Mifflinburg CPAP Hosts Donor Reception and Unveils Plans for Park Upgrades

The Mifflinburg Community Parks Action Projects group hosted their third annual Volunteer and Donor Recognition Reception February 23, 2026 at Union Cellars in Lewistown where Board President, Karen Musser, and Board Secretary, Julia Hummel, revealed the organization's plans for the future. Set against the beautiful backdrop of wine barrels, wine bottles, and the modern industrial design of the winery, community-minded folks viewed a slideshow presentation which detailed the vision and future upgrades planned for Mifflinburg Community Park and the Pool through a partnership with the Mifflinburg Borough.

During the third annual recognition reception, Musser and Hummel reflected and highlighted on the successful completion of Phase One and shared an ambitious roadmap for the future. The community build day went so well, and so many residents and businesses chipped in to help in one way or another. Phase One brought a new Tot Playground, a vibrant pollinator garden, and a custom mural by artist Emily Gaugler to the park. They extended a special thank you to the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Willow Playworks, Playworld, and the local agricultural students who helped to plant 452 new plants in the park.

While big decisions are on the horizon for the Community Pool, the current concept plans range from maintaining the existing structure to potentially replacing it with a modern splash pad.

The newest grant they were awarded for Phase Two totaled \$87,000 which will include resurfacing the existing basketball courts, the addition of four permanent pickleball courts, new backboards, rims, and nets, landscaping, picnic tables, and a bench. Work on these renovations will begin this spring or early summer.

There have also been a few "In Memory" additions to the park including one beautiful butterfly bench and a tree planted which features a nearby plaque where you can scan a QR code which plays a song by the Badlees.

While a grant was applied for to improve the driveway and parking area, they did not receive any funding. They had originally planned for a rock-climbing wall area, but they instead opted for a natural play area with real rocks for climbing. None of the grants covered excavation, and they are currently seeking donations, both monetary and those looking to donate their time to assist in these projects.

Harry Haney Park will be getting some much-needed adjustments as well. Improvements are slated to bring to the Little League fields up to regulation size for playoff games. The current field is fifteen feet too short and has resulted in no playoff games being played in the park.

Mifflinburg CPAP plans to host the Summer Send-Off once again with fun and games for children before they head back to school. Mifflinburg CPAP President, Karen Musser, stated "This event would not be able to happen without the help of the Ritz Craft Corporation's family of businesses including Rusty Rail Brewing and Ritz Trans."

Please be on the lookout for fundraising and volunteering opportunities where you can help give back to your community. They are also seeking artists to design a mural for the Community Pool area. Jazz Pianist Dan Tepfer Performing at the Weis Center

The Weis Center for the Performing Arts will welcome jazz pianist Dan Tepfer on Thursday, April 2 at 7:30 p.m. at the Weis Center. The performance is co-sponsored by the Bucknell Music Department and Kushell Endowment.

Dan Tepfer, born in Paris to American parents and based in New York City, is "a pianist of extraordinary technique and fearless harmonic sensibility" (JazzTimes). He has performed worldwide with artists ranging from Lee Konitz to Renée Fleming and released more than a dozen albums as a leader in solo, duo, and trio settings. The New York Times calls him a "deeply rational improviser drawn to the unknown," and his concert works include Solar Spiral, Algorithmic Transform, and Three Poems of Virginie Sampeur, for Cécile McLorin Salvant.

He gained international attention with Goldberg Variations / Variations (2011), combining Bach's masterpiece with his own improvisations, and in 2019 released Natural Machines, a video album exploring algorithms and the rhythms of the heart, featured on NPR's Tiny Desk. His honors include top prizes at Montreux and the American Piano Awards, and fellowships from major arts institutions. In 2025, he made his Carnegie Hall debut as a leader with Natural Machines 2.0 and The Knights.

When at the Weis Center, Tepfer will perform a program called Inventions / Reinventions. Following the critical and audience acclaim for his Goldberg Variations / Variations, Dan Tepfer released Inventions / Reinventions on StorySound Records in March 2023. It immediately entered the Classical Billboard Charts at #1, remaining there for two weeks.

