Lewisburg Neighborhoods Come Together to Remove 248 Pounds of Litter



Lewisburg Neighborhoods (LN) successfully hosted two community-wide litter pickups this April, bringing together volunteers of all ages to support a cleaner, more connected Lewisburg. These events launched from LN's office at 55 South 5th Street and extending across key areas throughout the borough.

As a community revitalization nonprofit celebrating two decades of making Lewisburg more welcoming, livable, and sustainable, Lewisburg Neighborhoods continues to create opportunities that strengthen neighborhood connection, environmental stewardship, and civic engagement.

Cleanup efforts spanned both the borough's residential streets and key community green spaces. Volunteers worked through neighborhoods from Water Street through 7th Street, walking block by block and picking up litter as they moved throughout the community.

Additional efforts focused on high-traffic and natural areas, including Hufnagle Park, the Bull Run stream cor-

ridor along 6th Street, Market Street, the piers, and the Rail Trail. During the second event, volunteers expanded their reach to include Danny Green Field and Wolfe Field, building on the broader community-wide effort across both residential and recreational spaces.

Efforts extended to the Rail Trail thanks to community member Kathy Petito, who independently collected two bags of both trash and recyclables, further amplifying the initiative's reach.

Across both events, volunteers collected a total of 248 pounds of litter, with 105 pounds successfully diverted through recycling efforts. The first cleanup on April 12 resulted in 126 pounds collected, including 60 pounds recycled and 66 pounds of trash. The second cleanup on April 26 brought in an additional 122 pounds, with 45 pounds recycled.

Each event welcomed approximately 50 volunteers, with strong participation from both Bucknell University students and local community members, reinforcing a shared commitment to environmental stewardship and civic pride.

Fraternity engagement played a key role in the success of the initiative. Members of Chi Phi participated in the first cleanup, followed by 33 members of Lambda Chi Alpha in the second, contributing energy and leadership to the effort.

Youth involvement was equally impactful. Participants from the YMCA's Leaders in Training program joined alongside their families, and a local Girl Scout troop contributed to the second cleanup — highlighting the importance of engaging the next generation in community care.

Additional support came from Nic Newman, Bucknell student and LN Sustainable Community Associate, who assisted in coordinating both cleanup events and provided logistical, organizational, and communications support throughout the initiative. This included helping set up and facilitate cleanup zones, as well as supporting Jessie Lee Bilger with promotional outreach efforts through local radio stations. As participation expanded in the second cleanup, additional hands-on support was brought in through Anthony Bach, who played a key role in the detailed sorting process. His efforts focused on carefully going through collected materials to ensure recyclables were properly separated from waste, strengthening the overall recycling impact of the initiative.

"These events are a reflection of what's possible when a community shows up for itself," said Jessie Lee Bilger, Director of Marketing & Community Engagement at Lewisburg Neighborhoods. "From students to families to local organizations, there was a shared sense of pride in taking care of the spaces we all use every day."

As Lewisburg Neighborhoods continues to expand programming centered on wellness, sustainability, and community connection, initiatives like these litter pickups play a vital role in fostering a more vibrant and engaged borough. Residents are encouraged to stay connected for future volunteer opportunities and community events through LN's website and social media platforms.

He regularly enjoyed the annual holiday Trivial Pursuit games where he could outsmart his children and grandchildren. His competitive spirit was always on display at his other happy place, the Bucknell Golf Club. He was a regular at the course for many years. No putt was too short to concede, and he was always happy to get his drive on the ninth hole past the old barn. Paul had a huge appetite for reading and was a big fan of authors Tom Clancy and John Grisham. He loved movies that spoke to his lawyer mind, watching The Fugitive dozens of times.

