

The Union County Historical Society held the annual John B. Deans Dinner and Program on Thursday, November 8 at Country Cupboard restaurant in Mifflinburg. The featured speaker was Earl E. Brown who discussed "Penns Creek Colonial Flour," and the innovative transportation system of the 1800's that moved goods from central Pennsylvania to the Susquehanna River and thence to their awaiting buyers, as far as the Chesapeake Bay.

As is customary, awards were presented to those whose efforts support the appreciation and understanding of local history, our historic environment, and our community.

The Outstanding Service Award was given to Alan Richard of Winfield for volunteering his exceptional knowledge and skill in scanning photographs and preparing photographic images for Society publications and annual calendars, as well as helping in the selection of the photographs; offering the story behind them, which provides a context for the image; and especially for his dedication to promoting the visibility and interpretation of Union County history.

The Outstanding Service Award was given to Linda Estupinan Snook for serving as the Educational Coordinator for the Historical Society: for developing and presenting programs at the Red Bank

One-room School; for bringing her reenacting skills to the classrooms as she demonstrates how folks lived and dressed in Colonial and Civil War era times; for planning the annual county bus tours that takes 4th and 5th grade students to historic locations in Union County. Linda Snook continues as a volunteer in this important position that was originally funded by state

The Historic Preservation Award was given to Bucknell University (Jim Hostettler accepting) for their adaptive reuse of the Dreisbach building at 400 Market Street, Lewisburg, now the Barnes and Noble at Bucknell University Bookstore. The c. 1900 building had been the home of C. Dreisbach's Sons' Hardware Company. Much of the front portion of the building was rebuilt after a disastrous fire in 1941. A commemorative plaque is now mounted on the building to honor the two firefighters who lost their lives bravely fighting the blaze. The austerity of the building facade reflects the World War 11 era of reconstruction. Many of the architectural elements were carefully restored by hand, including brickwork, woodwork, and steel casement and wooden double-hung windows, the original Otis freight elevator, and a handsome black steel safe. In faded print on the Fourth Street side of the building, the name Dreisbach remains visible.


# Plasticville Exhibit





# Stewart Refuses Indy Challenge For Now By Gerald Hodges/the Racing Reporter

Tony Stewart has passed up a chance to race for Roger Penske in next year's Indianapolis 500. The three-time NASCAR champion said including a sweep of Kentucky that he wouldn't attempt to race in both the Indy 500 and NASCAR's Coca-Cola 600 on the same day.

"As much as I would like to do it, we just don't have the time to do it proper," Stewart said. "The IRL is so competitive now, you're not going to just show up like drivers used to do in the past and be competitive. These guys don't leave anything on the table there. You're not going to stroll into the Indy 500 with these guys who race every week and be as competitive as they are."

Penske is the owner of Penske Racing and according to Forbes Inc. has a net worth of \$1.1 billion. He earned his livelihood through his career as a race car driver, ownership of the Penske Racing team, as CEO of Penske Automotive Group and his operation of an Indy Racing League Team and others.

Although Stewart turned down Penske's offer for now, Indianapolis Motor Speedway started an online petition where fans can encourage the two-time Brickyard 400 winner to accept the ride.

And that's not all. Several other NASCAR drivers including Brian Vickers, who tried to put together an Indy 500 deal last May but was stymied by Indy-Car's engine shortage let it be known they wanted the ride should

Stewart refuse. "I'm serious about Indy," said Vickers, "Would do it in a heartbeat, was not just tweeting to be funny."

Stewart and several other drivers including Robby Gordon have run both races in the past, but the time frame in which the two races are

held has always been a problem. There simply isn't enough time between the end of the Indianapolis

500 and the start of the Coke 600 for a driver to rest. But Julie Sobieski, ESPN vice president said the television network

would support the opportunity for drivers to participate in both races, which might include altering the starting times.

