I reported last week that the sky isn't falling on the Phillies. The sky was awfully low in Pittsburgh last weekend with all the rain and the Pirates sweeping three games from the Phils. Their run production is running pretty low as well. Bryce Harper means more to their offense than we previously thought.

The Steeler fans nightmare finally came true as I have been saying since January. Aaron Rodgers is officially a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers. No one can tell me that Rodgers isn't a better quarterback than Mason Rudolph. People don't like his attitude, age and fascination with ayahuasca. Rodger's first step to win the fans over would be to toss the football with Paul Skenes in the outfield as Skenes warms up before a start.

I can't see the Steelers going far in the postseason or even making the playoffs with Rodgers as their QB. He will win more games than Rudolph but that's the rub. Pittsburgh will win enough games to be slotted in their normal 18th to 22nd pick in next year's NFL draft. If Rudolph was the QB they would have a top ten pick in a quarterback-rich draft.

The New York Knicks continue to take one step forward and two steps back. Firing coach Tom Thibodeau after he led the Knicks to the Eastern Conference Finals for the first time in 25 years was a terrible move. Owner James Dolan loves star power and not the blue collar, lunch pail carrying coach that Thibs is. Dolan once had Isiah Thomas as his GM/head coach!

If you had a chance to watch any of the French Open tennis finals match last weekend you were treated to competition at its highest level. #2 seed Carlos Alcaraz was trailing #1 seed Jannik Sinner triple championship point at 3-5, 0-40 in the fourth set. That was the beginning of Alcaraz's unprecedented, preposterous comeback as he completely turned the match around.

The US Open golf championship is currently being played at Oakmont CC outside Pittsburgh. Scottie Scheffler is the favorite

and ranked the best golfer in the world. Is he really the best? LIV golf has watered down the quality of PGA fields. LIV players such as Brooks Koepka, Bryson DeChambeau and Jon Rahm are very good and will validate just how good Scheffler is.

If you listen to what Ohio State fans are advocating for penalties to the Michigan football program you have to laugh. They include vacating all wins over the last five years and their national title. Losing 30 scholarships for three years and banning Jim Harbaugh from ever entering the state of Michigan again! They are even calling them "that team to the south" because now Michigan will forever reside beneath them. It's going to be interesting to see what the actual penalties will be.

In last week's article I mentioned changes in college sports need some guide rails. It appears the NCAA settlement of the antitrust suit against them last week is a start. The NCAA has agreed to directly pay athletes and provides back pay to former athletes. It includes paying \$2.8 billion to athletes who played between 2016 and 2024. Payments will be issued over ten years and most of the money will come from the NCAA.

Power 4 conference schools (ACC, Big 10, Big 12 and SEC) will be able to share up to \$20.5 million in revenue with their athletes, with this amount increasing in future years. Other Division I institutions can choose to participate or not. No school is required to pay a dime to any player and just add it to their bottom line. Competition for players will require the big schools to get into a bidding war. This \$20.5M is basically a salary cap.

The benefit of this revenue sharing is that schools can have contracts with athletes and limit the number of transfers. There will be a buyout of the contracts and if another school pays that buyout that money goes against the new school's cap. There is no rule for a contract but schools will push them for consistent rosters year to year.

Athletes can still negotiate external NIL deals, but those worth \$600 or more will be subject to scrutiny to ensure they are at fair market value. It will no longer be 'pay to play.'

What all of this means is that schools will be eliminating sports that cost too much money. The big explosion in women's basketball and softball will be curtailed due to return on investment. Olympic

sports are also going to suffer for the same reason. I also foresee chaos and a lot of separation between athletic departments and school administrators.

It remains to be seen what happens to the smaller men's basketball schools like Fordham and Butler. The days of a non-Power 4 school making a deep run into March Madness will be limited. Talent on the gridiron at P4 schools will be spread out with the salary cap creating some parity.

In a related story ...Penn State is one of the first schools to sign a capital deal with a private equity firm. The College Investment Initiative is funded by the sports consulting firm Elevate. The total amount is reported to be in the eight-figures. Penn State AD Pat Craft is still denying any deal. Stay tuned for more to come.

District 4 LAX teams have now lost their last 20 games in state competition dating back to 2015. Both the Grove boys and Lewisburg girls lost their first round games. Different areas of the state each have their winning reputation in various sports.