WOO Sprints got all Three of Thier Scheduled Shows in at Lincoln and Williams Grove, WOO Late Models Next

Lincoln Speedway had a very successful WOO sprint event on Tuesday, May 5th with 40 drivers in attendance with 16 woo drivers on hand for the event. Michael Kofoid had a nice battle with David Gravel late in the race, till a late race yellow changed thing around. The caution worked in favor of Kofoid, Macedo and Chase Dietz, but Gravel who was leading, had trouble with the dirty air and fell back to fourth at the finish. Kofoid won his fourth WOO series feature of the season while Macedo and Deitz closed in at the end. Danny Dietrich came on strong at the end to place fifth. Nice run for 19-year-old driver Logan Rumsey who had a good time trial and heat race finished, then placed second in the dash, where he started in the feature. Logan hung around the top five all races but fell back to sixth at the finish. Tyler Ross scored a strong run for Pa Posse picking up the hard charger award starting 17th and finishing seventh. Cameron Smith was eight and Kasey Kahne filling in for Anthony Macri was ninth.

Friday night it was off to Williams Grove for the first of a two-day show for the Woo series. Friday night was all about Kasey Kahne scoring his first ever Williams Grove speedway feature

winning in the Macri #39M. Kasey, who has a long history of racing with NASCAR, made his first Williams Grove start in a sprint car 26 years ago and just got his first win their Friday night beating Sheldon Haudenschild (who came on strong at the end of the race). He is running for the WOO series Rookie of the Year honors. Luck was on Ashton's side as Dave Moody gave up his own team's ride for the weekend so Torgerson could keep up on his points for the ROY title. Ashton will have to come up with something else for this weekend when the WOO series heads to Eldora for a two day show and they are off to Knoxville for another two day show at the speedway located in Iowa. Saturday was the battle between the PA Posse and the WOO series for the Morgan Cup which goes to the winner of the feature. Whether he is a WOO series driver or a part of the PA posse, the trophy is going back with the WOO series to North Carolina as David Gravel scored the feature win on Saturday night over PA Posse driver Justin Whittall and Troy Wagaman Jr. Sheldon Haudenschild was fourth with Kasey Kahne fifth, that is two top five finishes for both of those drivers, along with Gravel, who had a first and third. Troy Wagaman Jr. With his two top five runs take over the Williams Grove points lead, going into this Friday night's show. In six 410-sprint car races run at the Grove so far this year; they have had six different winners. Starting back in March with Lance Dewease winning the season opening followed by Steve Snyder Jr picking up a surprise victory at the Grove in the Hefner #27, the Justin Peck came in from an off night of the High Limit series to score a Grove win. Then, another Mike Hefner car got a victory by Troy Wagaman Jr, followed by Kasey Kahne and David Gravel.

In other Friday night action Big Diamond beat the weather and ran a program that had the limited late models on hand. George Dixon Jr of Shirleysburg scored his second limited win of the season. His first was at Clinton County back in April. Dixon held off a late charge by Andrew Yoder to score the feature win at Big Diamond. Lane Snook was third with Travis Horan, Lucas Adams in the top five. A nice field of 19-drivers were on hand for the show. Duane Howard picked up his 94th 358-Modified feature win on Friday at Diamond, beating Loudon Reimart, Kevin Olenick, Tim Buckwalter and Dom Buffalino. On an "iffy" weather night, the track drew a field of 22-drivers for the Modified race along with eleven Roadrunners and fourteen Xcel 600 Modifieds.

BAPS Motor speedway ran a different type of program on Saturday night calling it a start them all with only feature events begin run for the four divisions on hand for the show. They do this at least once or twice a year and it seems to be a hit with the drivers and fans. The Limited late model class drew the biggest field of cars with 27- schedule to start the feature. With Lincoln speedway off on Saturday looking for close to forty drivers to be on hand in both sprint series events. In four races, Port winners have been Danny Dietrich, Jake Karklin, Ryan Smith and Brock Zearfoss. Here is another show you might want to take this Saturday at Hagerstown Speedway they will be running Limited late models, Crate late models and 305-sprints. The last time they ran this show back in April, it drew a field of 28-limited late models and 19 crate late models and 39 305 sprints, look for close to the same numbers for this Saturday's show. The last time feature winners were Kyle Lear in the limited late models, Trevor Collins in the crate late models, and Logan Spahr in the 305-sprints.

THE VIEW FROM HEAR

The school year is winding down and you know what that means. Your team has a chance to make Districts, play for a District championship and see how deep of a run your school's team can make at States or win an individual medal.

