On Thursday, March 5, the Middleburg Chapter of Beta Sigma hosted a baby shower to benefit Expectations Women's Center in Lewisburg with a generous donation of baby items for their "Wee" Care Store. Members have been shopping for items for this annual donation throughout the year. "Even though I do not have a little one to shop for, I still find it enjoyable to find sales on baby clothes and purchase them for donation to a good cause. Helping those in need I feel is like sharing God with others," said Amanda Moyer. The meeting also included baby shower games and refreshments. Members also have been dropping coins into a baby bottle to gift to the

program. Beta Sigma Phi presented Expectations Women's Center Executive Director Pam Burkholder, with a check for \$276.

Kay Poeth, President of the Middleburg Chapter commented, "We're a small group, but a mighty one!" about the many cute and useful gifts and generous monetary donation that were given.

For many years, the Middleburg Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi has adopted Expectations Women's Center as one of their philanthropic projects. The club members understand their mission and offer their support.

Guest speaker Pam Burkholder presented an informative and enlightening program on the services provided by Expectations, located in Lewisburg and Williamsport. Medical services offered include ultrasounds for pregnancy confirmation and pregnancy options education, parenting and healthy relationships educations, as well as providing baby supplies through the "Earn While You Learn" program. All services are confidential as allowed by state law and provided free of charge. Expectations Women's Center offers non-judgmental ways clients can explore their pregnancy options and make decisions in a calm and logical way.

"I really enjoy being able to help out those who need help in a joyous but stressful time. It makes me feel good to help others out," added Cindy Mattern. "Everyone should be able to hear the stories Pam and the other women have to tell. It is definitely a big choice to make in life but it is a precious one."

Expectations Women's Center is a nonprofit organization that serves as an education resource providing evidence-based education to empower individuals to make healthy choices that impact their lives emotionally, physically, and spiritually. Men and women can earn while they learn by completing educational lessons. Through attendance, participation in sessions, homework and other ways, clients earn coupons to be used at the "Wee" Care Store. Clients can "buy" baby clothing, baby bottles, baby furniture and many other essential items needed to care for their young children as well as personal hygiene and other items for themselves.

Parenting support is just one of the services offered at Expectations Women's Center. Others include pregnancy options education, pre-abortion assessments, resources for healthy relationships and pregnancy, decision-making and goal setting, post-abortion support, and education for men in these areas.

Expectations Women's Center is fully funded by the generosity of donors such as church groups, community businesses and organizations, and individuals. Fifty volunteers currently donate their talents to the center plus five full time staff members, a nurse manager who oversees medical services and two part time employees.

Beta Sigma Phi member, Kay Poeth, summed up the evening saying, "Expectations is an amazing agency. They are there to help young mothers and fathers develop great parenting skills to help them navigate through parenthood."

SUN Tech Student Earns Third Place at State Welding Competition

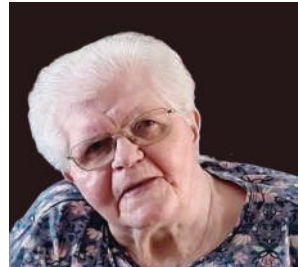

SPORTS NEWS

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

The easiest sport to win a PIAA state championship is Field Hockey followed closely by football. The most difficult, both boys and girls Track and Field. How do I know this? There is only an average of 90 schools in three classifications of field hockey and six tiers in football. Track and Field has an average 305 teams in two classes. The odds don't lie.

The PIAA hands out too many state titles across as many as six classifications. Ten years ago the PIAA added one or two classes to most girls and boys sports teams in an effort to provide a better competitive balance. They did this despite falling enrollments at all Pennsylvania schools.

Way back in 1998 you had to earn your state title as only two were handed out in softball and baseball. Basketball had three champions in 1983 when school enrollment was at its highest peak.

Since 2010, Cross Country, golf, lacrosse and volleyball have each added another title for both boys and girls teams. I understand the proliferation of more girls playing sports and the opportunity to play different sports each season... lacrosse, volleyball and wrestling. I think it's great that these opportunities exist today but it also weakens the core high school sports.

Imagine the two girls that played Jr High basketball and decided to wrestle when they got to high school. The high school hoops team would not be as good without those two. I remember way back, when two of the best athletes in my class who I played Little League and Teener baseball with didn't play in high school. They played tennis and golf instead of baseball in the Spring.

Club sports are also affecting high school teams with their travel leagues. If there's a scheduling conflict in baseball, I guarantee the family will forgo the high school game because of the money investment they have with the club team.

