

Lewisburg's Art Festival 2025

Even a touch of spring showers couldn't dampen the energy that was present through downtown Lewisburg on Saturday, April 26, 2025, as the annual Lewisburg Arts Festival unfolded. Hosted by the Lewisburg Arts Council, this eventonce again drew a multitude of art enthusiasts, both local and from afar, eager to explore the diverse offerings of over one hundred talented vendors who lined Market Street and the parking lots surrounding Hufnagle Park.

As I meandered down Market Street my senses were immediately drawn to the artistry of a different kind – the culinary arts. My journey began with a stop at Carmella's Italian Bakery where I purchased a Napoleon, a piece of tiramisu, and a soft cannoli-filled and topped donut which surely gave my diet a setback. It seems my artistic appreciation often takes a few delicious detours in search of edible masterpieces.

The showcase of artistic talent that the festival brought is unmatched in our area, and the number and variety of handcrafted treasures on display was tremendous. I saw skillfully crafted furniture and

wooden ducks, creative dog figurines, beautiful jewelry created with a variety of materials and stones, exquisite paintings, prints of amazing digital photographs, glass art, wooden bowls, ceramics, tie-dyed and children's clothing, and watercolor stickers. I loved the beautiful fluid abstract artwork from The Artsy Amateur, and I also made a usual stop at the Lewisburg Garden Club's stand where I purchased myself a newgraptophyllum pictum plant because I definitely deserved it, at least that's what I told my husband.

One of my favorite stops along my festival travels was at the booth for the Handmade Parade. If you read my article from the Polar Plunge, you will recall my love for the creativity and opportunity for individual expression which the Handmade Parade brought. I spoke with Lewisburg Arts Council members, Rachel Martine and Ellen Flacker-Darer, of Lewisburg, who were busy crafting "papa bear" which would be between 9-12 feet and was a sequel to the hot pink polar bear seen at the Polar Plunge. They told me about the monthly public workshops which will help to create the memorable displays of talented artwork which will be displayed at the Polar Plunge event. They were very thankful to the local Fairfield Inn who donated bedding which was cleaned and dyed to create over 306 fabric squares being used at the Arts Festival. Attendees can spend some time in their booth to add their own personalized touch to a largerriver-themed display which will be sewn together and displayed at next year's Polar Plunge event.

I also spoke with Selinda Kennedy who was a featured artist of the festival. Her terracotta clay redware pottery creations were impressive, and she even had some Lewisburg, Pennsylvania specific historic-inspired folk artwork which blends traditional techniques with her contemporary style. If you missed her work at the festival, you can check it out at the new Cooperative Gallery located at 229 Market Street in Lewisburg.

The festival catered to all ages, offering a variety of things for the kids as well which included lots of crafts and balloon art beyond browsing the vendor stalls. There were also many opportunities to savor the flavors of the region, with a wide range of delectable treats and usual fair foods, like fresh cut fries, cheesesteaks, roasted sweet corn, and cotton candy. Whether you were craving ethnic favorites, like gyros, or my favorite, the incredible Italian pastries from Carmella's, there was truly something for everyone.

The sounds of talented local musicians were also very present. While strolling through the festival, I even heard one booth playing a violin version of a favorite song of mine, The Sound of Silence by Dis-

turbed which was awesome! Also, a kind gentleman stopped me on my walk to the festival to tell me about a jazz band performance that would be taking place in a church slightly off of Market Street. I told him I would come back for it, and I am so glad that I did. The performance was given by Susquehanna University's Jazz Ensemble, and the music was invigorating and uplifting with its strong sound from several brass instruments. It fondly reminded me of the many jazz concerts of my older siblings that I attended as a kid but much better. The young lady who sang along to some songs was pretty impressive as well.

