

Paul Moyer of Beaver Springs won his very first sprint car feature event, and to top it off won at his home track, Selinsgrove Speedway, during the June 4th special Wednesday night show. Knowing he had a fast car after his heat race, Paul pulled the number one pill draw, setting his starting position from the pole. But finishing the job was another story, as Paul had many fast competitors behind him. He was hoping to at least finish in the top 5, but he did more than that. The car was on rails and he convincingly took home his very first sprint car win.

This is Paul's only 5th year competing in the 305 sprint car series. The Snyder county driver has been racing since 2014 but in a completely different car. He ran a 358 dirt modified competing for 4 years mainly at Big Diamond and raced previously in go-karts. So, racing on dirt wasn't a problem for Paul. Switching from a dirt modified to a sprint car was the learning curve he needed to overcome. The 2 types of racecars are like dealing with two different animals.

"The modified leans to the right in the turns and has a ton of adjustment options. The sprint car definitely leans to the left in the turns and feels so much more planted on the track. The modifieds lean on each other a lot and you really don't want to rub wheels in a sprint car," admitted Paul.

Racing blood is also in the family, as Paul went to watch his uncle Roger Moyer Sr., whose racer was also numbered the 1M and his cousin Roger Moyer, Jr. at Selinsgrove Speedway when he was younger.

Many of the 305 racers run on a very low budget as Paul depicts that scenario to a tee. Paul pulls his race car on an open trailer and many parts on the car are used. Case in point, both rear tires were bought used, as the right rear came from fellow competitor Ken Duke, Jr. (Thanks Ken!) The left rear used tire came from Doug Lucas's car #90. The wing on the car was also purchased used from local 410 racer Jake Karklin from

The majority of the 305 racers all have full time jobs to support their passion for racing. Paul owns Moyer Home Improvements to fund his addiction along with sponsor Urban Edge Tatoo of Selinsgrove. That is it!!! His crew chief, Doug Lucas of Middleburg, provides his services along

with Brian Thomas who helps tremendously in the shop performing maintenance on the car and supports Paul at the races when he can. Doug also recently purchased his own 305 sprint car and is a backup for Paul when needed and that car is currently being shaken down by 410 sprint car veteran Mike Walter, Sr. It was also 39 years since Doug stood in victory lane! Another huge supporter comes from Mike Kepner, who has been in-

strumental putting his touches on the car set up and obviously Mike made the right call Wednesday night with the car being on rails. Seth's Racing Engines of Beaver Springs is responsible for the horsepower.

Paul was shocked that he won his first race on a huge ½ mile track. "I expected to win my first on a bull ring type track. I never imagined I would win on the huge track and especially my hometown track," said Paul. "To say the least, this was a huge confidence builder," said Paul. The 305 racing series can have up to 50 cars fighting for 24 spots, so just making a

feature is a win in itself.

LIV sky was awfully low in Pittsburgh last weekend with all the rain and the Pirates sweeping three games from the Phils. Their run production is running pretty low as well. Bryce Harper means more to their offense than we previously thought.

The Steeler fans nightmare finally came true as I have been saying since January. Aaron Rodgers is officially a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers. No one can tell me that Rodgers isn't a better quarterback than Mason Rudolph. People don't like his attitude, age and fascination with ayahuasca. Rodger's first step to win the fans over would be to toss the football with Paul Skenes in the outfield as Skenes warms up before a start.

I can't see the Steelers going far in the postseason or even making the playoffs with Rodgers as their QB. He will win more games than Rudolph but that's the rub. Pittsburgh will win enough games to be slotted in their normal 18th to 22nd pick in next year's NFL draft. If Rudolph was the QB they would have a top ten pick in a quarterback-rich draft.

The New York Knicks continue to take one step forward and two steps back. Firing coach Tom Thibodeau after he led the Knicks to the Eastern Conference Finals for the first time in 25 years was a terrible move. Owner James Dolan loves star power and not the blue collar, lunch pail carrying coach that Thibs is. Dolan once had Isiah Thomas as his GM/head coach!