The number of high school students has declined 15% since 2000 and future projections have enrollments dropping further due to demographic changes and an older population base in Pennsylvania.

These are just some of the reasons the PIAA should consider making it more difficult and rewarding for teams to win a state title. The class you are assigned is based on male and female enrollment in grades 9,10 and 11 and adjusted every 2-3 years. The non-profit PIAA(?) divides the number of male and female students by the number of schools that participate in that sport.

The football example is 555 schools in PA have a varsity team. 555 divided by 6 = 92 average number of schools for six divisions, 1A to 6A. If a school has a male enrollment in grades 9-11 of 1-143 they are in 1A, 144-216 2A, 217-295 3A, 296-423 4A, 424-619 5A and 620-9999 6A.

If you have three tiers in football you would have 185 teams in each division. This would also help in regular season scheduling as it would be easier to play all your games against schools in your state classification and get rid of the crazy point ranking system we have in district qualifiers.

People will say a team with more students will have an advantage. Mifflinburg won this year's D4 3A title with by far the fewest male students in 3A, in fact had they

had two less boys in grades 9-11 they would have played in 2A.

I am sure most of you have heard of or watched the movie Hoosiers. Up until 1997 the state of Indiana only had a single-class state tournament for high school basketball. In 1954 Milan high school with an enrollment of 161 beat Muncie high school with an enrollment over 1,600. That's what memories and movies are made for.

March is made for madness because of college basketball and wrestling. The older coaches are thriving in this tournament. When NIL arrived a few years back a couple of great and successful coaches walked away from coaching due to the new rules and bidding for players to come play for them.

It turns out the legends like Tom Izzo with Michigan State, Rick Pitino at Saint Johns and John Calipari at Arkansas have figured this new NIL recruiting out. Instead of hitting the AAU circuit and in-home visits for recruits, they have their program's General Manager write a check for the players they want.

You still have to make the right decisions on who you pay to bring on campus or you'll be like a couple of basketball bluebloods who made that mistake. Kentucky paid a record \$22M for this year's team and didn't make it out of the first week. Kentucky spent twice as much money than the highest paid team playing in the Sweet 16, Michigan. Total NIL basketball payoffs this year for the teams in the Sweet 16 ranges from \$7.2M to \$11M.

North Carolina is the other mighty basketball program that came up short. Expect both the Tar Heels and Wildcats to have a new head coach soon.

The Big Ten is reaping the benefits of the NIL era in all sports. Not only have they won the last three football titles with three different schools, they have six out of the sixteen teams still playing basketball. The vast number of well-heeled BIG grads all over the world from the largest schools in the country has led to great success in this NIL era.

The Big 10 didn't need NIL to become the most dominant conference in wrestling. They have been the best league over the last two decades and it goes deeper than just Penn State winning their fifth straight national team title. A rising tide raises all boats is so true for the Big Ten.

I said it in the Fall and most people don't agree but Oklahoma State will be challenging Penn State sooner than you think. Unfortunately Penn State will not schedule them in a dual meet as long as David Taylor is the Cowboys coach. It appears as if Cael Sanderson's biggest recruit and star when Cael took the job at Penn State burned a lot of bridges when he left to coach Okie State. David Taylor was an assistant to Sanderson and a driving force behind the Nittany Lion Wrestling Club.

My takeaways from the national wrestling tournament was the number of great freshmen stars and the big upsets in the finals. There were also way too many stoppages of action and brick tossing which was a reflection of some very poor officiating.

Major League Baseball had opening day this week and I am more than ready for the season to begin after the World Baseball Classic. There are going to be some disgruntled fans when they find out more games are going to be streamed this year. Netflix has joined Peacock, Apple TV and Amazon Prime in exclusive broadcasts of certain games. Here's a quick look at the local favorite teams.

There weren't many changes with the Yankees and they should improve on their 94 regular season wins from last year. Ben Rice and Austin Wells will be bigger contributors and Ryan McMahon at 3B will be a lot better. The health of returning starting pitchers Gerrit Cole and Carlos Rodon in May/June will determine the Yankees post season fate.

The Orioles will be vastly improved and their offense gained some pop by getting Pete Alonso and Taylor Ward. Gunnar Henderson is their best overall player. Two rookies to keep an eye on are Samuel Basallo and Dylan Beaver.