Bach composed his set of Inventions as study pieces for his children and students, covering eight major and seven minor keys, for a total of fifteen. But there are twenty-four possible major and minor keys, so there are nine keys missing. In the Inventions / Reinventions program, while playing Bach's original compositions sequentially, Dan Tepfer creates his own Inventions for the missing keys, freely improvising new ones during each performance. In so doing, he follows the logic behind Bach's beloved original pieces, in which simple musical ideas, like characters in a novel or a play, are taken on a harmonic journey to foreign keys before returning home.

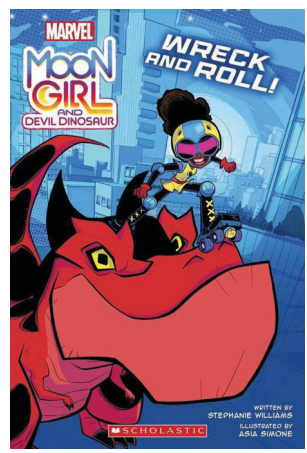

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

The Lewisburg boys basketball team continued their undefeated ways this calendar year in making a deep run in the PIAA state playoffs. The Green Dragons beat Pope John Paul 64-59 in Pottsville. Lewisburg was down ten points late in the first half when senior Rebiria Jemama changed momentum in a big way.

Jemama picked off a pass and threw down a dunk to wake his team and the fans up. Lew went on and out-scored PJP 40-35 in the second half. The Dragons scored only 24 points in the first half. Jemama led the Green with 19 and LJ Tucker had 18 and Cooper Mowry 10. Next up was Bishop McDevitt in the quarterfinals.

Unlike their previous game, Lewisburg was leading their 4A quarterfinal foe McDevitt by eighteen points 40-22 in the third quarter. Dragon coach Leon Tucker knew the game wasn't over and that McDevitt would make a run. Make a run they did after the hot-shooting LJ Tucker left the game with a twisted ankle.

Tucker returned after a few minutes but the Crusaders had clawed back during his absence. McDevitt took their first lead since the first quarter 54-53 with 1:31 to play. Nazir Meredith scored the go ahead basket seventeen seconds later and Lewisburg finally made some free throws to seal the win 60-58 to move on. Tucker hit six treys and totaled 23 points that led all scorers. Meredith had 13 and Jemama 10.

Lewisburg moved on to face Devon Prep on Tuesday and their magical season came to a loss 73-49. Defending state champ Devon Prep has lost twice the number of games it has won 9-18. Never let records fool you as they play out of the Philadelphia Catholic League which has open recruitment for talent.

The outcome was never in doubt and the speed and size of Prep was different than the Dragons saw all year. The three starting seniors for Lewisburg.... Cooper Mowry, Nazir Meredith and Rebiria Jemama left their marks on this program.

Coach Leon Tucker said "What this group accomplished this year; no other group at Lewisburg that's put on this uniform has done the things this group has done." Well done Lewisburg.

Mifflinburg's Malachi Moyer ended his outstanding high school swimming career by winning his first state medal. Moyer finished fourth in the 100 butterfly with a personal best of 51:26.

Selinsgrove graduate Shaela Kruskie won the 5K meter PSAC title at the league's indoor Track and Field cham-

pionships. The Shippensburg sophomore won easily by more than thirty seconds with a time of 17:16. Kruskie also took second place in the 3K meters.

We have another Grove grad that was recently honored. Kimberly Spiegel who graduated from Selinsgrove in 2011 and West Chester in 2016 is the first female to ever be inducted into the District 4 wrestling Hall of Fame. While at Selinsgrove Kimberly was a multiple Cadet national champ and a Junior Nationals champ. While at West Chester she was a member of the US Women's freestyle team and later won the NCWA Folkstyle title twice. Congratulations Kimberly on a well deserved honor.

We have three local grads competing in this week's NCAA wrestling championships in Cleveland. Midwest's Avery Basset will take the mat for Lock Haven at 174. Grove's Nate Schon (Drexel) and Mifflinburg's Emmanuel Ulrich (American) could possibly have a rematch at 285.

How dominant has Penn State been at the wrestling championships? You cannot place a bet on what school will win the team title because all the bookmakers know that it will be Penn State. I have never seen this happen before. Normally they will lay odds for a heavy favorite at minus 2,000. This means you would wager \$2K to win \$100, that's a foolish risk but sports books are always looking for action. You can place a bet on who you think will finish in second place.

