A Veterans Day Ceremony will be held at 11 am on Saturday, November 8 at Mifflinburg Community Park. The Union County WWII Honor Roll is the site of this annual event. It is truly is one of the hidden treasures of this region.

“If you have never visited it in the Mifflinburg community park, I encourage you to do so. It contains the 2260 names of those who served from our county and where we hold our yearly Veterans Day ceremony,” says Doug Walter, coordinator of the Union County Veterans Foundation.

Guest speaker of this year’s program will be Amanda Strandburg. She serves in the National Guard, is a wife, a mother of three and, on top of that, was named Mrs. Pennsylvania. Amanda started a program that aids female veterans. According to Doug Walter, “What an amazing young lady she is and she should bring a unique message.”

Area Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Cub Scouts will lead the Pledge of Allegiance. The Veterans Day program will also feature the Nazarene Church Singers who have been a part of this event for many years. They will perform the National Anthem and other patriotic songs. Also participating will be Gold Star Families, Shikellamy JROTC, Union County 4-H Clubs, Rosie the Riveter, and Children of the American Revolution. Jen Hagaman sets up at our ceremony as an outreach to veterans who are in need of help, either financially or health care-wise.

In case of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held at Mifflinburg Church of the Nazarene located at 12 Market Street.

“The veterans already did their part to ensure our freedoms and the least we can do is say Thank You by brightening their lives,” explains Doug and Tracy Walter. “We are trying our best to make this a true community event and to not only honor our heroes but to do something tangible to help them...where every day is Veterans Day!”

In conjunction with the Veteran Day Ceremony, a Christmas benefit for the VA Nursing Home in Hollidaysburg is underway. “The Hollidaysburg Veterans Home has become our permanent place to help,” states Doug Walter.

Clerk Christina Williams works in Sunbury in the early morning hours before heading across the bridge to Hummels Wharf. Sunbury was ahead early in the challenge but not for long. Hummels Wharf has zipped ahead and remains in the lead.

Walking into the Hummels Wharf Post Office, I was amazed that the Post Office sells greeting cards, gift cards, and even takes passport photos. They sell a wide variety of stamps with over 40 different stamp choices on display including 7 different Christmas stamps. For a stamp enthusiast like me, in addition to the Breast Cancer Research semipostal stamp, I had to study the selection and purchase a few more. I enjoying using a variety of stamps for birthdays, anniversaries, and holidays.

"We try to go above and beyond for our customers. We are very friendly and personable," said Postmaster Bickel. "Being on the busy strip, we offer as much as possible. So, we are always expanding what we offer." The Hummels Wharf Post Office serves 300-350 customers per week.

Another advantage at the Hummels Wharf Post Office is the use of a computerized sales system. Everything is accurate and easily recorded. The system also records data that aids in planning. Postmaster Bickel utilized that information to schedule closing the office for lunch. After examining the data, she determined the least busy time at her office was 10:00-10:30 am.

"This way local workers can stop during their lunch break. I want to be convenient and accessible to as many customers as possible."

Thanks to customer, Scott Rine, for the recommendation to visit the Hummels Wharf Post Office. He commented on "How nicely they decorated their lobby with pink in awareness of October being Breast Cancer Month. They really went above and beyond in their efforts. It would be nice to have them recognized...I do all my postal needs at the Hummels Wharf Post Office because of their friendliness, efficacy and great selection of stamps to choose from."

During the month of October, the US Postal Service has highlighted its Breast Cancer Research semipostal stamp. Semipostal stamps are First-Class Mail stamps sold at a price above the cost of a regular stamp to raise funds for designated causes. The stamp, the Postal Service's first semipostal stamp, supports the breast cancer research work of the National Institutes of Health and the Defense Department's medical research program. The sale of the stamp has raised almost \$98 million since its introduction in 1998. More than \$1.1 billion Breast Cancer Research stamps have been sold.

The artwork depicts a woman standing with her right arm raised, reaching behind her head in the position recommended for breast self-examination. Across the top of the stamp are the words "breast cancer." Circling the figure's right breast are the phrases "fund the fight" and "find a cure."

In addition to the Breast Cancer Research stamp, the Postal Service offers three other fundraising stamps. The Save Vanishing Species semipostal stamp, first issued in 2011; the Alzheimer's semipostal stamp, issued in 2017; and the Healing PTSD semipostal stamp, issued in 2019. All four semipostal stamps help to raise funds for causes in the national public interest and are available for purchase year-round.

The Hummels Wharf Post Office, located at 1245 Susquehanna Trail in Hummels Wharf- next to Fulton Bank, is open Monday- Friday from 8:15- 10:00 am and 10:30 am -4:15 pm and on Saturdays from 8-11 am.

Her leadership helped create lasting community resources and initiatives that continue to make a difference, including: the Penns Creek Adult Resource Center and Beaver Springs Senior Center; the expansion of Home-Delivered Meals; reliable aid with disaster recovery coordination following devastating floods/events; a robust COVID-19 response whereby USAA, Inc. led mobile vaccine clinics and worked with local grocery stores to reward older adults for protecting their health; and the Elder Cottage Housing Opportunity (ECHO) where the Agency works with the Union County Housing Authority to expand housing options for seniors.

Beyond the agency, Kyle has been a pillar of the Pennsylvania Association of Area Agencies on Aging (P4A) — serving two terms as president and spending more than 17 years on the P4A Board. She has mentored numerous new directors and fostered a spirit of collaboration across the region.

Holly's passion for serving older adults is evident in all that she does. This dedication has been recognized by Union County Commissioner and Chair of the USAA, Inc. Board of Directors, Stacy Richards, who said, "Her leadership has ensured that thousands of older adults in our community can live with dignity, independence, and security. She leaves behind a legacy of innovation, compassion, and service."

Shoulder Work Begins on Route 11 in Penn and Union Townships, Snyder County

Montoursville, PA – Motorists are advised that lane restrictions begin next week on Route 11 in both directions in Penn and Union townships, Snyder County, for shoulder maintenance.

Between Monday, October 27, 2025, and Wednesday, November 5, 2025, the Route 11 left (passing) lane will be restricted in both directions between Route 35 in Penn Township and Main Street in Port Trevorton, Union Township, while a Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) maintenance crew paves the shoulder in the area of the barrier.
