The inaugural Frosty 5k run/walk sponsored by the Lewisburg Sunset Rotary is planned for Saturday, February 4 starting at 10am in front of The Campus Theater in Downtown Lewisburg. Pre-registration is encouraged, however race day sign-ups will be accepted starting at 8:30am in The Campus Theater. Commemorative race hats are available while supplies last. Event is part of the 9th Annual Heart of Lewisburg Ice Festival and is organized by Fit for Funds of Lewisburg.

Bicentennial Books

 Roadmaster report: 25 ton of salt was delivered and stored, road names have been corrected with GIS, Tim attended a winter maintenance training with LSAT, approved the purchase of a new communication radio to be installed in one of the Twp trucks.
 Zoning report: No permits were issued during the month of October.
 Ambulance report: No report available. It had previously been requested that the Twp help cover training costs for WE ambulance. Currently, the ambulance pays for the training & if the person does not pass the course they must then reimburse the ambulance. S. Buttorff suggested that the Twp reimburse the ambulance for trainings after the course is passed so that the Twp does not become involved in collection responsibilities.
 Fire Co report: No report available
 Rec Center report: The building will be open 8am to 3pm effective 11/10/11 for walkers. The kitchen is coming together nicely but still in progress.

Old Business:
 C. Mifflinburg Hose Co. agreement — S. Buttorff noted that the Twp had previously received and read a letter at the 10/19/11 meeting from the Mifflinburg Hose Co notifying the Twp that Mifflinburg would pull their truck on 10/31/11. Mifflinburg thought that West End would be first due by that date. The supervisors did not feel that the West End Fire Co could be made first due at that time. Mifflinburg Hose held a special meeting & decided they would leave their truck in the Twp until 12/31/11. An addendum was proposed to the agreement between Mifflinburg Hose & the Twp. Motion by S. Buttorff to approve the addendum to Mifflinburg Hose Co agreement to extend services with the Twp through 12/31/11. All other parts of the agreement to remain the same. Second by B. Hosterman. Both in favor, motion passed.

 Meeting reconvened at 7:32 pm
 B: The Fireman Relief money was discussed in Executive Session. \$21028.20 must be disbursed by 11/26/11. The Twp had 2 fire companies providing services in 2008. West End Fire Co for the first 6 months & Mifflinburg Hose Co for the remaining 6 months of 2008. The entire 2008 Fire Relief funding was given to Mifflinburg Hose Co. West End Fire Co. should have received half of that money. To be fair, the 2011 will be split between Mifflinburg Hose & WE Fire Co as follows: \$21028.00 / 12 = \$1752.00; \$1750.00 x 11 = \$19250.00; \$19250.00 - \$6661.00 = \$12589.00 split will be \$12590.00 to Mifflinburg Hose Co & \$8438.20 to West End Fire Co. Motion by B. Hosterman to pay 2011 Fire Relief money of \$12590.00 to Mifflinburg Hose Co. Second by S. Buttorff. Both in favor, motion passed.

Since a new West End fireman relief assoc has not yet been formed, Rob Brady (DCED consultant) suggested the Twp request an extension of the 11/26/11 deadline for distributing foreign fire relief monies. As such, the Twp needs to ask the Auditor General for an extension so that the \$8438.20 that the Twp wants to give to WE Fire Co can be held until the relief assoc is formed. Motion to send a letter to the Auditor General requesting permission to hold \$8438.20 of the Fire Relief money for an additional 120 days until West End Fire Co is recognized. Letter to be sent certified mail.
 C: Tim Leitzel's General Foreman pay rate — Pay rate as General Foreman will be \$15.00/hr. Motion by S. Buttorff to set General Foreman rate at \$15.00/hr effective 11/16/11. Second by B. Hosterman. Both in favor, motion passed.
 D: Duane Camp's rate for sink installment at Rec Ctr — 0. Camp did work that was in addition to his regular duties installing a sink, plumbing & 2 microwaves in the Rec Ctr kitchen. S. Buttorff asked what the base labor rate for the Twp was. It is \$8.83/hr. He noted that minimum wage was \$7.25/hr. B. Hosterman suggested a rate of \$10.00/hr. Motion by S. 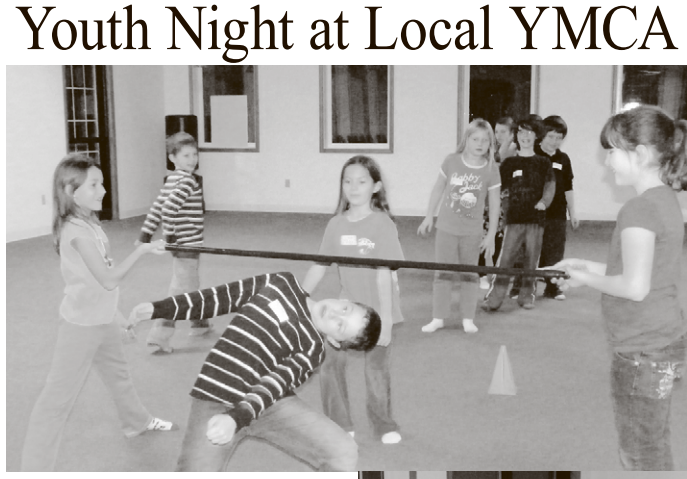

