

It also used to go down one more street as I recall. Also, everyone now has to go to the Firemen's Field to get a lot of the food – it used to be more convenient. That's my only complaint. I do have to say that the parking here is very easy and accessible, and more places should be like that.'





WIC Program Temporarily Closing Two Offices Due to Statewide Funding Delay

Family Planning Plus of SUN and MJ Counties regretfully announces that it will be temporarily closing its Selinsgrove and Sunbury WIC Program offices on August 30 until further notice. The remaining three offices (Lewisburg, Shamokin, and Lewistown) will remain open only one day a week to try to serve as many of the more than 5,000 women, infants, and children that it serves each month. The closures and cutbacks are due to a funding freeze brought about by a statewide audit

We have not received any WIC allocations since June when we received the payment for May. Unfortunately, we have almost completely exhausted our reserves and there is simply no other alternative," said Peggy Moser, Executive Director of the agency. Moser said that WIC funding is allocated by the federal government, but then filters down to the state and then to a regional entity. It is being held up at the state level.



It influences lifetime nutrition and health behaviors in a targeted, high-risk population of low-income mothers and young children at risk for developing nutrition-related diseases and disorders.

"WIC is grounded in nutrition science," said Brett Campbell, Nutritionist and SUN WIC Coordinator, "and has proven to be extremely efficient and effective. We are most concerned about our clients, and hope that this situation will be very short-term.

According to Campbell, removing participants from WIC due to inadequate funding has both short and long-term consequences. "In the short-term, mothers and young children cut from WIC will not have access to WIC's nutritious supplemental foods. They may gowithout healthy or enough food. In the long-term, healthy childhood growth and development may be hampered. Ultimately, these children may suffer the physical, mental, and financial costs that result from health and development problems. In short, preventing eligible mothers and young children from getting WIC services will deprive these young children a healthy start in life and the opportunity to thrive."
