

Warning signs will be placed at every entrance to the operation and a warning whistle will be as follows:

A one(1) minute series of long signals five (5) minutes prior to blasting and a series of short signals one (1) minute prior to blasting and a series of short signals one (1) minute prior to blasting.

All clear will be a prolonged signal following an inspection of the area.

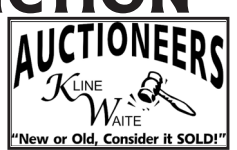