D4 wrestling has traditionally been a power in PA along with the Allentown area. District 12 (Philly) in basketball, D3 and 7 (Allentown and Pittsburgh burbs) for baseball. Allentown and Harrisburg area for field hockey and Pittsburgh for football.

Congratulations to Lewisburg's Landen Wagner (outfielder) and Mifflinburg's Cole Reibsome (pitcher) being named Heartland conference first team All-Stars. Mid-West infielder Braxton Smith and Wagner were also named first team District 4 All-Stars.

Athletes are not the only profession to not honour signed contracts. Shikellamy superintendent Jason Bendle is heading to Berwick with more than two years remaining on his contract. He left Danville for Shik after serving only 14 months of a five year contract. Do we want these types of people educating our youth?

It's been one month since Don Kelly took over as manager for the Pirates. His record is 15-14 and he already received a contract extension. Is there hope? Shadeur Sanders will be the Browns starting QB by Columbus day. Annie Knight Gregory's Grave Marker Restored by Conrad Weiser DAR

Recently, Conrad Weiser DAR replaced a repaired grave marker, cleaned the stone, and placed a wreath of remembrance on "Real Daughter" Annie Knight Gregory's grave in Union Cemetery in Selinsgrove. Annie Knight Gregory was the last surviving NSDAR Real Daughter. The daughter of Revolutionary War Soldier Richard Knight. He served as a drummer boy in the Revolutionary War with George Washington. Richard Knight was a Captain

of the infantry company he organized during the War of 1812.

She was on March 23, 1843 born in Liverpool, PA when her father was 66 years old. She attended Freeburg Academy. At the age of 18, she married Benjamin Gregory, a Selinsgrove banker.

Annie Knight Gregory joined DAR on November 4, 1897 #21323. She remembered her father as a tall man of dignified military bearing. On the occasion of Annie's 100th birthday she received greetings from President Franklin D Roosevelt. At Annie's death on December 17, 1943, she was NSDAR's last surviving real daughter.

Penn Valley Airport Hosted 2025 Open House

On May 31, 2025, the Penn Valley Airport in Selinsgrove hosted its 4th Annual Open House, organized by the Penn Valley Pilots Organization and Board of Directors. Residents of Snyder, Union, and Northumberland counties flocked to the event with 2,000 in attendance. Local Boy Scouts did an excellent job of parking and maneuvering guests and their vehicles in and out of the designated parking area.

The Open House featured exhibits, tours, and aircraft from Geisinger Life Flight, Angel Flight East, and local pilots. Planes were on display outside of the hangars and there were a variety of exhibitors inside the terminal including Brian's Susquehanna Thruway Project, Monkey RC (Jason Rice, RC Pilot), AerObats, Susquehanna Valley Modelers and more were all engaging with the public and showcasing the talent of the Valley's own pilot community.

This year the Army National Guard made a presence with recruiters and a trailer filled with activities for all. Sang Bilger of Selinsgrove put forth his best punch at the boxing activity to place a number on the scoreboard. Young people cheered him on! His wife, Debbie, enjoyed asking the recruiters about the Army National Guard and they were all very willing to answer her questions!

Local pilots were proud to exhibit their aircraft and share their experiences in flying for business and pleasure. Visitors walked across the airfield snapping photos, chatting with pilots, peeking inside the planes while youngsters clambering aboard to explore. Airplanes and helicopters taxied down the runway and into the sky thrilling their occupants as well as the spectators below.

According to Debbie Bilger, "Pilots were on hand to answer any questions. It was enjoyable to watch the airplanes as they flew in

and out of the airport, especially as the pilots had to navigate the wind speeds."

A popular attraction seemed to be the helicopter rides as many were taking to the skies for their first flight! People lined up for tours from Chester County Aviation, located in Coatesville PA, who offered helicopter rides. People were eager for a sightseeing tour. Chester County Aviation went up and down the Susquehanna River. "We are looking forward to next year's event," said Ethan Crane, owner of Chester County Aviation.

Valley Sky Tours were also giving tours in their Mooney 4-seater. The plane is approximately 47 years old and can fly at speeds of 200 miles per hour. Monica Kline and her daughter Ava were thrilled with their ride. "We both loved it. The views were amazing. And, I can't wait to go on another ride next year!" If you missed the opportunity to soar in the sky and see the Susquehanna Valley from a different vantage point, Valley Sky Tours offers sightseeing tours around the Susquehanna Valley, "their home base at Penn Valley Airport."

