# Union County Criminal Justice Board to Host Mini-Conference on Reducing Recidivism

The Union County Criminal Justice Advisory Board (CJAB) will host theinteractive mini conference, “Reducing Recidivism: Collaborating for Success,” on September 11 and 12and it aims to strengthen local collaboration and provide practical tools to support successful reentry and enhance community safety.  
The Mini-Conference will be held on Sept. 11 and 12 from 8:30 am - 3:30 pm at the Rusty Rail Brewing Company, located at 5 North 8th St., Mifflinburg. The conference is open to service providers and community members involved in prison reentry in Union County. There is no cost to attend. Breakfast and Lunch are provided both days.  
There will be planned activities and workshops led by our local agencies and partners, along with a sort of “speed networking” event where people will get a chance to meet others and learn about their work in the county. There will be resource tables set up as well.  
Thursday, September 11 features keynote speaker, Yusuf Dahl, who will present, “A Fair Future for All: Housing Discrimination in Reentry” in which he will discuss his journey from incarceration to real estate developer and fair-housing advocate. During the Fair Housing Training participants will learn about Fair Housing laws, how sustainable, fair housing is foundational to successful reentry. The day also includes an interactive re-entry simulation to understand the experience of and barriers to successful reentry. President Judge Lori Hackenberg will present welcome remarks.  
On Friday, September 12, the keynote speaker is Rick Parson who present, “My Role in Evidence-Based Practices: Why Am I Here?” who will explain how attendees can incorporate evidence-based practices to improve successful outcomes in reentries. There will also be workshops on Treatment, Mental Health, Housing, Community & Family Engagement in Reentry & Recovery, Victim Services, and more. A speed networking session will help to enhance collaboration. Opening remarks will be given by Judge Jeffrey Rowe and Judge Michael Picuch.  
“Union County is becoming known around the state for our strong collaborations and successful outcomes in our Criminal Justice System. Through strong collaboration and programs like treatment court, mental health court, the Law Enforcement Treatment Initiative, justice bridge housing, families in recovery, victim services, and more, we are moving the needle, helping families stay together, saving taxpayer money, and improving public safety. We are fortunate, and we know we have more work ahead!” stated Susan Jordan, Executive Director of Susquehanna Valley Mediation.

## Final Point Night at Clinton County Last Friday Led to New Champions, Big Racing Weekend Coming Up

Last Friday night was the final point's night for the four divisions of racing. On Friday August 15th, Andrew Yoder of Middleburg scored the feature win and the Limited Late Model point's title, getting his second win of the season. First the Laurel Highlands 305-sprint where John Walp of Knox PA had to keep Ken Duke in his sights if he wanted get his first win ever. Matt Tebbs scored the 25-lap feature win. His first of the season and became the ninth different winner in nine races there this season. Matt beat Jarrett Cavalet, Ken Duke, Owen Dimm and Jeff Weaver in the feature, the seventh-place finish by John Walp gave him enough of a cushion to win his first ever Clinton County speedway title by 40 points over Ken Duke. Matt Tebbs, who won the feature moved into third in the points with Dale Schweikart and Jeff Weaver in the top five. Eight drivers competed in all nine points races. The 305-sprints will have a non-points race on Saturday, September 20th to see if the division can get its tenth different winner of the season. Also, racing on that Saturday is the super late models and four-cylinders. In the Pro Stock class, Cory Long of Selinsgrove drove to his third win of the season and now wishes the season were not over. "We started out this season doing ok. Then we hit a bunch of bad luck in the middle of the season, but over the last few weeks we have been doing great with two wins and a third-place finish over the last three races", stated Cory. Marc Bitler of Milton PA also has had some good runs late in the season with two second place runs over the last three races. AJ Hoffman of Richfield with his third-place finish clinched his first ever Pro-Stock championship at Clinton County, Denny Fourney was fourth with Noah Kissinger fifth. Fourney is another driver that came on strong late in the year with two feature wins and that is going to keep him racing next season. "I was not sure if I wanted to continue racing with the bad luck. We were having but that all went away with the great last part of the season". Noted Fourney. Hoffman broke open a close battle for the championship late in the season beating AY Schilling by 110-points for the title, Fourney was third with Cory Long and Larry knight in the top five. "I don't really run for championship I just want to go out and have fun and this year was a fun year so the title is nice to have along with two feature wins", commented Hoffman. In the 270-micro class Jeff Weaver of Lock Haven scored his sixth feature win of the season over Quinn Roberts, Nathan Bacon, Michael Petock and Mac Wert. Wert of Milroy with his fifth-place finish scored his

