

Stuffy nose, sore throat, ear ache - general practitioners are overloaded in Spring and Summer with patients experiencing discomfort due to end of season colds and allergies. In some instances these minor cases can turn into a middle ear infection requiring the attention of a

More likely to occur in children than adults (80% of children will experience an ear infection before the age of three) the inflammation and fluid build-up in the air-filled space behind the ear drum can cause pain, affect balance, and interrupt sleep.

Statistics show that chronic ear infections affect two thirds of children under the age of six. Dr. Lisa Ayers of Surgical Specialists at Evangelical Community Hospital has seen many cases of children with ear infections that have moved beyond the one-time occurrence to repeated and persistent.

Dr. Avers said, "Beyond the medical aspect of it, middle ear infections can disrupt daily life for both kids and their parents. The infection causes pressure and pain and disturbs sleep patterns as the feeling can become more intense when lying down. Sleepless nights can cause irritability in both children and adults and can affect the way one deals with their day-to-day activities.'

One solution is the minimally invasive surgical insertion of pressure equalization tubes in the ear drum. The outpatient procedure places a small tube in the ear drum to drain any accumulated fluid and ventilation of the middle ear. The tubes are inserted through a very small surgical opening in the eardrum while the child is under general anesthesia. Extended hospitalization is rare; children recover quickly from the surgery, returning to their normal routines in a day or two.

Dr. Ayers said, "The tubes allow air to enter the middle ear cavity and fluid to flow through the tube into the ear canal. This decreases the feeling of pressure in the ears, reduces pain, and often improves

Procedures like this are done routinely at Evangelical Community Hospital in its one-day surgery unit. Starting in July, the surgeries will be done in the new Surgical and Cardiovascular Expansion in operating rooms that are 63% larger than in the past. In addition, loved ones anxiously waiting for their child in surgery will have a tracking system available that follows the child at all times during the procedure, from the time surgery begins to recovery. The tubes last anywhere from 6 -12 months and during this time,

the child needs to take extra care of keeping water from getting in the affected ear whether through swimming or taking a shower. The tubes often fall out on their own as the child grows but in some cases have to be removed surgically. Children who are susceptible to ear infections should be watched

closely after the tubes are removed. Regular check-ups with the ENT physician is recommended to make sure infection does not return and Dr. Ayers is currently accepting new ear, nose, and throat patients,

## Local Hospital Health Bike Helmet Safety Program




