



Lewisburg boys soccer beat Midd-West in the 2A district final. The Selinsgrove boys won their fourth consecutive soccer 3A district title over top-seeded Athens 1-0. Grove field hockey continued rolling on by beating Central Columbia 3-1 for their chip.

My most anticipated rematch was Lewisburg vs Midd-West in the district final. Lewisburg's Viktor Permyashkin and Keagan Crosby goals provided the winning margin. Crosby assisted on Viktor's goal as well. Both teams moved

Lewisburg (21-0-1) beat undefeated District 2 champ Lake Lehman 3-2 in the first round of states. Permyashkin scored the game's first two goals and was blowing kisses to the Lehman student section. Crosby scored the game winner. Lake Lehman had only given up four goals all year. Lehman did score two goals to make it interesting but Lewisburg moves on to play Devon Prep on Saturday in the

Midd-West (17-3-1) lost 10-3 to defending state champ Northwestern Lehigh in New Tripoli. Midd-West made it 2-1 when Abram Sellers scored on a corner kick. NW Lehigh led 4-1 at the half before winning and moving on.

Nick Bisaccia's goal is all the Grove boys soccer team needed to beat Athens. Strong defense, only allowing two shots on goal and the transfers from Norry Christian of the Bisaccia Brothers was the winning formula. Younger brother Josiah helped set up brother Nick's goal.

Selinsgrove (10-9-2) lost 5-0 to Abington Heights in Clarks Summit in the first round of states. It was definitely a

step up in competition for the District 4 champs.

In Grove's field hockey (19-3) district title win Emma Petersen got the Seals started. Her goal was followed by Violet Shaffer's game winner off a feed from Nora Moyer. Ella Heath put the game away with Petersen assisting in the

In the first round of states Selinsgrove lost to Greenwood 1-0, the #5 seed from district 3. It was the second time the Seals lost to Greenwood this year and the second time they were shut out this year.

Mifflinburg (16-5) got into the state tourney on Kira Shoemaker's lone goal to beat third-seeded Bloom for third place in the district and entry into states. The Cats lost 5-0 to D3 champion Boiling Springs in the first round of states on Tuesday. District 3 qualified six teams into the state 1A tourney, Clearly District 3 has the best 1A field hockey as five teams won their opening round games.

Lewisburg girls Cross Country finished third at states. Baylee Espinosa's 10th place finish ended her stellar high school career with four top 10 finishes at states 9th, 1st, 9th and 10th. Theo Wilkinson finished 19th for Lewisburg. Grove's Lake Dent finished 62nd.

Green Dragon's Justin Nolt medaled with a 12th place finish helping the team to finish 9th at states. It was a total team effort as Ian Cavanagh and Hugh Ikeda Shields finished 40th and 56th respectively.

Mifflinburg football won their D4 lid-lifter with a 56-14 thumping of 5X defending district champion Danville. The Ironmen hung tough for a quarter at 14-14. The Cats proceeded to put up 29 points before halftime for a 43-14 lead

Seth Hartman, Landon Moser and Chad Martin all had rushing TDs. Larry Murray had another highlight reel catch for a 28 yard touch from QB Martin. Mifflinburg gained over 400 yards in the first half to move onto the district final.

They will host second-seed Montoursville Friday night as Miff will attempt to win their first district title since 2002. Mifflinburg beat Montour 35-7 in the fourth week of the season. This game will be a lot closer as the Warriors have gone 6-1 since that loss. Both teams lost to Southern Columbia by similar scores since they played each other.

Stepping up to the college level and the first CFP rankings have come out with the Big 10 and SEC having all the teams ranked 1 through 7. The top four are Ohio St, Indiana, Texas A&M and Alabama and sure to change before the final ranking. My biggest surprise is Texas all the way up to #13.

These rankings mean a lot more than the ridiculous preseason college football polls which are a farce. Evidence of this besides Texas and Penn State is another pre-season Top 5 team in Clemson. Dabo Swinney's team (3-5) is assured of their worst season since 2010 (6-7).

Clemson's slide started three years ago because Dabo refused to adapt to the NIL/portal era. Tony Elliott was a twelve year member of Dabo's staff and offensive coordinator for five years. Elliott took the Virginia head coaching job in 2022 and his Cavaliers are alone in first place in the ACC.





Civil War Soldier Lies in Selinsgrove's Union Cemetery

On a wind swept knoll in Selinsgrove's Union Cemetery lies the earthly remains of Henry F. Long. Between his birth in 1841 and death in 1924, his life intersected with some of our country's most historic moments.

Henry was born September 3rd, 1841 in Saville Township, Perry County. He considered the 1861 Confederate attack on Fort Sumter "treasonous" and followed ensuing events with each newspaper delivered to his family's farm. By the Autumn of 1862, he was convinced more men were needed to keep the Confederacy from "destroying the union."

