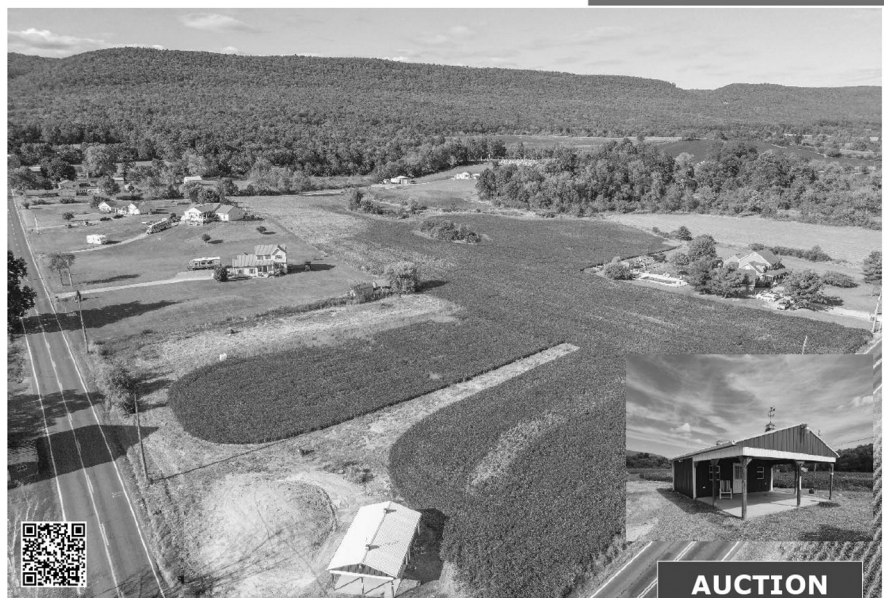

Selinsgrove Finishes Out 2025 Season with a Good Field of Competetors and a Good Crowd on Hand to Watch

Selinsgrove Speedway closed out the 2025 season with a three-division show last Friday, featuring the 410-sprint 360/358-sprint and the wingless sportsman. In the 410 feature, Chase Dietz chased down early leader Brock Zearfoss who was driving his family owned #32. Chase went on to win his third feature of the year at Selinsgrove aboard the Stehman #23. Danny Dietrich made a late race pass of Zearfoss to place second in the feature and clinched the 410-sprint point title. Dietrich, in the six races, had two wins, two second place runs and two third place runs to out distance second in points Chase Dietz 1590-1330. After Brock Zearfoss placed third in the feature, then came Gerard McIntyre and Middleburg resident Jake Karklin. In the points after Dietz in second came Blane Heimbach of Selinsgrove with 1250, Austin Bishop with 1235 and Karklin at 1165. Three heats for the 21, 410-sprint went to Zearfoss, Dietz and Dylan Cisney. In the 360/358 feature, Davie Franek scored the 25-lap feature win over Mike Walter of Selinsgrove. Mike again driving the number 7 has a win and a second two times in the car this year at Selinsgrove. Mike did double duty Friday placing seventh in the 410-feature and Mike won the 360/358 heat race. Brandon McGough won the other with 20 cars in the pits for the night’s action. Davie Franek also did doubler duty getting the win and a 11th place finish in the 410 feature. In the feature after Franek and Walter, came URC 360 regular Josh Weller, followed by Seth Schnoke and Scott Wilson. Another driver doing double duty was Will Brunson of Middleburgh placing 12th in the 360/358 feature and 16th in the 410-sprint car feature. Curt Stroup of Richfield did the doubler with a 15th place in the 410-feature and second in the wingless sportsman 20-lap feature. Tony Jackson won the Sportsman feature going away Dexter Ehrenzeller was third with Cliff Brian Jr next and Andy Burkhart in fifth. The race at Selinsgrove was the Kramer Williamson Memorial for both the 410-sprints with winner Dietz collecting \$7,300 for the win while Davie Franek won \$3,073 for the 360/358 feature win.