I'm not sure we have any local teams that can make a lot of noise at the state level but I can see 6-8 individuals placing in Track and Field. The Mifflinburg and Midd-West softball teams have a very good chance at winning a District 4 title.

The Selingsgrove baseball team is fighting to make the postseason. They spotted Jersey Shore a four run headstart but scored the next eleven runs to win 11-4. Declan Abraham's 3 for 4 with two runs and three RBIs led the comeback.

Once again the Seals came back to win their third straight by plating three runs in their last at bat in a 3-1 win over Shik. Late game heroics at the dish and Reid Kerstetter closing out games on the mound has been working well for Grove. Jayden Benner, Adam Witmer and Andrew Gesumaria all were 2 for 3.

The Grove nine then lost two games to hamper their qualifying for districts. District power Athens moved their record to 16-2 in beating the Seals 2-0. It was a very well pitched game on both sides. Tanner Teats had a double for Selingsgrove who started this week off with a loss at Midd-West. More on that later.

One team that reserved their spot in Districts is Lewisburg even though their four game winning streak came to an end in losing 8-1 to Shik. They followed that up with a 13-5 win over Danville to start their week and extend their season in Districts. Colin Shannon and Landyn Bieber both had two doubles and knocked in four and three runs.

Mifflinburg answered Loyalsock by matching their two runs scored in the third and fifth innings. JP Marr's RBI single in the fourth was the difference in the Wildcats 5-4 win. Marr finished 3 for 3 and also ended the game with a save. Marr came in to relieve starting and winning pitcher Cole Reibosome in the seventh after Reibosome hit his pitch limit. Brennan Snyder scored two runs with two hits.

Mason Schneck and Snyder combined on a two-hitter in the Miff 13-3 win over Hughesville. Snyder and Marr combined to go 4 for 7 with five RBIs. Jack Whittaker was 2 for 3 with a double and two runs and ribs.

There's been a lot of late inning excitement going on recently from our four schools on the diamond. This week Midd-West scored five runs in their last AB to tie Jersey Shore 10-10. The Stangs won the

game in the extra inning with just one hit.

Colton Aumiller led off the eighth with a single. Shore got two outs and then walked both Derek Wert and Alex Trojan. Tie game, bases loaded, two outs and Westin Kuhns swung at the first pitch after two walks...? Four pitches later Kuhns got the walk-off walk for the 11-10 win.

Midd-West started this week off with a 9-8 win over Selingsgrove in a game that had huge District ramifications. Aumiller struck out the Seals Abrahams with two runners in scoring position for the win. There were some very questionable ball/strike calls late in the game in high leverage situations. Max Trawitz led Midd-West going 3 for 4 with a double, triple and four RBIs.

Emma Wagner pitched and drove in three to lead Midd-West softball to a 12-0 shutout over Newport. Olivia Dorman was 2 for 4 with a double and scored three runs. Briahna Keister had a double and triple and Ava Yoder drove in four with two hits.

Against Selingsgrove it was Wagner's arm and bat once again in the 10-3 victory. Wagner pounded home runs in the first and second innings and struck out eight Seals in her complete game six-hitter. Six Mustangs had multiple hits including a solo blast from Cali Sauer. Wagner, Dorman and Lia Stoltzfus all had three hits. Grove's Molly Hess was 2 for 3 with a double and Addie Kolak was 2 for 3 with a homerun.

The Lewisburg girls gave up 10 runs in the first inning and fell to Warrior Run 16-1 in four innings. They followed that up with a better showing against a 13 win Bucktail team. The Green Dragon lost 8-6 despite Brinley Haile's 2 for 3 with a homer and four RBIs.

The Mifflinburg girls remained undefeated at 17-0 with a 9-0 shutout over Central Columbia. Avery Reibosome was 4 for 4 with two doubles and two RBIs. Anna Pachucki was 3 for 5 with a double. We all know the regular season is not the problem for Mifflinburg, their issue lies in the post season.

Selingsgrove couldn't hold a 7-4 lead after five innings, giving up six to East Pennsboro in the sixth, losing 10-8. Sadi Bigger had two doubles, Molly Hess was 2 for 4 with a triple and Teagan Richter 2 for 4 with a double and two ribs. Selingsgrove must win two of their last three games to qualify for Districts.