Keystone Aviation Group from the Northumberland Airport had two airplanes this year, providing rides and introductory flights to guests. The spectacle of aircraft equipped with smoke passing overhead delighted both children and adults, eliciting cheers and smiles.

Brady Fries, a native Penn Valley and now airline pilot, noted that "All ride goers loved their experiences with our three providers of flight experiences, the weather didn't hold anyone back."

There is a myriad of employment opportunities in aviation. In addition to pilots, other careers include airplane and helicopter mechanics, avionics technicians, air traffic controllers, drone pilots, dispatchers, and meteorologists. Recruiters from multiple airlines were also present, offering valuable insights into career opportunities, flight programs, and pathways to entering the aviation field. Attendees had the chance to engage directly with representatives, gaining valuable information about starting a career in aviation. Piedmont Airlines was a hit with their recruiters answering many questions from attendees interested in careers from the ground to sky.

"These events are also a foundation to help inspire the next generation of aviators whether that be flying or mechanical, to air traffic controller to airline dispatcher," said Fries.

Inside the terminal, a Redbird FMX full-motion aircraft simulator provided by Susquehanna STEM to the Skies was booked with enthusiastic future pilots. This provided hands-on experience in a virtual setting. It is exciting and realistic. Just seeing it does not begin to describe the overall rush of taxiing down the runway and flying into the clouds adjusting for the altitude, mountains, and terrain. Large crowds were gathered asking commercial pilots questions. Lots of people were posing for photos alongside airplanes that were on display. Piedmont Airlines sponsored a live on-air broadcast with This Is Bigfoot Country. Pilot Pals and Summit Early Learning also offered activities. SUN Tech partnered with Susquehanna STEM to the Skies and raffled off a '07 Oshkosh Pedal Plane.

Outside, young children and their families were enjoying face painting and playing a Connect Four-yard game. Selinsgrove DH&L along with Hummel's Wharf and Shamokin Dam had fire trucks on display. There were lots of food trucks on hand with options for all!

The Open House highlighted the importance of this regional airport to local communities. Penn Valley Airport provides jobs and economic value to the community. Aviation and business go hand-in-hand. Many private businesses use the airport to grow and maintain their businesses. First Responders also use the airport for emergency and disaster situations. The Penn Valley Pilots Organization (PVPO) is committed to expanding and enhancing the Open House each year. The Penn Valley Airport is located at 100 Airport Road in Selinsgrove.

"This great community event brings everyone together to show what aviation is," said Fries. "We offer different types of entertainment and activities for all. Next year we're working for something bigger and better, hoping to see familiar and new faces at Penn Valley Airport!"

Lewisburg Downtown Partnership Received 2 Grants

During the Main Street America Conference in Philadelphia, Governor Josh Shapiro recently announced that his Administration is investing in 81 community projects across Pennsylvania through the Main Street Matters program, fulfilling a key promise he made to help revitalize downtowns, support small businesses, and strengthen local economies. This historic investment in Pennsylvania’s Main Streets follows Governor Shapiro’s work to create the new Main Street Matters initiative and secure \$20 million for the 2024-25 bipartisan budget.

The Lewisburg Downtown Partnership received 2 grants totaling \$175,000 through the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development- \$75,000 Business Improvement Grant and a \$100,000 Implementation Grant.

The Business Improvement Grants will be awarded to applicants within the downtown district as micro-grants not to exceed \$5,000 each. These funds can be used to strengthen operations, foster long-term growth, or help small businesses make critical façade, structural, or interior improvements. “The Business Improvement Grant program will directly support the hardworking entrepreneurs who are the heart-beat of downtown. We’re excited to help them grow, thrive, and continue to enrich our community,” noted Ellen Ruby, Executive Director, Lewisburg Downtown Partnership.

The Implementation Grant is slated to provide wayfinding signage. “This investment through Main Street Matters is a game changer for Lewisburg. With these new gateway signs, we’re inviting the world to discover the heart and soul of our community—our historic downtown and the people and businesses that make it so special,” added Ruby. This includes everything from brown historic street signs to an interactive downtown map, historic highway signage, and gateway signage at the intersection of Rtes. 45 and 15.