The World of Outlaw 410 sprint car series was in are area for the second weekend in a row Friday night they raced at New Egypt N.J. speedway with a field of 28 drivers on hand. Carson Macedo picked up the feature win over Logan Schuchart, David Gravel, Michael Kofoid and Shelden Haudenschild. Saturday, they raced at Lincoln speedway near Hanover Pa, with the PA Posse tak-

ing the first two spots. Anthony Macri was back racing after missing three weeks of action, after his bad accident at Eldora speedway in Ohio in late September. Macri held off Friday night Selinsgrove feature Chase Dietz for the win, with Michael Kofoid, Sheldon Haudenschild and local driver Troy Wagaman Jr in fifth. Three other PA Posse drivers placed in the top ten: Brock Zearfoss sixth, Cameron Smith eight, after a ninth place Friday at Selinsgrove. Trout was tenth on Saturday at Lincoln with a field of 46 drivers on hand. Lincoln has one more show left in their season this coming Saturday when they will be running four features, two for the 410-sprint and two for the 358-sprints. The extra feature is from the events that got rained out back on September 27th. Going into the final two-point feature races finds Troy Wagaman who just won the Williams Grove track title two weeks ago his first at the Grove Wagaman, is holding 105-points led over Freddie Rahmer. Rahmer has four feature wins so far this year at Lincoln while Wagaman has three feature wins. In the 358-sprint action Dylan Norris, who just wrapped the Williams Grove 356 title is racing for the title at Lincoln where he holds a slim 20-point led over Jayden Wolf. Norris has four feature wins this year at Lincoln, while Wolf has one feature win.

Saturday at BAPS Motor speedway it was a full weekend of racing with a total of seven different divisions in action of Friday night the PASS 305-sprint were in action with a field of 25 drivers on hand with Doud Dodson scoring the 20-lap feature win over Christian Rumsey, followed by Logan Spahr, Owen Dimm and Jarrett Cavalet. Kruz Kepner of Kreamer is the PASS series points champion. The other division in action over the two days were Legend cars, Classis Car, Super Sportsman Limited late models, 602 crate Modifieds and Extreme stocks. The 25-Sportsman feature had only one caution with Kenny Edkin, grabbing his fourth feature win of the season over Timmy Barrick, Jay Fannasy, Scott Dellinger and Matt Ondek, with his fourth-place finish. Scott Dellinger was crowned the Sportsman track champion. In the 602 carte Modified feature Bryce Bashore score the 30-lap feature win over Ryan Simmonms, Jax Yoh, Adam White and Mike White. In the 20-lap limited late model feature Scott Palnmer of Greencastle scored the feature win. Before their feature started Scott had already clinched the late model point title his first ever at Baps, he won it by 335 over Travis Mease last year champion. Trent Merkel Chad Smith and Tommy Slanker were in the top five. In the feature, Palmer went on to win the feature by over straightway over Chase Billet, Dan Zechman, Michael Walls, and Coleby Frye. Frye, who did more racing in a Modified this season at Bridgeport speedway, scored two wins there and placed seventh in the final point standings. Getting back to Palmer, this was his fourth overall track title with others coming at Winchester and two at Hagerstown, with the last coming in 2016 in the super late model class.

This coming weekend besides the racing at Lincoln speedway on Saturday, Hagerstown speedway will have the super late models in the Fall Clash series race on Friday night along with the Short Track Super Series for big

block Modifieds. On Saturday, the show will feature the Modifieds STSS Modifieds for there main event along with the series 602 crate Sportsman Modifieds. Bedford will have a special tune-up race for super late models on Saturday night with 305-sprints and three other divisions also racing. This leads to a two-day show over the weekend of October 24-25 with twin features on Friday night for the super late models paying \$2,500 to win each. Saturday the 60-lap feature for the class will see the winner collect \$25,000. In last year’s race Mason Zeigler scored a big win over Max Blair, Kyle Hary, Dylan Yoder of Middleburg and Jeff Rine.