Letters Written During WW1 From Jay A. Rigel to Family and Friends

Letter to: Mrs. P. F. Rigel
Date: April 26, 1918
Location: Camp Sherman
Dear Parents and Bro,
This is Friday evening and will write a few lines. Got a pair of socks and a handkerchief. Suppose you sent it.
The weather has been unsettled the last few weeks with plenty of rain. I guess I told you I am driving a team now. It is not hard work but takes nearly all my time. They started to haul some of the rations at night. I hauled coal on Tuesday evening and last evening. I got through at 10 o'clock on Tuesday evening and 9 o'clock last evening. They are trying to run the camp like they do in France. In France everything is hauled at night. During the day we don't do very much but we have our teams hitched all day.
We are quarantined again. Guess for scarlet fever. One of the new men has it.
We are going on the rifle range for five days. I think we go tomorrow. Nearly all the company will go. I will let you know when the quarantine is lifted and when I get back from the range. I do not want Father to come as long as we are quarantined.
We have about 175 men in the company now. There will be no passes issued for a few weeks. The camp is filled up again and I don't think the new men will be trained here very long.
We go on hikes a couple times a week. The teamsters drive the teams and don't need to walk.
News is scarce and I must write a few more letters yet. I got a letter from cousin Maggie Krick on February 14th and have not answered it yet. Also Janet Ulsh. Cousin Elsie Kaltriter wrote a letter sometime ago. So I have some to answer if I get time. I will write again when I get back from the range.
I wish you all could see the camp and the men at drill. We do some drilling after retreat if we have time for it.
This leaves me well. Hope it will find you the same.

P.S. Roy wrote that he doesn't think he can come to camp, so if Father wants to come later let me know.

Saturday noon --- I will not go to the range today. Some of the other drivers are going.

Have you made Schnitz and Knepp recently? I made it this past week and it IS delicious! But perhaps you need to have acquired "a taste" for it in the past... What do you think? Are there other PA Dutch recipes that aren't so common today that you remember, that you prepare or is there a recipe you would like to have, so you CAN try it? Let me know...

Did you ever have scarlet fever? Or were you around someone who had it? Have you heard stories of someone who had it? Even though I worked in hospitals for many years, I don't think I've ever seen a case of scarlet fever. Tell me about it and also about the quarantines that used to be put on homes where there was a communicable disease. 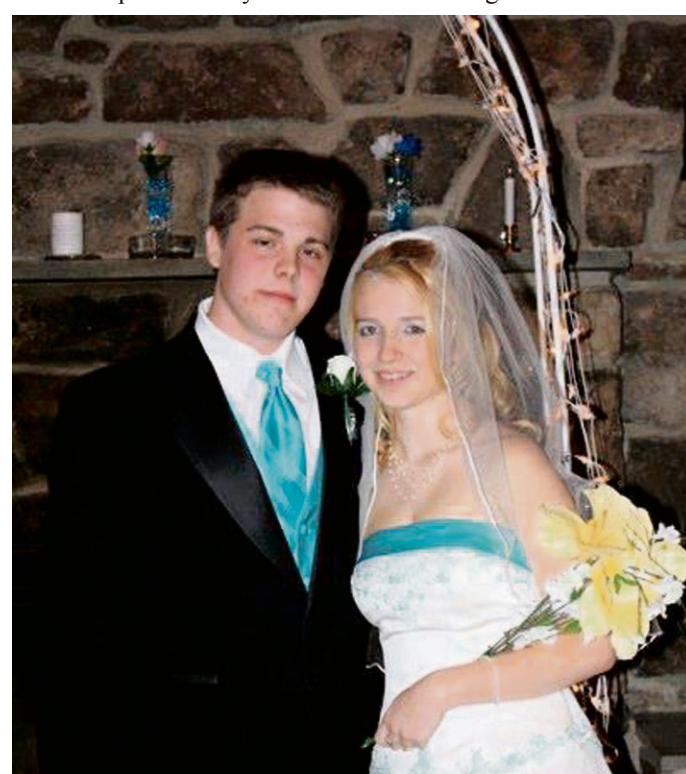

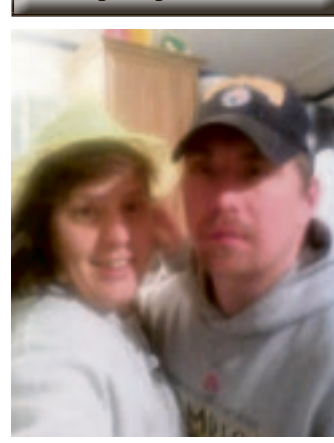
