





### Beavertown Honors Their Hometown Monkee Davy Jones





On Wednesday, February 29, 2012, Davy Jones, the lead singer of The Monkees, suffered a massive heart attack and passed away in Indiantown, Florida, near one of his homes. Jones was 66 years old. He was born in Manchester, England, on December 30, 1945. Jones owned a 15 acrehome, Spruce Lawn Farm, in Beavertown for over 22 years, on which he raised horses. He was very active in the community. He even purchased an old church on Orange Street that many residents considered an eye sore. Jones planned on turning the church into a community theater and Davy Jones Museum. He had the church repainted, brand new windows installed and a brand new steel roof and added a belfry. Jones also worked to revitalize other parts of Beavertown. Mayor Cloyd Wagner plans to create vertown.

Beavertown is holding a Davy Jones Memorial Service on Saturday, March 10, 2012, from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m. The service will begin at the Firemen's Carnival Grounds, 212 Sassafras Avenue (right behind the firehall and the Post Office) from 12 p.m. to 2:45 p.m. Attendees should bring lawn chairs. If inclement weather, bring rain gear and no alcoholic beverages permitted. The progam events are as follows: Music Jam by invited musicians on hand; Davy's friends tell of their

fond interactions with him: reading some comments of some who could not come in person; intermission; change venue to his proposed museum and community theater on Orange Street, 121 North Orange Street, from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m.; the solemn laying of the flowers, wreathes, photos and other gifts in honor of and to the memory of the day and closing remarks.


Jones rose to fame and became an international teen heart throb in the 1960's for his role on the television classic The Monkees. He continued his career as a serious actor and comedian on the theatrical stage, as a rock musician, composer and an artist, along with being true to his first love, as an extremely able horseman. Jones began his career at age 11 as Ena Sharples grandson on the still-running ITV Soap Opera Coronation Street. He went on to portray Dicken's mischievous "Artful Dodger" in the West End Production of *Oliver!* He later went on to play this role on Broadway and was nominated for a Tony Award at age 16. As a result of his success, he was offered a contract with Columbia Pictures/Screen Gems Television and The Monkees was created shortly after. Even though the series lasted from 1966-1968 with 58 episodes, the musical group's album sales surpassed all records and they continue to be best-sellers thirty years later. The Monkees, which include Jones along with bandmates Peter Tork, Mike Nesmith and Mickey Dolenz, recorded hits "Day Dream Believer", "I'm a Believer" (which was remade by Smash Mouth for the movie Shrek) and "Last Train to Clarksville," along with many

One of Jones most memorable television appearances was on the 1971 television show The Brady Bunch in the episode called "Getting Davy Jones" where he was Marsha Brady's dream prom date. He reprised his role in the 1995

The Brady Bunch Movie. Jones was working on creating the community theater and Davy Jones Museum before he passed away. It is unknown if the project will ever be completed.

Davy is survived by his wife Jessica, whom he married August 30, 2010, four daughters Talia, Sarah, Jessica and Annabel from previous marriages. He also has three sisters, who reside in England - Hazel, Beryl and Lynda and three grandchildren.

Letters Written During WW1 From Jay A. Rigel to Family and Friends

Letter to: Mrs. P.F. Rigel Date: May 25, 1918 Location: Camp Merritt

Dear Parents and all:

I mailed the letter that I wrote this morning. We got orders to send our identification number home and do it soon. It is a big number and I want you to copy it and keep it so you will not loose it. It is 1,946,691. We will wear identification tags, one around the neck and one on an arm. The name and number is on each tag.

Carrie asked about writing paper, she wants to send me some. I told her not to send it. We can get it free from the Y.M.C.A

(NOTE: At the top of each page, an American flag was on the left hand side, the words "With The Colors" are in the middle of the page and a triangle with Y.M.C.A. adorns the right hand side of the page. On the bottom of each page, the following statement occurs: "Help your County by Saving. Write on BOTH Sides of this Paper".)

The government will furnish our soap and towels now. So, we will not need to buy them.

Well, if you do not hear from me for 4 or 5 days you can guess I left the U.S. for somewhere in France. We might be here only a week and maybe 3 or 4 weeks. We do not know and will not know until we get orders, which will be only a very short time before we leave.

I sent a few cards out this morning. Our mail will be forwarded from Camp Sherman to this camp. I got a letter from Carrie at noon written on the 21st. I just bought a service pin. It cost only 25 cents and guess

it will not keep the color it should have. Father can wear it or whoever wants to. The U.S. boys are well taken care of over there. They are bet-

ter fed than any of the other armies. One man that has been around here for a few months told us

thy give all the boys a 24 hour pass to see some of N.Y. city. I will write again soon and will look for a letter from you soon. My love to all, Jay

I found some interesting facts in Dunkelberger's Story of Snyder County...the first registration took place on June 5th, 1917. All men eligible between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-one were required to register. A second registration was held on June 5th, 1918. The total registered for Snyder County was 3,079. When the Snyder County Honor Roll was unveiled in 1919, 609 from Snyder County were on it, plus 18 more who I assume served, but like Jay Rigel, had registered at a different place.

Of this number, 570 were volunteers or inducted men in the various branches of service in camp or field, thirty-three were in the students' Army Training Corps and six were volunteer nurses. Snyder County lost twenty-eight men in the war. Six were killed in action, six died of wounds, fifteen died of diseases and one died in an accident. Thirty-one men were gassed or wounded. Only one soldier, Roy R. Bickhart of Paxtonville, was taken prisoner.

You can find a list of the soldiers and nurses in Wagenseller's Snyder County Annals, Volume 2. The record usually includes a picture, together with a brief sketch of their career. I would love to have information about the WW1 records of



NASCAR NOTES: Penske racing will switch from Dodge to Ford in 2013. The team fields Dodge Chargers for No. 2 Brad Keselowski and No. 22 A.J. Allmendinger. When Penske returned to NASCAR in 1991, he ran Pontiacs through the 1994 season. He switched to Fords for the next eight seasons, 1995 through 2002, before forming his alliance with Dodge. The penalty dropped him to 49th in the points standings, 58 points out of the top-10 and 46 out of the top-20. Johnson does not have to worry about the team falling out of the top-35 in the owner standings

because he has access to a past champion's provisional.




Photo post card of White Springs c. 1910