The Mets drastically changed their lineup and got rid of some fan favorites. The addition of Bo Bichette will help and keep an eye on rookie RF Carson Benge. Getting Freddy Peralta as your ace with Nolan McLean as your 1A starter is their biggest improvement.

Annie Knight Gregory's Grave Marker To Be Honored by Conrad Weiser DAR

A wreath laying event for Annie Knight Gregory, the last Real Daughter of the NS-DAR and a member of the Conrad Weiser Chapter will be held on Saturday, April 11 at 1 pm at the Union Cemetery on University Avenue in Selinsgrove.

Annie Knight Gregory was the daughter of Revolutionary War Soldier Richard Knight. Richard was 10 years old when he bravely stepped into the ranks, as drummer boy, in the Sixth Pennsylvania Regiment, commanded by Lieutenant Colonel Josiah Harmer. When Richard Knight entered the army, he enlisted for the entire period of conflict, and was one of the youngest and bravest soldiers in the annals of the war. He appears as drummer and fifer in Captain Thomas Bull's company and as a private in the company of Captain Walter Finney. Richard Knight also participated in the War of 1812. His name appears as Captain in the First (Kennedy's) Regiment of Pennsylvania militia, and continues on the roll until December 5, 1814.

Richard Knight was married three times, and at the time of his death in January 1850; he was 83. He was survived by three sons and two daughters. Annie was a young girl of about 7 when her father died. Annie remembered her father as a tall man of dignified military bearing.

"All Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) are descended from Revolutionary War patriots and soldiers. Imagine, though, joining the DAR through the Revolutionary War service of your own father. This was the distinct privilege of a Real Daughter. Not to be confused with the 'daughter of a Revolutionary war soldier or patriot,' a Real Daughter was distinguished because she was a DAR member as well as the actual daughter of a soldier or patriot."

Annie Knight Gregory was the last surviving NSDAR Real Daughter. Annie was also the youngest "original" Daughter in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution. She joined DAR#21323. on November 4, 1897.

Annie was born on March 23, 1843 in Liverpool, PA when her father was 76 years old. She attended Freeburg Academy, a select boarding school. On November 25, 1863, at the age of 18, Annie Knight married Benjamin Franklin Gregory of Selinsgrove, Pennsylvania. He was a banker employed at First National Bank. They had two sons. The older, Harry Knight Gregory, was born on December 4, 1865, and became a prominent lawyer in the New Castle, Pennsylvania. Forrest Ever Gregory was born April 27, 1868, and was a businessman in Williamsport, PA. The couple was married for 45 years until Mr. Gregory's death in 1907.

On her 100th birthday Annie received greetings from President Franklin D Roosevelt. At Annie's death on December 17, 1943, she was NSDAR's last surviving "Real Daughter" and a member of the Conrad Weiser Chapter. During her lifetime she served as Second Regent of the Conrad Weiser Chapter. On November 15, 1938, she broadcast a message over radio station WRAC of Williamsport as part of a program arranged in her honor by the Lycoming Chapter of DAR and PA DAR officials. In 1940, Annie also forwarded a message by transcription to the National DAR being held in Washington D.C.

The public is invited to a wreath laying ceremony in honor of and remembrance of the last surviving "Real Daughter of NSDAR" Annie Knight Gregory's grave in Union Cemetery in Selinsgrove. The ceremony will be held on Saturday, April 11 at 1 pm.

The program will not involve insurance or billing; instead, it will be fully funded through grants and community donations, removing financial barriers to essential grief care in our rural communities

PennDOT Invites Pennsylvanians to Share Feedback on Winter Services

Safe travel on Pennsylvania roadways is a top priority for the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), no matter the season. With spring beginning, PennDOT is seeking the public's feedback on its services this winter through an online survey at https://qualtrics.pa.gov/jfe/form/SV_d6enJ54tQSo4gxU

"I'm incredibly proud of how the PennDOT team met the mission across Pennsylvania this season, working around the clock to keep people and goods moving," said PennDOT Secretary Mike Carroll. "The public's input through this annual survey helps us review perceptions and knowledge of our operations, while we also look for public information opportunities."

The survey is available through April 14 and should take about five minutes to complete. All responses are anonymous.

The 17-question survey asks respondents about their timeline expectations for safe and passable roadways how they rank snow-removal priorities, and how they rate PennDOT's winter services.

Respondents are also asked how they receive PennDOT roadway information, and whether or how they use the state's 511PA traveler information services. During the winter, www.511PA.com offers its standard traffic and incident information while adding PennDOT plow-truck locations, winter roadway conditions, and other services.