Having a big NASCAR star entered would be a bonus for both the

track and IndvCar. The Indy 500 is also Stewart's favorite race, but he failed to win in

However, Stewart didn't close the door completely. "I'm very humbled by the fact that he offered it to us," continued

Stewart. "It's a great opportunity, but it's very hard when you're running three Cup teams right now and the obligations that we have making sure that we're doing the right things, we have a lot of people that depend on us.
"It's kind of like being at Thanksgiving dinner. My plate is finally

full. I don't know if I can add anymore to what I have right now." "I'm not going to do it this year, but there's nothing saying that down

the road that I may not take him up on that same offer," Stewart said However, in an article by Speed Café, Stewart said that he has been approached several times by Paul Morris to have a crack at a V8 Supercar Series race in the shared driver races. "Paul Morris keeps inviting me out to have a go in one," said Stewart.

'I would love to have a chance to drive one. I'd love the opportunity to get behind the wheel of one." The V8 Supercars will race Stateside for the first time at the Texas

400 meeting at Austin's (Texas) Circuit Of The Americas track from May 17-19 next year. KESELOWSKI'S EARNINGS OVER 12M

five tries and last entered it in 2001.

According to NASCAR figures, Brad Keselowski, the 2012 NAS-CAR Sprint Cup champion earned \$12,106,255 dollars this year. He earned \$6.2 million in race winnings for winning five races, \$150,000 in "special prizes," and series sponsor, Sprint added a bonus of over \$5.7 million.

Clint Bowyer, runner-up in the series points race, was only fifth in money won with a total of \$7,993,802 and three wins, due to less victories.

Jimmie Johnson, who finished third in the standings, was second in earnings with a total of \$10,469,426. Of that his race winnings of \$8.129.639.00 was the most of all drivers this year. He tied Keselowski and Denny Hamlin for the most wins, five. Also he had four poles tying him with Kasey Kahne, who also had four poles.

Matt Kenseth who was third in money won, but seventh in the points, took in \$8,802,778.50 of which \$7, 528, 332 was race winnings. No doubt his win of the rain-delayed Daytona 500 (his second Daytona 500 win), worth \$1.589 million helped propel him to the top of money earners. Kenseth had two additional wins and one pole. Twenty-nine drivers won more than a million dollars this year.

YOUNĞER DRIVERS INVADING TRUCK SERIES For seven consecutive seasons, from 2004 through 2010, the truck

driver who raised the championship trophy at season's end had already celebrated his 40th birthday. In 2011, Austin Dillon, became the series' youngest champion at the

age of 21 years, six months and 22 days. Graduating to the NASCAR Nationwide Series this season, Dillon ran away with Rookie of the Year honors James Buescher won this year's title at the age of 22 years, seven

months and 21 days – the second-youngest champion in series history. He became the first Texan to win the Camping World Truck Series championship. Buescher especially excelled on the intermediincluding a sweep of Kentucky Speedway, came at 1.5-mile venues. This season was one of retribution for Buescher.

In 2011, he failed to qualify at Phoenix, the second race of the season. Though finishing third in points, the Phoenix setback spoiled a campaign that otherwise saw Buescher chip in one championship-worthy performance after another. This season, however, he started all 22 races, stationed in the top five points for 20 of them. Buescher battled Austin's

younger brother, Ty, throughout the 2012 campaign. Ty Dillon, 20 years of age, finished fourth in the series.

In fact, four of the top five final points finishers – Buescher, Dillon, Joev Coulter and Parker Kligerman – have yet to turn 23.

The youth movement continues.

KESELOWSKI, BOWYER NOT IN SHOOTOUT NASCAR's top-two drivers won't be in the February Shootout.

The sanctioning body decided prior to the start of the 2012 season to go back to its traditional eligibility requirements for the Shootout, which included pole winners from the previous year and past Shootout winners.

That means Brad Keselowski and Clint Bowyer won't be on the list

of 22 drivers eligible for the 2013 event. Not since 2004, when 2003 champion Matt Kenseth did not win a pole, has the Shootout been run without the previous year's Cup champion. The race used to be sponsored by Budweiser, which originally had






