

2025 Union County Veterans' 4th of July Parade and Festivities

The Union County Veterans 4th of July celebration kicks off on Friday, June 27 with a picnic, concert and a fireworks show at Wolfe Field, located at 304 Hufnagle Blvd in Lewisburg. At 5 pm, food vendors open their stands. At 7 pm, Blue River Soul Band featuring Karen Meeks takes the centerfield stage for a free two-hour concert of classic rock, rhythm and blues, pop, jazz, and blues. At dusk, the largest fireworks display in Union County will mesmerize spectators. The fireworks show is sponsored by Weis Markets. Rain dates for fireworks is June 28 or 29 at dusk.

"As a long-time supporter of veteran causes, we are proud to support the Union County Veterans parade once again as we celebrate our nation's independence," says Dennis Curtin, Weis Markets Director of Public Relations.

On Saturday, it's time for Union County to display its patriotism again. Prior to the parade, Scouts and cheerleaders from Lewisburg and Milton High Schools will distribute flags and free bags of Pardoe's Perky Peanuts. On Saturday, June 28, the Union County Veterans' 4th of July Gala Parade begins with roaring start with a fly-over from the C-47 "Luck of the Irish". The Douglas

C-47B Skytrain is being flown by the men and women from the Air Heritage Aviation Museum in Beaver Falls, PA. "Luck of the Irish" is a WWII veteran and flew two re-supply missions over the Battle of the Bulge on December 1944.

The parade steps out at 10 am and runs from 8th and Market St. in downtown Lewisburg. The parade then turns onto South 3rd Street before ending at the Soldiers and Sailors monument at 3rd Street/University Avenue and St. George Street. The parade features eight musical units, many local community groups, floats, vehicles, and honoring over 100 Veterans who will participating in this parade.

Along the parade route, The North Shore Railroad Company & Affiliates (NSHR) will have its two Military Units parked in Hufnagle Park for public viewing. The artwork on LVRR 9052 (Veterans Unit) and LVRR 9050 (Memorial Unit) were unveiled last May to honor United States military service members – past, present, and fallen.

The 4th annual Sgt. Thomas Reimensnyder Patriot Award will be presented to a community group that enters the most patriotic float in the parade. The winner receives \$250 from Susquehanna Community Bank and a trophy designed and produced by students at SUN Area Technical Institute.

After the parade, festivities continue at Hufnagle Park with featured bands and food vendors! The parade and concerts take place rain or shine.

Andrew then came back from his eighth starting spot, in the Limited Late Model, to place second in the feature earning the hard charger award in that division. Here is Andrew about both his runs, “We had a late caution, and I figured Rick Eckert had to be close to me. I could not tell if Dad was signaling me to go top or bottom, but I know Rick is really good on the bottom of the track. So, I thought to myself, do not miss the bottom the next couple of laps. Then with two and three laps to go, I missed the bottom. It just worked out, I guess. I did not mess up bad enough and the track was not to the point if you did mess up someone would have had to be right there to pass you. It just worked out the way it was going to happen, that is all that was to it, in the end. Early in the race, I had a nice battle with Shaun Jones who is also looking for his first super late model win. Me and him are used to battling each other. Last year we would battle for a 8th or 9th place finish and now we are battling for feature wins. So that is pretty cool also. Both of us have been consistently good this year for the most part. Stay up front and battle for wins, racing with guys like that is fun! He is going to get his win soon I am sure of that. I passed him once and slid by him because I hit a hole, and he got back by me then. We had another restart, and I was able to get back by him. I do not know if his tires were giving up or what, but I just got a good rhythm around the bottom to pick him off. Over the last few laps, I really just did not want to miss the bottom because I knew he was close one time I believe we got together a little bit just hard racing, the track did slow up so I knew he could not pass me on the outside, this car was good tonight I cannot thank Larry Baer enough for the chance to drive his car.” Andrew had also scored his first super late model win at Port Royal back on May 17th giving him two super late model wins this season. He almost came on to get a second-place finish in the limited feature. He talked about that also. “A first and a second tonight is pretty good. It would have been nice to win both, but we started back in the eighth spot and kept digging. Then got close late in the race, but Lane was good also. He got it done. I could hang with him once I got to second so I was thinking maybe I can, but he got it rolling again and I got a little tight and could not get off the bottom of the track, and he could he would miss the hole and I would hit one and that would mess me up, he was good he really have had to mess up for me to get by him. I want to win a first in both divisions on the same night at least one time this year tonight. I was close maybe next time it will happen”, Noted Yoder. Selinsgrove has five more scheduled shows where both divisions race on the same night. Hence, Andrew will get some more chances this year.

A group of professional women recently took a day off of work to help, inspire and empower 35 young women representing seven school districts in the Central Susquehanna Valley. The “Dream It Be It Career Support for Girls” event was held on April 25 at Susquehanna University.

Lewisburg, Mifflinburg, Midd-West, Milton, Selinsgrove, Shikellamy and Warrior Run School Districts all sent students to the conference, which is sponsored by the Soroptimist International of SUN Counties, a global volunteer service dedicated to transforming the lives of women and girls.

According to event chairperson, Angela Hummel of Angela Hummel Consulting, approximately 30 professional women from a variety of professions attended the event along with the students, serving as mentors and speakers.

Throughout the day, the young women heard from a variety of local speakers. The Honorable Pennsylvania State Sen. Lynda Schlegel-Culver provided an inspirational message around positive self-talk; Judge Lori R.

Hackenberg, President Judge of Union/Snyder Counties, tackled monitoring one’s social media presence and staying safe online.