If you had a chance to watch any of the French Open tennis finals match last weekend you were treated to competition at its highest level. #2 seed Carlos Alcaraz was trailing #1 seed Jannik Sinner triple championship point at 3-5, 0-40 in the fourth set. That was the beginning of Alcaraz's unprecedented, preposterous comeback as he completely turned the match around.

The US Open golf championship is currently being played at Oakmont CC outside Pittsburgh. Scottie Scheffler is the favorite

golf has watered down the quality of PGA fields. LIV players such as Brooks Koepka, Bryson DeChambeau and Jon Rahm are very good and will validate just how good Scheffler is. If you listen to what Ohio State fans are advocating for penalties

to the Michigan football program you have to laugh. They include vacating all wins over the last five years and their national title. Losing 30 scholarships for three years and banning Jim Harbaugh from ever entering the state of Michigan again! They are even calling them "that team to the south" because now Michigan will forever reside beneath them. It's going to be interesting to see what the actual penalties will be.

In last week's article I mentioned changes in college sports need some guide rails. It appears the NCAA settlement of the antitrust suit against them last week is a start. The NCAA has agreed to directly pay athletes and provides back pay to former athletes. It includes paying \$2.8 billion to athletes who played between 2016 and 2024. Payments will be issued over ten years and most of the money will come from the NCAA.

Power 4 conference schools (ACC, Big 10, Big 12 and SEC) will be able to share up to \$20.5 million in revenue with their athletes, with this amount increasing in future years. Other Division 1 institutions can choose to participate or not. No school is required to pay a dime to any player and just add it to their bottom line. Competition for players will require the big schools to get into a bidding war. This \$20.5M is basically a salary cap.

The benefit of this revenue sharing is that schools can have contracts with athletes and limit the number of transfers. There will be a buyout of the contracts and if another school pays that buyout that money goes against the new school's cap. There is no rule for a contract but schools will push them for consistent rosters year to year.

Athletes can still negotiate external NIL deals, but those worth \$600 or more will be subject to scrutiny to ensure they are at fair market value. It will no longer be 'pay to play.'

What all of this means is that schools will be eliminating sports that cost too much money. The big explosion in women's basketball and softball will be curtailed due to return on investment. Olympic sports are also going to suffer for the same reason. I also foresee chaos and a lot of separation between athletic departments and school administrators.

It remains to be seen what happens to the smaller men's basketball schools like Fordham and Butler. The days of a non-Power 4 school making a deep run into March Madness will be limited. Talent on the gridiron at P4 schools will be spread out with the salary cap

In a related story ...Penn State is one of the first schools to sign a capital deal with a private equity firm. The College Investment Initiative is funded by the sports consulting firm Elevate. The total amount is reported to be in the eight-figures. Penn State AD Pat Craft is still denying any deal. Stay tuned for more to come.

District 4 LAX teams have now lost their last 20 games in state competition dating back to 2015. Both the Grove boys and Lewisburg girls lost their first round games. Athletes are not the only profession to not honour signed contracts. Shikellamy superintendent Jason Bendle is heading to Berwick with more than two years remaining on his contract. He left Danville for Shik after serving only 14 months of a five year contract. Do we want these types of people educating our youth?

It's been one month since Don Kelly took over as manager for the Pirates. His record is 15-14 and he already received a contract extension. Is there hope? Shadeur Sanders will be the Browns starting QB by Columbus day. 

Lewisburg Downtown Partnership Received 2 Grants

During the Main Street America Conference in Philadelphia, Governor Josh Shapiro recently announced that his Administration is investing in 81 community projects across Pennsylvania through the Main Street Matters program, fulfilling a key promise he made to help revitalize downtowns, support small businesses, and strengthen local economies. This historic investment in Pennsylvania's Main Streets follows Governor Shapiro's work to create the new Main Street Matters initiative and secure \$20 million for the 2024-25 bi-

The Lewisburg Downtown Partnership received 2 grants totaling \$175,000 through the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development- \$75,000 Business Improvement Grant and a \$100,000 Implementation Grant.

