Gov. Wolf & Health Secretary Issue 'Stay at Home' Orders to 7 Counties

Governor Tom Wolf and Secretary of Health Dr. Rachel Levine today issued "Stay at Home" orders to Allegheny, Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Monroe, Montgomery, and Philadelphia counties, as the state seeks relief to save lives and stop the spread of COVID-19. This order took effect at 8:00 PM on Monday, March 23, 2020, and will continue until April 6, 2020.

All schools statewide will also remain closed through at least April 6, 2020.

"I remain deeply concerned about this public health crisis and we must continue to take careful but critical steps now to mitigate the spread of COVID-19," Gov. Wolf said. "We are issuing these orders because Pennsylvanians' health and safety remains our highest priority." "The number of cases continues to grow and so we must take further steps to stop the spread of this contagious and dangerous novel virus to protect the public's health and mitigate the risk to our hospital system," Dr. Levine said. "There is one way to make sure people don't need to be hospitalized and we don't strain our health care system: Stay calm. Stay home. Stay safe."

Individuals may leave their residence only to perform any of the following allowable individual activities and allowable essential travel:

- Tasks essential to maintain health and safety, or the health and safety of their family or household members (including pets), such as obtaining medicine or medical supplies, visiting a health care professional, or obtaining supplies they need to work from home
- Getting necessary services or supplies for themselves, for their family or household members, or as part of volunteer efforts, or to deliver those services or supplies to others to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences
- Engaging in outdoor activity, such as walking, hiking or running if they maintain social distancing
- To perform work providing essential products and services at a life-sustaining business
- To care for a family member or pet in another household
- Any travel related to the provision of or access to the above-mentioned individual activities or life-sustaining business activities
- Travel to care for elderly, minors, dependents, persons with disabilities, or other vulnerable persons
- Travel to or from educational institutions for purposes of receiving materials for distance learning, for receiving meals, and any other related services
- Travel to return to a place of residence from an outside jurisdiction
- Travel required by law enforcement or court order.
- Travel required for non-residents to return to their place of residence outside the commonwealth

The following operations are exempt:

- Life-sustaining business activities
- Health care or medical services providers
- Access to life-sustaining services for low-income residents, including food banks
- Access to child care services for employees of life-sustaining businesses that remain open as follows: child care facilities operating under the Department of Human Services, Office of Child Development and Early Learning waiver process; group and family child care operating in a residence; and part-day school age programs operating under an exemption from the March 19, 2020 business closure Orders.
- News media

- Law enforcement
- The federal government
- Religious institutions

Individuals experiencing homelessness are not subject to this order but are strongly urged to find shelter and government agencies are urged to take steps needed to provide shelter for those individuals.

International students, foster youth, and any other students who would otherwise experience displacement or homelessness as a result of campus closures are exempt and may remain in campus housing.

At this time, law enforcement will be focused on ensuring that residents are aware of the order and informing the public of social distancing practices rather than enforcement. To report a noncompliant business, contact your local law enforcement agency's non-emergency number or the nearest Pennsylvania State Police station. Please do not call 911 or the Department of Community and Economic Development to file reports. Law enforcement officers should refer to Business Closure Order Enforcement Guidance available online.

UJS Coronavirus Information

The Pennsylvania Judiciary has provided updates below regarding county-by-county court operations and proceedings. We continue to monitor developments regarding the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19) and its impact on court operations.

By order of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, all Pennsylvania Courts are generally closed to the public, beginning at the close of business March 19, 2020, and lasting through at least April 3, 2020, subject to general and specific directives and exceptions in the order.

We communicate regularly with the Governor's Office and the state Department of Health for guidance on measures to continue protecting the health and safety of court users and court employees.

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Judicial Emergency Declared For Snyder & Union Counties

As of March 16, 2020, President Judge Michael T. Hudock has declared a judicial emergency and all jury trials are cancelled. Snyder County jury selection for April 13-14 has been cancelled. Union County jury selection has been cancelled for April 20-21. Non-jury trials may be cancelled on a case by case basis.

Individuals who are scheduled for court are encouraged to remain outside the building or in their vehicle until the scheduled time of their court proceeding. Proceeding involving inmates in county or state prisons will be conducted via video conference to minimize risk of exposure to court employees, law enforcement personnel, inmates, prison staff, and sheriff deputies.

All court related officers will use telephone or video conferences instead of office conferences and court-related proceedings involving attorneys and a court-related officer will be conducted via telephone.

All court and court-related proceedings shall be scheduled and conducted to comply with the recommendations of the Governor and public health officials to limit the number of people assembled in one location. When possible, proceedings will be conducted via telephone or video conference.

Snyder County arraignments scheduled for April 20 are cancelled. Union County arraignments scheduled for April 27 have been cancelled. Arbitrations in Snyder & Union County have been cancelled.

Tornado Siren Testing

On Saturday April 4, 2020 at 12:00 Noon the Mifflinburg Hose Company will TEST the new TORNADO SIREN.

In the future this siren will be activated when a confirmed tornado touchdown occurs within Union County or southern Snyder County (Penns Creek area).

During this TEST we will activate the siren for THREE (3) MINUTES. The long, loud test will also be audible in surrounding townships.

This TEST will NOT be conducted in stormy weather conditions.