There have been four teams that crowned a record five individual wrestling champs in a single season. Iowa (1986), Oklahoma State (2005) and Penn State twice in 2017 and 2022. I think seven Penn Staters will wrestle in the finals but only four will win. I might be underestimating them again, but I think the chatter among all the other schools of how great the Nittany Lions are has become suffocating and will push the challengers.

I did pretty good in picking the BIG finalist by hitting 75% so here are my finalists at the NCAA's. 125-Seymour over Ventresca, 133-Forrest over Blaze, 141-Mendez over Vega, 149-Stiles over Van Ness, 157-Duke over Taylor, 165-Messenbrink over Blaze, 174-Haines over Ruiz, 184-McEnelly over Walsh, 197-Barr over Elam and at 285-Bastida over Doucet.

That's seven BIG champs and five runner-ups. If you haven't seen Oklahoma State's Jax Forrest at 133 wrestle, do yourself a favor and watch him. He should have been wrestling in Hershey two weeks ago as a senior at Bishop McCort high school. He decided to enroll early at OSU

and is ranked #1.

Just like that we are down to 32 teams left in March Madness! I hope your brackets are still somewhat intact. I probably watched four times the amount of wrestling than I did college basketball so far this year. That will change in the coming weeks.

Is the SEC now considered a basketball conference instead of football? They led all conferences with a record tying 10 bids to the tournament. They were followed by the BIG with 9 and the ACC and Big 12 with 8 each. 31 of the 37 teams receiving at-large selections are from the Power 4 conferences.

I have heard the experts talk and they are saying the five best players in college basketball are all freshmen. Unless their names are Carmelo Anthony or Pervis Ellison, I cannot see Duke (Cam Boozer), Arkansas (Darius Acuff), Illinois (Keaton Wagler), BYU (AJ Dybantsa) or Kansas (Darryn Peterson) winning a title being led by first year players.

College basketball is more about the coaching than the players. There are enough legendary coaches in the tourney that can devise schemes and ways to slow down these great freshmen. Dan Hurley, Tom Izzo, Mark Few and Rick Pitino all stress defensive play and will eventually face those freshmen at some point in the tourney.

The NIL plays into this as well because players are sticking around longer and the more a team plays together the better they get. That is why a lot of these mid-major schools make a run in March Madness but in the end, coaching and teamwork will win it all. I have Michigan playing Florida in the title game.

The World Baseball Classic was indeed that.... A Classic. The emotion and intensity was as high if not higher than last year's World Series. I am glad Venezuela won as they wanted it more than any other country, which is saying a lot.

Special Enrollment Opportunity for Medicare Advantage Members Affected by Insurance Company Contract Dispute

Affected Pennsylvanians have until April 30 to ensure they are enrolled in coverage that best supports their needs.

Harrisburg, PA — The Shapiro Administration recently announced a special enrollment period for Pennsylvanians impacted by a Medicare Advantage contract dispute between Lehigh Valley Health Network (LVHN) and UnitedHealthcare (UHC) after advocating directly to the federal government to reopen enrollment and ensure Pennsylvanians are adequately covered. The Pennsylvania Insurance Department (PID) and the Department of Aging worked with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to approve a special enrollment period that will run through April 30, allowing older Pennsylvanians to have more options to keep access to their trusted doctors.

“Impacted UHC Medicare Advantage policyholders that see LVHN providers should shop their coverage during this Special Enrollment Period,” said Pennsylvania Insurance Commissioner Michael Humphreys. “Consumers should talk to a licensed insurance agent or broker or a PA MEDI counselor to evaluate whether staying in a Medicare Advantage plan or moving to an Original Medicare plan with Medigap coverage is in their best interest. It’s frustrating that insurers and provider groups can’t agree on reimbursement levels and leave Pennsylvanians just trying to maintain medical services or provider relationships holding the bag. We want all impacted UHC policyholders to know that resources are available to help them in this time of con-

fusion.”

As of January 26, 2026, the Medicare Advantage contract between UHC and LVHN ended and over 5,400 UHC Medicare Advantage members in Pennsylvania lost in-network access to LVHN providers. The Special Enrollment Period is different from the current Medicare Advantage annual open enrollment period, which runs through March 31.