Local businesswomen Kristy Lair of Kickstart Fitness for Women, Jessica Fester of Wrk Inside Out, and local author Erin Geiswhite held an Overcoming Obstacles panel discussion with strong themes around abuse and neglect.

Other speakers included Hummel on Dreaming with Confidence and determining one’s personality style; Brianna Apfelbaum Kula of the Degenstein Foundation and Soroptimist club member who lead the students in an opening icebreaker making sunflowers out of Legos; and representatives of Transitions of PA who talked about self-care strategies.

Student feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. “I liked meeting new people and learning more about myself,” said Kelsey Deitrich of the Shikellamy School District. Her tablemate Keishla Ojeda Mercado from Milton said she liked the inspiring speakers and the positivity of the event. Others expressed they learned what they would like to do after graduation.

Other student comments included, “I learned to say positive things to try not to let self-doubt or any of my negative thoughts get in the way,” and “Instead of thinking I can’t do something, I know I can, and I won’t let myself get lost in negative thoughts.”

“The time, energy and dedication of our volunteers have made a lasting impact on the young women who attended,” said Hummel. “We were proud to host our local school districts and a special thank you goes out to the school counselors who helped to select participants and made arrangements so students could attend. Their partnership was essential to making this experience possible.”

Lynn Aurand, a Selinsgrove Area School District school counselor, was happy that her students were able to attend. “This was a wonderful event. Our students were very blessed, and all were very happy they attended. Each student confirmed her career plans and self-confidence were both clarified and strengthened.”

The Soroptimist club has been sponsoring the Dream It Be it event for 10 years. Other local sponsors this year included the Polished Party Place, Moments that Matter, the Charles and Betty Degenstein Foundation, the Charles B. Degenstein Foundation, and LB Water. The club is currently planning to host a similar event in the Fall.

Lewisburg Senior Center Closed Until Further Notice

The Lewisburg Senior Center, located at 116 North 2nd Street, is temporarily closed until further notice. The Union-Snyder Agency on Aging posted the temporary closing stating, “We regret to announce that, due to unforeseen circumstances the Lewisburg Senior Center will be temporarily closed for an undetermined period of time.”

“We understand this may be an inconvenience, and we appreciate your patience and understanding during this transition. We will keep you informed with any updates regarding the status of the Lewisburg Senior Center.”

According to Holly Kyle, Executive Director of the Union-Snyder Agency on Aging, the temporary closing was not anticipated, and noted, “As a small organization, staffing transitions present unique challenges, and unfortunately, we do not have additional personnel available to immediately step in and fill the gap. That said, we are doing everything we can to minimize the disruption.”

Since the Lewisburg Senior Center is the only one in Union County, members are being redirected to the three other Senior Centers in Snyder County to provide interim support and resources. Beaver Springs Senior Center is located at 55 Elm Street in Beaver Springs. For information, call 570-658-7333. Penns Creek Adult Resource Center is located at 2551 Richard Road in Penns Creek. For information, call 570-837-6200. Selinsgrove Senior Center is located at 8 North Water Street in Selinsgrove. For information, call 570-374-4170. Kyle added, “We appreciate the community’s patience and understanding during this time. We are working closely with our Board of Directors to move forward with a clear plan while continuing to serve our community to the best of our ability.”

Tours of the Dale-Engle-Walker House on July 6

The Dale-Engle-Walker House will be open for tours throughout the summer. The c. 1793 limestone house presents the story of Ulster-Scot immigrant Samuel Dale (1741-1804), his family and tenant farmers, Jacob and Maude Engle’s farm and dairy of the 1930s and 40s, and Charles and Rosemary Walker.

The Dale house was built c. 1793 by immigrant Samuel Dale (1741-1804); the back ell was added between 1820 and 1840. The ell is the back, perpendicular addition to the original house, with the roof sloping down toward the porch and three windows (on the second floor). There are doors into each section. The Victorian porch was added in the late 1800s.

The original house is a symmetrical building: two rooms flank a central hall, with front windows and a side-walled chimney and mantled fireplace. Architectural highlights include the front door and fan light with original glass; first floor twelve-over-twelve windows and second floor eight-over-twelve windows; original chestnut and pine floors; the early kitchen and hearth. The stonework is laid in an un-coursed, roughly squared pattern with larger stones at the corners.

The property stayed in the Dale family until 1929 and was worked by tenant farmers for many years. It was sold to the Engles, who operated a dairy and vegetable farm in the 1930s and ‘40s. Their milk shed is on the lane below the house. The property was purchased by the Walkers as a private residence and farm, and then bequeathed by the Walker estate to the Union County Historical Society.

The Dale-Engle-Walker House will be open on Sunday, July 6, with tours at 1 PM and 2:30 PM. Host Bruce Teeple will discuss local and regional history, agriculture, and economics, as well as the Dale family, who owned the property from the 1790s to 1929; the Engles, owners and farmers in the 1930s and ‘40s; and the Walkers, owners and farmers to 2000. Tours are free, although donations toward maintenance of this historic property are welcome.

Also on site is the Kantz log cabin and a replica wagon shed displaying early farm implements as well as the Engle milk house. The Kantz log cabin, dating to 1789, was a frontier trading cabin along the Tuscarora Indian Path at Middlecreek. It was restored by Kantz descendants in 1998 when they moved it to David and Marcia (Kantz) Milne’s property in Lewisburg. In 2019, the cabin was donated to the society by Marcia Milne, moved from her property, and reassembled at the Dale-Engle-Walker site.

Tours are free and open to the public; donations are gratefully accepted. Books about the property and other topics of local history are available for purchase. The property is available, for a small fee, for photo shoots and family events. Contact UCHS for details.
