The Dedication Ceremony welcomed a 2021 Sutphen Custom Pumper Tanker into operation. The tanker will serve Union Township and surrounding communities as Engine 6. Many thanks to committee members Rick Wetzel, Dave Anderson, Andy Renner, Chris Benfer, Benjamin Wetzel, Stave Hlavaty, Greg Wagner, John Ziants, Jeff Brouse, and the late Steve Anderson for their efforts on this project. The truck was built in the Sutphen East plant in Lake Ariel, PA.

This new Sutphen Custom Pumper was dedicated to the memory of Deputy Fire Chief Steven R. Anderson who passed away on November 27. Since 1975 Steve served in the Union Township Fire Company in Winfield and held many positions including Vice President. He was also a lifetime member and past Assistant Chief of William Cameron Engine Company in Lewisburg.

Farmland Protection Signup

Attention Union County Farmland Owners:

Applications for the 2022 Union County Ag-Land Preservation Program are being accepted until January 31, 2022. The Ag-Land Preservation Program is a State and County-run program that purchases development rights from landowners in order to protect farmland for future food production and open space preservation. This method of preserving farmland allows landowners to receive compensation for keeping their land in farming. The price paid for these rights is based on the difference between the whole farm-development market value and the farmland market value. For the year 2021 purchase period, easement purchases in Union County ranged from \$2400 to \$3140 per acre. Base prices are determined by a certified appraisal. A locally appointed board of director's guide the program, and establishes the methodology of prioritizing farms and the purchase price of development rights. The purchase price may not exceed 85% of the appraised easement value. In order to qualify, farms must be in a duly recorded Ag. Security Area, have at least 50 acres (unless contiguous to other approved preserved land), and meet soil quality parameters as required by state regulations. A farm must have a current erosion and sedimentation or conservation plan, and a manure management or nutrient management plan to apply.

As you may be aware, the Union County Ag-Land Preservation Board purchases easements through a very competitive and limited program. However, you may not be aware that the program also accepts donations of agricultural conservation easements. By donating your development rights from the property to a qualified organization, you may generally deduct the fair market value of the property. We will be accepting donations during this same timeframe and this is a way to have peace of mind that your farm will remain farmland.



Both times Anne was the nurse giving the shots. She was super friendly, relaxed, and made my son feel at ease. She did not treat him any differently as a 30-year-old disabled man than she would anyone else. He joked with her, she joked back. We both felt like she was a friend and was most certainly the kindest part of the process."

Bingaman continued, "When someone is 'different,' people around often react. This was a challenging day for us. Masks, COVID, etc., has been very stressful for my son. He does not always keep his opinions in-check due to frontal lobe issues. Anne acted with such kindness and warmth. It is the little things that matter most."

Griffin has a long history at Evangelical, beginning in October 2000 as a member of the PRN nursing pool. In January 2005, she began in Pediatrics where she served until she transferred to the Emergency Department in December 2010. In September 2020, Griffin began serving at the Ambulatory Surgical Center. Becoming "semi-retired" in October 2021, Griffin continues to be an active per diem employee serving patients through the COVID-19 vaccination clinics.

The DAISY Foundation was established in 1999 in California by the family of J. Patrick Barnes, who died at the age of 33 from complications of an auto-immune disease. During his eight-week hospital stay, his family was impressed by the care and compassion his nurses provided, not only to him but to everyone in the family. They created the DAISY Award in his memory to recognize those nurses who make a big difference in the lives of so many people.

Evangelical is proud to be a DAISY Award partner. Nurses are nominated by patients, family members of patients, as well as other healthcare professionals. Nominations are presented for consideration through a process of anonymity. The winner is then selected by a board of healthcare workers. Each DAISY Award Honoree is given a DAISY Award pin, a certificate of honor, a gift card from Service First Federal Credit Union, and a stone sculpture entitled, A Healer's Touch, handcrafted by a tribe in Zimbabwe.