first ever Clinton County points title scoring one win during the season and having several top five finishes. Cory Stabley last year's champion, placed second in points 160-out of first with Jeff Weaver, third Jillian Maurer, Michael Petock in the top five. For Weaver and his six-win season but he also had some mechanical issues during the season and also missed two racing events. Mac Wert has won championships in his go kart racing days, but it was his first in the micro class. "I do not know when this will sink in right now. I really cannot believe that I won a track title, at the track I love to race at the most" noted Mac. The four Cylinder class had Hunter Flook his first win of the season over Matt Weaver, Scott Englert, Larry Beachel and Garrett Lucas. Larry Beachel who scored four feature wins this season, clinched his first ever points title over Coty Maines, Garrett Lucas last year's champ Zak Kline and Matt Weaver, Beachel beat Maines by 140 points. All these titles came down to the final race of the season.

Saturday night the Lucas Oil series was racing at Port Royal for two nights of racing on Friday the feature winner was to win \$10,000 with that going to Ricky Thornton Jr over Jonathan Davenport, Brandon Sheppard, Devin Moran and Mike Marlar. The limited late models had a show with Brad McGinnis getting the best of fourteen-time overall winner Lane Snook, with Matt Murphy, Shaun Miller and Devin Hart in the top five. 45 Lucas Oil drivers and 35 Limited late model drivers signed up for the Friday night action. Saturday \$50,000 was going to the super late model winner and what a race it was with Chris and Thornton Jr exchanging slide jobs over the last half of the race it was intense till Ricky Thornton pulled away late to score the win over Madden with Devin Moran third followed by Brandon Sheppard and Jonathan Davenport. The local drivers did not fair to well but a regional driver Gregg Satterlee placing eight in the Saturday part of the show after starting 17th in the feature. Another region driver Max Blair had runs of eight on Friday and seventh on Saturday. The race was just show-up points for the local teams so not much changed in the standings going into this Saturday final point show Rick Eckert the defending champion leads Justin Weaver by 120-points with Colton Flinner 185 back in third, Dillan Stake and Hayes Mattern are next in line.

This Weekend will be big for the super late model class with three major events at three different race-tracks. It starts on Friday at Bedford Speedway with the first of ten races for the Jim Bernheisel run Fall Clash which will pay the winner \$12,055 to win for the 55-lap feature. In last year's race Mason Zeigler won the feature over Gregg Satterlee, Max Blair, Kyle Lee and Dylan Yoder. Another thing that is on the line for this Friday at Bedford which is the final point race for the super late models were Jeff Rine holds a one point led over Bryan Bernheisel for the track championship 551 to 550 Matt Sponaule sits at 523 with last year's champion Kyle Lee fourth and Jakob Piper in fifth, for Rine it would be his ninth title for Bernheisel it would be his first.

Saturday it will be the Butch Renninger Memorial for the super late models paying \$7,333 to win with the limited late models racing for \$3,333 to win in last year races for the supers Kyle Lee won their feature over Mason Zeigler, with Hayes Mattern, Justin

Weaver and Dillan Stake in the top five, the limited feature win went to Trent Brenneman who used the winning race to announce he is of now retired from racing. Ryan Zook was second with Shawn Shoemaker, DJ Myers and Casey Steinhoff in the top five. Trent is the great grandson of Butch Renninger. ## THE VIEW FROM HEAR

We have finally arrived at the real start of the football season! It could not have come sooner. College football has to get rid of that Week Zero moniker. High school football had an interesting first week with more than a few surprises.

If you're building a football program it's a good start to have someone from Mt Carmel leading your team, just ask the KC Chiefs. Jeff Janovich is in his second year as coach of Midd-West and grew up in coal country where football is king.

The Mustangs will look to run the ball with Kyle Shupp and Landon Hartman in the backfield. They will be running behind an experienced and stout offensive line. Joe Gabel, Graydon Van Horn and Garrett Hostetler are all returning starters. They will be joined by Jared Devine and Gannon Treaster up front.

Linebackers will lead the Mustang defense led by Samuel Jordan and Ronnie Johnson. Midd-West got off to a fast start by beating Central Columbia 27-7 in this year's opener. That puts them one up on Mt Carmel already.

Lewisburg is coming off one of its best years since the 1981 team led by Scot Keefer, Scott Stein and Joe Dubosky. Coach Eric Wicks has 15 seniors on the squad but lost a load of talent to graduation. One of those players is Jeremiah Davis and his 29 TD's and 2,000+ rushing yards.

