Libraries Offer Remote Tech Support & Librarian Services

Jeff Seebold, Technology Training Services Coordinator for the Union County Library System, is available to answer questions about accessing online library resources, basic IT questions and Microsoft Office questions. Whether it be learning how to get ebooks on your device or how to troubleshoot a computer issue, Jeff will help.

To make an appointment, email Jeff at tech@publibuc.org. Tech appointments can be scheduled Monday through Friday from 9 am to 5 pm and take place through the Google Meet program (no Google account required). You can use a laptop or mobile device to communicate with Jeff for assistance.

For reference questions, patrons can "Chat with a Librarian" for free through Power Library, Pennsylvania Libraries' online portal. The service is free and available to Pennsylvania residents 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. "Chat with a Librarian" can find resources to help you research papers, find a new author to match your interests, search the Pennsylvania State Archives digital collection and more.

Go to www.UnionCountyLibraries.org, scroll down to Online Services and click on the "Chat with a Librarian" button to get started.

Need a library card? Sign up by visiting www.UnionCountyLibraries.org, clicking on the "Get a Card" tab and downloading the application. Once filled out, email it to library_cards@publibuc.org. After your application is received, the library will issue you a starter card (good for 60 days) and send it in the mail.

The Union County Library System is comprised of three libraries: The Public Library for Union County in Lewisburg, Herr Memorial Library in Mifflinburg and The West End Library in Hartleton.

On April 21, at approximately 10:35 a.m. PSP was dispatched to a residence for a report of a male shooting at a parked vehicle. Ivan Samuel Nolt, 58, of Mifflinburg, was upset because members of the Jehovah's Witnesses were at his residence to speak to his wife. After the three occupants exited the vehicle and were standing approximately 15 feet away, Nolt fired six rounds from a .22 caliber rifle at the vehicle while standing in the front doorway of his residence. No one was injured during the incident. Nolt was taken into custody without incident. Nolt was arraigned before on call District Judge Hackenberg on charges of recklessly endangering another person, simple assault, criminal mischief, and terroristic threats and committed to Union County in lieu of \$5,000 straight cash bail. Numerous members of PSP Milton, FSU and CARS assisted.
Crash 11:09 a.m. April 17, on Furnace Road, in Buffalo Township. A 2010 Chevrolet HHR driven by Tyler S. Hamm, 25, of Williamsport, was traveling west on Furnace Road. Hamm lost control of his Chevrolet HHR and veered off the roadway making initial contact with a ditch on the north berm, traveling out of the ditch and striking a utility pole before coming to rest facing west. No injuries were reported.
Crash 7:33 p.m. April 17, on I-80 at mile marker 203, in White Deer Township. A 2011 Toyota Prius driven by Rasa L. Davidsonesa, 26, of Washington DC, was traveling west in the left lane of I-80. Fatal Crash 2:33 p.m. April 26, on I-80 at mile marker 199.8, in West Buffalo Township. A 2010 Kia Rio driven by Brianna M. Kimmel, 28, of Oakmont, was traveling in the left lane of I-80 and a 2018 Freightliner Cascade driven by Addam M. Brown, 36, of Lake Harmony, was traveling in the right lane behind Kimmel. For unknown reasons Kimmel lost control of her Kia Rio, causing it to spin out of control, travel across the right lane and exit the roadway via the southern berm. After exiting the roadway, Kimmel's Kia Rio made contact with a guide rail causing it to spin and re-enter the roadway, traveling back across both lanes. During this time, Brown moved into the left lane. When Kimmel's Kia Rio crossed the left lane, the front of Brown's Freightliner Cascade struck the driver side of Kimmel's Kia Rio. Both vehicles traveled off the roadway via the north berm. Kimmel's Kia Rio came to rest facing north, and Brown's Freightliner Cascade came to rest facing east. Kimmel was pronounced dead at the scene. Brown was not injured.

Responding patrol members initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle and Thomas was placed under arrest for terroristic threats, suspicion of driving under the influence and obstructing administration of law. Thomas was arraigned and released on unsecured bail in the amount of \$25,000.

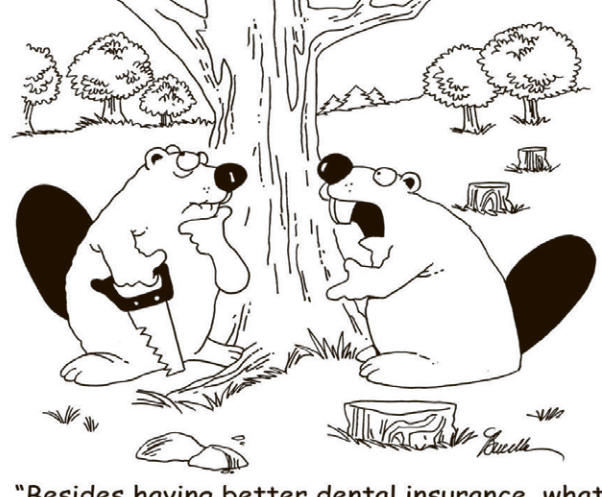

Virtual Experiences At The Lewisburg Children's Museum

The Lewisburg Children's Museum (LCM) is pleased to announce they will be offering virtual experiences to keep children socializing and engaged during this time of stay-at-home. In addition to free activity ideas and resources, starting Thursday, April 30, the LCM is introducing weekly virtual experiences through Zoom as part of a Museum-at-Home series.

The Museum is also introducing Virtual Parties, which enable children and their friends to gather for an online hangout. The LCM shares the platform and facilitates a game and craft activity for participants.

On Wednesdays at 10:00 am, LCM staff also host PopUp PlayDates through Facebook Live. PopUp PlayDates are designed to engage children and families with hands-on activities that they can easily do at home.

"We know that COVID-19 is impacting our community in difficult and unprecedented ways," says Kahla DeSmit, LCM Executive Director. "We are trying to find creative ways to engage families and also support the work of the Museum. Currently, these new virtual offerings are by donation, as we do not want cost to be prohibitive."

At this time, the LCM remains closed following state and federal directives regarding COVID-19 and will continue to reassess and update the community as information becomes available.
