Historical Glimpses of **Union County Opens**

Coinciding with Union County's Bicentennial Celebration, Packwood House Museum's exhibit titled, Historical Glimpses of Union, is now on display in the Packwood House Museum's Tour Center on North Water and Market streets, Lewisburg, every Tuesday through Saturday from June 8th through September 7th 10 AM-5 PM.

This particular exhibition includes a great variety of images and objects—old photographs, artwork from the recently held Bicentennial event, Sketch Union County where local artists took up pencils, pens, and brushes to capture their favorite spots in Union County as part of the Arts Festival in May.

Rare maps of Union County from 1857 and 1881 will be on view; the earlier one dating three years after Union County was split in two with the southern half becoming Snyder County and when Lewisburg was established as Union County's new seat of governance.

Lewisburg memorabilia including advertising items of all sorts as well as a very special home movie from the 1940s featuring Lewisburg and the surrounding area, will be particular crowd favorite.

In addition, items of local historical significance will be highlighted during tours of the museum that depart at 11 AM, 1 PM, and 3:30 PM Tuesday through Saturday. Included in the tour will be portraits of Colonel John Kelly and his wife Sarah, locally-made Pennsylvania-German furniture which was gathered by Edith Fetherston, the museum's founder, and quilts made in Union County, on display in the Robert Glover Shoemaker Quilt Gallery. The late Mr. Glover of Vicksburg bought hundreds of Pennsylvania quilts and the largest portion of his purchases can be seen at the Packwood House Museum.

Packwood Museum was a log tavern, an inn, and in the early 1800s became a hotel that, by 185, was called America House with 27 rooms. From 1936-1972 it was the large private home of John and Edith Fetherston. Their home and furnishings were opened in 1976 by a non-profit board of directors as a museum for the public's enjoyment.

This Bicentennial event at the Packwood House Museum is one of many being planned for the public's enjoyment in 2013, the year of Union County's Bicentennial Celebration. For more Bicentennial events go to www.UnionCounty200.com.







More about the Bake Ovens of older days...

The outside of the out-door oven was a small, separately built ment, with about a five-foot "fore shuss" (open front extension) at the oven mouth or front end.

The foundations were dug below the front line as also were those of the extension, one on each side for a wall about 18 inches above ground level, on the top of which a shelf was placed. The roof also extended over this five-foot extension, the sides of which were closed by nailing boards to the roof extension and to the sill that had been placed on top of this 18-inch wing wall. Into these two closed sides, shelves were placed. The inside of the building, under the oven, was dug out and a large opening was left in one side of the masonry for ventilation.

Heavy hand-hewn sills were walled in crosswise as a floor; and on these the Pennsylvania redware hearth bricks were lain and leveled. The hearth was laid flush with the stone oven mouth sill. On this hearth an eight inch high vertical brick wall was built, the plan of which was egg-shaped.

A chimney was now started in the rear end. It extended upward in the rear outer wall to about 18 inches above the hearth, with boards laid loosely on top as a temporary floor, mound shaped in the form of a hard-boiled egg cut lengthwise and placed with its flat side on top of this temporary floor.

On top of this dry earth mound the red bricks were placed edgewise to the mound, starting around the outside, row after row until the entire mound was covered. The last bricks in the top center were trimmed and edged in as the keystone of an arch. Over this arch of brick, about a foot depth of yellow clay was now thoroughly tamped and leveled off.

Now the timbers and blocking on the hearth were pulled out This left the temporary board floor which had served as scaf-

folding and the dry earth drop down on to the hearth. All this was also pulled and scraped out of the mouth of the oven. Now the ceiling, sides and hearth were thoroughly brushed in order to remove all the loose earth and sand that might adhere to it and might later drop into the baking. (To be continued next week)



Jeff Gordon almost passed Montoya, but had to settle for third. "We needed a good finish," said Gordon. "The car was good and we needed that last caution. We were a team on the move, but we didn't quite have a winning car.'

Kyle Busch, winner of Friday night's truck race was fourth, followed by Brad Keselowski, Clint Bowyer, Joey Logano, Kevin Harvick, Mark Martin, and Dale Earnhardt Jr. Jimmy Johnson finished 17th.

MORE SAFER BARRIERS NEEDED.

After taking a hard hit into the wall at Charlotte, Jeff Gordon said there needs to be more Safer barriers.

"I found the one off of (Turn) 2 here (Dover) and they haven't fixed that one. I saw somebody in the Truck Series found it, too. I understand their theory is they go through their testing and see where multiple impacts have happened and highest impacts and

"But, I've got to tell you, that hit at Charlotte was one of the hardest I've had in a race car. And the type of impact it was, I got hit from the left so it shifted everything to the left, and then I hit the wall on the right so I went from left to right. I had a rough week. I didn't quite understand the pain that I was feeling that night until I went back and watched the video and realized the angle that I hit as well as the fact that there was no Safer barrier. 'I had no idea there was no Safer barrier at that dogleg on the

front stretch. That blew my mind that there wasn't one. I mean, there's one at the start/finish line and it stops and then there's one at Turn 1. It goes around to Turn 2. That kind of shocked me. So, I certainly said something and when I get the opportunity, I'll talk to others as well about it. 'As I've learned in the past, they're going to look at those cir-

SECTION 8-27, CUSTOMER OWNED **ELECTRIC SERVICE GENERATION**

Customer generation may be installed to offset the customer energy consumption up to the annual consumption of the customer at a single service account and single property subject to the capacity limits established by resolution of the Borough. Customer generation shall be subject to the requirements of the Borough. The installation shall comply with all applicable land use, zoning, planning, Borough Ordinances, Rules, Regulations and the

Customer generation shall be owned and operated by the customer.

If the customer generates more energy than consumed during a monthly billing cycle, the customer shall receive an energy credit in kilowatt hours for the next billing month. Monthly credit shall be applicable to energy only. Excess energy credits shall expire with no additional credit or compensation from the Borough at the end of a twelve (12) month period established by resolution. The customer shall be required to pay all applicable charges including customer, capacity, tax and the purchased power adjustment.

The customer-generator operating an

electric generating facility shall maintain homeowners, commercial or other insurance providing coverage in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for the liability of the insured against losses or damages arising from the use of the customer's electric generating facility. The Borough shall be named an additional insured. The customer must submit evidence of such insurance to the Borough before interconnection with the Borough system. The Borough's receipt of evidence of liability insurance shall not imply an endorsement of the terms and conditions of the coverage.
