



McCoid also recounted that he smiled and said, "Yes," when he received the invitation to come to the Upper Susquehanna Synod. are a very steady, faithful committed synod. You certainly are a warm and loving synod," McCoid said.

In assembly business, approval was given to several constitutional changes, including a new provision about the office of treasurer in the synod. The delegation also passed two resolutions and one memorial to the Churchwide Organization regarding horizontal slickwater hydraulic fracturing. The first resolution called for the synod to establish a task force to undertake a comprehensive assessment of the justice issues surrounding the natural gas industry. The second resolution takes a public stance on the issue. It calls for a statewide moratorium on the issuing of future permits for hydraulic fracturing until long-range, comprehensive studies about the cumulative effects of air and water pollution, water resource depletion, public health endangerment, and other possible impacts from the drilling and fracturing processes have been completed. The third document, or a memorial, asks the ELCA to establish its own task force to study the issue of

Housing Guidelines for ordained ministers and Associ-

ates in Ministry.

Two in-gathering offerings were received for Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) and the Mrs. Kpanah B. Harris Memorial Fund. The collection for LDR was in gratitude for their response to the synod following the September 2011 flooding. The assembly gave \$1,416.75 to that cause. The Harris Memorial Fund is in memory of the wife of Bishop Sumoward Harris of the Lutheran Church in Liberia, one of the Upper Susquehanna Synod's companion synods. The assembly gave \$1,504.25 to this cause, which will work to establish a heart clinic in

Two missionaries from Liberia also reported to the assembly. The Rev. Brian and Christine Palmer spoke of their work on behalf of the Church. In addition, the Rev. Annette Kuhn from the Ansbach-Würzburg Kirchenkreis in Germany spoke to the assembly as well. Kuhn serves in the synod's other companion synod as a dean. Elected to Synod Council