The Business Improvement Grants will be awarded to applicants within the downtown district as micro-grants not to exceed \$5,000 each. These funds can be used to strengthen operations, foster long-term growth, or help small businesses make critical façade, structural, or interior improvements. "The Business Improvement Grant program will directly support the hardworking entrepreneurs who are the heartbeat of downtown. We're excited to help them grow, thrive, and continue to enrich our community," noted Ellen Ruby, Executive Director, Lewisburg Downtown Partnership.

The Implementation Grant is slated to provide wayfind ing signage. "This investment through Main Street Matters is a game changer for Lewisburg. With these new gateway signs, we're inviting the world to discover the heart and soul of our community—our historic downtown and the people and businesses that make it so special," added Ruby. This includes everything from brown historic street signs to an interactive downtown map, historic highway signage, and gateway signage at the intersection of Rtes. 45 and 15 The Main Street Matters (MSM) program is designed to

support our downtown cores and surrounding neighborhoods with tools to create healthy, vibrant, and welcoming communities. Funding is available to support revitalization efforts in planning, business support, aesthetic improvements, and the increase of safety and security. The Lewisburg Downtown Partnership is an Accredited

Main Street America and a Designated Pennsylvania Main Street through the Main Street Matters program. LDP works to ensure that downtown remains the heart and soul of Lewisburg and a cultural and economic magnet for the region. The LDP is thrilled that our State government understands

Buffalo Township Residents Voice Concerns About Cannon Road Project

The Buffalo Township website states, "Buffalo Township officials are truly 'neighbors serving neighbors,' offering accountable, effective and efficient services to their residents. The Supervisors are Paul Haines, Sr.-Chairman, Glenn Troup-Vice Chairman, and Todd Oberdorf.

An issue was noted during the May 5, 2025 meeting held at the Buffalo Township Municipal Building in Mifflinburg. Supervisor Todd Oberdorf voiced concerns about the expenses on the Cannon Road Project. He felt that due to the extent of the project it should have been voted on and discussed at a public meeting. The Road Master, Paul Haines Sr. who is also the Chairman of the Board, explained that he called the Assistant Supervisor, Glenn Troup, for approval. He noted that resident Leroy Troester volunteered to pay for all of the amesite for the project, 300' for the road and 20' for his driveway to be

Supervisor Todd Oberdorf questioned if there was a Sunshine Law violation because the project was discussed by two supervisors outside of an open meeting. They made a decision and acted on their own. He was also concerned about the amount of money to be spent

Oberdorf also questioned if the Buffalo Township can legally bill Leroy Troester. He noted that the Township did not pay tax on the amesite and that the Township is not "in the business to resell a product." Supervisor/Road Master Paul Haines countered that the

Township is not making money on the project. Oberdorf replied that it doesn't matter. The Township obtained the amesite at a government discount on a bid and should not be selling it. Solicitor Jason Brudecki called for an Executive Ses-

sion to discuss the matter as the Township cannot do work on private property. After the Executive Session, according to the May 5,

2025 minutes, "Todd Oberdorf made a motion, seconded by Glenn Troup to file a private criminal complaint against the Road Master (Paul Haines, Sr) for violation of the Second Class Township Code. Motion passed unanimously. Todd Oberdorf made a motion to dismiss Paul Haines from employment of the Township. The motion died for lack of a second." During public comment, one residentasked what the

budget was and what the labor costs were for the Cannon Road Project and who was paying for it. The Road Master explained that there was no budget for the repair as only larger projects are budgeted. The resident of the property in question on Cannon Road agreed to pay the entire cost of the amesite for the entire project, not payroll. Another resident questioned if the Township can le-

gally bill for the work done on the resident's driveway. Solicitor Brudecki replied that it cannot. It was suggested that the Road Master pay for the transgression. Solicitor Brudecki responded that if the resident doesn't pay the bill, the Township will. He stated that is why the action was taken after the Executive Session. In other business Buffalo Township, Paul Haines asked

for a motion for the Secretary/Treasurer to pay the May expenses on a weekly basis with Supervisor approval. Todd Oberdorf made a motion, seconded by Glenn Troup to approve the Secretary/Treasurer to pay the May expenses.on a weekly basis with Supervisor approval with