During this special enrollment period, older adults impacted by the contract dispute can get help through Pennsylvania Medicare Education and Decision Insight (PA MEDI) – the Commonwealth’s Medicare counseling program. It is available through the 52 Area Agencies on Aging to help with Medicare questions. Older Pennsylvanians can receive unbiased, no-cost Medicare assistance from trained PA MEDI counselors.

“It can be challenging choosing the right health care coverage, especially when older adults have maintained the same benefits for years. Our PA MEDI counselors are knowledgeable in all aspects of Medicare, with some of them being older adults and Medicare recipients themselves. Counselors can walk through the options to assist beneficiaries in making informed health insurance decisions that will best fit their needs,” said Secretary of Aging Jason Kavulich.

PID encourages UHC Medicare Advantage policyholders to take advantage of the Special Enrollment Period because they will have more choices, including the option to move to a traditional Medicare product and buy a Medicare Supplement (Medigap) policy without medical underwriting, which means they cannot be denied coverage because of pre-existing conditions.

Before April 30, affected Pennsylvanians should:

Check if their doctors are still in their plan’s network;

Compare other Medicare Advantage plans available in their area; and

Consider whether Original Medicare with a Medigap plan may better meet their needs.

Award-Winning Jazz Ensemble, Artemis, Returns to the Weis Center



The Weis Center for the Performing Arts will welcome Jazz supergroup Artemis on Friday, March 27

at 7:30 p.m. at the Weis Center, just days after their Carnegie Hall appearance. There will be a pre-performance interview from 6:45-7:15 p.m. in the Weis Center Atrium with Allison Miller facilitated by Peg Cronin. The performance is sponsored, in part, by Karl Voss and Chanin Wendling and family. This performance is part of the Weis Center's year-long Trees Series.

Founded by pianist and composer Renee Rosnes in 2017, ARTEMIS—named for the Greek goddess—is a multinational, multigenerational ensemble of jazz instrumental virtuosos. Its current lineup includes pianist Renee Rosnes, trumpeter Ingrid Jensen, tenor saxophonist Nicole Glover, bassist Noriko Ueda, and drummer Allison Miller.

Each member is an accomplished bandleader with a major career and a prolific body of work. The group's third release for Blue Note Records, *Arboresque*, features original compositions by all members as well as arrangements of pieces by Wayne Shorter, Burt Bacharach and Donald Brown. The recording was named one of *The Guardian's* Top Ten Jazz Albums of 2025, praised for its "cliché-free individuality and congenial collective spirit radi-

antly combined."

Following a powerful appearance in May 2025 on NPR's Tiny Desk Concert Series, the band's popularity has continued to grow through performances at major festivals and venues worldwide. NPR hailed ARTEMIS as "a killer line-up of players, composers and performers...who converge on an extremely cosmopolitan, sleek, rhythm-forward, modern sound."

ARTEMIS has been voted Jazz Group of the Year for three consecutive years by *DownBeat* magazine's Annual Readers Poll (2023–2025) and was awarded Mid-Size Ensemble of the Year in both 2024 and 2025 by the Jazz Journalists Association.

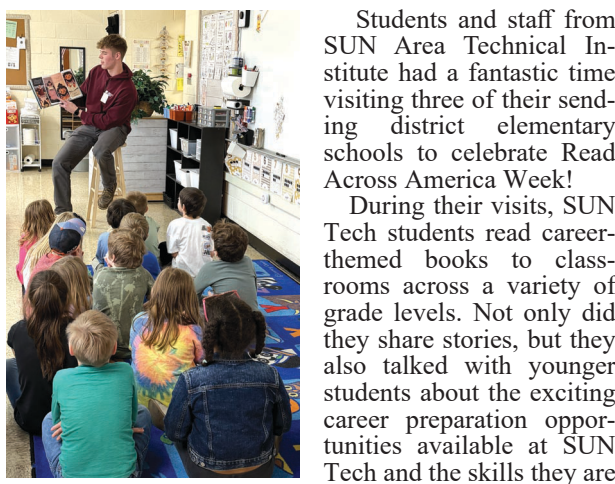
