Crop Reporting Deadline Change For Fall-Seeded Small Grains

Producers who are planting small grains this fall are reminded that the reporting date has been changed to November 15. All fall seeded small grains, existing hay fields or newly planted hay fields must be reported to the Farm Service Agency Office (FSA) if producers want to maintain farm history. Producers who are participating in government programs are required to report their planted acres to remain eligible for program benefits. Failure to report by the deadline date will result in the assessment of a late filed fee for each farm.

Kelsey's Fall Festival is held in memory of Kelsey Kuhns, who passed away November 1, 2005, after an 8 year battle with Leukemia. Kelsey's Dream is a foundation formed with the mission to make life a little brighter for children with cancer and children in need.

Kelsey's Dream (www.kelseysdream.org) supports Camp Dost, a specialized summer camp for pediatric cancer patients and their siblings. Kelsey's Dream has been able to fund t-shirts for the campers and councilors (freeing up funding for other opportunities) and provide a handmade blanket for all 100 campers. Funds raised are also used for programs at Geisinger for Pediatric Cancer Patients; Snack Pack Program and Teddies To Go kits. The foundation provided over 4,000 Chemo Ducks to children newly diagnosed with cancer, across the United States. They also provide handmade blankets and hats to every Pediatric Bone Marrow Transplant patient in three states. Check out their website to see what other programs they support.

Susquehanna River Symposium To Feature Research, Expert Speakers Oct. 12-13

Bucknell University will host the 7th Annual Susquehanna River Symposium on Fri., Oct. 12, and Sat., Oct. 13, in the Terrace Room (Room 256) of the Elaine Langone Center in the center of campus. The symposium, "Wasn't That A Mighty Storm! Flooding in the Susquehanna watershed," is free and open to the public without registration. Events will begin at 7 p.m. on Friday and at 9 a.m. on Saturday.

The symposium is sponsored by the Susquehanna River Initiative of the Bucknell University Environmental Center and by the Susquehanna River Heartland Coalition for Environmental Studies, a group of faculty members and students from local universities whose research focuses on the Susquehanna River.

According to Dr. Benjamin Hayes, Director of the Susquehanna River Initiative and chair of this year's symposium, "The goal of this symposium is to bring together students, faculty, scientists, engineers, planners, and community leaders to explore flooding in the Susquehanna watershed and its impacts on human and aquatic life, infrastructure, tributary stream channels, and areas downstream, including the Chesapeake Bay. Various speakers will also address the latest technologies and approaches to flood forecasting, floodplain management, and risk reduction."

Faculty and student research poster sessions will be held Friday evening and Saturday morning. Speakers include the following: H.W. "Skip" Wieder, director of the Susquehanna River Heartland Coalition for Environmental Studies; Paul Swartz, executive director of the Susquehanna River Basin Commission; Matthew J. Ehrhart, Pennsylvania Executive Director of the Chesapeake Bay Foundation; William Marosi, Chief Hydro-meteorologist with the Mid-Atlantic Flood Forecasting Center of NOAA National Weather Service; Mark Roland, Hydrologist with U. S. Geological Survey; R. Craig Kochel, Bucknell Professor of Geology; Geoff Smith, Biologist with Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission; T. Jay Cunningham, Director of Engineering Design with Pennsylvania Department of Transportation; and Trevor Finn, Montour County Commissioner and Sabrina Finn, Executive Director of The Women's Center Inc., of Columbia and Montour counties.

"Because of its geographic location with respect to sources of hurricanes and tropical storms, the enormous size of the watershed, and the hydrology and morphology of the channel, the Susquehanna River is one of the most flood-prone rivers in the United States," Hayes said. "Many of us remember clearly the devastation and deaths related to Hurricane Agnes in 1972 and other floods -- including the ice floods of 1972 and January 1996 -- and Hurricane Ivan in 2004. In early September of last year, Tropical Storm Lee dumped over 18 inches of rain in the watershed, which was already water-logged from Hurricane Irene sweeping through the basin several weeks earlier. Lee was the flood of record in our region. The flooding closed Bucknell's campus, displaced over 100,000 people, causes massive amounts of erosion and sedimentation, destroyed over 100 miles of roads, bridges, farm fields, and communities. Understanding the causes of flooding and their impact on streams, aquatic ecosystems, and human life is of great interest to people in our region."

A panel discussion, "Flood impacts and planning for the future," moderated by John Dawes, executive director with Foundation for Pennsylvania Watersheds, will follow the speakers on Saturday; and a showing of "The Water's Edge: Profits and policy behind the rising catastrophe of floods," an award-winning documentary by the Flood Safety Project and Public Entity Risk Institute, will be held in Walls Lounge (Room 213) of the Elaine Langone Center at 2:15 p.m.

PA Dutch Life & Culture

Today I'll share some interesting WWI information I received from a reader:

My father, Harvey Garrett, was born in 1896. He had traveled at about age 4 with his parents by covered wagon from Minnesota to Auburn, Washington. He passed away at age of 89.

He told me about the training method used on the ship going over to Brest, France as lot of farm boys got some of their training on the boat. Well, this squad of uncoordinated fellows had a knowing Sgt. in charge who understood the mindset of these rural draftees. He attached a small wad of hay to left foot and small wad of straw to right foot of each man. Lining them up in squad formation, when marching he would call: HAY FOOT, straw foot, HAY FOOT, straw foot, HAY FOOT, straw foot, and with the old military bravado got this group off on the right foot, so to speak.