The Main Street Matters (MSM) program is designed to support our downtown cores and surrounding neighborhoods with tools to create healthy, vibrant, and welcoming communities. Funding is available to support revitalization efforts in planning, business support, aesthetic improvements, and the increase of safety and security.

The Lewisburg Downtown Partnership is an Accredited Main Street America and a Designated Pennsylvania Main Street through the Main Street Matters program. LDP works to ensure that downtown remains the heart and soul of Lewisburg and a cultural and economic magnet for the region.

The LDP is thrilled that our State government understands and supports Main Streets like downtown Lewisburg. Downtowns are the lifeblood of our communities, a place where everyone belongs. Supporting small, locally owned businesses and suppliers is important on so many levels. They keep our community unique and encourage community and social interaction by providing our favorite local spots to hang out and socialize. It always bears repeating that 60-70% of every dollar spent locally stays local, and our local business owners reinvest in our communities, creating a full circle.

Ellen Ruby explained, “This is what happens when a community comes together—with help from Main Street Matters and the dedicated support of local leaders, residents, and business owners, Lewisburg is stepping into a new chapter of vibrancy and opportunity.”

Buffalo Township Residents Voice Concerns About Cannon Road Project

The Buffalo Township website states, “Buffalo Township officials are truly ‘neighbors serving neighbors,’ offering accountable, effective and efficient services to their residents. The Supervisors are Paul Haines, Sr.-Chairman, Glenn Troup-Vice Chairman, and Todd Oberdorf.

An issue was noted during the May 5, 2025 meeting held at the Buffalo Township Municipal Building in Mifflinburg. Supervisor Todd Oberdorf voiced concerns about the expenses on the Cannon Road Project. He felt that due to the extent of the project it should have been voted on and discussed at a public meeting. The Road Master, Paul Haines Sr. who is also the Chairman of the Board, explained that he called the Assistant Supervisor, Glenn Troup, for approval. He noted that resident Leroy Troester volunteered to pay for all of the amesite for the project, 300’ for the road and 20’ for his driveway to be paved.

Supervisor Todd Oberdorf questioned if there was a Sunshine Law violation because the project was discussed by two supervisors outside of an open meeting. They made a decision and acted on their own. He was also concerned about the amount of money to be spent on one project.

Oberdorf also questioned if the Buffalo Township can legally bill Leroy Troester. He noted that the Township did not pay tax on the amesite and that the Township is not “in the business to resell a product.”

Supervisor/Road Master Paul Haines countered that the Township is not making money on the project. Oberdorf replied that it doesn’t matter. The Township obtained the amesite at a government discount on a bid and should not be selling it.

Solicitor Jason Brudecki called for an Executive Session to discuss the matter as the Township cannot do work on private property.

After the Executive Session, according to the May 5, 2025 minutes, “Todd Oberdorf made a motion, seconded by Glenn Troup to file a private criminal complaint against the Road Master (Paul Haines, Sr) for violation of the Second Class Township Code. Motion passed unanimously. Todd Oberdorf made a motion to dismiss Paul Haines from employment of the Township. The motion died for lack of a second.”

During public comment, one resident asked what the budget was and what the labor costs were for the Cannon Road Project and who was paying for it. The Road Master explained that there was no budget for the repair as only larger projects are budgeted. The resident of the property in question on Cannon Road agreed to pay the entire cost of the amesite for the entire project, not payroll.

Another resident questioned if the Township can legally bill for the work done on the resident’s driveway. Solicitor Brudecki replied that it cannot. It was suggested that the Road Master pay for the transgression. Solicitor Brudecki responded that if the resident doesn’t pay the bill, the Township will. He stated that is why the action was taken after the Executive Session.

In other business Buffalo Township, Paul Haines asked for a motion for the Secretary/Treasurer to pay the May expenses on a weekly basis with Supervisor approval. Todd Oberdorf made a motion, seconded by Glenn Troup to approve the Secretary/Treasurer to pay the May expenses on a weekly basis with Supervisor approval with

the exception of any expenses incurred on Cannon Road. Motion passed unanimously.

Road Foreman Paul Haines reported that the Township has been performing cold patching, berming, and general maintenance.

Todd Oberdorf made a motion, seconded by Glenn Troup, to adopt the Resolution to proclaim May 18-May 24, 2025 EMS Week. Motion passed unanimously.