The Lewisburg Arts Festival was once again rich in artistic spirit, and whether you were drawn by the allure of fine art, the temptation of delicious treats, the joy of live music, or the simple pleasure of a community gathering, the festival offered something to resonate with every visitor. 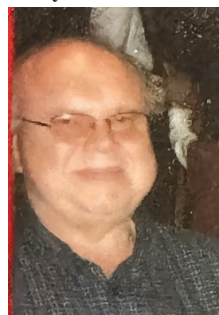

I had a good start from the outside pole and that was the key to having a good start. I got there a little early, but we were rolling in there pretty fast, the way the track was tonight. I got out front early and got to the bottom and kept going” said Andrew. “I never changed anything I was doing the whole race; I ran a quick pace. I was backing up in the corners a little bit because I did not want to get caught up in lapped cars, and we only dealt with them for a few laps before a caution got us back out in clean air. I knew Ryan Zook was behind me and he is pretty good wherever he races. I knew a win is a win but winning one at Selinsgrove is the best. I grew up around this place spent a number of years racing on the go-kart track, winning is good at some tracks but winning at Selinsgrove never gets old. We run Larry Baer’s stuff in the supers and did not do much limited stuff last year, but with Selinsgrove coming back with more races for both classes, we want to race them all for sure. We are going for a track title in both classes we will see how that goes. That is a great idea to start, but it might kick us in the butt later. There are a lot of nights we will run in both classes, we placed fourth at Hagerstown, and had another fourth last week, tonight we did not over tighten the car and got the win.

It was a packed pits Saturday night at Selinsgrove with 33-305-sprints 20-URC sprints 18-limited late models and 14 roadrunners, there was not one spot left in the pits and also a nice crowd of fans were on hand for the second show of the season. Derek Locke was declared the winner of the URC race when Jordan Thomas was disqualified for coming up light at the scales after his feature win, not only did Derek win the feature he also received the 358-sprint car bonus for the highest finish 358-sprint car drivers. Speaking of money, Andrew Yoder with his win on Sunday night at Port Royal, earned a total of \$3,500 for his two feature wins. Doug Dodson was the 305-sprint winner, his first win of the year and husband of the Pass Series announcer Stephanie. Brad Mitch made it two for two in the Roadrunner division. He looks to be tough to beat this season. This Friday, Selinsgrove will have a three-division show including super late models, their second race of the year. Reports are is that Dan Stone will make his season debut this Friday at Selinsgrove in his super deuce Longhorn Chassis super late model. The limited late models will have their third race of the year with Coleby Frye and Andrew Yoder scoring wins so far in that division. Ryan Zook who has placed second in both events, looks to move up one spot and get a feature win. Zook and Andrew Yoder are tied for the points lead each with 640 points. Brad Mitch leads the Roadrunners with 700 points, 100 more than Nate Stroup.

The Keith Kauffman classic last Saturday night at Port Royal Speedway went to Ryan Smith for his second win of the season. Now driving the Kreitz #69K, Smith won \$15,000 for the big win. Chase Dietz, Lance Dewease, Anthony Macri and Lucas Wolfe were in the top five. After a two-race weekend last week, they came back with a single show on Saturday with the 410-sprints, Pass 305-sprints and Limited late models. Brock Zearfoss leads the 410-point standings with 1210, 20 behind is Justin Whittall then Michael Walter, 45 behind Gerard McIntyre and Jeff Halligan 50-60 back in the top five. Rick Eckert leads the super late models with 1125; Gregg Satterlee at 1095; Colton Flinner, 1040 defending champ Dylan Yoder 1030 and Justin Weaver 1015. Ryan Zook leads the limited late model with 650; Lane Snook at 645; Casey Steinhoff 610; Brad McGinnis 605 and Keith Walls 580. Sunday, at Port Royal, Ricky Thornton completed his weekend with a second at Georgetown Speedway on Friday and two wins at Hagerstown paying him \$25,000 and another \$10,000 for his Sunday win at Port. Gregg Satterlee of Indiana Pa., did the best of the local drivers with a fifth-place finish, while Rick Eckert of York, Pa. was 10th. Nice field of 35 drivers were on hand for the event.