Fortunately for my father, the Armistice was signed the day they reached Port in France and they were all so happy they threw their hats in the air. Dad lost his and was forced to purchase another one. His length of service—only 6 months.

Dad talked much about his 6 months service, like it was forever. I was shocked when I asked, "How long were you in Army?" to get his reply, as his stories would make you think he had spent a lifetime in the military. His reward—many memories and a \$21.00 a month pension. It was a big event in his life!

I also happened to recall my Uncle Wayne who was in WWI telling about his basic training. He was 5ft 2in and when they crossed the big river near Fort Lewis, Washington, he had to hang onto the pack of man ahead of him to keep his nose above water. He was gassed in WWI and often had to use an atomizer to breathe. He died at age 54.

Kenseth Survives Chaotic Finish

TALLADEGA, Ala.—Matt Kenseth stood in victory lane Sunday with his No. 17 Ford intact, after winning the Sprint Cup Good Sam 500.

The same cannot be said for at least 21 cars that were behind him.

A caution came out on lap 183 of the 188-lap race, which set up a green-white-checked finish. Kenseth briefly took the lead on the restart, before relinquishing it to Tony Stewart. As the cars entered turn-4 on the final lap, Michael Waltrip, with a push from Casey Mears tapped the left rear of Stewart's No. 14.

Stewart slid, spun, and then went airborne.

It was chaos for those behind the leaders.

Kenseth was running second at the time the caution came out, and was declared the winner.

"The car was pretty fast, but hard to control," said Kenseth. "I got slowed down and I saw they were coming three-wide. I got a push and didn't see much after that."

Kenseth remains 12th in points, 62 behind the leader, with no hope to win this year's Chase.

Stewart acknowledged that he caused the big wreck.

"I messed up," he said. "I turned down. Michael (Waltrip) had a full head of steam, and I came down on him. I take full responsibility. It was my fault."

Stewart dropped from 5th to 7th in points, 43 behind the leader.

Jeff Gordon managed to get through the wreck and finish second.

"I didn't see anything but Kasey Kahne's bumper," said Gordon. "There's never been anything like this happen at Talladega. We were trying to race hard, but keep from wrecking. When I saw all that stuff, I just put it to the floor, and somehow came through it."

Gordon moved up four Chase spots to 6th. Being 42 points back with just six races remaining is probably too much for him to make up.

Kyle Busch, David Ragan, Greg Biffle, Regan Smith, Brad Keselowski, Travis Kvapil, Ryan Newman, and Jeff Burton were the remaining top-10 finishers.

Jimmie Johnson was caught up in the last lap wreck and finished 17th. He is now 14 points behind Keselowski.

paid up front.

And there are a lot of other concussions tracks must give.

Gateway International Raceway and Nashville Speedway, which hosted Nationwide and truck events for several years, started coming up in the red, so they told NASCAR, "Good bye."

Another example is The Milwaukee Mile in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, which also held NASCAR events. When it became unprofitable, the Fairgrounds Board, owner of the track, leased it to a different promoter/manager. After two years, that promoter could not turn a profit.

NASCAR goes first class. They don't slip in the back door. If you're going to partner in a NASCAR race, expect to pay big bucks. A lot of tracks and promoters want to jump on their bandwagon, until they learn that the only profiteers will be NASCAR.

NASCAR has one of the best marketing departments in the country, and they see to it that all the bases are covered. But it comes with a price. Fans, television, teams, track vendors, and track owners all help fund a NASCAR race.

Sometimes there isn't enough for everyone, and that's what happened to the Montreal promoter. He said, "That's enough." He wasn't willing to continue losing money.

NASCAR still hopes to race in Canada, possibly at Mosport International Raceway in Toronto, a track that is co-owned by Ron Fellows, the popular road course racer. In order to fill next year's 33-race schedule, they are looking at two other venues; Mid-Ohio Sports Car track in Lexington, Ohio, and Road Atlanta, just outside Atlanta, Georgia.

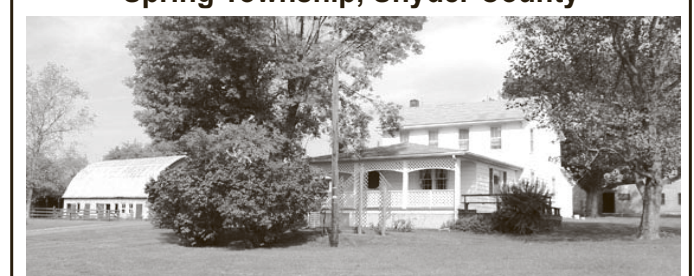

FSA Prepares to Issue CRP and DCP Payments

Snyder/Union County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Mary Kiel, announced that FSA will issue Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) and Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) payments during the first few weeks of October.

"FSA will issue the payments timely as long as all producer eligibility requirements are met," said Mrs. Kiel.

CRP and DCP payments could be affected if producers have not submitted the required Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) forms. Affected producers will need to submit the proper AGI forms before payments can be issued. In addition, producers who signed up for CRP emergency haying and grazing and did not pay in advance will notice that their annual rental payment was reduced by the acreage that was hayed or grazed.

"Producers who were affected by county office consolidations will not experience payment delays of this nature," said Mrs. Kiel. "All county office payments, regardless of consolidations, will be generated at the same time as long as all other eligibility requirements are met," she said.