Dietz Gets Selinsgrove Finale/ Franke Scores Kramer Kup/ Jackson Dominates Wingless Super Sportsmans

Selinsgrove,PA- A crisp fall evening with the mountains changing colors means that the end of the season is upon us. But not before one last go at the Selinsgrove Speedway. Had it not rained on June 10th, “The Fastest Half Mile on the East Coast” would have concluded its season back on September 19th. But the speedway and the Williamson Family wanted to make sure the Kramer Kup made its return in 2025. So for one last time Selinsgrove Speedway came to life with York’s Chase Dietz winning his 3rd High Caliber Cranes 410 Feature of 2025, Gettysburg’s Danny Dietrich clinched his 2nd career High Caliber Cranes 410 Sprint Car Championship. Sussex,NJ’s Davie Franek would score his 1st 360 win at Selinsgrove since 2018 taking home the Kramer Kup in the final night of the 2025 United Racing Club Season that would see Mertztown,PA’s Josh Weller take his third Straight URC Championship. Newville,PA’s Tony Jackson would take his second straight Wingless Super Sportsmans feature at Selinsgrove to round out the 2025 season.

21 High Caliber Cranes 410 Sprint Cars signed in for the final night of racing at Selinsgrove for the 2025 season. Jonestown’s Brock Zearfoss and Dietz would share the front row for the \$7,300 to win feature in honor of 25 time Selinsgrove 410 winner, Palmyra’s Kramer Williamson, who lost his life in 2013 during a URC event at the Lincoln Speedway.

The initial start would come back as Kody Hartlaub would spin down the back straight away and make heavy contact with the inside wall. Drew Young and Chris Smith would also spin with Young hitting the water barrels that sit at the opening to the infield on the back stretch. All drivers were ok but the red would fly to allow crews to clean the track.

Zearfoss would take the lead quickly on Dietz. Meanwhile Dietrich was the one to watch. Going three wide on the opening lap to try and make ground up from his 7th starting spot. Dietrich would get up into the top 5 after Steve Buckwalter’s motor expired while running 4th. He would make it in. But Ryan Taylor would have his right rear go flat and bring out the 2nd caution of the night.

On the restart Dietirch would get around New Oxford’s Gerard McIntyre for the 3rd spot. Middleburg’s Jake Karklin would get around Mechanicsburg’s Lucas Wolfe to crack the top five himself after some disappointing finishes during strong showings for the 5k. Zearfoss meanwhile would start working his way towards lap traffic. He was still running laps in the high 15 second range with the cool fall air allowing the motors to really let it all hang out. Zearfoss tho would have issues once he got into dirty air. Dietz would close back in on Zearfoss. Zearfoss would finally get around the lap car of Blane Heimbach. Dietz would take another lap to get around Heimbach. Deitz would throw his first slider attempt in turns three and four and Zearfoss was ready for it. Turned it back on Deitz. Zearfoss would take the lead back in turns 1

and 2. Dietz would take advantage of Zearfoss playing defense and sliding up the track. Zearfoss would lead the lap but Dietz would throw the slider again in turns one and two and finally clear Zearfoss to take the lead with 7 laps remaining in the 25 lap main event. Dietrich would throw a slider of his own on Zearfoss. Zearfoss would try to hold him off but Dietrich’s momentum was enough to get around Zearfoss and was closing in on Dietz fast coming to two laps to go. Just then JJ Loss would lose the motor in the Trone Outdoor’s 39 car and could not get back around to the pits bringing out the caution to set up a green white checker finish.

The 2 lap shoot out would begin with Dietrich trying to get low on Dietz in one and two. But the clean air was too much to overcome as Dietz would take home his third High Caliber Cranes 410 victory of the year with Dietrich,Zearfoss,McIntyre and Karklin making up the top 5. Danny Dietrich would take home his second High Caliber Cranes 410 Sprint Car Track Championship at Selinsgrove by 260 points over Dietz, Heimbach, Elverson,PA Austin Bishop and Karklin rounded out the top 5 in points.

“It’s just momentum.” Dietz said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. “I was holding on for the first couple laps. I felt like I could still hang on with Brock. Once we got into lap traffic I knew I had to make my move. Coming to the white I got over the cushion a little bit. But I had to protect Danny who’s been really good this year. Overall a great night!