Expect to see the ball in the air a lot more with Xavier Carter throwing to Jaylen Walker. Both lines took a hit from graduation but expect both sides to get better as the season progresses. There is no shame in losing the opener 38-13 to a rugged Line Mountain team. It's been said a team shows its most improvement from week #1 to week #2.

Another team hoping to show that improvement are the Seals in Selinsgrove. Grove kicked off their 100th season of football by losing 18-7 to Juniata despite outgaining the Indians by 77 yards. Expectations for Grove football are always high but might need to be tempered a bit this year.

Coach Matt Wenrich knows he has a young talented team with many second year players starting. Hopefully Wenrich believes the old Paterno saying "the best thing about freshmen is they become sophomores."

"A bigger and stronger Rocco Amato returns as starting QB with more confidence" per Wenrich. Returning wideout Wyatt Teats and TE Jake Beddall will be Rocco's main targets. Confidence and staying healthy will be the main factors in how many games the Seals will win.

Mifflinburg has lofty goals as 20 of 22 starters return this year. The Wildcats easily handled a good Loyalsock team 47-13 in the season opener.

Coach Cody Botts told me "it all starts up front on both offense and defense. We need to control both lines of scrimmage." Mifflinburg rushed for 234 yards on 42 carries and held the Lancers to just 21 yards on 25 carries. That's dominance up front.

Pre-season All-Star QB Chad Martin has a bevy of receivers to spread the field with. Larry Murray and Cheeky Griffith look to improve on their combined 105 catches for over 1300 yards and 18 TD's from last year. Adding Cole Reibsome at TE who had two TD catches last week will have Martin setting school records.

The defense has stars at every level. Chace Aikey at D-end and Landon Tucker at nose tackle up front. Tucker is an all-state wrestler and that wrestling background lends itself to great defensive line play. Think Aaron Donald, Steve Seftor and Alex Karrass. Freshman Brady Threeth slides in at linebacker with Murray and Griffith on the back end.

Miff is on the road for their next four games against teams that were a combined 39-14 last year. When I asked coach Botts how he was going to handle this tough stretch he said "they want to be challenged week in and week out as this will only make us better." No pressure, no diamonds.

In college football, I cannot believe that Texas has never been ranked number one pre-season. After the games this weekend they will no longer be #1. Don't worry Longhorn fans, nothing that happens this weekend will affect the twelve teams that will make up the playoff field at the end of the year. Notre Dame lost to Northern Illinois in their second game last year and played in the championship game.

What a great opening weekend though to start the season. Six top 10 teams will be facing off against each other. I'm still not a fan of the Big Noon Kick-off on Fox. The Texas/Ohio State game belongs in primetime. I will accept it this week as LSU/Clemson will be playing under the lights later that day. Then we get Notre Dame/Miami Sunday evening.

If you couldn't already tell, I like college football more than the professional game. The college game has Labor Day weekend all to itself and is making the most of this opportunity. Before I give you my predictions as to who is going to win it all, I'd like to give you another reason or two why college football is the best.

Former Northwestern football coach Pat Fitzgerald is coming back. Fitz reached a settlement with the school in his wrongful termination lawsuit, stemming from his dismissal amid allegations of haz-

ing in the football program. He was able to prove he knew nothing about the actions of some of his players.

Fitz won more games over his 17 years as head coach at Northwestern than he lost (110-101). He was a two-time All-American as a linebacker and has always been a stand-up guy. I always thought there was a rush to judgement with his termination.

College football will be even better with Pat back in the game. I expect he will be the next defensive coordinator at Iowa and take over as head coach when Kirk Ferentz retires. Fitzpatrick's son is currently a QB for Iowa.

The College Football Playoffs have been tweaked a bit from last year. The five highest ranked league champions will get an automatic bid but no guaranteed byes. The selection committee will rank the teams and the top four will get a bye and like last year the teams ranked 5-8 will host teams ranked 9-12.

My five league champions for those auto bids will be Texas, Penn State, Arizona St, Boise St and Clemson. I have Texas, Penn State, Oregon and Notre Dame in the final four. My hope is ND beats LSU in the elite 8 and proves to ex-Notre Dame, current LSU coach Brian Kelly that you can win at ND.

I have Notre Dame coach Marcus Freeman reawakening the echoes and winning their first title since 1988. Freeman's a dynamic coach and recruiter who has beaten Penn State more than twice in the last year. They won in the semi finals, poached PSU's RB coach and top recruiter Ju Ju Seiders and flipped a couple Penn State recruits to sign on in South Bend.