to see a 4 division show sponsored by Hilly Ridge Sales and Service and York County Racing Club Night featuring the return of the United Racing Club Sprint Cars in The 358/360 challenge Joe Whitcomb Memorial that saw Derek Locke of Mechanicsburg, in a 358 taking a win after Jordan Thomas was light at the scales by nearly 20 lbs. Middletown’s Doug Dodson picked up his first Keller’s Auto Body PASS 305 win at Selinsgrove. Middleburg’s Andrew Yoder picked up his first win of the season in the Creekside Auto Sales Limited Late Models presented by Spring Valley Mulch. Beaver Springs Brad Mitch grabbed his second consecutive Superior Homes Road Runner Feature. The United Racing Club made their first trip to the Selinsgrove speedway for the first time since 2023. Thomas was disqualified and that handed the win over to Derek Locke taking his first career URC Feature win. Becoming the 291st different driver to win a URC Feature. His 3rd career win at Selinsgrove. First since 2018. Locke also took home top 358 honors with his win and bonus money put up by Kratzer Insurance. With Thomas’s DQ that would move Haden Miller into round out the top 5.

URC Sprint Cars will be back in action at Selinsgrove on Friday June 6th for the Kramer Kup along with the 410 Sprint Cars and IMT USAC East Coast Wingless 360 sprint cars.

After stalking Kenny Heffner for more than three-quarters of Saturday night’s River Valley Builders PA Sprint Series 20-lap feature at Selinsgrove Speedway, Doug Dodson pulled off the winning pass and led the final three laps to capture the IMCA/RaceSaver portion of the track’s Joe Whitcomb Memorial night.

Heffner, of Watsonstown, had a chance to return the favor when a late caution forced a restart with two laps remaining, but Dodson, of Middletown, got a strong jump on that final green flag and brought the George Stevens-owned Power Mist Racing Fuels/Down East Granite/Crockett Log Homes #20 home 1.363 seconds ahead for the win.

It was his 10th career PASS victory, but his first at Selinsgrove (he has a super sportsman win there), where he had to beat a strong, 33-car field that included seven winners of past IMCA/RaceSaver events at the track.

Dodson said afterward that, as he was following Heffner, he noticed an issue with the track and the leader’s right rear tire, and he backed off his pace to conserve the rubber on his car, waiting for an opportunity when the leaders got into traffic.

That turned out to be exactly what happened: when Heffner slipped out of the rubbered area of the track, Dodson pounced.

“Fortunately, I could get out of the rubber a little bit,” he said. “I had a really good car.”

Heffner finished second after an interesting night in which he started the feature on the pole alongside his car owner Cale Reigle, driving a team car.

Kruz Kepner of nearby Kreamer had his second straight strong run in the young season and finished third, ahead of Mid Atlantic Sprint Series regular Tim Iulig of Bridgeton, N.J., and 2023 PASS Champion Logan Spahr of Lewisberry, who claimed his second consecutive top-five finish.

Completing the top 10 were Drew Young, Timmy Bittner, Mike Melair, John Braim, and Reigle, who has five PASS wins to his credit but hadn’t driven since 2022. The Ickesburg veteran said the strong run was “a blast,” enough for him to “call it a career one last time.”

Reigle also had placed second in his heat race. Those competitive events were won by Dodson, Iulig, Landon Price, and rookie Cody Hoover. Jason Roush took the B-Main.

The feature race was run with only one caution, not for a major incident, but the B-Main was stopped early for a frightening flip by Erick Knopp of Danville. Knopp, who had experienced a less serious incident in his heat race, was cut from his racer after complaining of neck and shoulder pain and taken to a local hospital. Fortunately, tests showed only major bruising, and the driver was able to return home. The car was destroyed.

Knopp announced on social media afterwards that he was retiring from racing.

Before we get to the Shadeur Sanders story I would like to address a very troubling incident that went mostly under the radar last week. The NCAA, an incompetent and feckless organization that oversees college athletics penalized Fordham University's men's basketball team. What Fordham did pales in comparison to what bigger schools have done in the past and the penalty did not fit the crime.

Fordham provided about \$10,735 in entertainment to eight recruits. This included jet ski rentals, tickets to Nets and Giant games, US Open tickets and professional photos on the Empire State building. No bags of cash provided by Adidas! All Level 2 infractions in the NIL era. Kansas basketball, a blueblood for sure, were charged with improper recruiting practices and cash payments to players before it was legal with NIL. Penalties for Fordham are 3 years probation, vacate 41 wins, recruiting restrictions and a \$35k fine plus 2% of their basketball budget. Staff members involved in the situation had all left the program before the NCAA handed down these overzealous fines. In comparison Kansas was placed on 3 year probation, vacated 15 wins, \$5k fine and 1% of basketball budget. Coach and Athletic Director are still there. Kansas did spend \$10M to defend the charges against them.