20 United Racing Club 360 Sprint Cars signed in for the final night of action. For the first time since 2022 they would be going for the Pink Kramer Kup that has been one of the most sought after trophies in Central PA since its inception in 2013.Scranton’s Scott Wilson and Franek would make up the front row for the 25 lap main event. It would also be the final night of points for the United Racing Club. Only 120 points separated Weller and Bernville,PA’s Hayden Miller from the championship battle both in the Driver and Owner Points. It would be almost identical to the High Caliber Cranes 410 start with three cars going around after Dover, PA’S Cole Young would make contact sending Young around. York’s Bryn Gohn would spin to avoid the incident but making contact with the wall himself and Manchester,PA’s Logan Rumsey would stop but have an issue that would end his night before it began. Also an honorable mention and thanks to Freemont,OH’s Kesey Ivy making the tow to Selinsgrove to make her URC Debut. Unfortunately it wouldn’t last long in the feature after a great run in the heat. Mechanical issues would not allow Ivy to rejoin the feature after the initial start.

Franek would get around Wilson off of turn two to take the lead. Michael Walter II made his return to the Bob Lilick 7 after picking up the 360 National Open 3 weeks ago at Selinsgrove. Walter would get up to second. A lap later Hilltown,PA’s Adam Carberry would come to a stop on the back straight to bring out the caution.

Pine Grove,PA’s Seth Schnoke would make some moves to get around a fading Wilson. But he had to try and hold off Weller. Weller would get around Schnoke and make a charge at Wilson for third. Weller would get around Wilson. The championship was in grasps. Up front Franek would pull away from Walter. Just then Gardners,PA Jake Galloway would come to a stop to bring out the caution with 12 laps remaining.

Franek retains the lead on the restart. Clean air was king with the late race restarts. Nothing was going to stop Franek from becoming the only repeat winner in the United Racing Club in 2025 with his second straight feature

win. His 17th career win at both Selinsgrove and with URC. Walter, Weller, Schnoke, and Wilson rounded out the top 5. With Weller’s third place run. He clinched his 4th career URC Championship.

“This is where I started.” Franek Said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. “I was fortunate to get to race with Kramer. I wanted to get this one so badly. Clean air was key. I could get out front and get some speed and be as smooth as possible. It started to stumble a little with three to go and I was praying that I wouldn’t run out of fuel and we got her home.”

“I wish we could get some more cars here to race with Mike and Davie . Weller Said, taking the URC Championship on the front stretch. “ We had two runs that were outside the top 5. That’s the stuff that wins you a championship. We’ll take the war over the battle.”

13 Wingless Super Sportsmans rounded out the night with McCalisterville’s Dexter Ehrenzeller and Reading,PA’s Andy Burkhart bringing the field to the green. It didn’t take long for Richfield’s Curt Stroup to get around Ehrenzeller. Stroup and Ehrenzeller would get passed by Jackson in no time. The beating was on as Tony Jackson would get out to a 3 and half second lead on Stroup. Then it was another 16 seconds back to the rest of the field. Jackson was on a mission. Mission completed as Jackson won his second straight Wingless Super Sportsman Feature at Selinsgrove, Stroup ,Ehrenzeller, Ephrata’s Cliff Brian Jr. and Burkhart made up the top 5.

“Took a few laps to get going.” Jackson said in High Caliber Cranes Victory Lane. “ We raced pretty hard. It was starting to get pretty far around on the top. Got to get into the corners a little slower. It’s our 15th win of the year. This has been incredible.”

The 2025 season has officially come to an end. Everyone at the Selinsgrove Speedway wants to send a deeply hearted thank you to everyone in the racing community for their support in 2025. It hasn’t been easy to bring back a track. But It’s with the best fans and drivers in Central Pennsylvania that Selinsgrove Speedway will be back bigger and better in 2026. 

Merrell, Addison Wenzel and Joslyn Zacharda each had two goals in shutting out Central Mountain 7-0. Kiana Kruskie's two goals won the game over Williamsport 2-1. The only blemish was losing to Altoona 4-3.