The Selingsgrove boys and girls track and field teams swept Shamokin in coach Brian Catherman's final home meet. Catherman is retiring after 27 years of coaching. Bucknell bound Matthew Stebila had three individual wins to pace the Seals. Stebila took first in the long and triple jump as well as the 300 IH. The girls were led by double winners Gigi Veach, Ashtyn Lukens, Mikayla Martin and Bella Furgison.

Midd-West hosted Mifflinburg and Montoursville in a tri-meet. The Cat's Chace Aikey won all three throws. Midd-West swept the distance runs along with the 1,600 and 3,200 relays. Leigha Wenger won the shot and javelin for the Mustang girls and Miff's Makenna Fogle and Parice Shuck each won two events.

The Heartland Athletic conference held their annual team meet in Bloomsburg last weekend. Lewisburg's Lydia Delsite had a big day in winning the triple jump and setting Lewisburg school records in the long and high jumps in winning her three gold medals. Delsite set the school triple jump record earlier in the season. Of interest to some, Delsite transferred from Moon Area High school this year and still holds the school records at the Pittsburgh area school in the high and long jumps.

The Selingsgrove girls finished in third place behind Lewisburg. Gigi Veach won the 400 and assisted in the 4x400 relay win. Bella Furgison took first place in the shot and discus.

On the boys side, Wyatt Nelson took gold in the 800 and Mifflinburg's Larry Murray won both the 100-meter dash and long jump.

Selingsgrove Lacrosse continued to dominate as they jumped all over Lewisburg with a 17-2 win. The trio of Nash Fordyce, Ben Bucher and Graham Davis each scored four goals. The girls LAX team won an exciting 9-7 match over Danville with Abby Raymond and Emily Aument scoring four goals each.

Mifflinburg's Landen 'Larry' Murray will take all that speed he has and continue his football career at Susquehanna in the Fall. Murray has been one of the region's better football players in recent years and I'm happy he has decided to continue his football career. SU got a good one.

I thought Aaron Rodgers would have already decided what he was

going to do in the fall. Is all this drama over Rodgers worth at best a .500 season and the 19th pick in next year's NFL draft? It's always been all about Aaron and the Pittsburgh brass should realize the best thing to do is let the 42 year old QB go on his weird and quirky way.

You have two young QBs in Will Howard and Drew Allar. Play them both this year to see what you have. If the Steelers only win four games all year, you will know what you have in Howard and Allar. You will also be picking in the top five spots in next year's draft which is loaded with top QB prospects.

New Steeler head coach Mike McCarthy has already begun the process of rebuilding Allar's mechanics from the ground up. From Allar's footwork to his throwing motion, McCarthy is teaching Drew how to play the position of quarterback. Allar has always had the size, hands and strong arm that you can't teach, he just hasn't had the coaching.

Speaking of changes, baseball has made some rule changes recently and in my mind, for the better. Games are finished in less time because of the pitch clock and starting extra innings with a runner on second base. Major League Baseball also banned the extreme in field shift, three infielders on either side of second base, thinking this would result in more base hits.

The overall batting average this year of .243 is the lowest it has been in the Modern Era of baseball (1901-present). The biggest reasons for fewer hits are faster and more athletic outfielders chasing down balls hit into the gaps that would have been doubles five years ago. To quote Brewers' Christian Yelich, "We've got all center fielders in the outfield. You don't just stick a slugger in left field and say, 'whatever you catch out there is a plus.'"

Lack of contact hitting, putting bat on ball, is also down. Batters are lifting and pulling the ball more than ever when they do make contact. This is the anti-bunt philosophy that teams would rather try and hit a three-run homer instead of advancing runners with a sacrifice bunt. Think three-point shot in basketball instead of a mid-range jumper for two.

Fewer hits can also be attributed to pitchers throwing instead of pitching. A complete game is rare as so many pitchers throw as hard as they can and turn the game over to the bullpen in the sixth or seventh inning. I enjoy today's game but miss seeing Greg Maddox out there pitching.

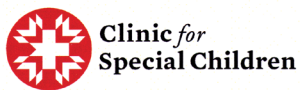