On the very day when the battle of Antietam was fought, Henry later recalled, "I was in my father's field cutting clover seed. A neighbor and friend of mine came along the road who invited me to go with him to New Bloomfield, to enlist in Captain John B. McCallister's cavalry company. The invitation was accepted, the cradle was hung on the fence, and I joined my friend on the way to New Bloomfield, stopping however long enough at my father's home

By late September 1862, Henry F. Long had been enrolled in Company I of the 17th Pennsylvania Cavalry and was being drilled in the Harrisburg area, where, "we were furnished with horses and other equipments. I considered myself most fortunate in having assigned me a good horse that proved one of the best in the company. I became very much attached to him, and he served me well."

Less than three months later, Henry's horse would provide some of that service. Just after the Battle of Fredericksburg in December, the 17th clashed with Confederate cavalrymen near Occoquan, Virginia. Private Long wrote, "being on the flank with several others, the Rebels expected to cut off our retreat. But, remembering, 'That he who fights and runs away, may live to fight another day,' we did our very best to escape; and here is where my faithful horse saved me from being captured." The disorderly rout was indeed an inauspicious beginning for the 17th, but the new regiment was outnumbered and facing none other than the elite veterans of JEB Stuart's Rebel horsemen.

The 17th shivered through the winter, along with the rest of the Army of the Potomac, in a Stafford County, Virginia camp. As winter turned to spring, prospects for Private Long and the 17th improved. The regiment's brigade was now in the division of Brigadier General John Buford, one of the premier cavalrymen in the Federal Army. Private Long was assigned to be an orderly for Major General George Meade, and was therefore stationed at Meade's headquarters during the Battle of Chancellorsville. His duties included the dangerous task of galloping up and down the line, carrying the written orders of General Meade to those under his command.

In the weeks following the Battle of Chancellorsville, the Federal Cavalry's performance blossomed. Running gun and saber battles with JEB Stuart's Rebels occurred in Brandy Station, Aldie, Middleburg and Upperville, VA and the Union horsemen were fighting their Confederate counterparts on equal terms. "Orderlies for messenger duty were almost constantly in demand and their services were most arduous" wrote Long. "We were in the saddle almost day

The 17th arrived in Gettysburg on June 30th. "As we rode through the streets of Gettysburg my patriotic heart was stirred because of our warm reception. The college boys sang, at another place a group of girls sang....and still a little later a number of young ladies sang the Star Spangled Banner for us. We were not accustomed to such welcome greetings, and our hearts were greatly cheered."

The regiment camped that night in the field just south of the Mummasburg Road, near the current location of the Peace Light on Oak Hill. After a night of picket duty, the men steeled themselves to meet the approaching enemy -Rebels under the command of Henry Heth, coming in numbers that would far exceed General Buford's line of cavalrymen. "The fighting now commenced in earnest. We were dismounted, sent our horses to the' rear, took a position behind a stone wall which extended along the ridge, and successfully resisted several charges made by the enemy until we were relieved by the First Corps." July 2nd found the 17th picketing and fighting in places burned into American history: the Peach Orchard, the Wheat Field, Devil's Den and Little Round Top.

Over the next year, Private Long would keep several more appointments with landmarks in our Nation's story. The 17th would do notable service at Todd's Tavern just before the famous Battles of Spotsylvania and then at Yellow Tavern. It would be at the next battle - Cold Harbor - where Private Long's service would come to an end.

'During the engagement at Cold Harbor, May 31, 1864, we made several mounted charges, on the enemy's line, but failed to dislodge him. We were then dismounted and charged again over the same ground, in an open field, when two bullets struck me in my left arm. I was removed to an improvised hospital, established in an old grain barn and, during the night, my left arm was amputated. The following day, with other wounded, I suffered a painful ride over rough corduroy roads, in a heavy army wagon, to White House Landing where we were placed on transports to Washington, D. C.'

The war behind him, Henry F. Long opened a new chapter in 1867, entering the Missionary Institute at Selinsgrove and graduating from the Theological Department. (The Missionary Institute is now Susquehanna University, within sight of Henry's grave.) Reverend Long would both pastor and plant Lutheran churches in Pennsylvania, Kansas, Georgia and Illinois before retiring back to his home state of Pennsylvania at the turn of the century.

After the death of their only child (Dora, nine months old), Rev. Long and his wife

Hannah adopted three children. In 1924, Henry's extraordinary life came to an end. It was reported that he was struck by a streetcar in Harrisburg and died a week later from his injuries.

Henry Long's headstone not only includes his date of birth and death, but also the inscription, "Co. I 17th Regt PA Cavalry." The engraving testifies to the impact of the Civil War years, an impact shared by tens of thousands of other American soldiers who carried their experiences to their graves.

The words of President Abraham Lincoln echo through the years challeng ing each generation to be dedicated to the "great task remaining before us, that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion.'