Mifflinburg (5-9-2) couldn't find the net in a 2-0 loss to Line Mountain and losing 4-0 to Danville. The Cats finally scored against Lewisburg in a 2-1 OT loss. Lyla Moyer got Miff on the board first but Laurel Boyer tied it up until Adelyn Boyer won it in overtime.

Midd-West beat Halifax 5-0 behind Emery Peters two goals and Maddie Bonsalls goal and assist. Mustang freshman goalie Addison Maust kept an upset alive against 15-0 Shik with 19 saves. Unfortunately Maust couldn't get save #20 forty-two seconds into the second OT as Shik won 1-0.

Selinsgrove field hockey has been the best in the area for many years and is still looking for that elusive state championship. Maybe this is the year? The Seals beat Midd-West 4-0 to win the HAC-1 championship. They outscored their HAC rivals 35-2 for the year. Abby Raymond had three assists with Emma Petersen getting the other and adding a goal. Raymond and Alyvia Herrold each had a goal in a 2-0 win over Lewisburg.

Midd-West (8-6-2) qualified for the second season by shutting out Shik 2-0 with Sabrina Fegley and Kylie Brown scoring both goals. Lewisburg (10-5-1) is ready for the playoffs as well, beating a good Newport team 2-1 and just falling short to a better Bloomsburg team 3-2.

The local school that does have a state championship this decade led by coach Ann Beckley in 2007 is primed for another deep run through the playoffs. Mifflinburg (12-4) beat Lewisburg 3-0 on Kira Shoemaker's hat trick. They just lost to the District 3 #1 seed Susquenita 2-1. Lainey Miller had the one goal for Miff. Midd-West (Middleburg) won a field hockey state title in 1995.

Lewisburg and Midd-West are looking for a repeat of last year's District championship game. The Dragons rolled Southern Columbia 6-0 behind Keegan Crosby's 3 assists and 1 goal and Viktor Permyashkin's two goals.

Midd-West lost for only the second time this year to Central Mountain 2-1. The Mustangs got back to winning in a 3-1 W over Warrior Run. Wyatt Nelson, Jacob Sellers and Connor Stoltzfus all had goals. They had a big test with undefeated Montoursville Wednesday.

For Selinsgrove defense was at the forefront as Seal Xander Goudreau had 11 saves and his Danville counterpart Colin Sauers had 14 in a 1-1 2OT tie. Ryan Toskey had Grove's lone goal. Nick Bisaccia had both tallies in the 2-0 victory over Williamsport. Mifflinburg lost to both Loyalsook 3-1 and Juniata 1-0.

Both the Lewisburg boys (18-1) and girls (19-0) cross-country teams ended their regular seasons as they have all year with Justin Nolt and Baylee Espinosa leading the way. Lewisburg swept a five-team meet in Shamokin. Nolt won by 45 seconds and four other Green Dragons finished in the top-10. Espinosa won by a margin of 44 seconds with four other teammates in the top-8.

Grove's X-country boys went 2-3 and the girls 4-1 in a five-team meet at Central Mountain. Seal Michael Andretta was the boys overall winner by 12 seconds and Matthew Stabila took 8th. Lake Dent 3rd, Ashtyn Lukens 4th and Isabel Clark 5th, paced the Grove girls to a 4-1 meet record.

Midd-West girls went 3-2 in a five-team meet at Central Columbia and the boys went 2-3. Ashlyn Hoffman 2nd and Evelyn Weiser 7th aided the Mustang girls. Grant Boop 3rd and Lincoln Hoffman 8th finished strong for the Midd-West boys.

Rough weekend on the gridiron last week only to get tougher this week. Shamokin's Marc Persing returned to Lewisburg where he coached 2017-2020 with an 8-0 team that shutout Lewisburg 38-0. Shamokin's defense controlled the Dragons run game and limited touches to star receiver Jaylen Walker. Freshman Ace Bynum had four catches for 68 yards. Lewisburg gets Montoursville this week.