That's the rub. The NCAA is a classic cartel and will not punish the big schools for fear of the major conferences leaving the NCAA and starting their own organization and taking March Madness with them, the cash cow of NCAA income. Fordham and other similar programs will continue to be the scapegoats of the NCAA.

All the pre-draft help didn't help Shadeur Sanders as he fell to the Cleveland Browns in the fifth round. I've heard many reasons why ... too arrogant, a distraction with Prime as his father, stating there were teams he would not play for if drafted by them. I cannot understand why the Browns took him after selecting another quarterback fifty picks earlier. I hope Steeler fans are going to be happy with Aaron Rodgers because he is coming to Pittsburgh.

I know I'm old school but all these digital numbers in baseball are too much. Exit velocity, launch angle, chase rate, FIP and BABIP? Pitch the ball, hit the ball and catch the ball is all I need. How do announcers know if a pitcher threw a 4-seam or 2-seam fastball? Great pitching will always beat great hitters. Perfect example of this was the Pirates Paul Skene's dominating the LA Dodgers last week. The permanent ban on Pete Rose will be lifted so he can be voted on for election to the Hall of Fame... long overdue.

There are two teams I don't want to face in Districts if they qualify. Both the Midd-West softball and baseball teams can and have competed well with the better teams in District 4. The boys beat Milton 12-13 with Kyle Shupp's two doubles and 5 ribs. Braxton Smith continues in the zone going 3 for 4 with a dinger and 5 runs and 5 Rbi's. They lost to a tough Danville nine 8-7 and Smith had another homer and double. They lost 17-8 to Central.

Miley Beachel continues to be a Wildcat slayer. In two games against the Lady Cats Miley has 35 K's and the same number of hits as the entire Miff squad. Her solo round-tripper was the only run scored. They split a twinbill with Troy winning 3-1 with Emma Wagner's two run double in the sixth and Beachel's 8 strikeouts leading the way. They were no-hit 15-0 in the nightcap.

Lewisburg girls softball gave up 16 runs in both losses against Shamokin and Central. A Meg Mitchell single against Central prevented a no-no. The 4-0 lead heading into the bottom of the second inning woke up the Indians as they scored eight runs before their next six outs leading to a 16-6 win. The baseball team treaded water losing 8-1 to Montoursville. The eight errors did not help. Cohen Hoover's two hitter and four runs scored led the Dragons over Milton 12-2. Garrett Glathar added two runs and three ribs.

Four runs in the sixth doomed Miff baseball against Williamsport in a 7-2 L. Catcher Jaden Boyer was 2 for 4 with a double. The Lady Cats should have saved some runs and hits from a 17-2 win over Milton that had won four straight. Anna Pachucki was a homer away from the cycle. Amelia Fluman had three knocks and 3 runs with 2 ribs. Aly Keister was 2 for 2 with a triple and three runs and Rbi's. Pachucki's double prevented a no-hitter against Midd-West.

Jake had two hits, two doubles and scored two runs in the loss.

Track & Field had some records set. Midd-West's Ben Hummel took gold in the 800 and 3200 against Central. Lewisburg boys and girls stayed undefeated beating Danville. Jon Hess and Haneef Shavers each won three events. Emma Bolton took the 110 hurdles and high jump. Caroline Blakeslee sprinted to wins in the 100 and 200 at the Lock Haven Invitational.

Selinsgrove lost their first track meet of the year to Williamsport. Wyatt Teats won the 400 and pole vault. Bella Furgison covered more distance in winning the shot and discus. Tip of the hat to Chace Aikey in setting the Mifflinburg school record in the discus. Chase took first in all the field events in a loss at Hughesville.

Danville broke Lewisburg boys tennis 43 match winning streak. The Dragons can get their revenge against Danville when they face them on Tuesday in the District semi's.
