Lumber Mill Burns, Owners Plan to Rebuild



Eight fire companies from Union, Snyder and Northumberland counties responded to a call around 6:38 p.m. on Thursday, August 30, 2012, on Swartz Road, in Buffalo Township. The main building was completely destroyed by the blaze. The saw mill had been in operation for many decades

Approximately 100 firefighters arrived on the scene and had the blaze under control within about 30 minutes. Smoke from the fire could be seen from Route 15 near the Union/Snyder county line. The fire was kept from spreading by the tin walls of the mill, which helped keep the surrounding stacks of logs, lumber pieces and wood remnants. Firefighters remained on the scene to extinguish any flare-ups that might occurred in what remained of the buildlower level of the mill. The owners of the mill are insured and estimate the damage to be around one million dollars. They plan to rebuild.

The 35 workers from this sawmill will be transferred to the second mill and they will begin working two shifts to keep up with business.

As a result, Evangelical has been listed on the flu preven-tion honor roll by the Department of Health.

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) it is esing the flu shot is the single most effective way of preventing Influenza. During flu season and beyond, the Hospital makes available sneeze stations with antiseptic hand-rub, masks, tissues and directions on proper cough and sneeze technique and on proper hand washing to fight against sharing common colds and other respiratory illnesses.

"It is the Hospital's main priority that we do everything in our power to protect patients and visitors during the flu season. We want them to come here for care and be assured they aren't being subjected to the possibility of flu. Our implementation of the mandatory masking policy works to protect everyone in the Hospital environment, protecting our patients, their visitors and even our staff," says Michelle Lincoln, RN, CIC, Infection Control Department.

The blaze was ruled accidental by investigators on Friday afternoon. The fire is believed to have been caused by a malfunctioning machine on the

timated that influenza causes an average of 23,000 deaths annually. Universal healthcare worker vaccination coupled with other measures to control respiratory illness is the best way to protect the vulnerable populations of our communities, something Evangelical Community Hospital takes very seriously.

On Wednesday, August 22, Owen Simwale, PhD, MPH, Influenza Surveillance Coordinator for the Division of Infectious Disease Epidemiology at the Department of Health awarded Evangelical Community Hospital with a plaque as recognition of the Hospital's achievement of reaching a 92.2% healthcare worker vaccination rate, put-ting them on the Honor Roll of Flu Prevention. The presentation was made in front of physicians, employees and volunteers who through their participation in the vaccine effort made the Hospital a safe environment for everyone.

In 2011, Evangelical Community Hospital introduced a mandatory masking policy for any employee working in any part of the Hospital who had not received a flu shot. Receiv-

# Hamlin Edges Gordon At Atlanta By Gerald Hodges/the Racing Reporter

HAMPTON, Ga.—Denny Hamlin outran Jeff Gordon on a two-lap dash to the finish in Sunday night's Sprint Cup race at Atlanta Motor Speedway. It was his second straight Cup Series victory, his series-best fourth of the season and the 21st of his career.

"Well, we just had such a strong car for three quarters of the race, honestly," said Hamlin. "You know the line I was running, I knew there was a price to pay if I kept going down there. Obviously it paid its price there at the end, and it took its toll on our car by wearing the splitter out. That really hurt us at the end. "Other than that, I feel like we had the best car. But circumstances just fell our way at the end."

Hamlin beat Gordon to the finish line by .378 seconds after a caution spoiled a probable victory for Martin Truex Jr., who was leading by two seconds when Jamie McMurray wrecked on the frontstretch on Lap 320 of 327.

"What a battle," said Gordon. "We just never could get my car tight enough. On the short runs we were really fast, which worked to our favor here to get that second place and almost that win. I'm just mad at myself right now. I don't know, I guess I'm just getting soft in my old age. I'm too nice because, I don't know, 15 years ago I would have just moved him right up the racetrack. I don't know why I didn't do that I thought I could get to his quarter panel and slow him down and stay there. But I got there, I just carried too much speed into 3 and it pushed up the racetrack."

Brad Keselowski ran third, followed by Truex, Kevin Harvick, Kyle Busch, Dale Earnhardt, Paul Menard, Matt Kenseth, and Mark Martin.

Tony Stewart started the race from the pole, but faded early and wound up 22nd.

"We just couldn't get the handle on this thing tonight," said Stewart, who won in March 2004, October 2006 and September 2010 at Atlanta. "We needed more side bite in the corners, and I was just too free. We chased it all night. We'll go back to the shop, tear it apart and see what the deal is.

Enduring a worse night was Stewart's teammate, Ryan Newman, who finished 35th. Newman was caught in a crash on lap 270, ending his night and putting a wild-card spot for the Chase further from his reach

# Green Screens film series begins with 'Waste Land'

The 2010 award-winning documentary "Waste Land," has been chosen as the first film in the fall 2012 Bucknell University Environmental Center's "Green Screens Film Series," which is presented as part of the Bucknell Film/Media Series. "Waste Land," which follows artist Vik Muniz as he travels to his native Brazil to the world's largest garbage dump, will be shown on Tues., Sept. 11, at 7:30 p.m. in the historic Campus Theatre in downtown Lewisburg.

Filmed over nearly three years, "Waste Land" documents Muniz's interactions with an eclectic band of "catadores" - selfdesignated pickers of recyclable materials at the garbage dump outside Rio de Janeiro. His initial objective was to "paint" the catadores with garbage, but Muniz's collaboration with the characters as they recreate photographic images of themselves out of garbage reveals both the dignity and despair of the catadores as they begin to re-imagine their lives.

An uplifting documentary that highlights the transformative power of art and the beauty of the human spirit, "Waste Land" was directed by Lucy Walker and received the Academy Award nomination for best feature documentary, the audience award for best international documentary at Sundance Film Festival, and awards from Amnesty International and the Berlin International Film Festival.

A panel discussion following the film, moderated by Dr. Wen-

dy Chou, will feature Tulu Bayar, Associate Professor of Art at Bucknell University and Dr. Peter Wilshusen, Executive Director of Bucknell's Environmental Center and David and Patricia Ekedahl Professor of Environmental Studies.