Midd-West (1-7) lost to Milton 47-0. Milton's first score was on a pick-six that led to a 26-0 halftime lead. Things didn't get any better for the Mustangs as they were dominated at the line of scrimmage. Midd-West travels to Mifflinburg Friday night.

Unfortunately it's not how you start a football game but it's the middle eight minutes of a game that are most crucial. The last four minutes of the first half and the first four minutes of the second half determines the outcome of most games.

Selinsgrove scored the first time they touched the ball. Oddly enough, Grove's next score was the last time it touched the ball. Both involved Brett Rice with an 85 yard kickoff return to start the game and a 77 yard rushing TD to end the game.

In between those two scores, undefeated Hollidaysburg put up 48 points for the 48-14 win. They scored three TD's in the last four minutes of the first half. It only gets tougher for Grove as they travel to Berwick to face another team that has yet to lose this year.

Mifflinburg (6-2) kept it rolling after Larry Murray ran back the opening game kickoff 98 yards for a score. That jump-started a 58-0 halftime lead over Central Columbia and ended up a 65-3 win.

Chad Martin threw the ball just five times but three of them were for touchdowns. The Cats rushed for 317 yards with Seth Hartman gaining 69, Landon Moser 67 and 2 TD's and Hunter Bolick 60 yards and a score. Murray also totaled 98 receiving yards and another two scores.

Construction is set to begin in October, with the goal of completing the project around December. Herr Memorial Library looks forward to celebrating the completion with a ribbon-cutting ceremony, with additional details to be shared as the project nears completion.

Local Project Linus Chapter Celebrates 25th Anniversary

This is a year to celebrate milestones! The Central Susquehanna Valley Chapter of Project Linus was organized in the summer of 2000 by Brenda Naugle and her daughter as a senior project. In the 25 years since then, handmade blankets have been delivered to over to 35,279 sick, hurting and traumatized children in the local 6 county area of Union, Snyder, Northumberland, Montour, Columbia and Lycoming.

In 2005 Brenda left the area and Pat Warren became the coordinator. That was 20 years ago. How time has flown! There are hundreds of people to thank for the hours of work that have been put into making quilts, afghans, and knotted fleece blankets. Some blankets take days to weeks to complete.

“Blankets have been made by kindergarten classes (knotted fleece blankets) and 95-year-old old seniors crocheting baby blankets. One 85-year-old blanketeer said it gave her a reason to get up in the morning. We have had hundreds of blanketeers working with us over the years,” said Pat Warren.

Thanks to the faithful work force who come in twice a month to label, check for pins, pack and deliver the blankets. The blankets are sent to children in hospitals, emergency rooms, homeless shelters, school guidance departments, organizations that serve foster children and needy children. Some of the blankets go to children who must sleep in their coats to keep warm at night.

“A Project Linus blanket is a hug when you need one most. Last year we delivered over 1700 blankets during October, November and December. When children receive one of our blankets in a hospital or emergency room, they are thrilled,” said Warren. “The blankets take the children’s minds off their surroundings and their distress. It makes them comfortable and easier to treat. We thank you for all the joy you help us spread.”

Join the volunteers at CSV Chapter of Project Linus to celebrate their 25th Anniversary during Fall Make a Blanket Day on Saturday, October 25, 2025. It will be held at Faith Lutheran Church on Rt. 45, west of Lewisburg, from 9:30 am until 2pm. To make a lunch reservations, call 570-966-3675.

The quilters and sewers will assemble quilts. Quilts tops are ready to have backs and batting sewn on, and then need to be knotted to finish. If you have never done this, they will teach you what to do. If you want to sew, you may bring your sewing machine or reserve one of Project Linus’ machines. Fleece blankets also need to be prepared and knotted.

If you have completed new, handmade blankets, you may drop them off on Make A Blanket Day or at one of their drop-off points (see Face Book site). If you want your blankets to go to Janet Weis Center, they must be laundered and have a laundry agreement with them. They also take donations of yarn and quilting fabric.

These days he writes songs about the profound joys that abound in this world, and almost all of them come back to love, in one form or another.