At any time, drivers can check conditions on more than 40,000 roadway miles by visiting www.511PA.com. 511PA, which is free and available 24 hours a day, provides traffic delay warnings, weather forecasts, traffic speed information, and access to more than 1,200 traffic cameras. 511PA is also available through a smartphone application for iPhone and Android devices, by calling 5-1-1, or by following regional X alerts.

Performances will be at Greenspace Center, 815 Market Street, Lewisburg on Friday and Saturday evenings at 7:30pm on April 10, 11, 17 and 18, and two Sunday matinees at 2:30pm on April 12 and 19. Tickets are just \$15 for adults and \$8 for students, with general admission seating, and they can be purchased at the door or at www.riverstagetheatre.org.

The Diary of Anne Frank, by Frances Goodrich and Albert Hackett, newly adapted by Wendy Kesselman, is adapted from the real-life story of a young Jewish girl whose family spent two years hiding with neighbors during the Nazi occupation of her country. The story follows Anne, her sister Margot, their parents Otto and Edith, as they gave up their former life to stay hidden in sealed-off upper rooms of an office building in Amsterdam for years until they were eventually discovered and sent to a concentration camp, where Anne eventually died at age 15. Along the way, this brave young girl wrote with lyrical determination about her personal relationships, aspirations, and the constant mortal danger that permeated their lives. The book is well-known to students and teachers around the world, and serves as not only a shining insight into a difficult period of world history but also a story of family, love, and hope. The play has been performed around the world since its debut in 1955, received the Tony Award for Best Play, and its revival in 1997 with Natalie Portman and Linda Lavin received multiple Tony nominations as well.

“We believe that theatre has great power to tell stories,” said RiverStage president Jove Graham, “and the story of Anne Frank is an incredibly important one that we are excited to tell. There is a reason that her writing has resonated with people for the last 80 years, and even though the events seem like they took place far away and long ago, I think it’s so important for people—especially young people—to know this story and understand the real-world life of this remarkable girl. Whether you are already familiar with the book or not, we know it will be a real treat to see these characters and their story come to life on stage. We are excited to welcome Josh Wilkinson as our director, who is an alumnus of Lewisburg High and has worked with the students there for several years now directing their fall plays. We can’t wait to see this story unfold for audiences to see and enjoy.”

As a special event following the Sunday, April 12th matinee, RiverStage will host a “talkback” with the cast and crew following the performance, where audience members are welcomed to stay, ask questions, and hear from them about how the production was put together and discuss the impact and meaning of the show in modern times. The show is directed by Josh Wilkinson and produced by Virginia Zimmerman, with costumes by Cynthia Shaffer, lighting design by Alexa Lewis, sound design by Cole Casimir, set design by Jove Graham, and stage management by Jill Kerr.

This production also features a wonderful cast of local actors from across the Susquehanna Valley. Anne Frank is played by Lewisburg high school senior Clara Graham, who has been seen in other RiverStage productions such as The Sound of Music, Oliver! and Spamalot. Her parents, Otto and Edith, are played by Jacob Hockenbrocht (RiverStage’s Mousetrap, Wrinkle In Time) and Kayleigh Confair, and her sister Margot is played by Ceili Kisvarday, who was last seen as Mrs. Lovett in Lewisburg High School’s Sweeney Todd. The couple they share a hideout with, the Van Daans, are played by Faith Sullivan and Andrew Confair, both of whom starred in RiverStage’s The Haunting of Hill House this season, and their son, Peter, is played by Jude Wilkinson (RiverStage’s Sound of Music, Oliver!, Spamalot). The cast also features numerous other actors who have been seen on local stages, including Fred Hooper (Mr. Dussel), Mary Burnett (Miep Gies), Jason Cassidy (Mr. Kraler), Christian Rivera (First Man), Keara Rae (Second Man), Third Man (Aidan Mateos), and Ellie Kisvarday (Understudy for Anne).

The Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation (CSVT) Project 2026 Update

From PennDOT Engineering District 3 Annual Overview of Major Projects

The Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation (CSVT) Project continues to progress, which will address safety and congestion concerns on the Route 11/15 corridor in Northumberland, Snyder, and Union counties. The project is divided into Northern and Southern sections.

The CSVT Northern Section opened to traffic in July 2022, and the most recent traffic counts show that the CSVT River Bridge is carrying roughly 16,000 vehicles per day, including 3,800 trucks, a 33 percent increase over previous counts.