Covid-19 Update: Safety of the Mail

The United States Postal Service has a dedicated COVID-19 Command Response leadership team that is focusing on employee, operational, business, and customer continuity during this unprecedented epidemic. We continue to follow the strategies and measures recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and public health departments. The CDC has information available on its website at <https://www.coronavirus.gov> that provides the latest information about COVID-19.

To reduce health risks, we also are temporarily modifying customer signature capture procedures. While maintaining a safe, appropriate distance, employees will request the customer's first initial and last name so that the employee can enter the information on the electronic screen or hard copy items such as return receipts, PS Forms 3811 and 3829. For increased safety, employees will politely ask the customer to step back a safe distance or close the screen door/door so that they may leave the item in the mail receptacle or appropriate location by the customer door.

Importantly, the CDC (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/faq.html>), the World Health Organization (<https://www.who.int/news-room/q-a-detail/q-a-coronaviruses>), as well as the Surgeon General have indicated that there is currently no evidence that COVID-19 is being spread through the mail.

Specifically, according to the World Health Organization, "the likelihood of an infected person contaminating commercial goods is low and the risk of catching the virus that causes COVID-19 from a package that has been moved, travelled, and been exposed to different conditions and temperature is also low." And according to the CDC, "in general, because of poor survivability of these coronaviruses on surfaces, there is likely very low risk of spread from products or packaging that are shipped over a period of days or weeks at ambient temperatures. Coronaviruses are generally thought to be spread most often by respiratory droplets. Currently there is no evidence to support transmission of COVID-19 associated with imported goods and there have not been any cases of COVID-19 in the United States associated with imported goods."

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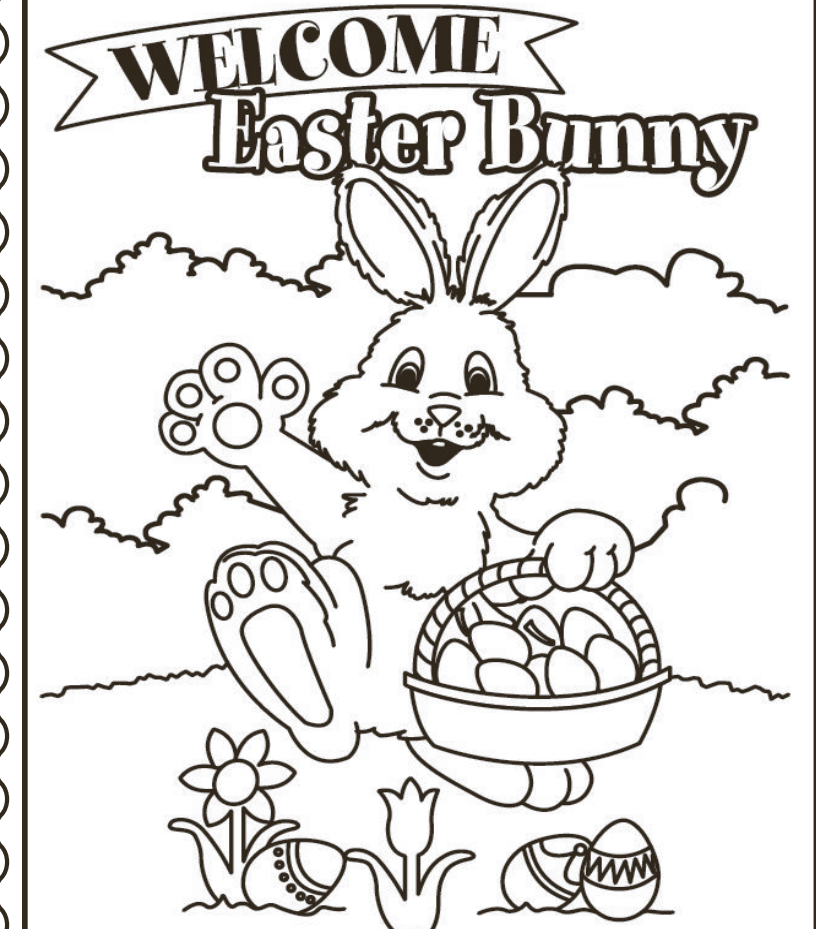

Degenstein Fdn. & Others COVID-19 Community Needs


Food pantries and schools are also being provided with toiletries, made possible by the fund, as well as vouchers for over-the-counter medications. Medications, including acetaminophen and cough syrup for adults and children, have been donated by Custom Care Pharmacy and are available with a voucher at A Community Clinic in Sunbury.

Additionally, staff and volunteers are being provide with rationed hand sanitizer. Anyone needing support should call 2-1-1, which is a 24/7 helpline for individuals with human service needs. Dial 2-1-1 to get connected to a trained community specialist that can connect individuals to resources in the area. The United Way and other partner agencies will use 2-1-1 as the referral service to triage and make referrals. If you or someone you know is experiencing a human service need for rent, food, energy assistance or other needs, please call 2-1-1.

The United Way and the entire community are grateful to the Degenstein Foundation for their consistent support of our community, particularly during times of crisis. The United Way, local Community Action Agencies, faith-based groups, and others are continuing to adapt to changes in community needs as the crisis come more complex. 
Students Lunches Distributed Weekdays Only