Solicitor Jason Brudecki stated that last year that PPL was taking down a line, Sunbury to Lewisburg. PPL now provided to the Township that the DEP provided notification to the Township of the NPDES Permit for PPL to rebuild the Sunbury/Lewisburg line.

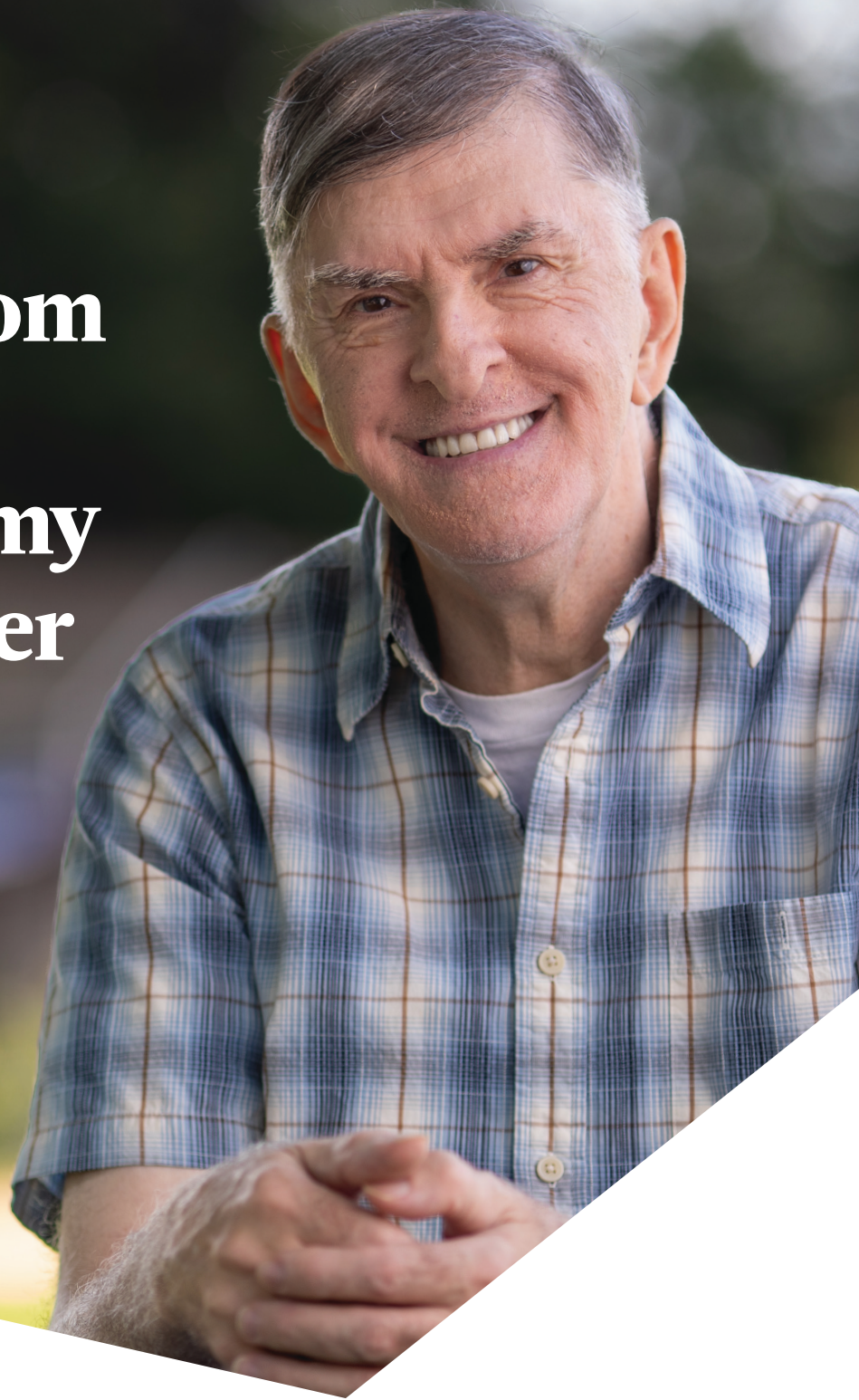

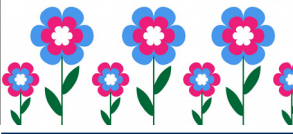