The CSVT Southern Section is currently underway with construction of roughly 6 miles of new four-lane, limited access highway connecting Route 15 south of Winfield to Routes 11/15 north of Selinsgrove in Monroe Township and Shamokin Dam Borough, Snyder County. It will include an interchange/connector to Route 61 (the Veterans Memorial Bridge) that leads to the City of Sunbury in Northumberland County.

The first contract was awarded to Trumbull Corporation of Pittsburgh for \$115.2 million in spring 2022. The contract included earthwork, drainage structures, erosion and sediment control facilities, construction of the new bridge carrying Sunbury Road over the CSVT highway, and improvements on existing local roads to accommodate the CSVT highway. Work began in summer 2022 and was completed in 2025.

The second contract was awarded to Walsh Construction Company II, LLC of Chicago, Illinois, for \$106.4 million in the fall of 2023 and is 98% complete. The contract included nine new bridges. Seven of the bridges will carry the CSVT highway over Mill Road, Attig Road, Park Road, Stetler Avenue, Eleventh Avenue, the Route 61 Connector, and Grangers Road. The remaining two bridges will carry the Cortland Drive Connector over the Route 61 Connector and the Route 61 Connector over ramps connecting to Routes 11/15. Additionally, four noise barrier walls are included in the contract. In Monroe Township, one noise barrier wall was constructed near Park Road, Fisher Road, and Villa Lane along the CSVT northbound lanes, and another near Mark Drive and Shawna Lane along the CSVT southbound lanes. In Shamokin Dam Borough, noise barrier walls were constructed adjacent to both the Weatherfield neighborhood and the Orchard Hills neighborhood. An additional noise barrier wall will be constructed under the next contract, in Monroe Township near South Old Trail along the CSVT southbound lanes. Work began in 2024 and is anticipated to be completed in 2026.

The third contract was awarded to a joint venture between Trumbull Corporation of Pittsburgh and Golden Triangle Construction Company, Inc. of Imperial, PA for \$186.4 million in the fall of 2025. The contract includes paving of the CSVT mainline, the Route 61 Connector, and various interchange ramps, as well as drainage structures, guide rail, traffic signals, highway lighting, and overhead sign structures. Additional work to be completed includes:

- Adjustments of existing local roads and property access along Route 522 and Routes 11/15 to accommodate the CSVT’s southern interchange,
- Construction of a noise wall along the CSVT southbound lanes near South Old Trail,
- Replacement of the existing bridge carrying Route 61 over existing Routes 11/15,
- Completion of the Cortland Drive Connector between the Weatherfield, and Orchard Hills neighborhoods in Shamokin Dam, and
- Reconnection of County Line Road (Route 1022) between Park Road (Route 1017) and Route 15.

The Southern Section mainline is anticipated to be opened to traffic in 2027 and the Route 61 Connector is anticipated to be open to traffic in 2028.

The contract also includes the following projects to resurface existing roads and replace existing traffic signals in the area around the CSVT Southern Section:

- Routes 11/15, known as the Golden Strip, between Roosevelt Avenue and the Routes 11/15 split in Monroe Township and Shamokin Borough, (\$4.1 million).
- Mill Road (Route 1014) between Route 204 and Routes 11/15 in Monroe and Penn townships, \$760,000.
- Park Road (Route 1017) between North Old Trail (Route 1013) and Pine Lane in Monroe Township, \$170,000.
- Eleventh Avenue (Route 1019) between North Old Trail and Park Road in Monroe Township. Work on this project includes embankment repairs prior to the resurfacing operations, \$790,000.
- Susquehanna Valley Mall Drive (Route 1023) between Penns Valley Drive and the jug handle located across from the Sheetz in Monroe Township, \$140,000.
- Traffic signal upgrade at the intersection of Routes 11/15 and Eighth Avenue in Shamokin Dam Borough \$350,000. The project is funded by a Green Light-Go grant, with a 20% match provided by the Borough.
- Traffic signal upgrade at the following three intersections, Routes 11/15 and Lori Lane, Routes 11/15 and Park Road, and Route 15 and Sunbury/Victor Lane in Monroe Township, \$1.2 million. This project is funded by a Green Light-Go grant, with a 20% match provided by the Township.

Two Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) projects are currently in the design and include the installation of message boards and cameras. The first project, which is scheduled to be let this summer will include installation of these devices on the CSVT southern section mainline and interchanges. The second project, which is planned to begin in 2028, will install these devices on existing roads in the area around CSVT.