The answer to the question is money....now what was the question? Notre Dame has finally realized this and spending their cash is no longer an issue. They have a new indoor practice facility finished three years ago. New stadium renovations and next year their 150k square foot football operations center will be completed.

They just signed a new contract with NBC for \$50M per year and do not have to share any play-off revenue with other league members. They will also be in the playoffs every year. All this money guarantees they stay an Independent for years to come. When Notre Dame football needs resources, it doesn't go wanting anymore.

The only hindrance I see down the road as an Independent is future scheduling. Michigan and USC have already ended their series with ND and the SEC is going to go with nine league games instead of the current eight. That means one less non-league game and ND plays two SEC teams this year.

There are no additional fees for using online services.

# Susquehanna Valley Chorale Announces 2025-26 Concert Season & Auditions

This season will honor beloved Music Director and Conductor Bill Payn, who will retire at the end of the season. For thirty years Dr. Payn has been at the helm of every SVC program. A new Director will soon be announced – stay tuned!

As I prepare to take my final bow in June of 2026, I can’t help but reflect on the amazing opportunities I have had to present a diverse repertoire of choral masterpieces and to work with the incredible talents of countless singers. He continued, “This upcoming season promises to be one of our most exciting yet, as we celebrate the culmination of three decades of music-making. I have planned a series of special performances that will highlight the Chorale’s rich history and showcase the incredible talent within our community. It is my hope that these concerts will serve as a fitting tribute to the shared passion and dedication that have defined SVC’s musical journey. In this, my final season, I look forward to celebrating the power of choral music to uplift and inspire. I hope each of our performances will serve as a testament to the enduring spirit of the Susquehanna Valley Chorale.”

To kick-off the season, the SVC will present two juxtaposing and exuberant works: the contemporary piece Gloria by Glasgow and a choral standard Te Deum by Dvořák on Sunday, October 19 at Zion Lutheran Church in Sunbury at 3:00 pm. Gloria is a new composition by composer Michael Glasgow, paired with the choral standard Te Deum by Antonín Dvořák. This fresh setting of the Gloria had its world premiere at Carnegie Hall in 2022. The popular Te Deum, while written over 100 years ago, is infused with a sense of grand ceremony as the Czech composer was exploring new American styles of instrumentation at the time. This program will feature guest soloists Jill Gardner and Tim LeFebvre.

Holiday traditions return when the SVC presents A Candlelight Christmas on Sunday, December 14 at Zion Lutheran Church in Sunbury at 3:00 pm. This year, the concert will feature a full orchestra as we share some of our signature repertoire, along with a few unexpected pieces. Many of our audience members come back year after year, eager to surround themselves with the sounds of the season, savoring every beautiful note. Join us for this festive musical offering that highlights the true themes of Christmas.

The SVC will present Verdi’s Requiem on Sunday, March 22 at Zion Lutheran Church in Sunbury at 3:00 pm. Held in regard as a pinnacle choral masterpiece, Giuseppe Verdi’s Requiem has only been performed twice throughout the chorale’s history. The SVC is thrilled to be welcoming four local soloists for this monumental performance. In addition, the SVC will be joined by members of the Williamsport Chamber Choir. This powerfully emotional and dramatic work is sure to be unlike anything you’ve ever heard before.

To end the season, the SVC will present part 2 of Pops: The Best of 30 Years on Saturday, May 2 at Weber Au-

ditorium, Susquehanna University in Selinsgrove at 7:30 pm. The SVC ends the season with the second half of their celebration honoring Bill Payn’s 30 years as SVC Conductor and Music Director. As always, this event will feature the SVC stage band and some of the SVC’s own talented soloists. Be prepared for some extra special surprises, as the SVC commemorates Bill’s final bow at the podium.

A season subscription costs \$85 and consists of four “freestyle” tickets that can be used at any SVC concert in any combination. Adult tickets are \$25 and student tickets are \$10. Youth under the age of 12 are always free. Tickets are available on SVC’s website, SVCmusic.org or by calling 570-547-0455.

SVC singers represent a wide range of musical backgrounds and walks of life. New adult singers ages 18+ are welcomed twice every season through auditions with Conductor William Payn. New adult singers are encouraged to audition. Regular auditions will take place on Tuesday, September 2 and Tuesday, September 9 by appointment only; rehearsal to follow at 7 pm.

Those who are considering auditioning, but are still undecided, are welcome to attend an open rehearsal on September 2 and audition the following week. Music will be provided for anyone observing the rehearsal.