Total preconstruction and construction costs based on year-of-expenditure for the CSVT overall is \$975 million.



Union County Encourages Residents to Continue Recycling

Lewisburg, PA –Union County is reminding residents and businesses that recycling is important for the health of our environment, economy, and community. While national recycling trends and market fluctuations have raised questions, Union County and its municipal partners remain committed to providing recycling programs—and ask residents to stay committed as well.

“All recyclables collected at drop-off locations are taken to the Lycoming County Resource Recovery Facility, a regional recycling processing center, operated by the Lycoming County Resource Management Service (LCRMS),” reports Bob Huntington, Union County Recycling Coordinator. The recycling center and landfill are on the same property and both are accessed through the LCRMS main gate off US 15 which might be leading to the confusion and speculation that recyclables are being disposed.

The county is not directly involved with single-stream recycling provided by local waste haulers

but those materials are also delivered to the LCRMS Resource Recovery Facility. It does not make financial sense for waste haulers to dispose of recycling in the landfill.

Recycling is more than a feel-good habit—it is a crucial part of managing waste responsibly. Every can, bottle, and cardboard box placed in a recycling bin helps reduce landfill use, conserves natural resources, and supports jobs in Pennsylvania’s nearly \$30 billion per year recycling industry. Recyclable materials make a variety of new products. For example, mixed paper is used to make toilet paper, office paper, and paper towels; recycled plastics are converted to carpet, backpacks, polar fleece, insulation, and plastic lumber; and metal cans are used to manufacture bicycle parts, car parts, appliances, and new cans.

“Recycling keeps waste out of our landfill,” notes Huntington, especially when we recycle correctly.” Participation in recycling, based on the amount of

materials collected annually, and as a percentage of the overall waste stream, has remained steady. Over the last decade residents have recycled 1,700 tons per year on average of aluminum cans, cardboard, glass, magazines, newspaper, office paper, plastics and steel cans.

However, Huntington stresses that recycling is really the last option when thinking about the three “R’s” of “Reduce, Reuse and Recycle”. The best option is to reduce the amount of waste and recyclables at the source when possible. Buy products with minimal packaging and that are made from recycled content. Take simple steps like opting out of junk mail by following the instructions on the US Postal Service website.

Reuse extends the lifespan of products before they are recycled or disposed of. Reuseable shopping bags and water bottles reduce waste and unwanted clothes, furniture and other household items in good repair can be donated to charities or offered to others for continued use.

Lycoming County Artist Featured Artist for 2026 Lewisburg Arts Festival

will be spotlighted in April with a month-long exhibition at The Gallery, located at 15 North Water Street, Lewisburg. The exhibition, which runs from April 3-26, will showcase over two dozen original pieces. Gallery hours are Tuesday through Sunday from 1 to 5 pm. The exhibition is free and open to the public. The public is invited to stop by The Gallery and meet the artist during the exhibition's opening reception on Saturday, April 4, from 2-4 pm.

On Festival Day – Saturday, April 25 – Kibbe will be at The Gallery from 10 am-noon and 2-4 pm, to demonstrate her art and answer questions.

Traditionally, scratchboard art is done on a specially-prepared surface covered with a layer of white clay that is then coated with a thin layer of black India ink. The artist creates the design by carefully removing the black to reveal the white beneath. Repeated meticulous scratches build depth and values.

"Initially," says Kibbe, "I was drawn to the dramatics of the black/white. And to the detail I could get that I so craved in my artwork that I wasn't getting working in oil and watercolor."

Switching from drawing and painting, where elements are added to create the design, to scratchboarding, where elements are taken away, was a bit of a challenge at first, says Kibbe. "It took a little bit of time to wrap my mind around drawing in highlights instead of shadows (and leaving shadows). It was basically drawing in reverse."

Experimenting with color added a whole new dimension to her work ... along with extra steps. After the black is removed, colors are added in, and then the process begins all over again. The real challenge, explains Kibbe, is "you really have to plan it ahead of time, as you usually only get one good pass of coloring." Not surprisingly, this is painstaking work. It can take weeks to complete a small piece.

For those interested in learning more about this art form, Kibbe will offer "Art A Bit Off," in which she will demonstrate her technique for adding color. The presentation will take place at The Gallery on Sunday, April 12, from 1:00 to 2:30 pm. There is no cost to attend, but registration is requested. You can register online at LewisburgArtsCouncil.org.
